Esplanade Park Along the Riverwalk Gets a Facelift

e are winding down summer and completing some much needed park upgrades. Esplanade Park will soon reopen with a fresh look, level ground, a wider view of the waterway and enhanced lighting. The grounds have been cleared of some concrete hazards, graded, resodded, pruned and thinned of some ground coverage, and mulch has been added to encourage more use. In addition, a number of new lights have been installed to increase public safety and make the park more usable in the evening.

With the much needed park upgrades and with the anticipated opening of the new addition at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, Esplanade Park will change the face of the area. This park, used often for large and small events, is regularly booked for festivals, Museum of Discovery and Science events, runs, strolls, struts and more. Major events such as Duck Derby, Riverwalk Stone Crab and Seafood Festival and Seminole Winterfest Boat Parade are just a few of the annual events that happen in this one park. Often you will find cardio and yoga classes in the area, or exercise by Party Cycle, or stand-up paddleboarding by Riverwalk Paddleboard.

Docks on the New River bring a new means of arriving at the park during the day. Boats routinely use the docks as they enjoy the surrounding area. Downtown Himmarshee Village continues to upgrade and grow. A number of new establishments are anticipated over the next few months and we look forward to having more things for the public to do.

The Fort Lauderdale History Center is located in the area and gives you a chance to learn about the local community and our history. The facilities

There Grows The Neighborhood

How Residents Shape Downtown

e're all familiar with the dramatic physical change Downtown has undergone these past 13 years, but there has been a transformation of a different kind that is more impactful than tons of concrete and rebar. That change is the growing residential population that has emerged in the last decade brought on by the development.

Census Tract 425, which roughly follows the same boundary as the Downtown Regional Activity Center, has shown a surge in the residential population over the years. In 2000 the Census counted 3,817 people living in Downtown. Then in the 2010 it counted 6,890, almost doubling in 10 years!

This demographic shift has greatly enabled the advancement of

improvements. Residents have stepped up to push for necessary changes to their Downtown home in several ways. For starters, the Wave Streetcar has depended greatly on the support of the new residents. Flagler Village Civic Association and Poinciana Park Civic Association both passed resolutions supporting the project and members from all three Downtown civic associations came out to speak in support of the special assessment at the Commission meetings.

Other major improvements residents have been working toward include the Las Olas Sunday Market and the Flagler Garden. The Downtown Civic Association relocated and expanded the market since becoming its new manager. This valuable amenity supplies Downtown with fresh produce from local vendors and also provides the opportunity to get together on Sundays.

The Flagler Village neighborhood has been a hotbed of civic activism the last few years as neighbors have come together through the civic association and the monthly FAT Village Art Walk. This tightly-knit community has successfully requested funds from the CRA for neighborhood improvements such as lighting, street furniture, security, marketing and signage. Also, the residentled Flagler Village Community Garden has gained significant traction thanks to the CRA and private sponsorships.

The current development boom will bring even more neighbors to our area, making for an even more vibrant Downtown. More than 4,000 units are currently in the works to transform the area once more. The overwhelming majority of these projects will be rental, catering to the young professional demographic, which prefers walking, biking and taking transit over driving a car. These folks want a lively urban environment that affords them a variety of amenities and experiences at their fingertips.

So, what will our Downtown population be when the 2020 Census comes around? Things can change quite a bit in seven years. The development brought on by the Wave Streetcar will bring thousands of new neighbors who we can't wait to meet!

No Place Like Home

After a Summer Break, We Appreciate Fort Lauderdale Even More

f you have wondered why my columns had improved so dramatically in the last two issues, I must confess I had a ghostwriter. Chamber President and CEO Dan Lindblade stepped in to give me a two-month vacation break (part of my contract when I signed on to do this). So like many of you, I have actually been away from Fort Lauderdale and spent some time in upstate New York's beautiful Lake George and Adirondack mountain region, went urban to Manhattan and Washington, D.C., and again to the mountains, in Banner Elk, N.C. I have kids of all ages and when we returned after visiting all these beautiful and exciting places, we were all unanimous in our opinion that Fort Lauderdale is a great place to live. While those other places were fun to visit, we love it here. So here are some random thoughts on what we observed in Fort Lauderdale when we got back.

