Riverwalk Report Card

he end of the fiscal year is almost here for governments, municipalities, companies, and many charities, including Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale. Success is measured via accomplishments made during the year, funding achieved, and the appropriate management of funds and staffing. As we wrap our fiscal year 2014-2015, we are pleased to tell you that while our list of projects, programs, and hardscape improvements was daunting at times, we achieved most of those milestones established by the Board of Directors.

Some of those tasks included:

- Coordination of a free water trolley in conjunction with the City of Fort Lauderdale, the Transportation Management Authority, and Riverwalk. The first year of operations has reaped great acclaim from our residents and visitors and we will be supporting its continuation.
- Installation of three food kiosks along Riverwalk to offer additional amenities to residents and visitors.
- 3. Return of Noon Tunes for a 12-week series in early summer.
- 4. Installation of additional art placed along Riverwalk to provide a continuation of the "Art in Public Places" project that is on-going throughout the city.
- Installation of an Information Kiosk to provide directions, information, and assistance to our residents and visitors.
- 6. Participation in the placement of the giant adirondack chair on Riverwalk, which has gained great exposure through thousands of photo ops taken by guests on Riverwalk.
- 7. Continued work on the Riverwalk Completion Project, which will connect the entire north side of Riverwalk on the New River.
- 8. Installation of the second 10-unit exercise station on the south side of the river at Smoker Park complete with a three-way water fountain.
- 9. Coordination of Riverwalk Recreation brings 10 different disciplines together

- to offer a wide variety of services, from dog training, photography classes, cardio classes, Segway tours, bicycle and tricycle tours to paddleboarding and kayaking on Riverwalk.
- 10. Coordination of a boat rental program with Ecoboats to offer the opportunity for residents and visitors to see Riverwalk and Fort Lauderdale by water.
- 11. Sponsorship over 110 different events and activities along Riverwalk and in Downtown Fort Lauderdale.
- 12. Enhanced media outreach as well as webbased efforts to continue sharing information about Fort Lauderdale, downtown, Riverwalk, and events coordinated with our partners and other charities.
- 13. Participation in encouraging Levitt Foundation to select Fort Lauderdale as a location for a Levitt Pavilion.
- 14. Coordination of the upgrade and activation of Shippey House.
- 15. Facilitation of a lighting update project in which the "guts" of our lights are being upgraded to LED providing more visibility along Riverwalk.

There were more projects completed and others that are still in the works. Your support of Riverwalk enables these projects to make downtown a vibrant and welcoming place for our residents and visitors. We thank you for your help this fiscal year and look forward to the upcoming year with great hope that you will continue that support.

THE DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TURNS 50!

magine Downtown Fort Lauderdale without the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, Museum of Discovery and Science, Riverwalk, NSU Art Museum | Fort Lauderdale, and Broward County Government Center. It's a pretty depressing thought, if you ask me. Besides, these are downtown cornerstones and what they have in common is that the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) played a key role in locating them here over a span of 50 years.

The Florida Legislature created the DDA in 1965, granting the agency the authority to acquire and clear property, issue bonds, plan transportation systems, and accomplish other goals needed for revitalization within its 23-acre boundary.

The many board members and staff who steered this agency throughout the decades made this downtown what it is by utilizing just about every tool provided in the DDA charter. Here are some of the major milestones that the DDA helped to realize since its inception:

1974 - 1985 Early on, the agency focused on acquiring and clearing land in the downtown core.

1978 The Federal Courthouse was constructed at the corner of Broward Blvd. and SE 3rd Ave.

1985 This year saw the opening of the Museum of Art, which was built on DDA land. Additionally, the DDA led the campaign for an \$8 million general bond obligation to fund the Riverwalk Arts & Entertainment District.

1991 The Broward Center for the Performing Arts opened on land donated by the DDA. **1992** The Museum of Discovery and Science (MODS) opened with support from the agency.

1993 The Riverwalk and the Historic Village were completed this year, made possible by the general obligation bond.

2000 - 2007 This period ushered in our first big residential boom. The DDA has lobbied for residential unit increases over the years. Approximately 5,000 units were built, along with 1.85 million square feet of class A office space. The DDA also began planning for the Wave Streetcar during this time.

