





Riverwalk Rededicated

Downtown's Linear Park Honored as Iconic Public Space

Riverwalk linear park will join the ranks of iconic public spaces across the nation to be rededicated in September. This follows Riverwalk's selection as one of three Florida sites to be honored under the National ASLA initiative: "Celebrating Our Landscape Heritage Through Stewardship."

The American Society of Landscape Architects partnered with EDSA in choosing Riverwalk as a key site of historical, cultural, and environmental significance. The park set off a flurry of urban development in Downtown Fort Lauderdale with its conception in 1994. For the first time, all segments of Downtown were connected, allowing businesses to flourish and community members to safely move along the scenic New River. Riverwalk provided the recreational spaces to encourage adults and children alike

to get out and about. Ever since, the park has remained an essential part of the preservation of Fort Lauderdale's unique waterways and the community's continued growth.

Fort Lauderdale's very own medallion site was selected with Ravine State Gardens in Palatka and the Chain of Parks in Tallahassee by the Florida chapter of ASLA. Created by New Deal programs during the Great Depression, Ravine State Gardens represents the connection between landscape architecture and economic recovery. It has even been cited as "the nation's outstanding CWA project." The Chain of Parks, located in Tallahassee's historical downtown region, hosts a prestigious arts festival fostering cultural development every year. All three sites highlight the way in which landscape architects improve our quality of life and physical health.

The rededication of Riverwalk will kick off on Monday, Sept. 10, at 6 p.m. with opening remarks by John P. "Jack" Seiler. Several other honored guests will attend the ceremony, including State of Florida representatives Perry Thurston and George Moraitis. Festivities will also include the planting of a live oak tree in Esplanade Park. All are welcome to attend.

Unsung Heroes

Get to Know Your Security Guards

You may recall reading about food deliverers in April; this month I checked in with another group of unsung heroes

— Downtown's security guards. They're not just a badge that eyeballs you when you enter a building — they wear many hats and go above and beyond their job descriptions. So here's a chance to get to know two familiar faces in our office community ...

Michael Miller is a security guard for Admiral Security who works at The Plaza at Las Olas, the headquarters for Stiles Corporation. Born in London, Mr. Miller grew up in Jamaica.

Chris Wren: What is a memorable anecdote from your job?

Michael Miller: I ride my bicycle to work and last year it needed repairs. Last Christmas, Stiles sent out an email to its employees explaining, 'Michael is having trouble with his bike.' Then at the Christmas party they presented me with a brand new bike — they had all pitched in to buy it for me.

CW: What do you like best about your job?

MM: The thing I like most about my job is the honor of working at Stiles. Mr. Stiles and the employees are all a pleasure to work with every day. I meet many people daily from all backgrounds — celebrities, business leaders, office workers. It is very stimulating. If someone looks lost, I will approach them and help, if possible. It is all about going the extra mile.

John Lombardi is a security officer from the Bronx, N.Y. He has 10 years of experience working at various buildings and currently works for Admiral Security at 200 Las Olas, headquarters for AutoNation.

CW: What is a memorable anecdote of your job?

JL: Coming to work at my former building the day Hurricane Wilma hit and being stuck there for three days. We had no water or lights for two days. The cooling tower pipe had broken loose, causing a major leak in the garage and no one knew what to do, so I took control and called the contractor out.

CW: What do you like most about your job? JL: Meeting people from all walks of life, from sports stars to the governor of Florida. I work with a nice group of people and coming to work is a pleasure. The people know that I am always there for them — that's why I love being a security officer.


PARK(ing) Day

In June, we saw what can happen to a city block when community activists get creative. In that same spirit of doit-yourself planning, the folks that brought us **Better Block** will be staging **Fort Lauderdale's Second Annual PARK(ing) Day** on Sept. 21. This is a national phenomenon that encourages reclaiming parking spots for a day to turn them into mini public parks.

There will be two locations with an interactive component that encourages visitors to bike/walk/travel between them and inform visitors about the proposed Wave Streetcar route. This is the work of Cadence, Florida Atlantic University School of Urban and Regional Planning, UrbanMatters CoLab, FAU School of Architecture, and the Broward Chapter of American Planning Association. Cadence is a full service landscape architecture and site planning firm based in Downtown. They focus on projects that reimagine the way South Floridians experience their living environments and are currently working on The Dan Marino Foundation campus.

