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

Recently the Master Plan and Projects Committee spent an evening walking, sitting and talking on the Riverwalk. Now we meet monthly to discuss ongoing master plans, initiatives for amenities and hardscape along the Walk such as exercise stations, water fountains, planters or kiosks. We discuss ideas for activation of the Walk through exercise classes, dog training and waterfront events. We consider the context of new and proposed residential development along the New River and opportunities to enhance and improve the public park itself. Our task on this night was to identify locations for mile markers, Adirondack chairs, water fountains and a possible food kiosk.

At Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale, we consider ourselves intimately familiar with the Riverwalk — its place in our City and our commitment to its continued enhancement is why we are involved.

AS THE MANY OF OUR RESIDENTS WHO USE THE RIVERWALK DAILY AS THEIR WATERFRONT PARK KNOW, THE RIVERWALK ON BOTH SIDES IS ONE OF THE "MUST DOS" IN FORT LAUDERDALE.

In fact, my office is located in Riverwalk Plaza (owned by Board Member John Ropes) directly on the Riverwalk. But by spending a couple of hours on the Riverwalk at dusk we were able to better plan and comment.

During our walkabout, members of the committee were impressed with the following:

• The New River with Downtown as its backdrop is gorgeous! Planning waterside events held on the Riverwalk itself is a high priority.

• More and more people are choosing to exercise along the Riverwalk.

• The ongoing growth on the south side of the River, which will include amenities and hundreds of new residents, will be a game changer for the south side of the Riverwalk.

• Opportunities for more outdoor seating is key! There are hidden and overlooked vistas on both sides of the New River which make great places to read or relax.

• The "experience" walking over the Third Avenue or Andrews Avenue bridge should be taken as a challenge to find new ways to cross the New River, perhaps a water front shuttle.

• More exercise equipment on the south side of the River will be much appreciated: we saw residents doing pushups on concrete walls.

As the many of our residents who use the Riverwalk daily as their waterfront park know, the Riverwalk on both sides is one of the "must dos" in Fort Lauderdale.

For anyone interested in joining the Master Plan and Projects Committee to share ideas and action items key to the growth and Planning of the Riverwalk, we meet the first Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Fort Lauderdale Woman's Club.

From Transportation to Skyline, Fort Lauderdale Moves Ahead

s Downtown continues to grow with commercial buildings, residential buildings and new businesses, we see a marked change in the dynamic of forming partnerships. Developers and builders are amicably designing and building projects with input from local groups such as homeowner associations and charities. Fort Lauderdale has grown to mid-size city proportions with a magnificent skyline that makes it notable. Multi-modal transportation options are being implemented and others are under review that will make movement throughout the state and through the city easier and effective.

Broward County Transportation Services, Sun Trolley and other local options exist today, and the WAVE is coming in the next few years. Passenger and freight transportation hubs and services are winding their way

through the system as we consider additional modes of movement. Expansion continues at the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport and additional plans are in the works to expand and deepen Port Everglades and the cruise/freight terminals there. Both the airport and seaport expansions will be game changers for our City. Consideration is being raised over expansion of the Convention Center and the addition of a new convention hotel.

Recent reports have rated Fort Lauderdale as one of the most desirable communities in the country to live. Rated as No. 7 in the Top 10 Best Downtowns for 2014 by Livability.com, Fort Lauderdale is currently a finalist for All-America City by the National Civic League, and has been selected as a part of America's 10 Most Exciting mid-size cities by movoto.com. Our Broward County Public Schools district is the sixth largest public school system in the United States, and the second largest in the state of Florida. Local schools continue to turn out scholastic achievers and rank high in statistics for graduating students. Unemployment in our community hovers around 5 percent — one of the lowest in Florida and in the nation. Skilled services are available. Businesses look hard at this part of the country as a desirable location to headquarter. Some of the major corporate presences are Citrix, AutoNation and Liberty Power as well as many more. Organizations such as the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance, recently receiving the 2014 Achievement in Public/Private Partnership Awards, and the Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce continue to recruit and encourage new businesses to the area as well as work very hard to retain existing businesses. Statistics provided by the greater Fort Lauderdale Convention and Visitors Bureau indicate that more than 13.4 million visitors arrived in Broward County last year generating \$47,698,582 in tax revenues derived from 5 percent bed tax collected by area hotels and \$10.56 billion for 2013 visitor expenditures, according to the Greater Fort Lauderdale Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Fort Lauderdale is home to the world's largest international boat show, Winterfest Boat Parade and host to a number of national events that draw millions of tourists per year.

