uilding successful Downtowns can be a beguiling endeavor that can mystify even the most seasoned city leader, economic developer, and urban planner. 


development convene in Fort Lauderdale," said Dennis O'Shea, chairman of the Fort Lauderdale DDA. "Their experience of planning and developing some of the country's most successful and innovative Downtowns is invaluable, and we hope that the exchange will help advance the state of the art."

Focal points of the symposium include connectivity opportunities, housing development, public realm, and other Downtown related issues. James Carras, Principal, Carras Community Investment, Inc. and Downtown Symposium organizer said, "Downtown leaders want to learn from others through best practices and insights from their peers."

I spoke with some of our distinguished guests and asked just what makes their Downtowns so successful. "Charlotte is rooted in 50+ years of innovative vision planning from public and private partners, who believed from the start that a strong Downtown is the foundation of a healthy regional economy," said Michael Smith, president and CEO of Charlotte Center City Partners. "We have a center that is one of the most walkable, bikeable, transit-oriented

Downtowns in the southeast and [we] continue to experience a building boom in housing and office [space]."

That mix of urban ingredients is vital to attracting the kind of momentum that Downtown Fort Lauderdale has also experienced. Charlotte has greatly benefited from the addition of a light rail system that has propelled growth and is currently undergoing an expansion.

Smith continued, "I look forward to attending the upcoming Downtown Symposium in Fort Lauderdale and exploring your urban laboratory and collaborating with leading Downtown executives from across the country."

We'll also hear the innovative tactics of our neighbor, the Miami DDA, which will surely have many success stories to report. "The growing popularity of Downtown Miami is based on the influx of new dining and cultural venues, which continue to help mold a 24-7 urban core that is popular among young professionals, families, and businesses," said Alyce Robertson, executive director of the Miami DDA. "We're excited to share our experiences and learn how other key Downtown organizations have addressed their challenges and opportunities while building a strong urban core."

Further afield in Austin, Texas, Dewitt M. Peart, president and CEO of Downtown Austin Alliance, explained the key to Downtown Austin's vibrant energy and distinctive brand. He said, "Our success is a direct result of having a private/public collaboration and strategic plan focused on keeping Downtown vibrant and welcoming for residents, employees, and visitors," he said. "My objective at the symposium is to exchange ideas and learn of innovative solutions being undertaken to address and solve some of the similar challenges we are all experiencing."

Meanwhile in Kansas City, an urban revival is underway with the help of a brand new streetcar system and many exciting new initiatives. Bill Dietrich, president and CEO of Downtown Council of Kansas City explained,



"There are no silver bullets to Downtown revitalization; you must effectively address all market segments. Through the implementation of a strategic approach that had political leadership, vision, commitment, and recognition of market opportunities, over \$6.5 billion of reinvestment in Downtown was accomplished," he said.

I asked Dietrich what he hopes to learn from the symposium. "Downtown Kansas City is back in the game, but our work is only half complete. We continuously learn from other communities and we look forward to [doing so] at the symposium. There are so many exciting developments occurring in the amazing cities participating at the symposium that we look forward to learning best practices that we can use in our efforts here," he said.

While all our cities share in the fundamental mix of place-making, each has something unique to offer. This event will be a prime opportunity to problem-solve together and learn from what each city does well.

The inaugural event is open to the public and will feature participant presentations and discussions and a keynote speaker, catered lunch, and more. 

Creating Place

CRAFTING A CITY WITH A SOUL THROUGH CREATIVE PLACEMAKING

ities with a soul are not just stops on a map. They are not just a bunch of buildings and streets and residents and businesses within a geographic boundary. Cities with a soul have a certain sense of character and uniqueness. They are alive with complementing features and individual parts that make up a whole.

The economy may be the city's lifeblood, keeping jobs local and amenities and services plentiful, but it's the culture of a community that brings a city to life. Cities with arts and culture truly have a beating heart, you might say.

In Downtown Fort Lauderdale, one of the main arteries that is pumping renewed inspiration and identity into our city is the Mockingbird Trail; the first outdoor urban art exhibition curated by the community, for the community. And while creative placemaking isn't anything new, the Mockingbird Trail is one of the best displays of this practice that I've witnessed in our city.