Hot Dogs, Bagels and Sustainable Seafood

Talking Snack with Chef Allen Susser, the 'Ambassador of Flavor' of Flavors of Fort Lauderdale

f you haven't noticed that Fort Lauderdale is currently in the midst of a major gastronomic revolution, then you must either live underneath a giant deposit of pink Himalayan rock salt, or you're one of those folks who merely eats to stay alive (oh, how I pity thee). With new concept restaurants popping up left and right, small-scale farmers' markets making a dent in the bottom lines of chain mega-grocers and gourmet specialty shops beginning to become more commonplace along Las Olas Boulevard than bridal boutiques and art galleries, it's pretty clear that the citizens of The Venice of America are demanding higher-quality fare from local eateries and some brave people are even becoming bold and empowered in their kitchens at home.

With pristine waters full of fish, a bounty of tropical fruits that 48 out of the 49 other states are exceedingly jealous over and a gang of extremely educated chefs leading the charge, South Florida has all the necessary ingredients to be a recognized powerhouse of deliciousness. And now it's official: This November will mark our fair city's culinary coming-out party, when the inaugural Flavors of Fort Lauderdale event hits the town.

This four-day festival for food fanatics will showcase all the wonderful aspects of what makes South Florida's cuisine one of the most vibrant in the world. With an emphasis on sustainable seafood and our region's most talented culinarians, Flavors is set to usher in a new generation of food appreciation here in the Sunshine State.

Leading the battalion of chefs is none other than the godfather of Floridian fare himself, Chef Allen Susser. There are almost too many great things to say about Chef Allen, from the creations he's served up at his namesake Aventura eatery, Chef Allen's Modern Seafood Grill, for more than 25 years, to his James Beard awards and his unyielding pursuit of teaching the world about sustainable seafood; this is a man who was put on Earth to cook otherworldly food and to spread the all-important message that our ecosystems are fragile and must be treated with the utmost care.

For these reasons (and many more), Chef Allen has been dubbed the honorary "Ambassador of Flavor" for Flavors of Fort Lauderdale. I recently caught up with him via telephone to find out some of his favorite things to cook and eat, where he likes to shop for ingredients and how a former Brooklynite like himself prefers his bagels. Read on for a taste of what a legendary chef stuffs his face with, as well as some inside info on Flavors and what it means to have such a prestigious role at Fort Lauderdale's first-ever major food showcase.

Erik Mathes: Chef Allen, it's an honor and a pleasure to be speaking with you this morning. May I ask: what does a celebrity chef like yourself typically eat for breakfast?

Chef Allen: (laughs) Thanks! I'm actually an egg white guy, myself. I toast up some cumin and fennel seeds and add a touch of crushed red pepper.

EM: Wow, that sounds pretty awesome. If you had the choice, knife and fork or hands?

CA: You know, if I had to choose, I really enjoy the casual nature and comfort of using my hands to eat. I mean, of course there are exceptions! But, hands is my final answer.

EM: Next: Describe your ideal burger. CA: Oh, definitely a blend of beef brisket, short rib, chuck — cooked on a griddle so the outside gets a nice crust while the inside stays soft and medium-rare. Then, I'd top it with onions grilled in truffle butter and good sharp cheddar.

EM: Now let's get to the serious stuff. You're the Ambassador of Flavor for the first-ever Flavors of Fort Lauderdale. How do you plan on putting your stamp on the inaugural event?

CA: By emphasizing the whole sustainable seafood movement. We live in an area where

we have unbelievable natural Above Chef Allen resources, from the fish swimming in the waters off our coastline, to the fruits that grow in our backyards in this tropical climate. When it comes to seafood, you can't just expect species of fish to replenish themselves if they're being overfished. People need to understand that some types of fish have different gestation periods and that means it's essential to pay proper attention to how much of each type is taken from the sea at a given time.

A perfect example is Florida stone crabs. Fishermen will remove one claw and toss 🖒

the rest of the crab back into the sea. Then, the crabs naturally regenerate the claw that was cut off and the whole process can continue without disrupting the stone crab population at large. It's really an unbelievable thing.

EM: So, what are some of your favorite specialty shops in the Fort Lauderdale area?

CA: I spend most of my time south of Fort Lauderdale near where I live and work, so I love places like Mimi's Ravioli, Norman Brothers Produce and Delaware Chicken Farm and Seafood for fresh specialty meats. In Fort Lauderdale, I love Gran Forno Bakery.

