Activation Success!

On July 27, Esplanade Park was invaded with 15 of Miami's **Gourmet Food Trucks** arranged and coordinated by none other than the Burger Beast.

With food trucks being the latest trend across the country, Riverwalk Trust decided in June to bring this culinary movement to the City of Fort Lauderdale. Event Chair Jason Crush and committee members Renée Quinn and Bradley Deckelbaum went to work with our staff. With only four weeks to promote the event, our goal was to activate the Riverwalk with a unique dining experience, an introduction to the trucks and get the public into Downtown on the Riverwalk.

The original recommendation by Burger Beast was for 15 of the most sought after trucks, including CheeseMe Mobile, The Fish Box, Nacho Mama's Mexican Grill, Ms. Cheezious, Sugar Rush, Latin Burger, Sugar Yummy Mama, Slow Food Truck, Big Kahuna, The Rolling Stove and Dim Ssam a Go Go.

The event was marketed through Facebook and other social media. A few days before the event, Riverwalk Trust's Facebook page indicated that about 1,000 people said they were going to attend the event and about 500 said maybe with another thousand tagged through the Miami Food Truck site. Much to our surprise, almost 3,000 people showed up for the event, making it one of the largest events in Esplanade Park.

"It was one of our most profitable nights ever," said Troy Thomas, owner of The Rolling Stove, one of the original food trucks. "We actually ran out of food 20 minutes before the event ended — a first in our history!"

The overwhelming response even benefited the restaurants on Second Street with the huge overflow of people the event generated. The evening was a win-win for all involved. Special thanks to our sponsors Crush Law, Stephens Distributing, America's Backyard and Archways. Watch for more Gourmet in the Park events in the future. In spite of the blazing heat, activation was accomplished for sure!

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
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Riverwalk Activities

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

What's Our Identity?


Many years ago, ranchers began marking their livestock with a scalding iron rod to differentiate which animal belonged to whom.

Rhythms of Africa

Lessons in Life

After performing successfully with Grammy-nominated reggae all stars **Third World** for 23 years, **Willie Stewart's** desire to work with children and give back to the **community**, coupled with his expertise in the world of percussion instruments, stirred a desire to help heal the world.

In November 2010, Stewart received a \$25,000 grant from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation to produce a second presentation of the artistic, educational and inspiring Rhythms of Africa – Music Around the World. The first concert, held in Miramar in 2009, transfixed a sold-out audience and the press with a unified performance of exceptional caliber. Sixty boys and girls ages 13 to 16 and the local and international musicians who traveled to Miramar to honor them, commanded the audience that night.

The level of excitement and the sold out cultural center stamped this free event of music, culture and education a creative and groundbreaking odyssey. The performance combined a power-packed lecture with theatrical interpretations and a concert that took the audience on a **magical journey** to Africa, Brazil, Jamaica, Cuba, Trinidad and the United States.

Rhythms of Africa introduces its audience to a historical, geographical and musical litany through **percussion** and the enchanted sounds of children realizing a dream, while playing music from **Nigeria**, the Ivory Coast, Tanzania and Morocco.

With the honorable support of the Knight Foundation, Rhythms of Africa has now found national acclaim and increased expectations. On Oct. 15, students from Lauderhill Lakes Educational Complex, Smart School Charter Middle and Eagle Charter Academy and their guest

professional musicians will lead the audience in two free performances, at 2 and 7 p.m. at **The Parker Playhouse** in Fort Lauderdale. "These remarkable percussion sessions with children unite musicians, families and entire communities," said Broward County Commissioner Dale Holness.

Eighty boys and girls will train this fall for six weeks to prepare for the musical presentation. For many, it is a dream beyond their wildest imaginations; most have never interacted with a musical instrument and many have not dared to envision themselves on a stage. This experience is designed to help them prepare for the world and believe that goals are possible. "It's meant to be a life-building and career-guiding experience," Stewart said.

"It was absolutely magical to watch Willie Stewart engage a room filled with more than 100 rambunctious teenagers and completely engage them," said James Eubanks, vice president of marketing and community relations at the Lauderhill Lakes Educational Complex. "Under his high-energy instruction our students were making music within minutes. Children have a natural need to express themselves; it's our job as educators to find constructive activities that will allow them to do just that."

Ticketing information will be available in September.



Fort Lauderdale's Cultural Scene

A Key Driver for Our Economy

Little did **Frank Stranahan** know when he opened Fort Lauderdale's first trading post on the northern banks of the **New River** more than 100 years ago that it would become the vibrant and dynamic destination it is today.

The visionary leaders who came together in the 1980s to create the **Arts & Entertainment District** along the Riverfront did so with the confidence that arts and culture would be a **catalyst** for sustainable economic **growth**, and their vision became a reality. Looking collectively at how we chart a course for future growth, what can we expect from the **arts**?

We all know that the arts entertain and inspire us. But the role of the arts goes well beyond the thrill of a live performance or the fun of a museum visit. The arts generate significant dollars that stimulate our economy. The Broward Center for the Performing Arts contributes more than \$90 million annually to the local economy — equivalent to the financial impact of a Super Bowl on Broward County every year.

You see the economic influence of the arts when you visit the Riverwalk for the SunTrust Jazz Brunch, take a walk down Las Olas during the Las Olas Art Fair, or try to get a table for lunch on Himmarshee Boulevard when there is a Broadway matinee in town. This is the result of our arts organizations proactively working together whose success is shared by the community at large.

