



FROM THEN TO NOW

ver 30 years ago, prior to the formation of the Riverwalk, the Downtown Development Authority had acquired property and was working with the County and the City to form our County seat, the Judicial Campus, Broward Center for the Performing Arts, two museums, multiple parks, and other Downtown-enhancing amenities along the river.

And about 30 years ago, discussions of a Riverwalk for Fort Lauderdale started assumingly based on another city's successful riverfront. First, there were conceptual discussions, and soon thereafter a team was formed. Feasibility, legal framework, city and county buy-in, funding requirements, land acquisition, design strategies, personnel, marketing, and political backing were just some of the initial steps. Back then, the Riverwalk was primarily owned by the County, the City, and the Downtown Development Authority. Most of the privately-owned properties were vacant lots, which paved the way for the City and County to vacate and acquire the land necessary to create the three plus miles of continuous Riverwalk we have today.

So, we had a team, a vision, a concept, funding, land, and most of the requirements to proceed, or so we thought. To better ensure our success, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization was created to specifically oversee what was a daunting task ahead. This new organization had to oversee the initial stages of the planning of Riverwalk but also set up a structure, recruit board members, fundraise through events, memberships, bricks, banners, grants, and donations, promote, develop relationships with City and County personnel and politicians, and everything else required to build and promote what the visionaries laid out for this new Riverwalk board.

Over the years, our Riverwalk has seen its share of challenges. From financial difficulties, lawsuits, economic cycles, changing politics and politicians, and so on, the picture was always changing and evolving and forever challenging. Over time, the concepts and visions have evolved and recently resulted in a major milestone event, the completion of the north side of the walk and a final design approved for two minor areas on the south side for full completion of the walk.

Now that the Riverwalk's linear park and walk is almost complete, the focus of our growing, evolving, and effective staff and board is on activation. Riverwalk is a connecting linear park within our Downtown's central business district, our County seat, and Broward's judicial system. It has over 3.4 million square feet of retail, Las Olas Blvd., 4.5 million square feet of office space, and 2,500 businesses, including many non-profit organizations. It is at the center of Broward County's most dense population with 13,000 residential units, another 7,000 units under construction or approved, and 1,200 new hotel units. Riverwalk also includes seven parks, multiple colleges, hospitals, and is home to the world-famous Winterfest boat parade, and the soon to be Levitt Fort Lauderdale Pavilion that will be located in Esplanade Park next to the Broward Center for the Performing Arts. We're a thriving community with morning to nighttime activities and it's time to tell our story beyond our local borders. Did our visionaries imagine this 30 years ago? You could not have planned better synergies for a complete Downtown. So, how do we best activate our Riverwalk and promote our Downtown for a far greater reach? Partnerships!

Our past mission was to build the Riverwalk based on the vision developed over the years. Now it's time for activation! We need to build our Downtown and Riverwalk brand to develop regional and national awareness and complement the individual efforts of our partners. We need to present our story through a branding and awareness campaign that reaches the six million residents located within a one-hour drive as well as our tourists so they can come and enjoy all the amazing amenities we have to offer Downtown and on the beautiful Riverwalk. Fort Lauderdale isn't just about our beaches anymore. We need to promote our businesses, including restaurants, bars, retail stores, museums, hotels, non-profits, schools, hospitals, residences, and new

developments, as well as our 100+ annual events, shows, historical district tours and of course our Riverwalk.

When I was asked to ioin Riverwalk's board several years ago I asked, "What is our number one goal?" It was simple: activation. What's the best way to create awareness for activation? Partnerships. At Riverwalk we're excited to be part of this activation partnership and to focus on how best to drive traffic to a fully emerging Downtown. (1)



DRIVERS OF CHANGE

MEET THE NEW DOWNTOWNERS

ith all the growth underway in Downtown Fort Lauderdale you may be wondering who's filling up all this new office and residential space. When the first condos emerged along the New River in the late '90s, we saw mostly empty-nesters from the western suburbs arrive to live the "city life". As thousands of new apartment units have come online in recent years, this city life is truly alive and the social fabric of Downtown has evolved too.