2010 After a 19-year time out, the St. Patrick's Day parade resumed, co-produced by the DDA and the City. The Federal Courthouse Committee began plans for a new Federal Courthouse.

2011 MODS expanded its campus with new wings.

2013 The new \$213 million Broward County Courthouse broke ground, reaffirming its commitment to downtown. The DDA has long advocated for courts to remain downtown.

2014 The Broward Center for the Performing Arts' award-winning expansions were completed.

2015 More than 5,700 residential units are under review, approved or have been recently completed and the new County Courthouse will be completed by the end of the year. Forty-two percent of downtown businesses are in fact court-related.

The residential population calling downtown their neighborhood is approximately 12,000, some being part-time. As this population grows, so will retail and service opportunities.

These are just a few of the many projects the DDA has helped to facilitate over five decades. There is no doubt in my mind that the coming decades will be even brighter for downtown thanks to the insightful leadership that has guided it. ⁽¹⁾

PIONEERING A WAY TOWARD A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

ort Lauderdale's tropical beauty lies in its seven miles of white sandy beaches, 33 square miles of urban energy, and 300 miles of winding canal coastline. However, the city's flat topography, location on a peninsula, dense coastal development, and shallow, porous aquifer also make our community vulnerable to the effects of climate change and sea level rise.

That vulnerability has become more apparent in recent years. Fortunately, the City and the region have been formally planning and collaborating since 2009 through the leadership of local elected officials and the dedication of staff supporting the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact. The Compact is one of the first and largest voluntary, collaborative, and bi-partisan efforts in the country to address climate issues and policy.

Our City benefits from overwhelming political and public support to address growing climate challenges. The City Commission unanimously adopted a communitywide Vision Plan Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale, and a five-year Strategic Plan - Press Play Fort Lauderdale - both of which identify sustainability, climate adaptation, and climate mitigation as the City's top long-term priority.

Fort Lauderdale actively pursues partnerships to explore new ideas, tools, and research. Assistant City Manager Susanne

Torriente is a founding member of the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact. The City of Fort Lauderdale was the first municipality on the Compact's Staff Steering Committee. The Compact and Fort Lauderdale model for integration and implementation have opened the door for informational peer-to-peer exchanges with Australia, South Africa, the Philippians, the Canadian consulate, Caribbean Islands, Great Britain, and the Netherlands.

More than 30 City staff members, coined "Climate Ambassadors," participated in a three-day National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) workshop earlier this year. This small training program became the catalyst to launch citywide training to educate all fulltime employees about climate change and their role in adapting our efforts. As new employees join the City, their orientation includes a sustainability component. Fort Lauderdale is one of the first of few local governments in the nation to dedicate climate training organization-wide.

Employees are developing new strategies to plan for a sustainable future as they become more mindful of climate change, the science, the seriousness, and most importantly, the solutions. A comprehensive Stormwater Master Plan is driving infrastructure investments in drainage, bio swales, and retention parks to minimize the effects of flooding. Planning staff incorporated Adaptation Action Areas into the City's Comprehensive Plan to prioritize funding for infrastructure projects that minimize impacts in vulnerable areas. The City adopted new flood zone maps and instituted tougher regulatory standards to protect future development and minimize the flood risk in low-lying areas.

As momentum builds within, Fort Lauderdale is engaging its community to further adaptation measures. Volunteers serve on the City's Sustainability Advisory Board and participate in events to plant trees and sea oats, collect hazardous waste and recycled materials, and promote walking and biking. A strong network of neighborhood associations serve as sounding boards for proposed initiatives and policy language through workshops, crowdsourcing forums, and Telephone Town Hall Meetings. The annual neighbor survey gauges resident perception regarding flooding and climate change to identify priorities and allocate future funding.

The City is eager and willing to collaborate, learn, and pilot new ideas and emerging technologies in this ever-changing world of tomorrow. Back to School Safety

GET TO SCHOOL A DIFFERENT WAY THIS YEAR

he school season is upon us. Although times have changed in terms of how children get to school, the importance of our children getting there safely remains the same. If you think back to your childhood, did you walk or bike to school? How about your children or grandchildren, do they walk?