All the construction projects from the new Courthouse to New River Landing to the apartment projects on Federal Highway grew quite a bit in the time we were gone. Looking forward to seeing new ones like Marina Lofts break ground soon. It is great to see this progress in building out our city's Downtown.

It is also great to see more activity on Las Olas Boulevard. As a longtime fan of Jackson's Steakhouse, it's wonderful to see Lobster Bar Sea Grille of the Buckhead Life Restaurant Group going in there. They are experienced operators and have what it takes to live up to the location's heritage. And it's nice to see that Grille 401 is continuing to do a steady business across the street. It is an equally important location for Downtown dining and drinking and we are happy that there has been some consistency in that location as well. The Downtown business lunch and happy hour favorite, YOLO, continues to do well after five years in business, which means all this new competition in the area really is good for everyone. Another relatively new addition, the Royal Pig, has a great menu and has been busy since opening. Other new entrants such as American Social and Voodka keep busy, too, bringing more life to the city's most famous Downtown retail street.

Off Las Olas in the FAT village neighborhood there is a place where the locals are on a mission: C&I Studios. From the outside, the facade of its 3,500-square foot FAT Village studio might seem unfamiliar and even intimidating to some Fort Lauderdale locals, but insiders know that with weekly events open to the public including BBQ Fridays, live local music events, movie nights, and an anchor position during the FAT Village ArtWalk,

On the inspiration behind these events, Josh Miller, founder of C&I Studios, explained, "Fort Lauderdale is constantly criticized for lacking local culture, or not being creative enough. We want to contribute to fixing that issue, and that's why we pack our schedule with so many local events that hopefully inspire and cultivate creativity within our city. We have made the decision to call Fort Lauderdale home, and now it's all about bringing our community together to see what a great place it is truly is."

The September calendar of events at C&I Studios includes:

• Friday, Sept. 13: BBQ Friday Sponsored by Exposed PR and The Riverside Market, BBQ Friday is a chance to roll up the bay doors, grab a cold beer, and celebrate making it through another week. Free dogs and burgers are always provided, and the event is open to the public.

Saturday, Sept. 14: Live at C&I Studios

A monthly live music event, this month's Live at C&I Studios features Civilian, The Careful Ones, and Keith Michaud. Cover is \$6, \$4 with your iPhone showing that you're a fan on Facebook.

Saturday, Sept. 21: Movie Night

This month's movie night features "The Goonies." \$1 gets you in; bring a blanket and get comfy as "The Goonies" is projected on C&I Studios 40-foot cyc wall.

Saturday, Sept. 28: FAT Village ArtWalk

Stop by C&I Studios on the last Saturday of every month for a unique event featuring local artists, photographers, fashion designers, and musicians. Entry is free and cocktails are available.

Strength in Unity and Diversity

South Florida Cultural Consortium Collects and Shares

hey" say that Florida is the only state that the more south you go, the more north you get. True enough, when driving I-95 or Turnpike for the six or seven hours that it takes to get to Miami after crossing the Georgia border into Florida, you can feel an energy shift from the Palm Beach County line and increase as you head south. Traffic thickens, drivers seem a little more intense, and the sound and lights of urban atmosphere slowly replace the peaceful country vibe. The five counties of Martin, Palm Beach, Broward, Miami-Dade and Monroe together form a regional destination with thriving cultural segments in the southernmost state of our country, with Miami, of course, leading the way. It's an important distinction, and becoming more so as each region develops in its own right, and as nationally, South Florida becomes more and more recognized for culture, "Heat" and beaches.

With a mission to develop cultural excellence and accessibility through collaboration among these five counties particularly, the South Florida Cultural Consortium offers the largest regional, governmentsponsored artists' awards in the United States, with \$15,000 and \$7,500 fellowships to resident visual and media artists. Since it was established in 1988, the

Each of the five local arts agencies (agency designated by state to enhance culture) share strategies from the work in each of their communities and pool resources to initiate joint projects that take advantage of this collaboration. Theater League of South Florida, the Carbonell Awards, Florida Cultural Arts Alliance membership and Voices and Venues online newsletter are each solid projects in long-standing existence from these pooled resources.