Colliers International presented highlights of Downtown's demographics at our July board meeting. Their findings reflect that the rapid change has been driven largely by... you guessed it: millennials. We've heard all about how this generation, born between the mid '80s and late '90s, is transforming cities across the nation. In the 33301 zip code, which includes much of Downtown Fort Lauderdale, we have a firsthand look.

Thanks to this group, our population is a youthful one with a median age of 36.9 and careers that are on the ascent. For this reason, nearly two-thirds of millennial Downtowners favor renting over buying - which is the exact opposite of the national rate - and they're willing to pay for it. Downtown rental rates grew by more than

27 percent over the last five years, to an average of \$1.66 per square foot. Despite these increases, demand remains strong with an average vacancy rate of just six percent and 2,400 more units under construction.


Millennials are well-educated, health conscious and discerning consumers, who largely value experiences over material possessions. This helps explain why retail companies have increased in-store demonstrations and activities that engage the customer (sip and shop, anyone?).

The report brings other surprising trends closer into focus. The most active tenants in the

Downtown office market are in the e-commerce, wealth management, tech, and law industries - just the jobs many young professionals seek out. Another intriguing trend is the effect telecommuting and co-working has had on office leases. Companies are requiring less space as more employees work remotely and fewer desire the large corner office. That's good news for budgetconscious startups since the average full service office lease in Downtown is \$38.71 per square foot, up 28 percent over the last three years.

Suburban office tenants are increasingly drawn to the Downtown core because of its vibrant energy and array of amenities, even though Downtown rents are 40 percent more than in the rest of the county. With more employees and residents in the urban core, the commercial market is just getting started with close to 200,000 square feet of new retail space under construction.

While metrics like these help define our changing population, Downtown Fort Lauderdale is much more than statistics. It's a vibrant, dynamic city representing a full spectrum of people and lifestyles. To that end, we welcome all newcomers and the new energy and change they bring. @

TRANSIT OF TOMORROW

HOW TRANSPORTATION IS CHANGING WITH THE TIMES IN FORT LAUDERDALE

ember the promises of the future? They included supersonic airplanes, recreational space travel, magnetically levitated trains, and flying cars. I'm fascinated with technology, how it works, and the potential positive impact it can have on society. I was inspired by what I saw in *Popular* Science, Popular Mechanics and what I experienced at Disney's Tomorrowland, EPCOT Center, and two world fairs. They promised future housing solutions in dense urban centers and fantastic ways to move people around and between cities. It represented optimism at its best.

Today we don't have flying cars (yet), we don't have monorails

whisking us around on elevated tracks, we no longer have supersonic passenger airplanes (are we going backwards?), and maglev trains are few and far between. However, there is technology that has been developed and is under development that is pretty incredible. Passenger travel is changing. Rideshare companies have transformed the taxi service industry. We're also getting ever closer to an electrically powered and driverless future with car-to-car communication potentially giving us a quantum leap in efficiencies and safety. In addition, businessman and inventor Elon Musk is reviving an old concept and proposing a train that can travel at speeds exceeding 600 miles per hour.

While all that may represent the future, today Fort Lauderdale is getting the Wave Streetcar in our Downtown; plus a Downtown stop for the Brightline high speed train connecting southeast Florida with Orlando; and Tri-Rail is pursuing bringing trains east of I-95. While these options aren't representative of fantastic future technology, they are tried and true methods for reliable, efficient, and cost effective transportation. When considered in conjunction with our port and international airport, it's an exciting time in our city.

The City of Fort Lauderdale's building division processed approximately 30,000 building permits over



the last 12 months. Over the same time period, the Development Review Committee, which reviews large-scale development projects, has processed approximately 85 commercial and residential applications that have moved on to the construction phase. Further, the city was recently granted an additional 5,000 residential units and is seeking access to more.