The City of Fort Lauderdale generated a visioning plan known as Fast Forward to 2035 and we are well on our way to achieving the goals established by the community. Fort Lauderdale and Broward County are on the move and there are some very great things to come.





Encore Performance

Broward Center Unveils \$56 Million Expansion Project

ust like many 20-somethings, when the Broward Center for the Performing Arts finished its second decade, it was time for a new look, a time to reflect on its future, and time to step up its social life.

The Broward Center for the Performing Arts opened its doors on Feb. 26, 1991, and at the ripe old age of 21, in 2012, it broke ground on a \$56 million expansion that accomplishes all of these emerging adulthood goals.

Fresh touches polish the theaters, a luxurious club graces the complex, a new pavilion and restaurant overlook the New River, and a new education wing will be ready this summer.

As the multimillion-dollar expansion wraps up, Go Riverwalk Magazine is the first media outlet to get a tour of the project, called ENCORE!

"The renovation really had three primary objectives," said Kelley Shanley, president and CEO, Broward Center for the Performing Arts. "At the base level, we wanted to restore the existing complex. That was job one — a stewardship notion — take care of what's existing."

Second was to look toward the future: "how are we

going to think about the community's needs 20 years from now?" And third was addressing education needs and creating additional space to do that. Oh, and create a sustainable business model that is less dependent on government funding.

\$2 Million More to Go

The \$56 million expansion has raised more than \$54 million so far, with contributions still welcome, Shanley added. During a gala on April 12, Shanley announced that a donor who wishes to remain anonymous has offered to match up to \$1 million in giving to the ENCORE! capital campaign. The gifts must come by May 26 to be eligible for the one-to-one match. This gesture will allow the Foundation to reach its \$56 million fundraising goal for the Broward Center's capital renewal and expansion project, ENCORE! Building Community through the Arts.

The April 12 gala dinner and concert christened the newly renovated Broward Center. Sheryl Crow entertained the crowd of 200, who paid \$500 each for the evening.

The Broward Center broke ground on the \$56 million expansion in October 2012. "The Broward Center is a cultural landmark in South Florida, welcoming more than 600,000 visitors annually from all over the world," Shanley

said at the time. "The ENCORE! capital project builds on our history of success with a promise for the future."

Let's Get Social

While the performing arts center tries out its new persona, it also works to become more social. This fall, the Broward Center will be wired for Wi-Fi so patrons can easily share their theater experience — just not during the show, although the complex is considering designated "tweet seats" where theater goers can sit together and tap away on their phones.

"There's this social aspect to attending the theater that we wanted to provide for," Shanley said. "We wanted to provide spaces for people to have this experience."

When arriving at the Broward Center, a redesigned center plaza greets patrons. "This gives us a brand new entrance," said Doug Tober, vice president and general manager at the center. The box office has a new video wall showcasing upcoming attractions.

The new glass-encased, two-story Huizenga Pavilion sits on the New River and hosts a restaurant downstairs and an upstairs private event space, called the Porter Riverview Ballroom. The 3,700-square-foot space is outfitted with two 16-foot by 9-foot projectors and screens and the windows overlooking the New River have black out drapes to darken the room for presentations. The sliding windows can open to let in balmy breezes on milder days and evenings. The area can sit 20 round tables of 12.

