














Let the Season Begin


It is therefore the perfect time to welcome the "cast" of community

EXPLORE DOWNTOWN TO SEE WHAT'S NEW

Summer is at its end, fall is speeding this way and with it, our interns are back to school. Clarrisa Buch, a highly regarded Miami-Dade County Silver Knight winner this year, has been our office intern and a writer throughout her entire senior year of high school and is off to the University of Missouri as a freshman. Carolina Guardabassi, a rising sophomore at Elon University in North Carolina, shared her skills as a writer and office intern this summer along with Jarod Crush, a rising junior at Cardinal Gibbons High School. A number of routine happenings occur weekly and provide activation to the Riverwalk area:

- Cardio Mix Training, in its fourth year, has a strong following and continues to meet twice weekly and is guided by Josh Hecht.
- Paddleboard Riverwalk operates Saturdays and Sundays each week from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for guided tours and rental. Night tours and lesson are available as well.

- Soon you will have the ability to grab a bite at food kiosks around the Bubier Park area from early morning through the afternoon. These additions should be in operation this fall.
- Informational kiosks are also being readied and will soon be out in public to help share information from our Downtown partners and keep you up to date on happenings in the area, directions to restaurants, bars and retail, and help you enjoy many of the amenities of the A&E District.
- The Riverwalk Water Trolley is anticipated to kick off in early fall with six stops along the route three on each side of the New River Downtown along Riverwalk. This new addition is long awaited by Downtown residents and workers and will be a great new way to travel Downtown. Operation and oversight will be provided by the TMA and City of Fort Lauderdale.
- The long awaited Ambassador program is scheduled to begin shortly and we believe that with these new faces on the street, the addition of kiosks for information and food, the sustainable daily and weekly events and volunteers along Riverwalk, a strong movement toward positive activation in Downtown will continue.

In addition to these changes we welcome Patricia Zeiler as the new Executive Director to the Fort Lauderdale Historical Society, and Robyn Chiarelli as Executive Director to the Transportation Management Authority — great partners in the Downtown and with Riverwalk.





Agents of Change

THE NEW FACES OF **DOWNTOWN**



ast summer I visited the West Palm Beach DDA to learn ■ about their programs and one of them was their wildly successful ambassador security program. I was amazed at the high level of effectiveness — how Downtown West Palm had gone from a place stigmatized by crime, to the inviting, vibrant and safe place it is today. They credited the Private Security Consultants (PSC) with the turnaround. Now Fort Lauderdale's DDA has decided to implement its own similar pilot program.

The PSC Ambassadors assess the community's needs and patrol a designated area. The pilot program will start in the Downtown core along Southwest Second Street and Andrews Avenue to the Las Olas Shopping District and down to the County Courthouse. The PSC Ambassadors focus on assisting those who need help (with directions, information, or anything else) and addressing any nuisance activity. Interaction with the public is vital to what PSC does and key to keeping Downtown inviting and safe. PSC provides security guard service to approximately 100 malls, government municipalities, hotels, private communities, and other government facilities, and has operations across the United States. They also provide security services to the federal government and to Fortune 500 companies. More than half of their directors have prior experience as law enforcement officers, in the U.S. military and with fire departments.

Adding PSC to the Downtown mix is something the





The police department will act in concert with PSC so that they can communicate with each other about Downtown activity. PSC will collect data, monitor its progress, and collaborate with the police department, DDA, the City of Fort Lauderdale, and Flagler Village Improvement Association — the lead partners funding the endeavor.

The new ambassadors will act as the veritable eyes and ears of Downtown. So the program is not just about security, but also outreach and public relations. They serve as the face of Downtown and will help set a tone of welcoming hospitality. This was a huge asset to Downtown West Palm Beach, which was fighting an image problem of being unsafe. Since the arrival of the ambassadors, crime has reduced by half and visitors are flocking to the area. A year from now, I look forward to reporting the same kind of success for Downtown Fort Lauderdale!