Fort Lauderdale's current population is approximately 178,000 while Broward County's population is approximately 1.8 million with substantial population increases anticipated for both the city and county by 2030. These new technologies will allow for more efficient design of parking structures, better use of available road space, and safer roads for cars, bikes, and pedestrians. But, with population projections for Broward County indicating 2.5 million people by 2030, we need mass transit options as well.

The truth is many people can't afford a car and others don't want to own one. All the potential of driverless cars and ridesharing still represents cars on the roads. Given the population projections in relation to roads we cannot expand, mass transit is the best way forward. The Wave, Brightline, and Tri-Rail east of I-95 give Fort Lauderdale needed connections locally and regionally and only help to move our great city forward.



Riding the Sun Trolley is just like hailing a cab; simply "Wave 'n' Ride" and stand in a safe location anywhere along the route and the trolley will pick you up.

As of Aug. 19, 2017, the Sun Trolley offers a new way to explore Fort Lauderdale by conducting guided tours on the third Saturday of each month. 

GROWING UPWARDS

TAKING A PULSE OF DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT

nother season is about to begin. After the heat of the summer it is nice to look forward to spending more time outside and enjoying all the amenities Downtown Fort Lauderdale has to offer. If you look around Downtown, you can see cranes and construction activity all around us. It is clear the city is experiencing tremendous growth. To provide a sense of the quantity of development currently underway, following are some statistics.

One development segment that is growing exponentially in Downtown Fort Lauderdale is hotel rooms. There are currently less than 400 hotel rooms available but there are over 850 hotel rooms under construction (with more approved or in review). With the tripling in the supply of Downtown hotel rooms, it will be vitally important to develop new sources of visitors to occupy all the hotel rooms. This will bring a tremendous influx in activity and vibrancy to the area.

There are also over 1,650 residential units currently under construction. When those units are complete, and ultimately occupied, that will lead to thousands of new residents in our Downtown, adding much activity to our city core.

With all the new visitors and the new residents will come demand for more restaurants, retail stores, and office space. Developers have over 130,000 square feet of new retail space and over 40,000 square feet of commercial office space under construction to serve those needs.

It looks like utilizing rooftops is coming to Downtown Fort Lauderdale! The Restaurant People are planning a restaurant/bar named Rooftop at the corner of Las Olas and Andrews Avenue, which should be open this season. The 788 East Las Olas building should be completed this fall and the Riverside Hotel plans to utilize the rooftop as function space for banquet events. The Dalmar Hotel, being built near NE Third Street and Federal Highway, is also planning rooftop event space with private dining capabilities for mid-2018.

In addition to all the activity of developers, Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale is the catalyst in building and nurturing Riverwalk as a vibrant community connected by the New River. The recent completion of the extension of the Riverwalk to Riverwalk Laura Ward Park and Las Olas Boulevard is a tremendous addition to our Downtown. There is a free Riverwalk Water Trollev service available and the water taxi is also available.

We have unique ways of traveling through our Downtown, and beyond!

The Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce's Downtown Council hosts a monthly breakfast at the Tower Club. The September breakfast will be Sept. 28 at 7:30 a.m. Bob Swindell, the president of the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance, will be the speaker on the topic of the skills gap. CULTURE MEANS CAPITAL

BROWARD'S ARTS AND CULTURE SECTOR IS A \$414.2 MILLION INDUSTRY

he results are in. Arts and culture in Broward County account for \$414 million in spending. What does this mean?

Released in June 2017, the Arts & Economic Prosperity 5 (AEP5) report documents the economic impact of the nonprofit arts and cultural industry. Conducted by Americans for the Arts, the nation's nonprofit organization for advancing the arts in America, the report included Broward County as one of 341 study regions across the country.

In 2015, Broward's nonprofit arts and cultural organizations spent \$148.5 million, which leveraged a remarkable \$265.7 million in additional spending by their audiences.

The study also concludes that Broward County's arts sector accounts for 11,078 full-time jobs and generates \$40.1 million in local and state government revenue. This spending directly impacts local businesses such as restaurants, hotels, parking garages, and retail stores.

