## SEPTEMBER — A TIME TO REMEMBER

A monument is any physical object created, erected or installed to commemorate those involved in or affected by an event. Monuments can also be an essential source of information for young people in understanding past events and sacrifices made by older generations. Fort Lauderdale is a relatively young city, and we do not have as much history or as many monuments as American cities to the Northeast. However, we announced earlier in the year that Riverwalk launched a Capital Campaign to fund the construction of a unique 9/11 Monument.

September is always the month everyone reflects on where he or she was that fateful Tuesday morning in 2001. Thus I wanted to give everyone an update as well as an opportunity to be a part of helping to establish this monument within our city. In three short months, we have raised close to \$35,000.

Each monument is and should be unique. A monument is significant because it acts as a historical touchstone. It reminds those who lived through the actual event. The monument was designed by EDSA, Inc, displays a PATH Rail segment from the tracks from the World Trade Center wreckage, in an uplifted position held by granite support pillars, which refer

to the solid bedrock of Manhattan that supports its massive buildings. The granite support pillars are in pairs, joined by an internally illuminated acrylic spine that inspires the hope of light emerging out of darkness. The base of the monument will carry the storyline of the memorial. The structure will be illuminated to ensure the monument is respectfully lit at night. The artifact location is central to Riverwalk and provides visibility from all vantage points.

Many times monuments are not in the most prominent of places, or on land that may not be as accessible to the general public. Our 9/11 Monument will be front and center on Fort Lauderdale's Riverwalk along the north side of the New River. The Riverwalk and the New River are pulsing arteries in the heart of the city. We work, but more significantly live and play here, thus having it as an important reminder why we need to embrace life, while still remembering those nearly 3,000 lives that were lost on that day.

## PUBLIC ART — GOING BIG

FORT LAUDERDALE HAS THE POTENTIAL TO REACH NEW HEIGHTS WITH ART

South Florida is not without a substantial amount of choices for arts and entertainment. With a range of venues from West Palm Beach all the way down to Miami, you're biggest challenge may be deciding on just one. Fort Lauderdale is a big part of those choices, but I don't really want to talk about that here. What I really want to talk about is public art.

Art has many meanings to many different people. Scholars, academics, art critics, and others will argue what public art is, whether we need it or not, and the positive or negative impacts it can have. However, only you can decide if it has any meaning to you or if it's important. Fort Lauderdale does have public art installations that are fabulous, but traveling to other cities reveals that public art can be done on a bigger scale and in more visible locations.

For instance, in downtown Vancouver, many of the buildings have a public plaza space with an art installation. These spaces ranged from waterfalls with steps inscribed with inspirational quotes that you could sit on to have some lunch and meet up with friends to glass art installations that were stunning to see. People would use them during lunch breaks, as meeting spots and they are a type of tourist attraction.

Go to Washington D.C. and you can't swing a stick

without hitting a statue that tells part of our nation's history. Obviously, history is of huge importance and acknowledging those that came before us, made sacrifices and shaped this beautiful country we live in should be celebrated. I've spent many an hour just wandering around D.C. with no agenda just to look at those statues and read the plaques or look them up on my phone (my favorite is the George Henry Thomas statue near Logan Circle and which pointed me to an interesting piece of our history as a country).

Seattle, Washington has beautiful and whimsical sculptures in various parts of the city. One is a giant potted flower, about three stories tall, that is painted in bright colors and the petals slowly rotate in the wind. It just sits there on a street corner near the convention center for no other reason than to provide something out of the ordinary and unexpected.

The Denver Blue Bear is a sight to behold and is iconic in many ways. At 40-feet tall, blue and curiously looking into the glass wall of the Denver convention center, the Denver Blue Bear changes what could easily have been a plain and uninteresting corporate space into something truly special and head-turning that children and adults alike love to see whether they are going to a convention or not.


Public art can change the way people think about a city. Fort Lauderdale is not just a great city; it is a fantastic city that is growing in all sorts of ways. As a city, we deserve to have outstanding architecture, culture, entertainment, public spaces and all the other amenities that rival any city in the world. What could our public art look like in the future? I don't know. However, what I do know is that it should be something that is unique to Fort Lauderdale. It should be something that helps tell our story. Moreover, it should be something that is controversial and makes people think in some way.