With an annual budget of more than \$350,000, managed by the fiscal agent Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs, and contributed to by each of the five, each county takes turns in chairing the initiative. At present, Michael Spring, director of Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs, is chair. "The South Florida Cultural Consortium is a powerful catalyst for the economic, social and cultural development of the region," he said. national and global attention on South Florida as a unified metropolis with diverse and outstanding cultural resources."

Every year, nearly 400 artists who live and work throughout the five counties submit their applications for consideration of this fellowship. A regional panel of experts from South Florida is convened to provide an initial review of the submissions. The regional panel forwards its recommendations to a national panel. This national panel is given the responsibility of recommending the final recipients.

The funding available from each county determines the number of awards presented within each county. The dynamics of the panel shape the selections from year to year. Merit is determined based on individual accomplishments as evidenced by the work submitted for review, with the highest premium placed on coherent bodies of work. In addition to receiving cash awards, the artists take part in an exhibition hosted and organized by a visual arts institution in one of the five counties.

"One of the most critical steps in advancing and supporting the work of visual artists who live in our region is to offer additional fellowships," said Brandi Reddick, communications and artists' manager for Art in Public Places, Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs. "Each year, we see an increased number of applications from participating counties. This year, in response to the growing number of artists in our community, Miami-Dade County added an additional \$15,000 fellowship during the 2013 cycle."

However, it may seem like a good idea to also further the cause of the regional perspective with more collaboration and cohesive goals. "Developing a strong cultural landscape and creating a community that



supports and attracts artists is an integral part of successful regional planning," said Earl Bosworth, director, Broward Cultural Division. "It has been proven that a community rich in arts and culture offers a competitive edge for enticing investment and tourism, as well as creating jobs and economic prosperity. The arts vary tremendously in each South Florida county, providing a wonderful, eclectic mixture of artistic practices and cultural experiences."

What's not to support, when there is compelling artwork and diverse artists? This year in Broward County, four artists were recipients of the 2013 South Florida Cultural Consortium Visual and Media Artists Fellowships: Leah Brown, \$15,000, mixed media; Henning Haupt, \$7,500, mixed media; Catalina Jaramillo, \$15,000, installation; and Rosanna Saccoccio, \$7,500, visual art. In total, 14 fellowships were awarded in the five-county area.

The 2013 regional panel, whose selections are conducted anonymously and based solely on the evaluation of the artists' work as evidenced by samples submitted, included Chris Cook, executive director, Cannonball (Miami-Dade); Tom Scicluna, artist, 2012 SFCC Fellowship Recipient (Miami-Dade); Chelsea Guerdat, director of exhibitions, Bass Museum of Art (Miami-Dade); Jane Hart, curator, Art and Culture Center of Hollywood (Broward); and Peter Boswell, curator, Museum of Art | Fort Lauderdale (Broward).

The submissions were forwarded for final adjudication and selection to the national panel comprised of Elizabeth Dunbar, executive director at DiverseWorks in Houston, Texas; Andria Hickey, associate curator at the Public Art Fund; and Ryan Inouye, curatorial assistant in the Department of Education and Public Programs at the New Museum, New York.

A juried exhibition, Who Am I to You?, featuring the works of the 14 South Florida regional recipients was at the Museum of Art | Fort Lauderdale this summer.

With Broward County posing as a strategically central location to this coalition, the artists and administrators look both north and south to further their impact, and to create a union of like-minded ideas for planning, in order to share creativity and funds, and increase global and economic leverage for future development.

Let's Build a Parklet

Sustainable Development Update: Transforming Spaces into Places

ast year on annual PARK(ing) Day, if you walked along Southeast Sixth Street across from the County Courthouse, or Northwest Fifth Street in FAT Village, you may have stopped to sit and chat with a friend at an outdoor pop-up space known fondly as a "parklet." Parklets are semi-permanent decks that expand the pedestrian area beyond the sidewalk into a parking space.

PARK(ing) Day began in San Francisco in 2005 with the intent to convert a single metered parking space into a temporary public park and has grown into an annual global event. In many cities, PARK(ing) Day has evolved into a fully-fledged parklet program to convert these parking spaces on a full-time basis.