EM: Gran Forno really does make the best bread, but I'll have to check out those other places you mentioned. How about your favorite Lauderdale-area restaurants?

Other than Chef Allen's, of course.

CA: (laughs) Well, Oliver Saucy over at Cafe Maxx in Pompano Beach] is incredible and I love what Dean Max is doing over at 3030

EM: Getting back to Flavors of Fort Lauderdale for a second, what impact would you like the event to have on the community at large?

CA: I really want to spread the message about sustainable seafood to the masses, as well as show people that South Florida really is a major global culinary destination.

We have some of the best seafood in the world here, great chefs and an attitude and style that makes it truly

EM: Great answer. And now back to the food questions. What would be your last meal?

CA: (laughs) Great question. (Pauses to think). Probably a hot dog.

EM: (laughs incredulously) A hot dog?! Are you serious?

CA: Yeah, a Nathan's hot dog. But, then, of course, I'd have to get an order of those greasy fries to go along with it.

EM: I was gonna say, you really can't have one without the other. So, after you enjoy that last meal of a Nathan's hot dog and fries, what would be your last words?

CA: You know, I'd probably say, "It was all worth it."

EM: I really couldn't ask for a better line to end this interview. Thank you Chef Allen for being such a great sport and I and the rest of South Florida look forward to seeing you at Flavors of Fort Lauderdale this November. @

Ground-Breaking Makeover

Broward Center for the Performing Arts Starts Renovations This Month

he Broward Center for
the Performing Arts
will break ground on
its much-anticipated
expansion project on Sept.
20. This will launch the
beginning of a \$44 million
renovation project, designed to bring
upgrades to the center's theaters as well as a
brand new arts education center.

The expansion is part of an arts and culture boom occurring across South Florida. Fort Lauderdale's **Museum of Discovery and Science** opened the doors to its new **EcoDiscovery** Center in


November, while early 2012 brought the arrival of the new Young at Arts Children's Museum in Davie and the Arts Garage in Delray. The Broward Center expansion will keep the ball rolling by launching "the next era of arts and entertainment."

The Broward Center is ranked in the top 10 of theaters nationwide (according to an analysis of ticket sales on Pollstar). It consistently draws more than 700,000 visitors each year due to CEO and President Kelley Shanley's commitment to the patron experience. He planned this expansion to ensure the center remains a leader in national theater by "offering things to

patrons of the Broward Center that they may have found enjoyable in other venues, incorporated in a way that fits with the theater experience."

While most aspects of the renovation won't be unveiled for 18 to 24 months, patrons will be able to enjoy the center's new Club Level for the Fall 2012 season. The Club Level offers what Shanley calls a "completely predictable premium experience." Club members will receive complimentary valet parking upon arrival and tempting hors d'oeuvres and an open bar in the Club Level Lounge. Ushers will bring them to their personal, plush,





The exclusive lounge, located on the mezzanine level, will be open 60 minutes prior to curtain, throughout the performance, and 45 minutes after the show. It encourages patrons to make their night at the theater more of a "night on the town," allowing members to socialize, eat, drink, and mingle. This is part of the center's plan to develop a market for corporate purchases, "to really create a special evening out and a unique kind of theater experience."

The lounge is designed to have a clear view of the stage as well as windows facing Riverwalk Park, for another goal of the expansion is to better link the Broward Center with the Riverwalk promenade.

Shanley believes the renovations are "really capitalizing on the unique area in which the Broward Center is situated" at the heart of downtown Fort Lauderdale. He hopes it will reignite the "gravitational pull" not only toward the theater, but toward Riverwalk and all Himmarshee District and Las Olas businesses, something that has been a part of the center's mission since its conception.

Tickets are available now for the opera, ballet and Broadway series. About 70 seats are available at a variety of different price levels. Contact the Premium Sales and Services Manager at clublevel@ browardcenter.org or call (954) 468-3287 to purchase.



Glam-A-Thon and Broward Health Foundation Helps Local Patients

hroughout my whole adult life I've had a job and health insurance," said Donna V., 57. Then, like many in this economy, she lost her job

— and those all-important benefits — in July 2011.

She continues to see her reconstructive surgeon and just finished her second **chemotherapy** treatment out of six. She has started working again, in administration and marketing at an outpatient treatment program.

This year, 100 local women will be helped through a partnership between Broward Health Foundation and Glam-A-Thon. This is the first year that the partnership helps local breast cancer patients with all sorts of services, including medications, mammograms, surgery, wigs and even day care for their children while undergoing treatment.