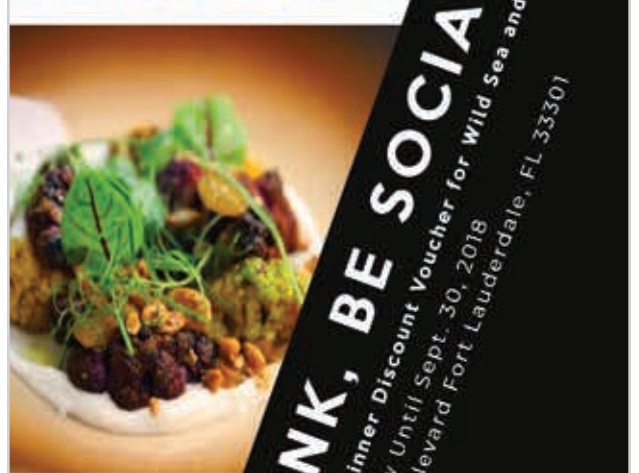

## THE ROAD TO BETTER TRANSPORTATION

SO MUCH HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED IN SEVEN YEARS

The only sure thing about the world we live in today is that change is constant and persistent. As I sit at my desk writing my last Riverwalk article as the Director of Transportation and Mobility, I look back at the journey that we started seven years ago when the Department was first created.

We had what seemed like an impossible goal, to change the culture of our community to one where you move people and not only cars. However, through the City's *Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2035 Plan* and the Department's *Connecting the Blocks Plan*, we succeeded in setting the foundation for achieving this ambitious goal.

Since the Department was formed and our Vision was created we:

- Installed over 200,000 linear feet of bicycle lanes, crosswalks and sidewalks through multimodal improvement projects such as the 13th Street and North Dixie Highway Complete Streets projects and the Downtown Walkability Improvement Projects
- Worked with private developers to install over 250 transit, bicycle, and pedestrian amenities in their plans and developments.
- Reduced our traffic fatalities by over 20% with the launch of the City's Vision Zero initiative.
- Retimed and installed traffic signals for over


12 major intersections and roadways within the City including SE 17th street where the average travel time decreased by 9% Eastbound and by 6% Westbound.

- Only increased the number of new vehicle trips within the City by 0.9% from 2015-2017 despite completing over 200 new developments in this same timeframe.
- Developed *Lauderstreet*, a first of its kind online interactive tool to inform our neighbors of road and sidewalk closures within the City so that they can seek alternate routes.
- Coordinated with the Florida Department of Transportation and Broward County to create custom traffic signal plans during special events to improve traffic flow. The traffic delay for one of our largest special events, the July 4th spectacular on the beach, was reduced by over 50%.
- Advocated for significant roadway and traffic improvements in the City's two most congested and critical corridors, Sunrise and Broward Boulevard.

Even more recently the City of Fort Lauderdale was ranked as the City with the 9th fastest commute time in South Florida, beating out cities like Miami and Hollywood. Knowing that the City of Fort Lauderdale has moved towards the goal of

mobility and connectivity through these accomplishments assures me that our community will continue to push forward in the years to come.

Although my time as the Director of this Department has come to an end, I am overjoyed to know that my team and I have touched the lives of those who live, work and play in Fort Lauderdale.

My heart will always be with this City, and I hope that with this foundation it will continue to promote our smart growth and transform us into the City you never want to leave.

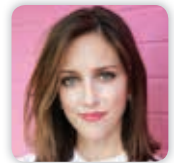

It brings me great joy when fellow Broward organizations recognize the importance of the arts. That is why we are thrilled the Community Foundation of Broward selected the Cultural Division for a \$35,000 grant to further the impact of our Creative Investment Program and Community Arts Education Partnership grant programs.

While State funding allocated to the arts sector may have struck a historic low, the drive and appreciation of the arts continue to grow.

The grant was made possible by the following Funds at the Community Foundation of Broward: Fonda and H. Wayne Huizenga, Jr., Family Trust Fund, Gary J. Scotto Fund, and Mary and Alex Mackenzie Community Impact Fund.

The seven recipients selected to receive additional funding for their projects all celebrate different art forms:

- Musician and event producer Joshua Tiktin secured support to assist the production of the monthly art walks that take place the last Saturday of the month in MASS District. His efforts increase the walks' accessibility to the public while creating economic opportunities for local musicians, artists and vendors. (More info at [Massdistrict.com](http://Massdistrict.com)).
- Artist and activist Niki Lopez is continuing her exhibition *What's Your Elephant?* 1310 Gallery located in the Sailboat Bend Artists' Lofts, which provides a space to freely express matters that are difficult to address and often avoided – a powerful

and moving contribution for all those participating. (Exhibition on view through September 29; more info at [Nikiartstudio.com](http://Nikiartstudio.com)).

- Ingrid Schindall and Sarah Michelle Rupert are organizing the Small Press Fair, in November this year, a regional opportunity for print professionals to share and create new work. (More info at [Spf-ftl.com](http://Spf-ftl.com)).
- Performing artist Jenny Larsson is bringing her residency program, Fågelbo (The Nest), to life. Expected to take place this December in FAT Village.
- Darius Daughtry went on to produce Volume II of his theatrical mixtape titled *The Happening* which was essentially a multi-disciplinary performance bringing attention to current social issues.
- Cathleen Dean used her funding toward the 48 Hour Film Project for South Florida, its Dean's eighth year working with the project and is responsible for its increasing success.
- Another project expansion was Calibe Thompson's Caribbean Culinary Museum and Culinary Theater that was part of her Taste the Islands Experience, took place on the first weekend of June, Caribbean Heritage Month.