Riders On The Storm

FORT LAUDERDALE'S EFFORTS TO DECREASE YOUR FLOOD INSURANCE RATES

ne of the top priorities identified in the citywide vision is to be a resilient community. We've been fortunate for many decades not to have had a direct hit from a hurricane, but the flooding that occurred during the Halloween 2011 rains and the impacts from Superstorm Sandy two years ago remind us that the possibility of flooding exists with every major storm. Fortunately the City of Fort Lauderdale is dedicated to minimizing storm related damage and keeping your flood insurance rates as low as possible.

Blessed with 165 miles of navigable waterways, seven miles of beautiful beaches, and our prized jewel — the Riverwalk, water is all around us. Our beloved amenity can also be our biggest enemy. Most homeowners' insurance policies do not cover property losses due to floodwaters, making the separate purchase of a flood insurance policy a must for many property owners. Since all areas are susceptible to varying degrees of flooding, all property owners should consider purchasing a flood insurance policy, even if it is not mandated for their location. If you do not have valid flood insurance, contact an agent immediately. Property owners can insure

On Aug. 18, new FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps went into effect. Several thousand properties in Fort Lauderdale will be added to,


or removed from, the Special Flood Hazard Area based on these new maps. If you are a local homeowner, the new maps may affect your need to purchase flood insurance, as well as the cost of your annual premium. If you haven't already checked to see if your property's flood zone designation changed, I encourage you to use an online interactive map viewing tool to find out if your home or business is in a flood zone or if the base flood elevation of your property has changed.

Thanks to the City's cross departmental team of community builders, we currently implement numerous proactive activities that reduce our local flood hazard and earn our neighbors a 20 percent discount on their insurance rates. With the implementation of the new flood maps, we are also adopting higher regulatory standards for future development. Examples of these higher standards include imposing certain limitations on enclosed areas below elevated buildings, requiring the lowest floor of buildings to be at least one foot above the base flood elevation to be consistent with the Florida Building Code, and prohibiting the use of fill to elevate buildings and structures.

Updating our building standards in anticipation of future climate conditions will facilitate critical adaptation measures, and bring us closer to achieving our vision of being a stronger and more resilient community.

Connecting the Blocks

MAKING IT EASIER TO WALK, BIKE, TAKE TRANSIT AND DRIVE YOUR VEHICLE SAFELY

e all want to be able to get out of our cars more, be able to walk or bike to get where we need to go to be healthier and enjoy our fabulous South Florida climate, but it is not always as easy as it appears. There may not be a crosswalk or even sidewalks along our route, there may not be a transit line that is convenient to our needs, or there might not be bike lanes or racks where we are going. Or we may not feel safe being on the street alongside vehicles with drivers who aren't paying attention, speeding and violating traffic laws that are there to protect walkers and bikers.

During the City's recent community visioning process, Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2035, our neighbors came out overwhelmingly to say that they see the Fort Lauderdale of tomorrow as a city where you can choose to walk, bike, take transit and drive your vehicle safely and easily throughout a connected network of streets.

Construction has already begun on projects to transform Fort Lauderdale into our vision for the future with new connections for bicyclists, pedestrians and transit as well as improved safety for all users of the roadway. The painted intersections on Las Olas Boulevard featured in the July

PHOTO BY JASON LEIDY issue of Go Riverwalk Magazine, the new lighted crosswalk at Las Olas Boulevard and Southeast 13th Avenue, and the reconstruction of A1A north of Sunrise Boulevard are examples of these initiatives, to name just a few. More transformational projects are on the horizon as well, including the Wave Streetcar.

These projects will change the built environment, but creating

a safe and connected community requires more than just engineering measures — they need to be partnered with other components such as education and enforcement. In the Bicycling and Walking in the United States 2014 Benchmarking Report produced by the Alliance for Biking and Walking, Florida has the highest rate of pedestrian fatalities in the country and is ranked in the top 10 worst states for bicycle fatalities, as well. Dangerous by Design 2014, produced by Smart Growth America, identifies Florida as holding the top four spots for most dangerous metropolitan areas across the country out of 51 locations with the Fort Lauderdale/Miami/Pompano metro region coming in fourth.

A paradigm shift across sectors is paramount to making the kind of change necessary to make our streets a place where everyone feels safe, no matter which form of transportation they choose, and that there is a choice. The focus must change from moving vehicles to moving people. The City is partnering across departments and agencies to supplement the engineering projects with educational campaigns and high visibility enforcement operations in targeted locations.