Dangling blue and teal acrylic artwork graces the room's skylight, which has shades, in the middle of the room. Lynnel Art to Form, a Boston company, created the installation, which is reminiscent of water.

The New River Bistro will have 66 tables with additional seating outside, weather permitting, to seat a total of 130 people. This area has sliding doors as well that can open to bring the outdoors in. The restaurant is slated to open in the fall. The Broadway season opens Oct. 17 with "Annie."

A new underground tunnel links the restaurant to the main performing arts center. The tunnel, located beneath the driveway, was originally intended to be a service corridor for the kitchen, Tober said, but now will serve as a connector for the public to get to their shows. The Peck Courtyard has a new bar, Bernie's Courtyard Bar, which will serve wine, premium cocktails, beer, soft drinks, coffee and snacks.

Administration offices will move to the third level of the main complex. For more than 20 years, that space has been the attic and storage area. With the expansion, additional floor space was built so most of the administrative staff will be housed together.

New Education Wing

On the west side of the Broward Center, the new Rose Miniaci Arts Education Center will feature the JM Family

Studio Theater, a 2,100-square foot main education space and 3,000 square feet of classroom, coaching and administrative space.

It will have a large classroom with a fully sprung dance floor, so the Broward Center can now offer dance classes. Smaller classrooms, a

registration desk, and 2,100 space decked with hardwood flooring overlooking the Avenue of the Arts complement the education center. This space will also have seven rows of retractable seating for 100 to enjoy small performances. A full production mezzanine overlooks this space with room for sound and lighting equipment. Broward Center will work with area schools and vocational programs to provide training for sound and lighting state certification. Jan Goodheart, vice president of external affairs at

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Broward Center, said with so many schools and churches having their own stage space, there is an increased need for this kind of training in South Florida.

The education center hosts its own kitchen area, which will be linked with a service corridor to the Abdo New River Room. This space has served as a workhorse through the years, with its daily use flipping from a breakfast in the morning to an arts reception in the evening. Because this small space frequently is used for different purposes throughout a day, the Broward Center needs more gathering space.

The Silver Airways Intermezzo Lounge opened in mid-March and its windows slide open to create an indoor/ outdoor feel. When Broward Center patrons buy a ticket to a performance, they can add on the Intermezzo experience to enjoy the cathedral ceilinged space fused with a warm stone and wood atmosphere. The lounge can hold 60 to 70 people at a time.

A Spot for Dragalongs

The Au-Rene Theater was the first part of the Broward Center to get renovated, receiving new seating, enhanced sound and lighting and all-inclusive Club Level experience. The main theater got a facelift, right down to a new carpet. The navy with red, green and light blue flowers were inspired by the old carpet, so returning patrons may feel a touch of déjà vu when looking down. Other improvements include a complete restoration of the performance spaces and audience chambers, with advanced sound and lighting systems, energy-efficient lighting and air-handling equipment, new orchestra lift systems and updated production equipment, as well as updated restrooms.

Even the seats have been updated ... the color is slightly different and a wood finish graces the seat bottoms. "Little changes have made it look a little bit nicer and a little bit richer," Shanley said. "It's the same space but refreshed and renewed."


The Club Level opened last season in an area that originally housed production space overlooking the main theater. Now two windows allow a stage view so the more chatty patrons can keep an eye on the show while socializing with friends. "This was driven by demand from corporate sponsors," Shanley said, "people who had an experience at sporting events."

Perhaps a wife wants to go to the ballet but her husband is less enthused. The Club Level is ideal for this type of patron, called a "dragalong" in the industry.

Here, guests enjoy access to a private lounge along with complimentary valet parking, open bar, hors d'ouerves and dessert, and extra-roomy theater seats in a dedicated seat area adjacent to the lounge. The seats are three inches wider, one inch deeper and sport drink holders.