There are many factors that contribute to choosing to drive to school. It could be that walking is inconvenient with our busy schedules or that homes are no longer close to schools. What would it take to make a different choice? What would it take to choose walking or biking instead?

Each of us can help make the journey to school safer for those who choose to walk and maybe encourage others to start. Some safe driving practices include yielding to pedestrians in a crosswalk, giving bicyclists three feet of space when passing, obeying school zone speed limits, and stopping for school buses.

It is also important to stay on the main routes avoiding cutting through quiet neighborhood streets where walkers and bicyclists begin their

journeys. Perhaps the best way to help the little ones who will be walking and riding is to be aware and remain focused at all times.

Another way to increase walking and biking to school is to sponsor group activities such as a walking school bus or a bicycle train. A walking school bus is a group of children walking to school with one or more adults leading the way. If that sounds simple, it is, and that's part of the beauty of the walking school bus. It can be as informal as two families taking

turns walking their children to school or a structured program with a route, a regular schedule, and trained volunteers.

Or you could lead a bicycle train of children riding their bikes to school. It's like a carpool—without the car—with the added benefits of exercise and visits with friends and neighbors.

So in addition to buying back to school supplies, review back to school safety. Take just a few minutes to sit with young ones in your life to review the ABC's of safe behaviors for walking and biking:

- **A** Stay ALERT of surroundings.
- **B** Look BOTH WAYS, making eye contact with drivers.
- **C** Always use CROSSWALKS and signals. Don't forget to check bicycles for road readiness:
- **A** AIR: Are tires fully inflated?
- **B** BRAKES: Are brakes working properly?
- **C** CHAIN: Is the chain properly oiled?

As temperatures cool, consider walking with a child for some quality time or sponsor a neighborhood bike train. No matter how you travel each morning and afternoon, remember that each of us plays a role in safer streets.

COME FOR THE NIGHT. STAY FOR THE WEEKEND!

he show of the century for Broward County will premiere on Saturday, Oct. 3 at the Au-Rene Theater, Broward Center for the Performing Arts. It's a pinnacle performance. Organized by local, private, and government-funded enterprises, the show is being produced and directed by resident Broadway superstar Neil Goldberg and cast with Broward County's very own talent.

"WE" is a Broadway-style show illuminating culture, talent, and diversity with awe-inspiring performances, spectacular theatrics, and stunning visuals. Renowned celebrity artists will be joined on stage by a cast of more than 100 brilliantly-talented South Florida musicians, dancers, poets, choirs, athletes, and creative variety acts celebrating the community we call home.

Back in May, more than 2,100 performing artists of all disciplines came to Goldberg's studio in Pompano Beach. During weeks of intense auditions, Goldberg remarked that what he "had seen was enough to produce the greatest Broadway-style Broward spectacle ever." The multi-national producer was spellbound himself.

A spell was cast, and in June at a media conference at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, the performers were revealed. In telling this story, it always comes back to the talent - Broward's talent, because that is what Duende, the weekend-long celebration of Broward County's 100 years, is all about.

In the final hours of the audition process, the last batch of artists approached the stage and gave it their all to be part of this historic event. For the creative and county team previewing, it became clear how character can be revealed in three minutes or less - Broward County's character.

Nine year-old piano prodigy Brandon Goldberg, dressed in style, emanated humility before he bolted down the notes that left jaws dropped. Says Fushu Daiko's drummer Ben Miller, "Every drum has a story." Fifteen plus drums exploded in dramatic, Japanese form for a 20-minute audition. Fushu Daiko has been a Broward County cultural organization for more than 25 years and it showed; they were professional, confident, and compelling. Fushu Daiko's story is Broward's story.

ultural arts are an important component to every thriving metropolitan economy and that is why the Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce supports its expansion.

held at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts in the Au-Rene Theater. Directed by Cirque Dreams founder and Broadway Director, Neil Goldberg, "WE" is a Broadway show illuminating our culture and talent with awe-inspiring performances.

The Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce has always recognized the need for a well-balanced approach to our live, work, play, and visit economy. Our investors continue to step up and fund \$56 million in renovations for the Broward Center. This includes the new Huizenga Pavilion and the Rose Miniaci Arts Education Center. The payback on these projects will be enormous and will provide further engagement on the Riverwalk.