"The data is clear. The arts are not a charity; they are an industry," said Earl Bosworth, director of the Broward Cultural Division. "While they support a quality of life that we all know and appreciate, the arts are also a significant economic driver in Broward County."

The impact of spending by nonprofit arts and cultural organizations is far reaching. Sixty three percent of nonresident survey respondents indicated that the primary purpose of their visit to Broward County was, "specifically to attend this arts/ cultural event." Nonresident attendees also spent an average of 66 percent more than local attendees. This finding demonstrates the power of the arts to attract visitors to the community. A vibrant arts and culture industry helps local businesses thrive.

Communities that support the arts and culture not only enhance their quality of life, but they also invest in their economic well-being.



ACTING OUT

CHILDREN LEARN LIFE SKILLS AT FLORIDA'S OLDEST CHILDREN'S THEATER

ort Lauderdale Children's Theater (FLCT) is an educational organization that trains Pre-K through high school students. The FLCT produces five large main stage plays annually, split between family for-allages productions and their Teen Repertory Series that tackles some more serious topics. Each year between 250-300 students participate in FLCT programming.

Executive artistic director Janet Erlick explains, "The Florida Children's Theater was founded in 1952 by two moms in a garage because there was nothing cultural for their children to do. In 1992, in addition to stage plays, we started doing community outreach programs in the schools. We were doing programs addressing issues like bullying long before it was the hot cultural topic it is now. The outreach programs offer one-act plays and workshops like Literacy Through Drama, which enhance reading comprehension skills using theater."


The skills learned in the theater may be more important now than ever for young people, shifting their attention to something other than technology. "Here we look at every aspect of communication, of speaking, at listening, being able to handle creative problemsolving," says Erlick. When things do not go right in a live theater production, the students need to think on their feet. Besides being the actors, they also handle the technical and stagecraft aspects of the show. They are running lights and sound and stage-managing all aspects of the production. So if something goes wrong in real-time, they have to solve the problem in real-time.

Those are the great life skills they learn that they cannot get from a computer or smartphone.

Erlick says, "Art is the great equalizer. It reaches across all cultures, learning styles, and abilities, infusing the arts within the academic curriculum and getting back to what we are hard-wired to learn. We learn through rhythm, repetition, music, drawing, and creativity. Try to learn the ABCs without that famous ABCs tune. We are creative beings and that is the way we learn about and explore our world."

Today, games and toys are very literal. There is no room for imagination. Creativity and attention spans are shrinking. Erlick points out, "There is so much more pressure on young people and many are overscheduled. There is no time for daydreaming and time to do nothing, which is so critical to creativity." One of the alarming trends is the lack of imaginative play. Erlick gives this example, "There is a simple improv game called "This Is Not a Pen", where children sit and pass a pen around and say, 'This is not a pen, this is a telescope', (holding it up to their eye) or 'This is not a pen, this is a flute', (blowing into it). That has never been a difficult game in the past; now they have a harder time initially with games like that. In the arts, you have to keep coming back to a part, a painting, a story - creating and refining. Nowadays everything is so instant there is no time for refining and reflection, whereas in the theater kids are working a show for eight to 10 weeks, where there is constant refinement."

The Florida Children's Theater is a unique experience. I know of few other activities, courses, or apps that will teach young people perseverance, confidence, empathy, teamwork, and the flexibility to handle change, like live theater.



VALUABLE UPDATES

HELPING FIRST RESPONDERS AND ASSESSING TAXABLE VALUE

n this column, I share how excited we are about a new state law to help first responders and I tell you of other ongoing work at the Broward County Property Appraiser's office.

First Responder's Disability Exemption

The property tax exemption for certain totally and permanently disabled first responders and surviving spouse's bill was recently implemented. This bill allows for a Florida first responder who is totally and permanently disabled as a result of injuries sustained in the line of duty to be exempt from taxation on their Homesteaded property. There are specific requirements for this exemption so please contact my office if you have any questions.

