


These are only a few of the upcoming events and happenings so I trust that you will make a note in your calendar to participate.





examples of decades-long companies that have shaped the community by volunteering their time and resources to make it better.



IN THE OPEN AIR

FROM THEN TO NOW – FORT LAUDERDALE MAKES STRIDES TOWARDS A PEDESTRIAN-FRIENDLY DOWNTOWN

The theme for this month's issue is Fort Lauderdale alfresco and that brings to mind many, many things. Being in the open air is the primary connotation, but many people think of alfresco dining, and I do too. But, it got me thinking about just being outside in the fresh air and what that means in an urban area.

I can't think of a city I've ever been to that doesn't have pedestrian areas (plazas, sidewalks, parks, etc...). Some cities do it much better than others and Fort Lauderdale is no different. There are some areas that could use improvement in our city, but Fort Lauderdale has made huge strides in the right direction and continues to be committed to the effort.

Our Downtown is a prime example, in my opinion, of a city doing it right. When the City adopted the Downtown Master Plan back in 2003 it made a commitment to require wide sidewalks and to have the streets lined with shade trees so we could all have a comfortable walk.

I moved to Florida in 1994 and since then I've heard for years how nobody in South Florida walks. Well, I'm here to say that's completely untrue. Go to our Downtown any time of the day (weekday or weekend) and you will see people walking all over the place. From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., it's generally business people getting to and from offices and restaurants, but the big indicator is what happens after the businesses close. When I first moved here, the Downtown was empty after 5 p.m. and pretty much on the weekends as well. Flagler Village hardly saw any people walking around after 5 p.m. (or before for that matter) and almost none at night. Now, you can go Downtown and see people walking everywhere. Flagler Village is full of people jogging, walking their dogs or just heading out to somewhere local for drinks with friends.

This has to do with many factors, not the least of which is all the new residential properties that have opened in the last decade. But, you can't ignore the importance of being comfortable and feeling safe when you walk down the sidewalk.

Unfortunately, we can't always get it exactly the way we want. Maybe the available space isn't quite enough or we have water, sewer, electric, and cable running below ground or above our heads (hopefully just the electric and cable are above our heads), so we have to compromise here and there or ask for additional space from private property owners. But, in every case of new development the City's Urban Design & Planning Division of Sustainable Development (shameless plug) works hard to get the best public sidewalk experience around.

So next time you're driving your car in Downtown



Fort Lauderdale take note of the people you see walking around alfresco. If you live, visit or work Downtown, especially during our fall and winter months, get outside and enjoy the city. It can be relaxing, it gets you exercise, and now it comes with more shade. Go down the Riverwalk – it's especially nice!

REIMAGINING NE 13TH STREET

TRANSFORMING FORT LAUDERDALE INTO A CITY FOR PEOPLE, NOT JUST CARS

hen I drive down many of our city streets, I always try to see the potential for a public place to not only move cars but also transport all people while promoting the art, character, and businesses of the neighborhood. Many of the advocates, business owners, and neighbors saw this same potential when they looked at NE 13th Street.

The City of Fort Lauderdale partnered with the Central City Alliance, the Fort Lauderdale Central City Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), Broward County, and others beginning in 2014 to transform NE 13th Street between NE Fourth Avenue and NE Ninth Avenue into a complete street for all modes of transportation. After various public outreach meetings to develop the design of the project, construction on NE 13th Street began in 2016 and concluded in October 2017.

This project was a labor of love for all those who saw NE 13th Street as more than a road to drive through but a destination to come to. This project improved the streetscape by adding on-street parking, bike lanes, wider sidewalks, pedestrian lighting, and landscaping improvements. Improving traffic flow while maintaining travel speed, wider sidewalks separating pedestrians from vehicles, and a dedicated space for bicycles created a walkable corridor while improving safety for people along the street.

The City of Fort Lauderdale and our partners celebrated this amazing achievement by hosting a ribbon cutting event on NE 13th Street on Oct. 21. As a part of the event, there was a Funky Fun Run 5K, a ribbon cutting ceremony featuring City officials and partners, a street festival with live music, art, food vendors, and family activities, and a Unity Beacon lighting ceremony.