But before you learn about it and can appreciate the significance of the Mockingbird Trail, understand how projects like this are defined in modern community building. As the book definition reads, creative placemaking projects "intentionally leverage arts, culture, and creativity to serve a community's interest while driving a broader agenda for change in a way that also builds character and quality of place."

Driving an agenda for change. That's powerful! With that definition in mind, as we think about the value creative placemaking has in our community, it's important to understand how a community grows and changes.

Before 1900, the greater Fort Lauderdale community saw very little change and negligible population growth. When the city became incorporated about 100 years ago, there were only 212 residents documented. Over the next several decades, population and the corresponding development patterns expanded almost exponentially.

Broward County went from 40,000 residents in 1940, to 600,000 in 1970, to 1 million in 1980. Today, almost 40 years later, the number of those living between the edge of the Everglades and the Atlantic Ocean has nearly doubled to almost 2 million residents.

As our community grew, it became more homogenized with nondescript development and residential uprooting from our city center. Our boulevards became bordered by strip malls, chain establishments, and big box retail. Of the 31 municipalities within the county, it's often impossible to know when you've left one city and entered another.

This shift in development began to quickly diminish returns on past urban public space investments and started to chip away at the soul of the community. But as new apartments, beer gardens, and millennials moved into the urban core of Fort Lauderdale postgreat recession, a thirst for neighborhood identity and community pride also grew.

Combined with a real need for improvements to the public realm – like parks, sidewalks, bike lanes, and street trees - creative pioneers began to think about relatively quick fixes to our physical community that could also have a meaningful impact to our quality of life.

We began to paint intersections to promote walkability. We grew vegetables on vacant lots. We even simply posted photographs of our neighbors on blank walls to celebrate community. And we imagined a mythical giant bird leaving feathers and eggs and footprints along a secret trail in the city. How fun!

These are today's examples of creative placemaking efforts that celebrate and stabilize community distinctiveness with modest-scale investments. These are the projects that build character and a quality of place, and this is a dramatic change in American economic and community development.

So I hope you are curious enough now to want to learn more about the Mockingbird Trail. I hope you will appreciate what it does for a neighborhood and a community. And until next month, when I tell you all about how this idea of an urban art trail came to be a reality, I hope you look around and celebrate all of the creative placemaking that keeps our city alive. A Unique Approach

INTEGRATING ART AND CULTURE IN TRANSPORTATION AND MOBILITY EFFORTS

rt and culture through transportation and mobility efforts – is this really a thing? Here, at the City of Fort Lauderdale, it certainly is! Transportation and mobility are more than just maintaining traffic flow and providing alternative ways to get around. The City has completed many transportation projects that integrate the arts, redefining what it means to work on transportation and mobility projects in a municipal government.

From artistic intersection and crosswalk design to utility box art wraps and playfully designed bicycle racks, the City is pushing the envelope by taking non-standard approaches to traffic calming and streetscape treatments. The elements of art and culture add beauty to public infrastructure, help to create a sense of place, communicate the intent or context of public spaces, such as gathering areas or pedestrian priority areas, and promote physical activity through active design.

The most recent example is a project on NE First Street, completed as part of the City's Downtown Walkability Program. The project extends from US-1 to NE Third Avenue and includes traffic calming features to slow vehicles down, a designated pedestrian crosswalk for a safe crossing opportunity, the installation of new on-street parking spaces, as well as artistic features. These artistic features include a playful bicycle rack that is a "bookworm" extending an education theme onto the street adjacent to the Next Generation Learning Center. Not only have we witnessed people parking their bikes there, we have also seen toddlers and young kids using it as a jungle gym.

Other artistic features that are to be installed include a sidewalk painting of children holding hands to show the diversity of Fort Lauderdale and bollards that look like colored pencils. In addition to creating a pleasant and visually appealing experience for pedestrians accessing this facility, it provides cues to the drivers about what they can expect as they drive through the area. These visual cues in combination with physical changes to the street, including meandering the lanes, will encourage


appropriate speeds, attentive drivers, and encourage more people to enjoy this stretch on their feet.