So far, Broward Health Foundation has spent half of the \$100,000 donated by Glam-A-Thon, said Traci Allyn Shur, director of major gifts for Broward Health Foundation. Fort Lauderdale women have received medi-bras, a specially designed bra for a woman to wear after she has had a mastectomy (and which often is not covered by insurance). The foundation has paid for taxi service for a woman who does not have

a car to get to medical treatment and back. "That was a huge thing we did," Shur said. And they have paid for an electric bill so a woman has air conditioning.

"How do you live through chemo treatment and have no air conditioning?" Shur asks. "That, to me, is a crisis. That is what the Glam-a-Thon fund is for: to help women in crisis."

In short, Broward Health Foundation and Glam-A-Thon have helped the uninsured and underinsured with lots of things, no matter how small, which simply make a patient's life a bit easier.

"Those are the key things we're doing because they had nowhere else to go," Shur said. "We are happy to help as many woman as we could with that \$100,000."

Even a woman who shows she has an emergent need — perhaps health insurance will kick in down the road, but not just yet— will get helped. "We're not going to make them wait. We're going to take care of them," Shur said.

Tammy Gail, founder of Glam-A-Thon, agrees. "There's always a need and it doesn't matter how great or how small. That's really an important focus for me."

Glam-A-Thon proceeds help patients through the Lillian S. Wells Women's Center at Broward General Medical Center and the Lisa Boccard Fund at Coral Springs Medical

Center. Representatives from the centers and Broward Health's patient advocates, called patient navigators, meet regularly with Shur to identify who can benefit from the Glam-A-Thon funds.

"This is a group with **soul**," Shur said. "It's about the person. We're trying to treat the whole person here. It's been a tremendous partnership. It has been a wonderful relationship."

Donna V. knows how important the locally-raised funds are, and that's why Shur recommended we talk to Donna.

Shur added: "We saved her life. How do you quantify that?" (1)

D'Angelo Pizza, Wine Bar and Tapas

Helping Fort Lauderdale Live Up to Its Nickname

If Fort Lauderdale is to be officially considered the Venice of America, then it makes sense that there would be Italian eateries here that are on par with what you'd experience across the Atlantic.

After one fruitless search after another, I can finally say I've found such a spot in Laudy, where you'll walk inside and not remember what nation you started your day in by the time you step out. With rustic, thin-crust pizza, artisanal cold cuts and cheese, calzones, calamari and ceviche reminiscent of classic

Old Country cuisine at its finest, D'Angelo Pizza • Wine Bar • Tapas will transport your taste buds to a land where gastronomic greatness stems from keeping things simple and elegant.

The brainchild of Angelo Elia, owner and executive chef of South Florida staple Casa D'Angelo, this place is like a modern hangout in Milan, with an ample array of vino (housed in a glass-encased wine room), clean black, white and cream-colored decor, and an attentive staff that makes every guest feel like famiglia. From the puffy bread topped with thin slices of prosciutto di parma and shaved parmigiano, to flavor-packed homestyle



plates of imported sausage with escarole and beans, D'Angelo Pizza · Wine Bar · Tapas has something for everyone — not to mention delectable gelato, cannolis, and creative desserts like the Nutella-slathered Gigi Pizza.

Start your meal with a bowl of pasta fagioli, smoky, thick and chock full of ditalini and cannellini beans; then, sink your teeth





into four different varieties of bruschetta — sun-dried tomato pesto, smoked salmon and cream cheese, prosciutto with marinated eggplant and chopped tomato and mozzarella — for a fabulous fix of **finger food**. After that, treat yourself to a portion of paper-thin beef carpaccio with truffle oil and arugula before making way for D'Angelo's signature dish: Crispy fontina polenta with reggiano and roasted porcini.

Polenta is a cake made from cornmeal, so it possesses a subtle sweetness that is an ideal complement to savory wild mushrooms and sharp cheese. The polenta itself is seasoned with rosemary, garlic and a little basil pesto, before being topped with a trifecta of funghi (shiitake, cremini and porcini) and shavings of reggiano. It is served with a small green salad

with tomato, and garnished with sprigs of fresh herbs for an extra splash of color and aroma. A dish like this will instantly take you back to that trip you took to Tuscany years ago, or give you a sample of what awaits you abroad if you've never traveled beyond our shores.