One of the new features of the project is the addition of a roundabout at the intersection of Old Dixie Highway and NE 13th Street. This roundabout was added to the project in order to serve as a tool to protect bicyclists and pedestrians that also use the street. Roundabouts can not only help save lives but also improve traffic flow, reduce pollution and fuel use, and provide aesthetic landscaping and artwork to the area.

When using the roundabout at NE 13th Street or anywhere in the city it is always important to:

- Watch your speed as you approach the roundabout
- Yield to any pedestrians or bicyclists crossing at the designated crosswalk
- Look to your left and yield to traffic already in the roundabout
- Enter the roundabout when there is a safe gap in traffic
- Use your right turn signal before you exit the roundabout

This project has already begun to make a positive impact in the business community around NE 13th Street with the submittal of at least four new

developments on the corridor. Through a truly collaborative experience and shared vision, we have been able to reimagine NE 13th Street as an iconic corridor in our city for years to come. My hope is that we can continue to leave this impact on other streets and neighborhoods throughout the city. The next time you drive in the city, just take a moment to imagine what a street could be, not just what it has always been, so that together we can transform Fort Lauderdale into a city for people not just vehicles. 

WORKFORCE SKILLS GAP STUDY

FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS UNIQUE TO BROWARD COUNTY

t a recent Chamber breakfast co-hosted by the Downtown Council and the Education Committee of the Chamber, we heard from Bob Swindell, President and CEO of the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance. Swindell shared with us the results of a Workforce Skills Gap Study done by Boyette Strategic Advisors. The study was done for targeted industries identified by the Alliance and focused on skilled, high-wage jobs. There were 31 findings that came out of the study.

Half of employers noted that it is difficult to find workers due to a lack of technical or soft skills and differences in salary expectations. One-third of companies surveyed said it is hard to recruit from outside South Florida. A disparity exists between the cost of living in Broward and our wage scales. Broward County has a cost of living index of 110 while Austin, Texas has an index of 99.1. However, the average hourly employee earns 25 percent more in Austin than in Broward. Part of this is attributable to our hospitalitybased economy, with many service level employees. However, it is important that we provide career ladders for workers.

Seventy percent of high school students say their families expect them to attend a four-year college. While 68 percent of high school students attend college, 40 percent never graduate (but have the debt from attending), and 37 percent are in jobs that do not require a four-year degree. The present trend in high schools is to prepare all students for college, regardless of the student's interests or passion. However, there is an urgent need to bring vocational training back to high schools.

Opportunity occupations pay more than 15 percent above the average pay and do not require a four-year degree. Broward Public Schools have made career and technical education a priority and are expanding these programs to meet this need. The study identified distressed areas in our county where internet in a household is not a given. It is important to connect lower skilled adults with middle skill pathways and bring training to them.

Broward County has been number one in job growth for months. We have more than 300,000 college students in the region. There are 63,000 students enrolled annually in Broward College, recently named one of the top three community colleges in the nation by the Aspen Institute. Nova Southeastern University, recognized for high research activity by the Carnegie Foundation, has 24,000 students. We also have Career Source, which has the best workforce development programs in the country.

remember one of my coaches in high school telling me to run to where I wanted the ball and "we will get it to you." It worked. Wayne Gretsky's famous quote was similar. "I skate to where the puck is going to be..."

We know where we want to be in 2030: we must create and sustain 72,000 net new jobs in order to maintain current unemployment. That means we must have new companies. We must have a stable and growing talent pool. We must have transportation solutions preventing gridlock. We must have a financial services industry with money to lend. COMING SOON TO THE RIVERSIDE HOTEL: A NEW RESTAURANT, FITNESS CENTER, AND ROOFTOP EVENT SPACE

Utdoor dining is a hallmark of Florida. Here in Fort Lauderdale, we are taking alfresco dining to new levels as more restaurants in the Downtown are opening on rooftops and along the river. Eating inside in an air-conditioned space is ok in the heat of the summer, but when the weather changes, I want to be outside. Why do we love eating outside? It is a picnic with no work. It is a visit with Mother Nature for a meal. It is a nice dose of stress relief. That is why we should all be excited by the new venues that are adding outdoor eateries to the Downtown. Leading the charge is the Riverside Hotel.

