





Building on Pride and Stimulating Progress

A new arts program will soon unfold in Broward County. In November, the Community Foundation of Broward will launch the **Art of Community Challenge**, with an aim to improve collaboration among the richly diverse residents of Broward County.

With a population of 1.7 million people, Broward is larger than 13 states. Over the years this has caused a natural isolation in its various populations, resulting in a limited spectrum in the sharing of ideas and cooperation on making a **collective impact** to tackle big community challenges.

To help bridge and bond communities, the Community Foundation of Broward seeks to invest \$2.5 million in bold, unique projects over the next five years that integrate the arts in addressing issues of public concern.

Since 1984, the Community Foundation of Broward has provided leadership on community solutions and fostered philanthropy that connects people who care, with causes that matter. Working behind the scenes, founders Libby and Jack Deinhardt guided the foundation through the years into a catalyzing force in creating a future for all in **Broward County** by addressing the community's critical and persistent

challenges, while

aiming to unite people, institutions and resources, and producing significant results.

The Art of Community Challenge will work to increase the use of arts to improve residents' connections to each other and to their community. Recognizing the arts as a strong catalyst in bridge-building between diverse cultural groups is the heart of this initiative. A vibrant arts community is essential to ensure that Broward continues to grow and flourish.

Artists will need to do the following in partnership with a nonprofit or for-profit organization:

- identify an important community issue that moves and motivates you;
- create a collaboration of at least three organizations/agencies (from different disciplines or sectors) that care about the issue as you do and can help create change;
- excite and engage community residents; and
- design a cool, innovative project that will make a difference on the issue.

Injecting creative solutions and collaborative enterprise into the heart of a growing society will elevate its **vibrancy**, connect its constituents and harness civic pride through developing aesthetic projects. A united community will forge ahead through economic hardship and build on resident **pride** in order to stimulate solutions.







t First Baptist Church,
Christmas really does begin in July.

That's when auditions begin for the long-running Fort Lauderdale Christmas Pageant, produced by First Baptist Church. It's no easy task to put on a much loved fully staged holiday show, complete with a cast of 700, three camels, flying angels and the occasional celebrity singer.

For 27 years, First Baptist has produced an annual Christmas pageant, and each year, it has grown bigger and more elaborate. This year's pageant, the 28th, will welcome singer Wayne Newton opening night.

Thus, pageant plans begin in the summer. "It's pretty much a year-round thing for us," said Mike Jeffries, minister of creative technologies/global missions at First Baptist Church in Downtown Fort Lauderdale. "It has grown, especially with the introduction of Jeff Crevier as our creative director."

The Christmas Pageant features a festive opening scene with holiday carols in a turn-of-the-century setting, a concert of Christmas favorites and a second act retelling the life story of Jesus with music and drama, complete with live camels and flying angels. Forty percent of the show is new each year, with new songs and new dances.

"Someone who comes every year will see something new," Jeffries said. "It's a holiday **tradition** for so many families."

The pageant started at War Memorial Auditorium in 1984, and church member Sandy Casteel served as show coordinator. Only two performances were presented that year.

n 1990, today's First Baptist sanctuary was designed and built with the Christmas Pageant in mind, including extra wide aisles and extra high doors (for the camels to maneuver through), hidden passageways for cast and crew and large storage areas, Jeffries said.

This year, **Wayne Newton** will perform during the pageant on opening night, Nov. 25. In years past, **Johnny Cash** and **John Tesh** have made guest appearances.

"We're excited to have him be a part of the night," Jeffries said. Newton will sing favorites during a mini concert within the show.

The pageant is produced by **Dr. Larry Thompson**, Senior Pastor, who was a

drama major in college and is very involved; the Rev. John Jones, pageant musical director, administrative pastor and minister of music, who develops and selects the choir and orchestra music; the Rev. Jeff Crevier, creative director, in charge of the music, dance and drama elements; and Christye Crevier, choreographer and costume development.