Esplanade Park will be the site for another amenity should the Fort Lauderdale City Commission approve moving forward with building a new pavilion through a partnership with a foundation called Levitt Pavilions. 

THREE LOCALS SHARE THEIR INSPIRED VISIONS WITH THE CITY THEY LOVE

Laura Brill Elmore has artistic abilities that seem to run in the family. Her mother was an art teacher and her grandmother, a painter. "I've actually been doing art since I was a little girl. I grew up coloring and painting," says the bornand-raised South Floridian. "It's always just been a part of me. I was always really shy, but art gave me a little bit more confidence." Laura recalls being in elementary school and completing art projects, and was even featured in the Miami Herald.

With an artistic skillset and a love of the business world, Elmore pursued a degree at the University of Florida. She was able to combine her love of art and business with a newly developed program for graphic design at the university. "It was the perfect blend of being creative and being business savvy," she says.

Just after graduation, she spent time with an advertising agency and also worked for Stiles. Despite never having taught before, she worked in the Bahamas as an art teacher. She later began

working with nonprofits and realized that she was passionate about giving back. Elmore continues to support nonprofits with her talents by donating graphic design work and creating special paintings.

A glimpse into her portfolio showcases her love of historical art. In fact, she rarely incorporates people in her paintings. "I really just have a connection with capturing places." She has painted many historical locations in Fort Lauderdale, including the Stranahan House, Riverside Inn, and an entire series on Las Olas. Some future projects include working with Birch State Park.

Often painting on location, Elmore becomes deeply focused on her work, and describes it as her therapy. "When you paint, everything else blurs around you." It is a very personal experience for her, and few have actually seen her paint. "My husband has only seen me paint one time, and we've been together for five years." Elmore has only really sold one original piece. "It's so hard to price your art. How do you price yourself?" she says.

In addition to selling prints of her artwork, Elmore works as a graphic designer with her husband at 954 Design. While he handles the web design aspects of the business, she takes care of tasks like creating logos and business cards. The company has clients all over the world, some based in Fort Lauderdale, and others in New York and Japan.

"If anybody has a passion, just get a business card. With technology, all you really need is a website." Elmore continues to create her own opportunities, and encourages others to do the same. "Just put your energy out there, and see what happens."

Christopher Ian Macfarlane

It is 3 a.m.; the world is asleep. Artist Christopher Ian Macfarlane, however, isn't. He is wide-awake creating art with memories of his early days spent in Ocala, FL. He is married and a father of three, so Henry Mancini is being piped in through head phones to keep the night quiet. "Music paints pictures for me," he says, speaking of his inspiration.

The 31-year-old grew up liking *Looney Tunes* for its expressionism. "You can pause it and it's funny at any point," he says. *Looney Tunes* stood in stark contrast to the stoic nature expressed in He-Man or Transformer caricatures of the day, he explains. He believes art should be devoid of the rules that often restrict human mobility, artistically.

"People should be free to create whatever they want. I don't like to feel limited at all." The influence of early slap-stick comedy cartoons has become embedded in his work rendering it unique.

"I am really self-conscious, and I

do really care what other people think about [my art]," Macfarlane says. His current style came from covering up perceived errors in his work because he was very conscientious that someone might find an imperfect piece of artwork he tossed aside.

A good number of people might look at his work and identify it as cubism, a style brought to life by Pablo Picasso. However, the more trained the eye, Macfarlane's style begins to reveal itself as an evolution of cubism.

He does not have a formal art education because he believes that it builds walls to creativity instead of



fostering borderless boundaries. "I often wonder if I didn't sell a piece at my first art show if I would have continued to do [art]. People like it so I just keep making it for them," he says.

"I just didn't want someone else's definition of what a particular genre of art is to limit my creativity." After all, art forms that were first considered wrong or broken are today new branches or genres of creativity.

The saturation and idolization of Wynwood has turned Macfarlane's attention to downtown Fort



Lauderdale. His works can often be seen in FAT Village and at Jump The Shark in Flagler Village. In the General Provision space at the May FAT Village Art Walk, his piece was displayed atop a high wheel bicycle that actually moved and lit up. Additional work was shown during July's art walk.