According to Las Olas Company President Michael Weymouth, the Riverside Hotel will be opening a new restaurant along the river. "As more outdoor restaurants and cafés are in demand along the river, we decided to create a new restaurant – The Riverside Boathouse. We are hoping to open sometime in December. Ideally, we are shooting to be open by the boat parade," explained Weymouth. The Boathouse will be a Mediterraneanthemed restaurant with a range of food and price points. "We will have tapas plates starting at around \$6 and a diverse selection of entrees in the \$14 - \$16 range." Another feature of the Boathouse is the ability to walk right out of the restaurant and be on the Riverwalk or catch water transportation.

In addition to the restaurant, the Riverside Hotel is adding a 4,500 square foot gym facility and a significant outdoor event deck. Weymouth points out, "When the hotel was built in 1936 they did not take [fitness] into consideration. Moreover, as the hospitality industry has evolved, we realized fitness



centers have become more important. We recognize that it's something we have not been providing to our guests. So we decided to relocate the corporate offices and consolidate some of the departments of the hotel, thus, freeing up room for the restaurant and fitness center. So we are going from a room with a few free weights to a state-of-the-art fitness center and spa that will have a spectacular view overlooking the pool and the New River."

The new rooftop event space will be located in the recently completed addition – Las Olas Plaza just to the east of the hotel along Las Olas. This third-floor outdoor terrace will be on the third-floor level, which is a perfect elevation, sitting just above the treeline with views of the river and Downtown. The event deck will be able to accommodate up to 800 people with full back-of-house facilities. "We took the entire rooftop area, which is about 13,000 square feet and we are making it into an event deck. It is open-air, but we also can put up tents and have installed enough restrooms and facilities to handle any



event," said Weymouth. This event space will be programmed by the hotel's Sales and Catering Department. (9)

IN CASE OF DISASTER

HURRICANE IRMA CATASTROPHIC STRUCTURAL DAMAGE REPORT FORM

s our community recovers from Hurricane Irma, many people may have experienced storm damage to their properties. There are provisions in the law that pertain to your property assessment should your property sustain catastrophic damage due to a hurricane, fire or other calamity. Examples of structural damage include significant roof damage, damage to load-bearing walls or damage to the foundation of your home. While downed trees, fences, roof leaks and missing shingles/tiles may be difficult or expensive to repair, they do not affect the structural integrity of the home or make the home uninhabitable.

If you have sustained catastrophic structural damage to your property, it is important you let our office know so we can arrange for one of our appraisers to inspect the property. We have created a simple online form to make this process easy for you. The online Hurricane Irma Catastrophic Structural Damage Report form is located on our website at www.bcpa.net or www.bcpa. net/DamageForm.asp

It is important to know that the Property Appraiser's office cannot adjust your 2017 property assessment or taxes as a result of damage sustained by Hurricane Irma. Damage to your property as a result of Hurricane Irma may impact your 2018 property assessment assuming the repairs have not been completed by Jan. 1, 2018.

2017 TRIM Season

Our office has just completed the 2017 TRIM season having mailed 748,108 real property and 23,159 tangible personal property TRIM Notices to property owners and businesses in Broward County. After mailing these TRIM Notices, we assisted over 20,000 property owners seeking information about the TRIM Notice or late filing of exemptions.

The deadline for petitioning the 2017 property assessment has passed. Anyone seeking to file a 2017 value appeal must contact the Value Adjustment Board directly or use the www.bcvab.broward.org/axiaweb2017/ for details on "good cause" late filing. Since the September late filing deadline has passed, we are unable to accept any more 2017 exemption applications regardless of any good reason for missing the late filing deadline.

If you purchased your property in 2017, you can prefile for 2018 Homestead Exemption at any time. You can apply online at www.bcpasecure.net/homesteadonline/ web/index.aspx, in our main office or at one of our many outreach community events. Our Outreach Community calendar, available on our website, lists all of the events where we will have a representative available to assist residents with exemption filing or other related matters.