As a result of this newly enacted Florida law, I had the privilege of signing up totally and permanently disabled Florida first responders for a full exemption from all ad valorem taxes. One of the first to receive this exemption was Howard, a former Broward Sheriff's deputy who became totally and permanently disabled while assisting other first responders at Ground Zero after the 9-11 attacks. Our first responders are true heroes and deserve whatever assistance we can provide, but more importantly our respect and appreciation.

Estimate of Taxable Value

On June 30, I certified the 2017 Estimate of Taxable Value for the various taxing authorities. For months, the employees of our office have been working diligently to determine the value of all property in Broward County. These property assessments are important because the property tax a property owner pays is determined by the assessed value of the property, less any tax-saving exemptions, times the millage rate, plus any non-ad valorem fees set by local taxing authorities. The tax roll certification I signed certifies that these values are accurate and correct.

In Broward County, there was an overall increase in taxable value of 9.32 percent, including new construction, with the taxable value for existing properties increasing 7.82 percent in the county. This increase is based on the sales from Jan. 1, 2017 back through Jan. 2, 2016. Florida law requires our assessments to be a year in arrears meaning the current real estate market will impact the 2018 property assessments. These values are significant because they are used by the county, school board, cities, and other taxing authorities to set their budgets for the upcoming fiscal year.



TAKING A LIFT OF FAITH

IFLY IS GIVING THRILL SEEKERS A CHANCE TO TACKLE HUMAN FLIGHT HEAD ON

hree of the top fears for most Americans are: fear of flying, public speaking, and heights. Since skydiving includes two of these three, one would think few people would try the sport. It would be like an activity that required you to do public speaking in a pit full of snakes – not likely! However, skydiving is very well-liked and it continues to grow in popularity. According to the United States Parachute Association, during 2016, there were an estimated 3.2 million jumps in the United States alone.

iFLY Indoor Skydiving is the latest in active entertainment to come to South Florida. iFLY gives people of all ages and abilities a chance to experience skydiving in a unique, safe, and controlled environment. Instead of falling from the sky, you are floating on an uplifting rush of air. You can experience the freedom of floating, turning, and flying in midair, without having to throw yourself out of a perfectly good airplane.

Whether you have skydived before or always wanted to, but have trepidations, iFLY in Davie may be the perfect resolution to your dilemma. With the help of iFLY instructors (all International Body Flight Association certified), people learn to control their bodies in the air and practice real human flight. Every flier goes through a brief safety training class that gives you the basics of what to expect and teaches you the hand signals used by your instructor to communicate with you in the flying chamber. After your ground instruction and once you are geared up with a flight suit, goggles, and a helmet, the only requirement is for you to thrust your pelvis out and lean into the air-filled flight chamber door. Once inside the chamber, your instructor will also customize the wind speed according to your experience and body type. The first time inside the chamber your instructor will guide you through a few maneuvers and get you comfortable. Your session allows you to come back into the chamber for a second time when you are given more freedom to fly on your own.

Outdoor skydivers use iFLY as well, as an environment to train. Almost 20 percent of fliers at iFLY are people who skydive outdoors all the time but want an easy, low-cost place to practice. Countless people try skydiving indoors before going up. There are many people who have never jumped out of an airplane but who love to fly inside. Many who train here also compete in indoor skydiving competitions around the world.

After the conclusion of my flight, our instructor Jake gave us a little show of what a truly skilled indoor flyer can achieve. He flew around like Spiderman – flying up to the top of the chamber, sticking to the walls then streamlining his body like a missile and streaking down to the bottom of the chamber before flattening out to stop a foot below the chamber floor. I want to get that good!

Just to prove you did it or to get a hundred "likes" on your Facebook page, the iFLY facility is also equipped with a full variety of media recording devices. The day after your flight you receive a link to photos and video of your experience, which are available for purchase.