As he selflessly creates art, he is building a steady following with permanent murals at Makers Square and C&I Studios in FAT Village. He was prompted by his wife's friend to get out and start showing his work.

Macfarlane added another permanent fixture to his portfolio on July 20, creating a mural in the MASS (Music Arts South of Sunrise) Art District in Fort Lauderdale. He says, "It's my home and I want to put it on the map."

Suzanne Barton

Fort Lauderdale photographer Suzanne Barton's "Tiny Dancer Series" takes her photography skills underwater to exhibit just how beautiful movement can be in the absence of gravity. Her pieces are then further brought to life through aluminum printing and resin overlay.

The shortest part of creating a final product is often the shoot itself. This is no different for Barton as she puts nearly 40 hours into each piece.

With new photos ready to go, Barton uses photoshop and other after-effect software to digitally add design and accentuate movements in the water. After multiple steps to ensure the colors of the piece, the final proof is then sent off to the aluminum printing lab for the final product, sizing anywhere between 20x30" to 40x60". These aluminum prints then undergo dye sublimation, a process in which extreme heat and pressure literally make the dye become a part of the aluminum.

Once her final aluminum print arrives, Barton adds the final and most time consuming details of her work. Just as she digitally accentuates movements, she then reinforces these by sprinkling reflective on the aluminum and even a few Swarovski crystals where she sees fit.

Barton explains, "You pour the resin...and in 24 hours it's dry, but you have to worry about anything that falls on it," such as particles floating in the air. This hand-poured resin is sticky and messy, and if done wrong could mean discarding the piece entirely. Barton quickly came up with a solution for this problem, adding a full tent and screen to her studio to block out any possible threats. In 24 hours she has an elegant, eye-popping, aluminum print, with resin overlay to seal the deal.

Currently, a few of Barton's underwater pieces can be seen at Studio 19 Art in Fort Lauderdale, Lenore's Table at the Global Grille, and she is soon to have several in the Hyatt Regency at Pier 66 in Fort Lauderdale. Royal Caribbean recently commissioned her to produce two

art pieces to be displayed on the landing steps of one of the decks of the cruise line's newest ship *Harmony of the Seas.* Additionally, she will be displaying her pieces at the 12th Annual World Aquatic Health Conference this October in Scottsdale, AZ.

"I would rather have [my work] decorate a place where the ambiance is perfect for it, and then if someone wants to buy it, they can buy it," she says. Barton sees her products being somewhere more practical than just galleries.


She is no newbie in the

photography world. Sitting on the board of directors for the AJC Children's Foundation in Honduras, she uses her skill to passionately tell stories of the people she serves through charity. Domestically, Barton has raised \$25,000 for the Broward County Humane Society and \$13,000 for Glam-A-Thon, a Breast Cancer Awareness event. She is also working on the HeARTful Campaign, raising donations for those affected by cancer in our community.

She is optimistic and driven. "I live by the philosophy of what would I do today, if I knew I couldn't fail?"

hether designed to educate, entertain, engage, or anything in between, the arts are an integral part of any community. Funding to support artistic initiatives can be difficult to come by, but groups in Broward County are making strides in achieving success.

In 2014, for the first time ever, four winners of the prestigious Knight Arts Challenge South Florida came from Broward County. Although most winners are traditionally from Miami-Dade, this influx of awardees from Broward reflects a steadily growing local arts scene.

"We've seen a cultural rumbling across the region. With more winners coming from Broward, it encourages others to apply," said Knight Foundation Arts Program Director Bahia Ramos.

Knight Arts Challenge South Florida is a program designed to bring the region together through the arts, infusing over \$2 million into the area in 2014. The challenge represents part of the \$86 million the Knight Foundation has invested in the cultural community since 2006.

The rules for the challenge are simple: 1.) The idea is about the arts. 2.) The project takes place in or benefits South Florida. 3.) You find matching funds. According to Ramos, when considering a potential project to submit, sharing resources with collaborators may generate synergy and increase the quality of a submission. Based on the recent Broward awardees, this type of collaboration is a common theme.