With our children returning back to school, now more than ever, it is critical that each one of us make safe choices. Yield to pedestrians at crosswalks and intersections when they have the walk light, share the road with bicyclists and give them three feet, don't text and drive and obey the speed limits, and take extra caution while traveling through our neighborhoods. Working together we are making Fort Lauderdale the safe, multimodal city of tomorrow. @





s we head into the season of snowbirds and culture, it's a good time to look at some of the classical cornerstones of Broward County's arts and cultural repertoire. SOBs, as they are called — Symphony Opera Ballet — have found a solid place in Broward County because the Symphony of the Americas, Miami City Ballet, and Florida Grand Opera are thriving, international, multi-talented operations that produce world-class performances year after year.

For a county halfway between Palm Beach and Miami-Dade counties, this infusion of classical expertise elevates Broward into more than just another place to live. It's a destination location — a strategic stop, for more than its irresistibly blue water line and warm, sandy coast. Symphony, opera and ballet have their creative roots in the Italian Renaissance 1400s and 1500s. Broward County in the 21st century is rich with these historic sopranos, sonatas and dance, offering them to visitors and residents in remarkable seasons of performance.

Florida Grand Opera

In 1994, Greater Miami Opera Association and Opera Guild, Inc., of Fort Lauderdale merged to form Florida Grand Opera. Beginning in 1948, performances in Fort Lauderdale were presented at the War Memorial Auditorium until the opening of the Broward Center for the Performing Arts in 1991. The opera's founder, Arturo di Filippi, regularly brought leading artists from the Metropolitan Opera to South Florida, presenting them in the roles for which they had won worldwide acclaim. A 1965 production of "Lucia di Lammermoor" with Joan Sutherland featured a young Italian tenor, Luciano Pavarotti, in his American debut. From its distant origins in 1400s Italy, opera began to flourish in South Florida, and Broward County was very much a part of it.

In the fall of 2013, Susan T. Danis, FGO's general director, opened her first season with Marvin David Levy's "Mourning Becomes Electra," and closed with Jules Massenet's "Thaïs," continuing the history of excellence and diversity in this world-class organization. "Madama Butterfly," "Cosi fan tutte," "The Pearl Fishers" and "The Consul" will be the jewels of the 2014 season. www.fgo.org




Symphony of the Americas

Symphony of the Americas has been South Florida's premier orchestral organization for more than 25 years, and the Broward Center for the Performing Arts is its performance home base. Operating with a balanced budget for its entire lifespan, this organization is dedicated with an award-winning maestro, James Brooks-Bruzzese.

Committed to South Florida's multi-cultural population with an inventive approach of combining classical music with other forms, its international outreach program, Summerfest, marks its 22nd year this summer with visitors from Rome. In the past, performances and master classes have been presented in every country of Central America and encompass world-class orchestral artists, ballet soloists, classical Mexican mariachi, pulses of tango, mesmerizing acrobats of the Cirque de la Symphonie, the drama and intensity of opera, Broadway, pops, and the rhythms of Spanish zarzuela.

The Symphony's Serenades@Sunset series offers smaller musical ensembles in concert, in a more relaxed setting. The symphony's free outdoor pops concerts throughout the season offer a perfect outing for families and friends. Miami City Ballet

Miami City Ballet is today the eighth largest ballet company in the United States, by budget size. It contains 46 dancers with a budget of approximately \$15.5 million. Under the artistic direction of Lourdes Lopez, the company makes four counties in South Florida its home, Broward, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach, and Collier. With a repertoire of 100 ballets, performances showcase a number of world premieres which include George Balanchine's masterworks and works by contemporary choreographers such as Paul Taylor, Twyla Tharp, Jerome Robbins, Christopher Wheeldon and Trey McIntyre. The company also performs classical works such as "Giselle," "Coppélia," "Don Quixote," and "Romeo and Juliet." Internationally, Miami City Ballet has performed in Europe, Great Britain, South America, Central America, and Israel.