BLUEPRINT FOR THE BETTER

FOR SIX MONTHS STARTING THIS FALL, THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE WILL INSTALL A PROTECTED BIKE LANE ON LAS OLAS BOULEVARD IN AN EFFORT TO REACH ITS GOAL OF ZERO FATALITIES ON LOCAL STREETS

he City of Fort Lauderdale is auditioning an initiative that will make a huge impact on both Las Olas Boulevard and those who frequent it. For six months, starting this fall, the City will be installing a temporary protected bike lane on the boulevard between 11th and 15th Avenues. Why the change? Take a stroll down memory lane.

The very first automobile hit North American streets in 1789 thanks to a forward-thinking inventor and engineer named Oliver Evans. Since then, the mobility of humans has catapulted from one horsepower to as much as 740 horsepower. The average household owns or leases around one car per driver, which translates into an increase in traffic flowing down our boulevards, avenues, and lanes. It's 2017 and people are on the move now more than ever before.

Our streets cater to a local crowd, which includes more than just drivers. Multimodal transportation is a buzz term that has been gaining traction as cities have turned their attention to enhancing the transportation experience for pedestrians and bike riders. Fort Lauderdale, a trendsetter in its own right, has also tapped into this need.

After a mobility study conducted in 2013, the Colee Hammock neighborhood, which juts up against Las Olas Blvd. wanted to take steps to make their neighborhood safer for those who use the streets by foot, bike, and vehicle. This initiative is one way to work towards Vision Zero – the City's goal of eliminating all fatalities caused by vehiclerelated accidents. The Las Olas parking protected bike lane, the first of its kind in South Florida, will serve to give bikers a space on the road to make them feel safe during their travels.

In preparation for the six-month trial run, the City will be demarcating boundaries of the lane by removing the white line already on the street and replacing it with removable paint and temporary delineators. Catherine Price, Department of Mobility project manager, says the idea is to, "repurpose the asphalt to increase mobility for other users, i.e. bicyclists." Bright green coloring will highlight the protected bike lane at intersections and intermittent planters will also provide an aesthetically pleasing aspect to the initiative.

Travelers will also notice a bright green bike box at intersections. Price explains, "It gives priority to the bicyclists. They stand and wait at the signal in front of the vehicles so the bicyclists have a lead time before the vehicles to get out of the intersection." This box will allow bike riders to position themselves in front of vehicles so that they are able to proceed without threat of collision and will also allow bikers to make left turns safely.

The bike lane test run will last through next spring when it undergoes a thorough evaluation. Residents and visitors can educate themselves on the way the lane is supposed to operate using the resources provided by the City. They can also provide feedback about the success of the project. As the rubber continues to meet the road, the City plans to educate pedestrians, drivers, and bikers on protected bike lane etiquette in order to ensure the initiative goes smoothly and can be evaluated properly.

According to Monique Damiano, City of Fort Lauderdale public information specialist, "The initiative is in response to something our neighbors have repeatedly told us in our neighbor surveys... They want a more connected, safer, bicycle-friendly city. This project will be a great visual to show neighbors that we hear them and we're working towards their vision for our city."

Go Back to Basics on A1A

A1A is a tourist magnet. A walk down this waterfront thoroughfare just wouldn't be complete without seeing tourists snap selfies in front of our blue green waters. And if that wasn't enough of a clue, meticulously manicured beachfront hotels seem to constantly buzz with activity along

the boulevard. At the same time, though, A1A's simple charm takes us back to the bare bones – Fort Lauderdale as a beautiful oceanside town. Walk the length of the street and get lost in the nuances. Follow the iconic white wave wall from the hustle of the Elbo Room to the clean quietness of the stretch north of Sunrise Blvd. Early in the morning lands you stunning sunrises. Nighttime walks, luminous moon sightings.





Check the Pulse of the City on Las Olas Boulevard

This list wouldn't be complete without our beloved boulevard. From west to east, it has a section that can strike a chord with any pedestrian. First, you've got the business district speckled with crisp dress shirts and business suits. The stretch between SE Third Ave. and Federal Hwy. yields a day in the life view of a Fort Lauderdale professional. People watching opportunities abound. Then, further east, as the pace slows, boutiques flank a quintessentially idyllic median punctuated by shade trees wrapped in lights depending on the time of year. And then there's the bit that feeds the Las Olas Isle streets – quiet and perfect for evening strolls to nowhere or afternoon walks to beach activities just over the Las Olas Blvd. bridge. Bridge tender Jessica Gomez says the most perfect time of day to walk is when the sun is setting in the west and sherbet colors light up the sky.