For example, current recipient FAT Village is broadening



its involvement with partners for the Projects Contemporary Art Space. It's working to increase the popular monthly art walks with the \$80,000 received from the Knight Arts Challenge. Currently in the midst of raising matching funds, Projects co-curator Peter Symons sees this as an opportunity to expand engagement with a wide range of both local and international artists, while celebrating what's unique about calling South Florida home. "Where you live informs what you do. I believe the arts are central to defining and giving character to a place," he said.

Another Broward grantee working to celebrate the community through teamwork is dancer Ranjana Warier, who is working in concert with a Miami poet to set traditional Indian dance to the rhythms of Afro-Caribbean poetry. She was awarded \$35,000 and is incorporating a multicultural approach.

Broward College is benefiting from a partnership with the University of Florida, College of Fine Arts and the \$75,000 awarded for the expansion of the Brazilian Music Institute. The funds continue to be used for performances and events through both organizations.

The last on our list of local recipients from 2014 is the Jason Taylor Foundation, spearheaded by the former Dolphins football star and dedicated to programs for South Florida's children in need. The foundation was awarded \$50,000 and has brought a poetry competition to the area.

With all of these alliances being formed between artists, how many Broward-based winners for the Knight Arts Challenge will there be this year? We'll find out in November when the 2015 grantees are announced. A new crop of finalists singled out from over 1,000 submissions are looking to capture the momentum from last year. Among them is Fort Lauderdale-based Las Olas Village, planning on collaborating with a postcard artist from San Francisco to recreate large iconic Florida postcards. Another 2015 hopeful finalist is the Gay Men's Chorus of South Florida, whose proposal includes increasing the visibility of South Florida's LGBT arts scene through joint programming with the Island City Stage Theater and Stonewall National Museum and Archives. The Art and Culture Center of Hollywood is also a Broward finalist this year with a submission to improve arts education communication through new equipment.

No matter who takes away the coveted Knight Arts Challenge Award this year, based on the current winners, collaboration may be the key to gaining a viable edge in this competitive field.

Countless artists rely on funding with a blend of government, corporate, foundation, organization, non-profit, in-kind, and individual support. Although the Knight Foundation is perhaps the single largest funder of arts programs specific to South Florida, other resources exist on the local, regional, state, and national levels. A few agencies include:

Broward County Library System

VARIOUS LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT BROWARD COUNTY • WWW.BROWARD.ORG/LIBRARY With 38 branch locations, covering over one million square feet, the Broward County Library system has more than one million library cardholders who can choose from over three million library materials available to the community. Approximately 10 million guests visit the branches and circulate about nine million items each year. The Main Library and the Fort Lauderdale Reading Center, one of the county's oldest libraries, are both located in the heart of Fort Lauderdale. The library system is also home to the African-American Research Library and Cultural Institution, which houses literary collections of African-American authors, books and artifacts from Africa, the Caribbean, and North and South America, and a 5,000-square-foot art gallery. It is one of only a few specialized libraries in the country.

Girls' Club

The Girls' Club is the only private collection in the world that is both open to the public and dedicated to showcasing contemporary art by women. From paintings and drawings, to photography and video, the exhibitions are usually showcased for about a year. The organization also offers lectures, artist series, and workshops. Created by artist Francie Bishop Good and her husband David Horvitz in 2006, the club is free and open to the public Wednesday through Friday from 1 to 5 p.m.



THE LOVE SHACK

ELMO AND ZOE LOVE HAVE PACKED ALL OF THEIR PASSIONS INTO ONE LAS OLAS STOREFRONT. THE CITY'S FIRST BIKE, ANTIQUE BAR-LOUNGE IS HERE.

lmo and Zoe Love have a different take on running a business. "The normal way has become that one makes up the perfect business plan, with all the numbers, the concept, and the theme. And then they go looking for a location. We almost [did] that backwards," Elmo said.

He and his wife opened up Two& last August with their Las Olas location in mind – plus a few of their favorite things – bikes, art, drinks, and antiques. "The thing about this location was that it was not going to have parking spots no matter what. Parking for cars was going to be a challenge," Elmo said.

This neighborhood bar encourages safe nights out. Elmo urges locals to ride their bikes to and from Two& instead of getting into a car after a few drinks and endangering lives. "We're the way more chill hangout. Our best customers either walk from around the corner or ride their bikes from within a couple of miles."