Staff considers opportunities to integrate art and culture, as well as sustainability, in every project. The Wave Streetcar will have art features within the stations, as well as artistic wrapping of new communication boxes servicing the streetcar. Staff is also exploring opportunities for boxing art around some of the catenary poles.

The Tunnel Pedestrian Plaza project will include artistic elements to celebrate its history. The Downtown Mobility Hub project, a streetscape project aimed at facilitating connections to all the modes of transportation within a four block area of the Downtown, will include an iconic, functional art element. The SE Sixth Street plaza will redefine the public realm with fun fixtures and a new way of using space that is appropriate for its users, pedestrians, bicyclists, and Wave Streetcar riders. The Las Olas Boulevard project will include a temporary bridge decking over the Himmarshee Canal with an artistic feature celebrating our waterways. The NE 13 Street project will include an artistic sculpture in the middle of a new roundabout. Not only are we focusing on physical art elements, we are also focusing on providing education and awareness through these installations.

The sky is the limit and staff has been encouraged and challenged to take innovative approaches for all of Fort Lauderdale and our visitors to enjoy. Over the next three to five years, you will really start to see the city, Downtown specifically, blossoming with color and




enhance the community. Be sure to register for each of the informative networking Breakfast Meetings Downtown.


Broward Cultural Division is encouraging everyone to be involved in this national initiative, this coast-to-coast collective recognition of the importance of culture, art, and humanity in America.

Intelligent Dialogue

A CALL FOR CONSTRUCTIVE CONVERSATION AND COMMUNITY CONSENSUS

eeping a thriving economy moving requires a lot of work with everyone rowing in the same direction. Unfortunately, there can be strong headwinds. We are beginning to see that right now.

Then there are those who just plain disagree with expansion, progress, and growth. We have been experiencing this for decades. The battle between those who would like the city of yesteryear versus those with their eye on increased density, jobs, and a more diverse economy that can withstand downturns is evident.

A citizens group has garnered enough signatures to force the Fort Lauderdale City Commission to discuss a moratorium on any construction east of Federal Highway to the Atlantic Ocean. Yet another petition forces discussion on use of public lands on our barrier island.

The Chamber always supports intelligent dialogue. However, this technical coup, allowed by the City Charter, is not in the best interest of building community consensus. It puts politicians in an awkward position and fuels fear, uncertainty, and distrust.

A moratorium on construction would be a disaster. Think of all the jobs, tax revenues, and improvements that would be lost. We have a process in place through which developments are approved and constructed. There are a myriad of items a developer must provide throughout the approval process. Public

hearings are held, testimony received, and votes are taken.

What concerns me most is that these "neighbors" were not neighborly enough to try to work things out before using this extreme tactic. There are so many opportunities to engage and overcome concerns.

The contempt some have for our growth pattern is exactly why our organization convenes focus groups and meetings. We have brought leaders together on issues related to transportation, housing, the economy, health, homelessness, sea level rise, financial services, education, and a host of other critical topics.

This fall we will host a Real Estate Roundtable to establish future direction. This needs to be done in order to refresh our focus, gain agreement, and provide common ground. We generated this through our normal planning and budgeting process in 2015 because we forecasted headwinds.

There are a number of other factors that have caused concern. Our building department has come about and is headed in the right direction after turbulent times. New processes are in place. Staff leadership has been hired and is focused.

At a recent Economic Development Advisory Board meeting presentation, it was clear to me that we have capable leaders in place. Several Fiscal Year 16-17 appropriations, not the least of which includes computerization enhancements, are on track and in process.

Issues of concern are discussed every day. We develop master plans, charrettes, strategic vision documents, studies, and reports that cost taxpayers a lot. Most are worth the time and effort. Few are not. All were developed after identification of issues through trust and respect. (1)

An Epicenter of Exploration

FLORIDA HAS THE POTENTIAL TO BECOME THE MARINE RESEARCH HUB OF THE UNITED STATES

hy does a starfish regenerate? What prevents sharks from getting cancer? How much of the ocean is still unexplored? When we think about the fact that 71 percent of the earth is water and 29 percent is dirt, it starts to become clear that the next great scientific discoveries are likely to be lurking somewhere near the bottom of the world's oceans.