Fort Lauderdale can now proudly say we are on that list of innovative and forward thinking cities. On Aug. 20, the Fort Lauderdale City Commission approved a pilot program to allow up to 20 City parking spaces to be transformed into Parklets by adjacent business owners. Rather than a costly and disruptive total streetscape overhaul, installing Parklets is an urban-triage approach that repurposes part of the street into a space for people. They provide amenities like seating, planting, bike parking, and art.

New Director Poised to Reestablish Museum of Art | Fort Lauderdale as Nucleus of Culture

INTRODUCING BONNIE CLEARWATER

ova Southeastern University's Museum of Art | Fort Lauderdale is soaring to new precipices as of the start of the new season. This June, Bonnie Clearwater, M.A., was named the museum's new director.

"The concept of great museums lie with great universities," said George Hanbury II Ph.D., NSU President and CEO. "(We) looked for someone that would be a leader; who would not only

make a great museum but integrate that museum into a great university."

Fortunately for the museum, Clearwater has roots in both. She exudes confidence in the same way she expresses her passion. Her enthusiasm is contagious and evolved.

Conjured from infancy, a thirst for knowledge of the art world drove her initial introduction to the subject. While pursuing a bachelor's degree in art history at New York University, Clearwater interned at the Grey Art Gallery of NYU where she became assistant to the director. Subsequently, she secured a position as a private curator for the collectors Leonard and Evelyn Lauder and simultaneously for the Mark Rothko Foundation. With a master's degree in both modern and medieval art from Columbia University, Clearwater established herself as a go-getting maverick, moving cross-country to Los Angeles to be the director of art programs for the Lannan Foundation and director of the Lannan Museum in Lake Worth. Clearwater split her talents between both coasts before moving permanently to South Florida.

It was 1990 on Ocean Drive. Clearwater was having lunch with a colleague who was eager to bring her to the burgeoning art scene. "I just felt there was something in the air and having known the scene and the collectors I knew that there was a moment of coalescing and I called my husband in L.A. and said we're moving to Miami Beach," she said.

The South Florida art scene caught her attention; not in an overtly conspicuous way, but subtly. Clearwater saw a developing vibrancy in the budding Miami culture that was at the time humming with art deco flair and Cuban flavor the likes of José Bedia and Carlos Alfonzo. To the rest of the art world, compared to New York and Los Angeles, Miami was a non-entity. Yet, that was empty talk to Clearwater and that talk was short lived.

"That was part of my role — bringing awareness to a scene that was developing," she said.

Named chief curator of the Museum of Contemporary Art in 1994, Clearwater validated art's sophistication by endorsing its potential and helped to put Miami on the map. With free reign and a vision of her own, Clearwater brought a diversity of exhibitions, internationally recognized community outreach programs and educational partnerships.

"She's had a great reputation of building community programs," Hanbury said. "The community knows that the museum is for them and not just a selected few."

Just 20 minutes from North Miami and 50 miles south of West Palm, Fort Lauderdale

to the sense of society that artists, patrons and collectors share. She observed this years ago visiting the museum when it first opened in 1986. To her, the area epitomizes collected creativity. She plans to tap into such a rich ensemble of expression and open up communication between artist and viewer. Increased membership, partnerships with young professional groups, and community

has erected itself as a nucleus of culture. For a city with such vibrancy, Clearwater believes Fort Lauderdale has already been ready to carry the torch.

"What I am aiming for, with the Museum (of Art | Fort Lauderdale), is to be the central hub that will join the Miami art scene with the Palm Beach art scene and now you have a real gold coast of culture," she said.

Clearwater describes a strong connection

outreach are avenues she intends to pursue. Additionally, Clearwater sees the museum as a leader in involving local businesses and bringing attention to the Downtown and Riverwalk areas.

Art and education go hand in hand. Both Clearwater and Hanbury subscribe to that philosophy, hoping that a blended marriage of these already related disciplines will take on new meaning as the museum heads toward a clear identity and focus.

Hanbury eagerly anticipates expanding students' appreciation for the arts and humanities. "I would like to integrate our academic programs and the arts and sciences into the museum for multiple academic exercises, not just in all art and culture, but the business of museums, the psychology of museums, the pure humanity of museums." He envisions this mission enveloping the immediate Fort Lauderdale and South Florida communities.