Patrons can come in for a cold one, scope out the antiques and art for sale on the wall, and get their bikes fixed.

"This is what we do. If you're driving through the middle of nowhere out in the country and you see a sign that says watermelons and truck repair – that's what we are. This is just us doing stuff that we know how to do."

For a time, Zoe made antique selling her business – buying items at auctions and selling them on Ebay. Some of the residual antiques are on display in the back room of Two&.

Elmo's contribution takes up the front of the store. Bike racks parallel the shop's front windows. In the afternoon, people come in to put air in their bike tires at the store's pumping station or to chat with Elmo.

If bikes seem random, they're not. Elmo quit building custom cars in 2006 because of the lack of lucrativeness and started buying bike parts on Ebay. "It stared as a hobby – building the bikes. They were almost like art projects." A couple of stints at local bike shops followed and he picked up the technical side of the trade. He and Zoe are

also cyclists, and no strangers to Critical Mass, the bike group of locals who ride through the city on a monthly basis. Zoe leads an unaffiliated Wednesday night ride called Bicihangeo.

The east side of the store houses Elmo's bike repair tools. The rest of the space is simple, similar to the skeleton that the storefront has had since the 30s. Originally Molly's Teahouse, in 1944 it became Harry's Cocktail Lounge. In the 1950s Gallagher's Bar and Restaurant occupied the space and did so until the 1970s or 80s when an antique shop took over. After leasing the space, Elmo and Zoe didn't do much to the infrastructure. The bar is positioned exactly where it was back in 1944.

At first, the couple went after the former Off the Hookah spot in the Las Olas Riverfront plaza. Elmo says that the concept would have equaled a 13,000 square foot furniture store that always had parties going on. As tempting as that sounded, soon to come establishments on E. Las Olas, like Thursday's and Whiskey Jacks, made the boulevard seem more feasible, even with limited parking. Elmo sees the area as an up-and-coming drinking hotspot.

"We always talked about doing some sort of bar, restaurant, nightclub. Maybe with investors." But, according to Elmo, investors mean hiked-up prices. The bar component yields 75 percent of Two&'s business, but beer and wine solely comprise the menu. He is in the midst of a campaign to fund a \$40,000 liquor license, doing so through a YouTube call to action video.

The plan is to get a license within a few months, and, so as to not stall Two&'s momentum, expand the hangout's offerings.

"It's like grandma's house on a holiday," Elmo said. "If you show up early, it's probably just you and grandma. You hang out for a while, and you talk about what's going on in your life. Later on, more and more crazy relatives show up. It gets busy for a while. And then in the evening, it's kind of just you and grandma again. The bikes, the antiques, the bar - it's like going to a relative's house."

he curtain is about to open at Amaturo Theater for the Gala Performance. The dancers are warmed up, in sync with their partners and themselves. They have spent endless hours preparing to produce an indescribable energy on stage through the art of ballet. On an evening in October 2014, Fort Lauderdale based contemporary ballet dancer Emily Tedesco stands ready to show the crowd what she can do, just as she has her whole career.

"I've been dancing since I can remember," she says. Her entire life has revolved around dance classes, performances, and moving to her next opportunity to further her skill.

Born in upstate New York, Tedesco didn't take long to pursue her dream of becoming a professional dancer. "At 15 I left home...my dad thought my mom was crazy for letting me go."

Barely out of junior high, Tedesco claimed a full merit scholarship and the last spot in the dorms at the American School of Ballet, the official school for the New York City Ballet. "If you're going to [dance] seriously, that's the time to start seriously training, in your teens." Three years at the American School prepared Tedesco for the next decade of her life, which would consist of her dancing education, traveling across the country, and dancing for some of the most influential choreographers and dance companies of

Finishing her education around the age of 18, she began her first job a year later, learning with the San Francisco Ballet Company for a full year. She then spent the next decade traveling, learning, and performing with the Boston Ballet II, Oregon Ballet Theatre, Nevada Ballet Theatre, and Wideman/Davis Dance Company before moving to Fort Lauderdale four years ago. She is now with the Florida Grand Ballet.





Tedesco says that one of her most memorable performances was during her time at the Nevada Ballet Theatre in Las Vegas. Her choreographer created a *Pas De Deux* or dance for two, unlike any piece she had done before. "It allowed me to trust my natural movement rather than [be] in this box of ballet technique."