Slow it Down on Idlewyld Drive

Within walking distance of the residential part of Las Olas Blvd. is the tucked away enclave that is Idlewyld Drive. It begins with a park (off Poinciana Drive) and snakes by private docks on the ever-changing intracoastal and offshoot streets named after distinctive flowers. At Clematis Place, you'll find two library book hutches honor system operated. On the rest of the street, towering palms submit to the breeze coming off the water, which reminds you that the ocean is somewhere nearby.

Take in the Royal Poincianas on N. Victoria Park Road

This tapering off of Broward Blvd. is known for its strikingly beautiful Royal Poinciana trees - go at the right time of year and the rouge leaves fall like snow. Plus, the street boasts architecturally modern homes next to the well-preserved historic structures of the Victoria Park neighborhood. Find runners, dog walkers, and cyclists here at any time of the day on the sidewalk and the Annie Beck park pathway just by the water.

Go off the Beaten Path on Sunset Key Boulevard

Here's a lesser-known gem for you, located off the Victoria Park neighborhood. What Sunset Key lacks in length, it

makes up for in width. The wide street yields a pedestrian-friendly atmosphere - as the name suggests, think island living. The quiet boulevard is marked by five different drives, which lead to individual culs-de-sac. Locals love it for a short bike ride or quiet evening saunter.

Embrace the Charming Quietude of Ponce De Leon Drive

The entire Rio Vista neighborhood is a walker's goldmine. The streets are immaculate, the homes - impressive, the trees - leafy and settled. Ponce De Leon Drive is like the grand master of streets. The median-divided drive is everything a quiet, charismatic, neighborhood thoroughfare ought to be, equipped with a lush little green space – Hector Park – where Ponce De Leon meets SE 11th St.

Live Where Others Vacation on the 17th Street Causeway Bridge

Sometimes we want a little elevation to our strolls - taking regular, brisk walks is an ideal way to ease stress and stay active - and the 17th Street Causeway bridge makes that convenient with easily accessed metered parking on the east side. A causeway may not sound very scenic, but with Port Everglades to the south and a slew of boat traffic to the right, left, and under the bridge at any given moment, you may find that your

mind easily wanders from focusing on the quickness of breath you may experience on the way up. At the top, it's a coveted vantage point reminiscent of a cruise ship deck - only, instead of just staying at this port of call for a few hours, you get to live here all year round.

PLUS:

- NE 13th Street has been reimagined and redesigned. The road underwent a complete streets makeover this year to improve the pedestrian experience by way of safety and connectivity upgrades. See this month's Transportation and Mobility column (page 28) for more information.
- Stay tuned for details on Old Dixie Highway improvements between NE 13th Street and the bridge over Middle River. The \$2.6 million dollar project, which will add bike lanes, landscaping, and crosswalks, is scheduled to be completed by early next year.
- Keep on the lookout for changes coming to S. Andrews Ave. and along the Wave Streetcar route.

hile not everyone is destined to be the next Picasso or Van Gogh, we have all experimented with art at some point in our lives. Whether it was as a child holding a box of crayons in one hand and a blank piece of paper in the other, or as a high school student in art class, most of us have been creators in some form. Art digs into parts of the brain that help to develop focus, creativity, and emotional intelligence, but unfortunately, due to budget cuts seen nationwide, the resources that schools devote to humanities continue to diminish.

Winterfest sees the importance of art in the classroom and strives to make a difference. The Winterfest Boat Parade is in its 46th year, but the organization first began its student art contest a little

over 20 years ago. The original concept was for students to create a scene that they would enjoy seeing in the annual Winterfest Boat Parade and the winner would go on the cover of the Bell South Yellow Pages. "As we have evolved, of course, the art is no longer on the cover of the phone books, but we still love the connection of having young students participate and become engaged by upholding this 46-year-old tradition," says Kathy Keleher, Winterfest's marketing and parade director.