In addition to the expected 45,000 visitors to the show this year during 18 performances, **PBS** stations broadcast the pageant nationwide and DVDs are sent to every U.S. Navy ship. NBC showed the pageant nationally on Christmas Eve in 1993.

While 700 cast members show up **onstage**, another 500 work **behind the scenes**, from makeup artists to greeters to snack preparers.

Those on stage include a 250-member chancel choir and orchestra, who perform in the middle section of the pageant. If someone has a part on stage, he or she is a church member, Jeffries said. A few support personnel are hired, such as for lighting, rigging and the animals.

This year, 28 animals will be a part of the show, including

horses, a donkey, goats, chickens, rabbits and of course, the camels that the wise men ride in on. "Every kind of animal you'd find in a **Biblical backyard**," Jeffries said.

hree camels appear on stage and an extra is on hand in case one has unexpected stage fright or other issues. The production used to hire camels from a circus but a few years ago, creative director Crevier happened to see camels in a field in Davie. So now the camels are locals, too. "Just like the rest of the cast, they get to go home" every night, Jeffries said.

ven with 18 performances attended by 45,000 people with tickets ranging from \$13 to \$50 apiece, the show just breaks even. "You'd be amazed to learn how much it costs to have camels."

Among this year's attendees will be the pageant's 1 millionth visitor.

Sandy Casteel has been involved with all 28 years, beginning with the heady job of coordinator the very first year and for years afterward. While others executed the dancing, singing and choreography, Casteel supervised everything else, from costumes to feeding the crew. After 22 years of volunteering in that position, she stepped down to let a paid person take over.

This year, she oversees all of the costumes in the big **Broadway-style** opening number — still, no small task, considering she and her team of seamstresses outfit 300 singers and dancers.

This year, the flying angels will appear to fly willy nilly over the stage and audience, instead of flitting on predetermined routes as in past years.

"This is 28 years in the making. It has been so much fun to see it evolve and share the real Christmas story," Casteel said. (1)



CHRISTMAS

A Look at Past Holiday Celebrations

oliday **celebrations** here really haven't changed in the last 100 or so years.

Gatherings with family and trips to the beach accentuate our Thanksgivings, Christmases and Hanukkahs just as they did back in 1918.

According to the Sun Sentinel on Dec. 27, 1918, "Christmas Day was bright and warm and our people enjoyed the day at outdoor sports, automobiling, boating and bathing and to many of our winter visitors, surfbathing at Christmastime was a novelty, but that fact didn't prevent them from enjoying part of the day in the ocean."

Helen Landers, Broward County Historian, Broward County Libraries Division, Historical Commission, kindly shared a stack of written local memories with me. The commission has gathered the historical notes and newspaper clippings over the

years to share whenever they host holiday events.

One of those notes early holiday remembrances by Fort Lauderdale matriarch Ivy Stranahan. In a 1970 interview, she recounted her first Christmas party in Fort Lauderdale, in 1900.

"Those were the years before commercialism. We didn't even give presents or decorate much. What counted was that we could get together. Sometimes people walked from as far away as Davie. Everyone had to stay all night because of the wilderness and the Indians."

tranahan was 89 at the time of the interview. She had been Fort Lauderdale's first school teacher, moving here to fill that job in 1899 and marrying Frank Stranahan in 1900. They built the Stranahan House in 1904. hile the Stranahan House today becomes bedecked and bow tied during the holidays, no artificial trimmings graced the residence back then. "We didn't have trees for the first five or 10 years but we decorated with palms, vines and smilax. There were loads of them and we didn't have to use anything else.

"There was no such thing as a New Year's celebration. We just had the one party before Christmas. It was too hard for everyone to come together from so far away. "Today people are so wrapped up in writing cards and buying presents that they are completely overcome by the time Christmas gets here. We didn't worry about commercialism until the 1920s and it was wonderful. There was a real interest in the people themselves."