Florida is the third largest state in the nation. It has the biggest coral reef in the continental U.S., is the third largest barrier reef ecosystem in the world, and is arguably the most recognizable peninsula in the country. While tourism and retirement are important economic drivers that have dominated the state's history, Florida has the potential to become the marine research hub of the United States, and at the very least, a major worldwide collaborator.

The ocean drives weather, regulates temperature, and ultimately supports all living organisms, but to date, humans have explored less than five percent of it. Over the past few years, however, several of Florida's public and private universities have begun individually and collectively pioneering research into some of the mysteries that could be found in the remaining 95 percent of the undersea world and realizing the ability to monetize potential discoveries.

For example:

- The Mote Marine Laboratory & Aquarium in Sarasota has determined that sharks are genetically similar to humans and is cultivating shark immune cells to see which compounds inhibit the growth of certain kinds of tumor cells.
- The University of Miami and Florida International University have recently discovered that part of Florida's coral reef is actually dissolving into the water faster than it can regenerate, possibly due to the effects of ocean acidification.
- Scientists at Nova Southeastern University are looking for ways people might benefit from the DNA that has allowed sharks to survive for more than 400 million years - leading to help in fighting cancer tumors, healing wounds, building stronger tooth replacements, and halting the growth of bacteria.
- Research being conducted at Florida Atlantic University's (FAU) Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute is dedicated to understanding the ways that currents, tides, and other modes of water movement affect marine ecosystems and planetary processes.
- The Center of Excellence in Biomedical and Marine Biotechnology, also housed at FAU Harbor Branch, was created to support Florida researchers, who are studying the scientific potential of the oceans for drug discovery and biotechnology applications.
- · After securing a five-year lease agreement with the U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) in 2014, researchers at Florida Atlantic University's Southeast National Marine Renewable Energy Center installed the world's first test site for ocean current turbines 13 miles off the coast of Fort Lauderdale to harness energy from the Gulf Stream.

In addition to reinforcing Florida's tourism industry, a healthy ocean supports the marine industry workforce that boasts an annual wage that is 28 percent higher than the state average. As a legacy industry in Florida, the marine industry and its advocates are invested stewards of our water resources and are natural proponents of showcasing marine research as Florida's future marque industry. We are not only committed to protecting the well being of the ocean and its inhabitants, but also determined to support finding the answers to some of our world's most compelling questions. @



A Growing Success

MARANDO FARMS WAS BORN OUT OF THE RECESSION AND HASN'T STOPPED EXPANDING SINCE

he recession of 2007-2009 changed many businesses and a lot of lives, and most not for the better. But looking back, for some, the change of direction may have been a blessing in disguise. For Chelsea and Fred Marando, it's not that the recession was bad luck turned good. It was a time that made them reevaluate their careers. That reevaluation, and a lot of hard work on their part, led to their current success with Marando Farms.

A few years ago, the Marando's both worked in the construction industry. They had survived layoffs in 2007 and 2008 and thought that they had made it through the worst of it. But in 2009, they both found themselves out of work.

Initially, they started to do landscaping just to generate some income. Then they landed a contract with Bank of America to "mow and blow" foreclosed bank properties. In a matter of six months they were handling over 600 properties. "With that we needed [room] to lay down [sod for landscaping], so that's why we initially got this property," Chelsea says. "After a while I really liked this property and found there was a lot of charm to it." Soon they were designing gardens for a few friends and growing produce of their own on the property. "We had both come from family farms," she says. And both went off to college so they wouldn't have to stay on the family farm. But life sometimes comes full circle.

In addition to growing their own produce, Fred and Chelsea started visiting local and regional farmers, introducing themselves and building relationships. They began purchasing a variety of produce from these farmers and bringing it back to their Downtown farm market. Things went so well that after two years they started a CSA, Community-Supported Agriculture.