Over the course of time, public and private schools have maintained the same theme – creating a scene that students would like to see in the parade, but elements of the contest are progressing. This year, Winterfest has redeveloped a relationship with the Broward Education Foundation, and as a result, Lisa Milenkovic, supervisor of STEM+ Computer Science, Applied Learning Development in Broward County Public Schools, along with other representatives, has decided to incorporate the contest in a way that benefits students in a modern and sophisticated way.

"Lisa has taken our contest, added elements of math and the other subjects that need to be assigned, and is now putting this as part of the STEM program curriculum in all of the Broward County public schools starting in November," Keleher says.

Art can cross boundaries that not many other creative forms can, and when asked what Winterfest ultimately desires to accomplish through this contest, Keleher stated that, "When it comes to the arts and education there is nothing more important comes to the arts and education there is nothing more important than giving children the option of evolving into what they truly want to be. As we have all felt the arts diminish in the classroom, it is very important that the community, as well as business leaders help when it comes to the school system, after school programs, and things of that sort, in order to give children options, whether it's music, painting, or three dimensional photography, because our children are not cookie cutter situations. You may have children that are unbelievably good at math and others that are incredibly artistic, and we need to make sure that our educational systems some way somehow are able to have these children flourish." PERCEPTION IS NOT REALITY

ARC BROWARD AIMS TO BRIDGE THE UNEMPLOYMENT GAP AMONGST THOSE WITH DISABILITIES BY EQUIPPING THE WORKFORCE AND DEBUNKING MISCONCEPTIONS

A rc Broward is an organization that has been assisting people with disabilities for over 40 years. A primary emphasis has been to give job-seeking individuals a better opportunity to find a long-term career rather than a part-time job. This is no easy objective. The Florida Chamber Foundation reported that 63 percent of people with disabilities are not active in the workforce. The obstacles may be high, but many of these barriers are in the minds of potential employers and not in the hard work of the disabled.

Arc Works, a division of Arc Broward, helps to break down the myths and misconceptions potential employers may have about hiring people with disabilities. As Arc Broward COO Julie Price says, "Our business development people are tasked with going out and speaking to business owners and hiring managers asking, 'What could it look like in your workplace to employ an individual with a disability?' It happens organically, with these one-on-one conversations. And this notion of them being a financial burden does not exist." In fact, studies show that 80 percent of the time, work accommodations for people with disabilities cost an organization less than \$100. Also, these accommodations, made for employees with disabilities, have been found to benefit a company's older population as well.

Arc Works provides the necessary training, skills, and ongoing support to ready people with disabilities to seek and maintain long-term employment. They also offer certification and professional job coaching to ensure the long-term success of an employee in his or her employment. "We give job seekers the ability to earn accredited certificates in several industries and to get experience to build their resume in the companies that Arc Broward owns outright," explains Dennis Hass, president/CEO of Arc Broward.

Arc Works recently opened a 2,600 square-foot space that holds classes, seminars, and speaker programs to keep members connected professionally and socially. This space

is known as Work Bar. "The reason we located Work Bar near Downtown Fort Lauderdale is that it is smack dab in the epicenter of the Broward business community. The single best thing we can do is have a business owner meet our students and job seekers," said Haas.

Work Bar brings in people from a wide variety of industries as speakers to interact with individuals with disabilities who are passionate about not only finding a job but also a career. "There may be industries that have lent themselves to more of what we think had worked best for people with disabilities, but that has changed in recent decades. People with disabilities have as varied career interests as everyone else," said Haas. Price echoed those thoughts. "By exposing job seekers to a variety of industries and jobs, they then have a choice to express their likes for a career, thus having a better chance to succeed. Moreover, the employer will have less turnover." In fact, hiring a worker with a disability is both a retention and employment strategy for some companies. One national

company reported that their turnover rate for individuals with disabilities was 20 percent compared to a 150 percent turnover rate among non-disabled employees. The same national survey found that 92 percent of customers felt more favorable toward businesses that hire individuals with disabilities.

Rachel Perz, general manager of the Brio Tuscan Grille in Plantation has been delighted and impressed with the two employees she hired from Arc Broward. Perz has a family member with disabilities and did not need to be convinced by the hard work and dedication of people with disabilities. In fact, Perz says, "We have recently promoted one of the individuals from Arc Broward and are looking to hire another individual to fill that position."