IN GOOD SPIRITS

HUNTING FOR DISTILLERIES WHILE ROAD-TRIPPING NORTH

hose who know Jonny and me, know we like a good cocktail – and with an olive or piece of fruit it can be considered dinner. As we travel, we have stopped at distilleries like other travelers stop at historic sites. And in 2017 it's easier than ever to find distilleries outside the ones on the famous Bourbon Trail. Gin, vodka, rum, bourbon and even some single malt whisky are showing up in unexpected places – often in conjunction with a brewery. At last count there were more than 1,300 micro distillers in the US – nearly in all 50 states and Washington DC.

"We did the mash" – a line from a goofy old song. Mash – fermented ground barley, yeast, and pure water – is used in both beer brewing and sprit making with the base of beer being further fermented before being distilled into alcohol. Other spirits, notably bourbon, use corn and rye as well. Wheat is often the grain of choice in vodka, although potatoes were/ are used and brandy and cognac are grape based.

Any area that is known for great orchards usually has a favorite brandy or liqueur made nearby. Gin is basically vodka with infused botanicals (Juniper *must* be present for it to be called gin) and rum is made from fermented sugar cane and/or molasses. The individual touches come from the barrels used for storage as well as the length of time of storage. Bourbon, for example, must be aged in new charred white oak barrels.

We think the crafters are having fun if the names are anything to judge by. You won't find them in our local markets due to distribution agreements, federal laws, and just plain production limitations – but most liquor stores in each state now have a section devoted to locally-made spirits. In the Midwest even some grocery chains have hometown hooch (Meijers comes to mind).

PLACES WE TRIED ON OUR TRAVELS:

- **Angel's Envy** (Downtown Louisville, KY) the renovated building is as elegant as the whisky
- Hard Truth Distillery (Nashville, IN) where the brewmaster generously gave us a bottle of their gin
- White Vodka (Vermont Spirits, White River Junction, VT) distilled from whey, yes, a dairy product
- Death's Door Distillery (Middleton, WI) single malt whisky
- Iron Fish Distillery (Thompsonville, MI) bourbon aged in maple syrup barrels
- Finger Lakes Distillery (Burdett, NY) for McKenzie Whisky's unaged "Glen Thunder"

If we go west next year a stop will be Feisty Spirits in Colorado to try single grain whisky made from millet or kamut. We would consider traveling to Tahoe just to try "Hot Stinking Garlic Vodka". Or maybe not. Cheers!



GABRIELA ESQUIVEL

TITLE OF WORK: FROM WINTER TO SPRING

aking in a Gabriela Esquivel painting is like walking into your most vulnerable yet treasured memory, uninhibited, and pausing as rekindled feelings or moments take a stronghold. It's almost as if the painting can't let you pass without gently tugging on your figurative heartstrings.

Esquivel, a native Costa Rican who lives in Fort Lauderdale, studied art for 11 years in Puerto Rico. From the time she was three she took painting lessons from various artists including those with Swiss, Costa Rican, and Puerto Rican backgrounds. But her career as an artist didn't blossom until she sold her first painting in 2004. She says, "I've painted in different mediums during my life: pastels, oil, tempera, and now acrylic on

canvas. I have one piece painted on wood that I think I painted when I was five years old."

Music is a big part of what inspires Esquivel. It helps her stay focused and motivated through everything. "Sound and music are part of my daily life," she says. "I started studying music in Puerto Rico and I'm still a music student here in Fort Lauderdale. I study piano. Music influenced one of my painting collections called, "Sound of the New Sun". In this collection I try to reach peace, inner balance, and freedom through sound and color."

Her deep connection to each painting is significant and diverse. "Usually, they belong to collections. These collections have spiritual, expressionists, symbolists,

and surrealists themes. I paint inner worlds, the journey of the soul. Daily life inspires me as an artist." Although she wears her heart on her canvas, she still faces tough challenges. "My biggest challenge as an artist is to be able to continue being an artist every day. Sometimes life gets in the middle and I have to be very focused to keep the creator being alive."

During December 2015 and 2016, she participated in Spectrum Art Fair, during Art Basel Week. She is also offering a Brushes and Sangria course in Fort Lauderdale at the Village Design Art Gallery, for inquiring minds.