"A CSA is where we invest in the farmer and during the winter and spring they grow a certain amount of produce for us. That produce gets directly brought back to our farm market and we put it in baskets, bushels, and half-bushels and families purchase a subscription for this produce in advance. So then the family comes and picks up their bushel or basket of fresh produce each week. We do this for 20 weeks during the peak growing season," explains Chelsea.

In addition to running their farm market and CSA and supplying large amounts of fresh and organic produce to many high-end restaurants around Fort Lauderdale, they have built Eat Real Food Community Gardens right on their Downtown property. They've installed 16 raised bed garden plots that are rented out to families or business to grow their own fresh organic produce.

In February 2016, the Marando's purchased 10 acres of land in Davie to develop Marando Ranch. This will be a "destination farm" that is poised to be fun, educational, and tasty. The ranch will be comprised of a country store with locally produced organic eggs, meat, fish, and baked goods. There will be animal observation areas, a catch-and-release pond, a petting farm, on-site honeybees, and u-pick gardens. The ranch will also provide educational workshops on a variety of topics ranging from gardening to healthy eating and everything in between.

Is all this food talk and organic gardening making you hungry? Well, coming this fall, Marando Ranch will be opening a "Farm to Fork" restaurant on the ranch. Chelsea says, "We just want to bring the family farm experience back into people's lives."



The Muralist

ARTIST BILL SAVARESE'S RIVERWALK MURAL CELEBRATES FORT LAUDERDALE'S RICH HISTORY AND LUSH LANDSCAPE

veryone always says that you should do what you love and love what you do. For local artist Bill Savarese, this statement could not be more accurate. Through both residential and also commercial murals, he has created a name for himself in South Florida, and one of his latest designs is now featured on a pump house along the Riverwalk.

Before getting his BFA from the University of Denver, Savarese was encouraged to only minor in art, but decided to forgo the advice of his superiors and make it his major. His career began in 1989, when he won a national competition to paint his first large mural.

Savarese moved to South Florida in 1997 and currently does different types of faux finishing and design work as well, but his murals are the main attraction. The biggest influence for him when painting those murals is the impressionist period, but he clarifies that each individual site determines what mural will go there.

The New Jersey-born artist was commissioned to paint the pump house by the Fort Lauderdale Public Works Department and after a debate about what mural should dress the structure, all parties agreed on a tropical theme. "I worked from a photo I had of the Bonnet House property in Fort Lauderdale, which ended up being my inspiration for the tiki portion," Savarese says. This evocation of the city's history amidst a lush

tropical setting with blue and green hues made passersby stop to take a look while strolling on the Riverwalk. "I had so many people coming up to me saying how great the piece looked while I was out painting," Savarese says.

Although Savarese says he does not fall into the 'starving artist' category, the one issue he does have with his profession has to do with the funding of art projects in our local communities - not just in South Florida, but across the nation. "Artists in general don't have the funding and opportunities that they should have in such a blossoming movement," he says. "People didn't want


temporary installations when I first started out, but murals have become more prevalent. Although I'm becoming very successful, I know the struggle is still there for many artists."

The solution to the lack of funding and available opportunities for artists? "Encourage more spending in the arts," Savarese says. "People on the street really do appreciate the murals and the art, and I really enjoy when I get so much positive feedback from the community when I'm working at a site." His satisfaction comes from people appreciating how he changes their communities. He cares just as much about his art as he cares about the people who experience it.

So what's next? It's fairly classified, but he did say that he prefers painting larger murals. "I love big projects. I now want to focus on larger exterior and interior designs."

The pump house mural on the Riverwalk is located on the north side just east of the Andrews Avenue Bridge and perfectly melds Fort Lauderdale's history with an eye-catching tropical backdrop, while simultaneously blending in with the foliage along the New River. Portrait of a Filmmaker

THE GENESIS OF BRIAN BAYERL'S CAREER AND THE FOCUS
OF HIS CURRENT WORKS

or filmmaker Brian Bayerl, the entire state of Florida is pretty much his hometown. "I was actually born in North Carolina, but literally my dad was on a business trip. I've been down here [in Florida] my whole life," he says. The son of newspaper photographers, who traveled for their profession, Bayerl has lived all over the state – Orlando, Tampa, Tallahassee, Jacksonville, Fort Lauderdale, and most recently Wilton Manors and Hollywood.