"This museum here should be for everybody," Clearwater said. "And everybody should feel that it belongs to them."

Some call her influence catalytic, even prophetic. Accordingly, the museum is setting sail on hopes that it will advance the venue as a beacon on the gold coast of culture and beyond.



Modern Waterfront Dining

Eclectic Melting Pot of Flavors Awaits at Kaluz






hat was once the Roadhouse Grill has since been beautifully transformed into Kaluz, a "new American" cutting-edge waterfront restaurant residing at the southwest corner of the Commercial Boulevard Bridge. If you have yet to visit Kaluz, you'll be shockingly surprised by its modern look, trendy vibe and floor-to-ceiling windows that offer patrons a crowning view from any vantage point inside the restaurant. Or if you prefer some fresh air, Kaluz also boasts a casual chic outdoor dining area with a full bar and flat screen TVs, which is perfect for boaters who've spent the day out on the water and want to enjoy great food at a scenic venue without feeling underdressed.

Kaluz, which opened the night of Feb. 14, serves both lunch and dinner and remains

open in between. Executive Chef Michael Knapik describes the menu as an eclectic melting pot of flavors with tastes from around the world, which makes sense because owner David Baldwin is a seasoned restaurateur who has operated restaurants both nationally and internationally.

Each menu item is made fresh daily, from scratch, in order to always provide savory dishes with fresh, bold flavors. The menu remains the same for lunch and dinner, but offers an assortment of dishes ranging from flatbreads and burgers, to pastas and entrées such as the Plum Duck Confit. In order to keep regular diners on their toes and interested in the concept, Chef Knapik concocts a new special each week that is not normally found on the standard menu.



EACH MENU ITEM IS MADE FRESH DAILY, FROM SCRATCH, IN ORDER TO ALWAYS PROVIDE SAVORY DISHES WITH FRESH, BOLD FLAVORS.

We started with the Tuna Tartare appetizer (a house favorite), which is comprised of poke-style ahi tuna stacked atop a hearty bed of fresh avocado accented with sriracha swirls. It is served alongside waffle-cut potato chips. The sriracha swirls added a twisty tang that made my taste buds dance and the housemade waffle chips created the perfect crisp to accompany the delectable dish — definitely a must-try!

For an entrée, we enjoyed the Hatfield Farm Pork Chop, a double bone-in pork chop topped with Granny Smith apple chutney and finished with apple cinnamon demiglace, served atop a bed of Parmesan mashed potatoes. The pork chop was seasoned to perfection, while the chutney created a bold fusion of flavors, which proved it to be a great accompaniment to the dish. The mashed potatoes packed an unexpected (yet delicious!) kick, which I'm told is because they're made with aged Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese. Yum!


We also tried the Pan Seared Key Largo Yellowtail topped with fresh corn salsa, tomatillo sauce and avocado cream, served over coconut basmati rice. The only other ingredient I would add to this already flavorful dish is a squirt of lime, which was conveniently served as an accent on the plate. I recommend finishing dinner off by Going Bananas and noshing on banana cake soaked in banana liqueur topped with hazelnut icing, shaved coconut, sliced bananas and vanilla ice cream.

Kaluz's contemporary décor and waterfront view offer a picturesque setting for diners to enjoy a variety of dishes that are both appetizing to the eyes and pleasing to the stomach.

To shed new light on the Riverwalk, the City of Fort Lauderdale Engineering Department has supervised the design and installation of new lighting. Begun in May and finished in August, the project aimed to give the **Riverwalk** a vibrant atmosphere to improve its experience, safety and use. The lights were composed to satisfy the new building codes, including the replacement of the old metal lighting poles with concrete pre-stressed precast poles. Sunshine State Electric of Florida, Inc. has been contracted by the City to do this work, while City crews did a portion of the work.

In December 2013, Riverwalk will celebrate its 25th anniversary. To commemorate the occasion, each month Go Riverwalk Magazine will showcase one of the many public enhancements that has been made along the two-mile stretch of brick walkway along the New River in Downtown Fort Lauderdale.