With an international mix of dancers who come from the New York City Ballet, Boston Ballet, National Ballet of Caracas, National Ballet of Cuba, and American Ballet Theatre, among others, Miami City Ballet attracts an annual viewing of almost 20,000 for its milliondollar holiday spectacular, "George Balanchine's The Nutcracker."

Miami City Ballet's 29th season opens this October with audience favorites "George Balanchine's The Nutcracker," "Romeo and Juliet" and "Nine Sinatra Songs" along with company premieres of "Richard Alston's Carmen," "Jerome Robbins' The Concert" and a groundbreaking collaboration between choreographer Justin Peck and visual artist Shepard Fairey. www.miamicityballet.org

owntown Fort Lauderdale is known for its great restaurants, beautiful homes, vivacious community, and now has a new attraction:
Segway tours along the New River.

I didn't know much about Segways before I took Fort Lauderdale's latest excursion. The only thought that came to mind when I heard the word "Segway" was that ubiquitous mall cop we've seen rolling around local shopping centers on such a scooter.

Now if I hear the word, dozens of things come to mind: gorgeous homes, million-dollar yachts, picturesque neighborhoods, and a one-of-a-kind experience.

Segway Fort Lauderdale takes the first-time Segway rider and turns him or her into a pro. I had no experience before stepping on the scooter, and while it was daunting at first, I quickly learned that it's really not that hard.

Before the tour began, Jon Rosen led us through a 15-to 20-minute training session. I learned everything from speeding up to quickly stopping, and twirling around in circles, to get familiar with the ride. In just a short amount of time, I felt confident enough to take my skills around Downtown.


Rosen, founder and owner of Segway Fort Lauderdale, explained that being able to try something a little more adventurous and feeling the thrill of conquering a fear is what makes the tour that exceptional.

I can now vouch for that.

I would not consider myself the risk-taking type, so jumping on a Segway was a challenge. The scooter registers body motion, so when you're on one you feel as if you've added wheels to your body, which can come off as terrifying.

However, with Segway Fort Lauderdale, it takes less than five minutes to become a scooter expert. I learned how to balance, make sharp turns, accelerate to its top speed of about 12 miles an hour, and slowly come to a stop, all the while cruising through Downtown's scenic areas.





During my one-hour tour, I saw the largest skyscraper in Downtown, rolled by some of the most famous yachts in the New River, stopped by the historic Stranahan House, and traveled through the Rio Vista residential area, all while putting my new Segway tricks to the test. Before returning to Rosen's home base near Riverfront Cruises, we stopped for a quick break.

I can honestly say that while I was scared at first, Rosen made my first Segway experience fun and extremely gratifying. I was able to see a different, more personal side of Fort Lauderdale as I wheeled around town.

Segway Fort Lauderdale also offers two-hour tours that cover all of the above and a journey over the 17th Street Bridge, where you can overlook Downtown, the beach line, and the Port Everglades all at once.

The two-hour tour generally covers about 10 miles, while the one-hour tour I was on covers about five. Rosen also has Segway tours in Hollywood and Boca Raton.

Regardless of which tour you choose, Segway Fort Lauderdale is a must-do activity for residents and tourists alike. Rosen has taken just about everyone on a tour, including a 92-year-old man. Rated the sixth best thing to do in Fort Lauderdale by Trip Advisor, I guarantee that this fun-filled activity is something you will remember for a lifetime.

Besides seeing the beautiful landscapes and familiarizing myself with all that Downtown has to offer, I have to say the best part of the tour was when Rosen handed me a card saying I was "mall cop certified."

So what are you waiting for? Call Segway Fort Lauderdale and book a tour so you too can become "mall cop certified" and experience Downtown in a whole new light. (1)





piece of the Northeast has just drifted through Port Everglades and we are so happy to have caught it. The Liberty Belle paddlewheel riverboat is the newest and largest addition to Marine Hospitality's fleet, which includes the sightseeing Riverfront Cruises boat and the Anticipation IV and Anticipation V private charter yachts. The Liberty Belle will also be used primarily for private charter events such as weddings, private parties, corporate parties or other special events. Able to carry 600 passengers and coming in at 140 feet long, the Liberty Belle is the

biggest charter yacht in South Florida right now.