Come this November, not far from his new neighborhood, Bayerl will showcase two of his most recent films – *Taylor and Ultra*: *On the 60s, The Factory, and Being a Warhol Superstar,* a short, which premiered at Tribeca, and *Datuna*: *Portrait of America*, a feature released in 2015 – at the upcoming Fort Lauderdale International Film Festival.

During his childhood, his parents' profession made certain industry practices normal for Bayerl. "When I was a kid, I could use the dark rooms at newspapers. I basically had free range, so I would take still pictures. I could process my own film. I could print pictures and develop them right in the dark room. Photographers would come in and wouldn't even bat an eyelash, they were so used to having me in there." His first photograph was published in the *Ocala Star Banner* when he was 10.

During the same time, he remembers grabbing the VHS camera that his grandparents brought down during their visits and shooting mini projects. Among the first were his super eight films. "That was really just me riding down the hill on a skateboard and then we'd go to Colonial Photo and Hobby in Orlando and process it and I could watch it on a little projector."

A distinct crossroads came during high school. He had one elective slot and three options – drama 4, photography 4, and video production 2.

He chose video production. His first narrative projects involved recruiting his friends to play character roles. "[The films] were pretty tasteless," he says. "There was a murder mystery where I was the guy who was murdered. I had all these girls play my ex-girlfriends and there was a detective, who had to interview them and figure out who killed me. Random, weird stuff."

Bayerl went on to major in English at Florida State University (FSU). The experience he got while working on the FSU Student Government movie channel, his own television show, and in his friends' film projects gave him the confidence to start his career. Plus, he technically had been at it since adolescence.

As his day job, Bayerl runs a film production company servicing local clients for corporate work and advertising. Throughout the years, Bayerl has been involved in reality TV shows for networks like Nat Geo Wild and Animal Planet. That pays the bills. His passion, though, is filmmaking.

His "career highs" have been recently consistent editing 8: The Mormon Proposition, which premiered at the Sundance Film Festival, collaborating with director and music documentarian Mark Moorman, and a project that ran on PBS - Full Circle: Before They Were Famous, which chronicles a photographer, who took pictures of Andy Warhol and Robert Indiana.


Released in 2015, Bayerl's Datuna: Portrait of America, follows Georgian-born contemporary artist David Datuna, as he creates his recent piece of the same title. The work showcases the American flag framed by the lenses of reading glasses, which incorporate imbedded graphics and movie clips accessible via Google Glass, the latest in wearable technology. Through software written specifically for this project, a patron, while wearing Google Glass is able to view corresponding video clips of, for example, Steve Jobs or Tesla, which highlight facets of American technology.


Producer Michael Huter, who worked with Bayerl on Full Circle: Before They Were Famous, turned him on to the idea of following Datuna's project from start to finish, a window into his career.

Bayerl flew up to New York to meet Datuna to assess the chemistry between filmmaker and subject – the first step of the filming process and according to Bayerl, the most important. "David and I bonded really quickly as artists," he says. "Once you have that rapport with your subject, you're ready to go."

Shortly after their first meeting, Datuna was diagnosed with stage three lung cancer. "He was very clear that he wanted to finish this project. They were going to show it in Miami during Art Basel week. We decided that we'd keep filming even if nothing ever happened with it."

Datuna didn't tell anyone except for a few close friends and Bayerl about his diagnosis. Sometimes, only Bayerl would accompany Datuna to his chemotherapy and radiation appointments. Fast-forward about a year and a half - Datuna beat cancer, his piece was accepted by the

Smithsonian, and Bayerl's film was released.

"Portrait of America's" theme, technology and innovation, was especially poignant for Datuna. Growing up in Tbilisi, Georgia, as part of the Soviet Union, he remembers his father being arrested eight times in three years for listening to Elvis Presley. Datuna wanted to be an artist. His parents sold everything and moved to America so he could.

One of the most moving moments of the process for Bayerl was filming Datuna and his son in front of an Elvis Presley portrait at a gallery and watching him explain this part of his own history to his son. "His thoughts on freedom and artistic expression and how important it is was really delightful to be around," Bayerl says. "Those kind of moments are the best thing about filmmaking."