Increasing the percentage of people with disabilities that get hired is not easy. The change happens on the ground level moving opinions one mind at a time. Arc Works is doing just that – transforming people's lives by providing them with an opportunity to have a career while becoming a valued member of the workforce.

oliday entertaining, like hurricanes, requires preparation to ensure a less stressful outcome. When planning your menu take a couple of tips from us.

If you are planning a dinner – you should not serve

more than two to three appetizers and limit the amount of each to no more than three small bites of your selections (two if large). You don't want to fill everyone up – just tease the palate. Don't forget the vegetarians and include at least one non-meat bite.

For any party, ask yourself how much last minute work you want to do. If your friends are all cooks (and you like to share your kitchen) the menu can involve work by the guests. If they are like some of *our* friends who are allergic to spoons, pots, and pans, you can do a lot of prep before and still look like a genius. Pick a theme (ethnic) or not, but be sure to have a few items that are full flavored. Dips and spreads are perfect for any occasion and have the benefit of being ready ahead of time but not tasting like it.

Quesadillas are great in any language. Eight-inch flour tortillas are handy as you can cut them into 4 x 2" with no artistic skill necessary. You will need two for each quesadilla. Pick your fillings, assemble, and grill like a









grilled cheese sandwich using a pat of butter in the pan. Try pulled pork (can purchase almost anywhere now) with shredded mozzarella or monterey jack and a drizzle of hoisin sauce for a fusion flavor-bomb. Or purchase a seafood dip (crab, lobster, etc.) and spread on a tortilla, add shredded cheese of your choice, top with second tortilla then grill. Quesadillas can be assembled early in the day and cooked at night.

Good meatballs (by good meatballs I mean Aidells or similar, which are meat, not soy wannabes) are available at many warehouse stores and make an easy hot bite with the addition of a dipping sauce (can be marinara, sweet chili sauce etc.). Buy some cute picks.

And let us not neglect pizza. It's really easy to make with a good store bought flatbread (we love the Stonegate brand, either size). Heat bread until warm (leave oven on), spread with some purchased hummus and top with crumbled feta or goat cheese. Return to oven just to warm everything. Cut in pieces and enjoy with a glass of sherry or

light bodied red wine.

f your ears crave the sound of something authentic and pure, look no further than South Florida band the SOSOS. Band members pride themselves on their acoustic sound with predominant use of root or nonelectric instruments.

The band was founded back in 2006. Monteleone had recently released a project as a solo artist and when fellow musicians listened to what he was trying to achieve musically, they wanted to join him. While several band members have come and gone – Monteleone and Mitch Herrick are the only two left from the original group – the band's name and image have remained firm.

"I was down in Miami watching a show with a friend of mine," Monteleone says, "and we saw this band and they were called the fantastic something or other, I don't remember exactly what their name was. But they weren't very good. They kind of sucked and on our way home we were talking about the band we just saw and my friend said, 'I don't know why they call themselves the fantastic whatever, they're really just ok. They should be called the just ok, or kind of so so.' I started thinking and SOSOS you can use as a brand, the way you can spell it out, the way you can write it. It has a look to it. It is more of a brand than anything else and it also doesn't dictate what the music sounds like. So I asked my friend what she thought about it, if it was ok if I stole her idea, and she said yeah go for it. I ran it by the guys, asked them what they thought. They said it was cool and it stuck."

All members of the band are strictly full time musicians trying to earn a living. They book gigs during the week where they play covers. Events where original content will be performed are promoted on their website and social media accounts. "When it comes to our own music, the way I write is involuntary. Sometimes I'll have a dream and in my dream will be a song. I'll wake up, grab my guitar, and start playing exactly what I dreamt," Monteleone says.

The band looks up to artists like Damien Rice and has had the opportunity to share the stage with a variety of musicians from the Goo Goo Dolls and Kid Rock to Robin Thicke. If you're out and about you may catch them playing at Fat Cats or Hollywood Beach Theatre, or you can attend one of their upcoming events in Fort Lauderdale. We've even seen them rehearsing in the gazebo at Esplanade Park. For more information on