Built in Chester, Penn., the Liberty Belle began its journey south when it was bought at auction in August 2013. To date, about \$1 million has been spent on renovations with another \$1 million planning to be spent on other enhancements such as fresh carpeting, wall coverings, furniture, and remodeled bathrooms. The Liberty Belle has now made its home in Fort Lauderdale and first announced its arrival with a July Fourth Fireworks Cruise for its maiden voyage, which hosted passengers of all ages.




Current owner, James Campbell, was first interested in the riverboat because of its iconic style and traditional design. Campbell says that he feels the Liberty Belle is a great addition to the current fleet because it would bring a "tranquil and genteel experience" to canal cruises. Complete with an open deck, seating, bars, dance floor, and best of all, air conditioning, a cruise aboard the Liberty Belle is a trip into the past with the comfortable amenities of the present. Despite lacking the iconic paddlewheel spinning on the back of the boat, few or no riverboats actually utilize the paddlewheel as a propeller anymore and instead are equipped, like the Liberty Belle, with diesel engines that do most of the work. At the end of July, the Liberty Belle hosted Riverwalk

Fort Lauderdale for its Summer Social Cruise, which benefitted Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale, the Fort Lauderdale Women's Club, Rebuilding Together Broward County, Covenant House Florida, Children Diagnostic and Treatment Center, and the Stranahan House Museum.


The Back Story

AUTHOR ELAINE VIETS WORKS BEHIND THE SCENES TO DIG UP DETAILS FOR HER BOOKS

ational best-selling author Elaine Viets turned to mystery writing after a 25-year career as a newspaper reporter and syndicated columnist. Then came her own annus horribilis — her husband was diagnosed with cancer, the stock market crashed and took the couple's savings with it, and the publisher, for whom Viets had been writing a series, cancelled its mystery imprint.

To help make ends meet, Viets took a job as a bookseller at Barnes and Noble. "I learned that people treat an underpaid clerk differently than someone making a hefty salary," she said. She kept notes and used the experience for her second Dead-End Job series book, "Murder Between the Covers," which took place at a fictitious independent bookstore. The main character, Helen Hawthorne, loves the job but wishes — prophetically — that someone would murder her

When the series began, Helen was on the run from her unfaithful ex-husband, to whom a judge had promised one-half of her future income. Rather than hand over a dime, she went on the lam and found employment in Fort Lauderdale, taking a different low-paying job in every book.

"When I worked at Zola Keller on Las Olas for 'Just Murdered.' I noticed that weddings created intense emotions — love, hate, anger. Zola had to be a diplomat to handle the brides and their families."

Things have changed for Elaine ... and Helen Hawthorne. For the first ten books, Helen Hawthorne was on the lam hiding from her no-account husband and had to take those dreadful minimum pay, dead-end jobs. But, romance bloomed and she married Phil Sagemont and they opened a private detective agency in Fort Lauderdale.

Helen is no longer on the lam and co-owns a private investigation business, but Viets still does in-depth research on the jobs presented in the books (now undercover gigs for Helen). For "Catnapped!," Viets worked with a director of the Cat Fanciers' Association and even learned how to wash longhaired show cats. "A cat bath starts with Goop — the hand cleaner — and includes two shampoos, a conditioner and, if it's a white cat, a blue rinse. Then the cats are dried with a special dryer," she explained. "I'm grateful I have self-cleaning cats."

In Catnapped! Fort Lauderdale celebrity socialite Trish Barrymore's no-account accountant husband Mort Barrymore, is found dead. Their pedigreed Chartreux show cat goes missing and even though there is a ransom note for \$500,000 by the catnapper, Trish is the main suspect. Helen and Phil are on the case. And another cattastrophe looms. Their home, Coronado Apartments in Fort Lauderdale, is slated for a teardown when Margery, their landlady, is arrested for murder one.

These days, Elaine is making special appearances, working on her next Dead-End Job book, and her newest book in her equally successful series Josie Marcus Mystery Shopper. 🗓

ull yourself into the world of black holes — the Museum of Discovery and Science presents the new traveling exhibit Black Holes: Space Warps and Time Twists, opening Sept. 20 at noon.