Who is driving this activity? People of all ages and affinities – students and seniors, families and singles, workers and retirees, residents and tourists. In addition to the mil-

lions who attend cultural events, thousands more work in the cultural industries and the impact is considerable. Consider the cast and crew of a long-running tour of "Wicked" at the Broward Center, or the construction teams helping to build a new addition on the Museum of Discovery and Science. The ripple effect of all of this activity translates into an impact that is not often visible – but is significant.

Audience Spending

Arts patrons frequently dine out, purchase drinks, snacks or souvenirs, take a taxi or park

a car and hire a babysitter. A recent Americans for the Arts survey found that the average arts patron in Broward County spent \$25.64 in addition to the price of the ticket. The impact is considerable: 700,000 people — three times the population of the city of Fort Lauderdale — attend Broward Center events each year.

Cultural Tourism

Broward Center leads the Riverwalk Arts & Entertainment Consortium, which markets the cultural activities of the destination collaboratively. Together we have demonstrated that the whole is greater than the sum of its parts, leveraging shared marketing dollars for effective results. More than a million ticketed visitors attend events in the District each year, with at least 12 percent coming from outside the tri-county area. Research shows that these "cultural tourists" spend at least 20 percent more than residents. They stay in hotels, rent cars, dine out and visit shops and boutiques.


Creative Economy

and young, talented professionals. Their decisions on where to locate their headquarters or build their careers are increasingly driven by quality of life and the availability of cultural amenities.

Civic Engagement

Last year, 1,400 volunteers donated in excess of 100,000 hours to the Broward Center. The contributions of volunteers and docents to the cultural scene keep many non-profits doors open and these residents become some of the most ardent ambassadors for our community.

The Arts Mean Business

Area businesses have clearly recognized that the arts mean business. Many of our local companies — large and small — are long-time **supporters** of the arts. They know that it is good corporate citizenship, but they also value the return they get on their investments when they support the arts. Lori Chevy, president of Bank of America's Broward County market, shares the belief that communities thrive when economic. social and environmental factors combine. She sees support for the arts as essential to Broward County's future as a place of culture, economic opportunity and vitality.

As a new season launches with exciting cultural programs, keep in mind that whether you are watching a film, taking in a show, visiting a museum, attending a class or taking a tour, you are also helping to make our economy **strong**.



Shares Oregon's Pinot Noir Story at Riverwalk Trust Wine Dinner

In the history of American winemaking, the story of Oregon's viniculture is a relatively new one.

But it's a story worth telling and one the founder of Willamette Valley Vineyards will share with guests at the Riverwalk Trust's wine dinner on Sept. 15 at Timpano Italian Chophouse.

Jim Bernau is passionate about wine, particularly about the pinot noirs his winery cultivates in Oregon's Willamette Valley, nestled in the western part of the state between two mountain ranges. Bernau wants to share why pinot noir from his valley is so special.

"Why the grapes that are grown naturally make far better wine and why they end up tasting better," he said in an interview in advance of his Fort Lauderdale visit.

Timpano's executive chef Curtis Hawk has paired five different wines with a five-course dinner and palette-cleansing "intermezzo" in the middle of the September dinner.

Bringing Fresh Food from the Farm to Your Table

In the midst of the locally grown food craze, **Market 17** is looking to establish itself as the go-to gourmet restaurant for all of your fresh culinary cravings Situated just before the 17th Street Causeway Bridge, this fresh food eatery has taken the phrase "**farm to table**" quite literally.

"Organic things taste better," said Kirsta Grauberger, co-owner of Market 17. The restaurant orders all of its foods straight from the farm, and in most cases from right here in Florida. Therefore, depending on availability of ingredients, the menu changes daily. Each morning before kitchen prep is underway, executive chef Daniel Ramos meets with the staff to discuss the daily menu options. "It's a collaborative kitchen, a creative team effort," Grauberger said.

Forever changing, the Market 17 menu boasts fresh ingredients and while foods are always organic, Grauberger steers away from being labeled as a "healthy" restaurant. Small portions and low calorie dishes are not the be-all, end-all. "We use plenty of butter in the kitchen!" she said.

Market 17 chefs are meticulous about the quality of **flavor** and the

dimensions of culinary creativity. Ramos "is one of the most passionate chefs that I know," Grauberger said. "His brain never stops thinking about food."

Some of their most popular dishes include grass fed beef, Colorado rack of lamb, guinea hen and lobster. Their desserts are also seasonal. The Monkey Bread, a cinnamon roll served with banana chutney, is one of Market 17's many crowd pleasers.

The earthy chic eatery caters to the masses. "Above all we want to be known for our food," Grauberger said. Texture, taste and freshness are important words at Market 17 and no dish is left without ample quantities of each.

The 17th Street restaurant places such an emphasis on the dining experience that it offers "Dining in the Dark" options for guests. After alerting the waiter of any allergies or

extreme dislikes, brave foodies are led into an isolated room outfitted with black walls and a table for their party. The room then goes completely dark. Guests are presented with various courses to test their palettes and the accuracy of their taste buds.

"It's shocking how much your eyesight and taste buds are connected," Grauberger said. While dining in the dark, you quickly abandon your silverware and rely on your other **senses** of smell, touch and taste and focus on subtle aspects of the course such as temperature, individual flavors and consistency.


According to Grauberger the dining experience has elicited rave reviews. Market 17 has been invited to coordinate such an experience for a party of 200 at the 2012 South Beach Food and Wine Festival in Miami.

For those looking to try dining in the dark, bring a party of minimum four, maximum 10. The experience runs at \$75 per person plus an additional \$15 for an extra course. Of course foodies interested in a more traditional restaurant setting are welcome in the main dining room for dinner every night except for Monday during summer hours.