"We want this to be quintessential Fort Lauderdale," Shanley said ⁽¹⁾

A Dog's Best Friend

Pooches and Owners Head to Class Along the Riverwalk

hen Downtown Fort Lauderdale resident Kiki Harris rescued her dog Macy, the pair had some work to do.

Harris enrolled Macy, a terrier mix, in A Dog's Best Friend classes where the duo were able to work on everything from basic commands to controlling Macy's bark.

"The classes are really great," Harris said. "You learn things that you can work on every day, in and out of the classes."

A Dog's Best Friend, founded in 1994 by Tim Mullally, prides itself on giving pups everything they need to succeed and making the learning experience fun ... not just for the dogs, but also for their owners.

Mullally has been surrounded by dogs his entire life, growing up with parents who bred German shepherds and Australian shepherds. At age 12, Mullally's father gave him his own German shepherd and enrolled him in training classes, marking the beginning of Mullally's journey in the dog obedience world.

Known as "the humane way to train," A Dog's Best Friend was the first positive reinforcement dog training company in South Florida. Mullally wanted to toss the traditional, negative approach to dog training and take it in a whole new unique direction.

Instead of waiting for your dog to do something wrong and then correcting him, A Dog's Best Friend focuses on teaching your dog what you want him to do as a solution to the behaviors you do not like. Positive reinforcement is all about maintaining control of the environment and effectively communicating with your dog so he understands exactly what you want.

Donna Levy started her golden retriever Sophie in classes when she was just a baby to get her started "the right way."

"The classes have really helped our relationship," Levy said. "We get to enjoy each other more, and I am able to take her out to different restaurants." Levy has trained her last three dogs with Mullally and has tried a variety of classes over the years.

A Dog's Best Friend offers in-home training, boarding training and a range of specialty and group training classes.

An added feature to the company was bringing group training classes to Esplanade Park on the Riverwalk. On Thursday nights, A Dog's Best Friend hosts intermediate and masters dog obedience classes. The courses last six weeks and cover various methods from fading hand signals to higher-level distraction work.

"I love the park. It has a beautiful location and dogfriendly environment," Mullally said. "We also have the ability to work around real-life settings and distractions."

Each week, the classes meet in a different part of the park to ensure that the dogs learn to behave everywhere, and not just in their comfort zones.

"Sometimes we switch it up and walk up and down Las Olas," Mullally said. "We even took the dogs down the Christmas parade last year during a class."

Both Levy and Harris have participated in the Esplanade Park classes and rave about the beautiful outdoor location and benefits to the outdoor sessions as well.

"The location is so convenient for us, and it also feels great to be outside," Harris said.

According to Mullally, the biggest goal for owners is gaining control of their dogs around distractions and what better way to reach that goal then learning at a beautiful pet-friendly park in the heart of Fort Lauderdale? ⁽¹⁾

ust a short walk from the south side of the Riverwalk sits Hardy Park Bistro, a welcoming new neighborhood eatery. Opened in November 2013, this neighborhood gem is situated on Southwest Seventh Street, just west of Andrews Avenue

do what he loved, even meeting his wife along his journey. Sharing the same inspiration, they knew they wanted to open a restaurant and after about 10 years on the seas, it was time.

With a weekly menu change and daily specials, Hardy Park Bistro strives to keep your interest peaked. But it does keep a few favorites for familiarity — its signature dish is the Roasted Duck Confit, au jus, served over fingerling potatoes, olives, haricot verts and an arugula pesto.

Philip doesn't choose favorites from his menu — he simply enjoys eating and drinking and chooses what he eats based on his mood. A current favorite is Blue Point Oysters with a Coopers Original Pale Ale,

brewed in Australia, while sitting outside.

So what's next for Hardy Park Bistro? Philip has some big plans up his sleeve but will only tell us that there will be a bar and more outdoor seating added soon. The rest, well, is a secret right now.

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



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