From then on Tedesco says her path in ballet began to change, focusing more on contemporary styles of ballet rather than the traditional ballet she had danced for so many years.

Presently, Fort Lauderdale is Tedesco's hub, allowing her to travel in multiple directions and still not be too far away. "Quite honestly I have close to 12 hour days," she says. Tedesco lets out a small laugh as she sits in our 7:30 p.m.







interview. "For instance I left my house around 9:30 this morning."

During her season with Florida Grand Ballet, she starts her days in Miami at 10:30 a.m. to practice until about 3 p.m. From Miami she leaves to go to one of three dance programs - the Sunghee Ballet Academy, Muse Center for the Arts, and Vladimir Issaev's School of Classical Ballet - to teach young and aspiring dancers. She enjoys teaching her students, ages eight all the way to pre-professional. "For me that's fun – helping to pass on everything I've gathered. Right now I like having the balance of dancing and teaching and choreographing."

Though she has made the conscious decision to step back from the intense lifestyle of professional dance, she is sure it is only temporary. Tedesco is excited to be a part of a new company here in Fort Lauderdale through a network of other dancers in the Florida Grand Ballet. They performed for the very first time together last October, debuting their company at the Gala Performance at Broward Center for the Performing Arts. The company has six permanent members and three or four guest artists at any time.

"It's not your usual intense company. We're a hard working group of people [and] we all understand each other." She enjoys the tight knit group and looks forward to more performances to come.



Eats From the Street

bright and bold Temple Street Eatery storefront stands out on the bustling Federal Highway in downtown Fort Lauderdale. Opened in August 2014, Temple Street Eatery has quickly earned its reputation as an authentic local neighborhood dumpling and noodle bar. "Our goal when we opened this restaurant was to bring new and authentic Southeast Asian street food flavors to Fort Lauderdale's palate," says co-owner Alex Kuk.

Kuk is a native Floridian, while co-owner Diego Ng grew up in Venezuela. The two met while enrolled in the hospitality program at Florida International University and kept in touch before deciding to go into business together.

Inspired by their Asian heritage and international travels, Temple Street Eatery was born. "The name is an ode to a street in Hong Kong with a lot of history. Today it's a night market," Ng says.

Since opening last year the restaurant has grown beyond the duo's expectations. "We are very happy that people are enjoying what we're doing," says Kuk.

The menu incorporates flavors from Chinese, Vietnamese, Latin, and American cuisines. With every dish comes a thoughtful influence of traditional Asian ingredients. "Our wonton soup [is the same as] on the streets of Hong Kong. Our rice is the same [as] you would find in Vietnam. Our miso soup could be found in Japan,"



∧ BULGOGI RICE BOWL RECIPE

Yields two servings

Ingredients:

5oz cooked rice (white or brown, short grain recommended) 1lb ribeye, par freeze to slice into thin strips 1/2 bunch scallion, cut to 1" strips 1/2 white onion, julienned 1 carrot, julienned

Bugolgi sauce:

5 oz soy sauce

1 oz sesame oil

1 oz sugar

1 oz raw white onion

1 oz raw garlic

Process:

AK: A comedian, I think.

DN: I would love to work for the best soccer team in the world, which is Manchester United. Most likely as a personal trainer or a physical therapist.

Ng says. Many of the ingredients are sourced locally, while others, including ramen and soba noodles, come from Japan and California.

The most popular dish at the restaurant is the Bulgogi Rice Bowl (\$12) made with marinated beef, sautéed with onions, carrots, scallion, and shoga. For those looking for a hearty meal, try the Bibimbap Rice Bowl (\$10) with rice, mushrooms, pickled vegetables, scallion, marinated bean sprouts, fried eggs, and gochujang sauce. What about something truly unique? Order the Katsu Burger (\$9), which is a panko-crusted burger served with Asian slaw and a pineapple slice. Daily specials are offered, which





Hal's father valued hard work for his kids. Hal had learned the fooddislodging technique as a summer busboy at their country club.


But even after the kernel popped out, the man was still red-faced; breathless. "His heart's bad," said his tearful wife.