DINING DESTINATION: KITCHEN 420

CHINESE RESTAURATEUR TAKES ON "HIGHLY ADDICTIVE" AMERICAN COMFORT FOOD

OWNER Q&A

Christina Wan

You're celebrating 50 years in the restaurant industry, right?

Yes, 50 years in South Florida, but when you talk about the restaurant business in its entirety [as a family], it's been probably beyond 90 years. Before my father was born, my grandfather already had restaurants in China. This is before the Mao Revolution. We're talking about 100 years in this kind of industry.

How did you come up with Kitchen 420's name?

420 is our address. We were coming up with 50 million names. It was originally going to be Kitchen on Fourth, Eat on Fourth, or something on Fourth. And then I said 'It all sounds pretty crazy. What's wrong with 420?' Then my daughter goes, 'Mom, do you know what 420 is?' I said, 'No, are you going to tell me what 420 is? It's my address.'

hristina Wan is no stranger to running restaurants. This marks her 50th year as a restaurateur. Wan's newest venture features a slight deviation from the norm, gourmet Chinese food, the common thread featured in her restaurants in South Florida. This summer, she opened Kitchen 420, specializing in breakfast and American comfort food, with some help from her nephew Alex Kuk, who co-owns the neighboring Temple Street Eatery in the Fresh Market plaza off N. Federal Highway.

"I think we saw that there was a need for breakfast," Kuk says. "Americans love breakfast so much, McDonald's is doing it all day." Kitchen 420, which serves up breakfast and lunch options from 6:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., opened in the middle of June in the space Giraffas Brazilian Grill used to occupy.

Kitchen 420 is all about American classics "made with love." Kuk says, "We felt that [Kitchen 420] would be easier to manage, and something exciting. We know Chinese food. We want to try something new."

For breakfast we're talking about lemon ricotta pancakes served with fresh blueberries; chorizo hash with poached eggs, green chili sauce, and tarragon aioli; and pizza frittata made with kale, roasted mushrooms, tomatoes, caramelized onions, mozzarella cheese, and tomato sauce. The Breakfast Bites portion of the menu serves classic 'before noon' staples like eggs, grits, fruit, and bagels.

Fried green tomatoes, blackeyed pea hummus, chicken and waffles, and sides like cheesy grits, crispy brussels, and blue cheese slaw make the transition to lunch while keeping with the hearty indulgence theme. Salads are also available and slimmed down versions can be requested. Everything is made to order and the sauces and dressings made in-house.

Kitchen sounds greet diners from the get-go, giving off a diner-like feel. Seats are aplenty – tables or booths, with a view of the kitchen staff or not. More than proximity to Temple Street Eatery and Christina Wan's Mandarin House a couple of blocks north, Kuk says the neighborhood drew them to the location. "We love the pockets back here – Victoria Park, Rio Vista, FAT Village. It's almost like San Fran or Chicago."

And the name Kitchen 420? Wan says it's simply the address – 420 N. Federal Highway. @





Chorizo Hash

Serves four

Ingredients:

- 1 lb ground Spanish chorizo
- 8 oz diced roasted poblano peppers
- 6 oz caramelized onions
- 3 lbs potatoes
- 2 tbs garlic powder
- 2 tbs onion powder
- 2 tbs chili powder
- 8 whole eggs
- 3 tbs kosher salt
- 1 tbs ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup distilled vinegar

Method:

Boil potatoes until fork tender for about 35 minutes and let cool to room temperature. Roughly chop potatoes into 1/4" pieces. Add clarified butter to pan and cook chorizo. Add poblanos and caramelized onions to pan and toss to combine. Add potatoes and seasoning to pan, toss together and form into a pancake shape. Once potatoes begin to caramelize, flip.

In pot, bring water to a boil and reduce heat to just below a simmer and add 1/4 cup of distilled vinegar. Poach eggs in liquid for roughly three and a half minutes until whites are cooked and yolk is tender. Plate hash and place eggs on top.




HANDY'S 11th Annual Scholar's Breakfast






Barbara Capeletti