Looking forward, these are the projects that will leave a mark on the history of South Florida, and we are excited for the community to witness their contributions first hand. These artists are driven to spread knowledge that can only be learned through experience, and that's the culture we are grateful to support and provide to this community we call home.

## RESILIENCY AND TRANSPORTATION

TWO BIG IDEAS THAT NEEDS OUR FOCUS

The Chamber's semi-annual Ocean Land Investments' BIG IDEAS Conference September 13 will give our region an opportunity to engage on relevant issues with long-term impact.

We are lining up several mayors of our major cities to share their vision along with key subject matter experts to help us understand the dynamics of these critical economic drivers.

Economic resiliency, transportation, talent, wages, homelessness, environmental opportunities...the list is endless. We decided to focus on two areas this year—resiliency and transportation. As the saying goes, "You have no priorities when everything is a priority."

We will also announce our business plan to engage on resiliency. We are the convener of ideas and conversations. Big Ideas will be the vehicle from which we build participation, education, talent, solutions, funding, lobbying and much more.

We have many partners to be sure. Our regional news media, Miami Herald, SunSentinel, Palm Beach Post, and WLRN, have stepped up in their coverage with The Invading Seas series. The Southeast Florida Regional Climate Compact has made great strides in its efforts to identify and execute on its plan.

What we have found is no one organization can

tackle resiliency. It is mammoth in scale and scope. We need to rethink how we approach everything from engineering and design to insurance and everyday life.

We could spend an entire semester and then some on resiliency, but we will also spend time on transportation opportunities.

We stumbled with the Wave Streetcar system which was derailed earlier this year. What solutions do we have post Wave? How will we build consensus? Everything from autonomous vehicles to artificial intelligence needs to be explored and fast.

Our Metropolitan Planning Organization led by Greg Stuart is the vehicle by which we prioritize and fund our projects. Brightline is a big boost for the region, however, there is no stop at the airport. Everything is on the table. The challenge is planning, funding and building an interconnected system.

Elon Musk's Boring Company is talking about building a high-speed train to Chicago's O'Hare Airport. The Chicago Express Loop would be privately funded and take 12 minutes from downtown through tunnels at 125-150 miles per hour.


One of my mentors recently told me, "We can't afford to let perfection be the enemy of good." BIG IDEAS could be just the good start we need.

## FORT LAUDERDALE — WHAT WILL BE OUR PERSONALITY?

CULTURE, ART AND ARCHITECTURE ALL WILL SHAPE OUR IDENTITY

From Amsterdam to Zurich, great cities from around the world contain a combination of identifiable elements that work together to imbue a unique personality that is unmistakable. Arts, culture, philanthropy, education, and iconic architecture are essential components of any distinguished metropolis. Think of places like London, Tokyo, Dubai, or Manhattan and a distinct image and feeling of each one can immediately be called to mind. They may all contain the same important ingredients, but the final product is decidedly unique.

Every progressive city needs to support a thriving arts scene. It's hard to imagine Sydney without its Opera House, New York without Radio City Music Hall, or Paris without The Louvre. Obviously, the buildings alone do not constitute the whole of the impressive artistic environments, but they contribute greatly to the overall investment needed to create a world-class city and offer a foundation that allows for the organic growth of talent to surround them.

Culture, like art, can be subjective and hard to define, but we can certainly consider places like Florence, Vienna, and Alexandria as exceptions to that rule, with their vibrant, multi-cultural, and historic yet individual

personas. Rio de Janeiro, famous for Carnival, is also a city synonymous with culture, as is Istanbul, which was founded around 660 BC and is a hotbed of culture with a rich history to share.

Anchored by heavyweight philanthropists, Bill and Melinda Gates, the tech-centered city of Seattle seems to personify an attitude of giving with tens of millions of dollars donated annually to worthy causes. Globally, nearly 200 of the world's wealthiest people have joined the Gateses and Warren Buffet in The Giving Pledge, a commitment to dedicate the majority of their wealth to giving back. Representing major cities and global economies across 22 countries, this level of philanthropy has the potential to change the fabric of society.

With a reputation for exceptional educational opportunities and outcomes, international locales like Montreal, Berlin, and Seoul top the list of the ten best cities in the world in which to be a student. With descriptions that include futuristic, trendy, and multicultural, these cities offer the right blend of essential elements.

Possibly the most important component and one that every city mentioned here shares is iconic architecture. The architecture of a city is like its fingerprint; no two are exactly alike. However, like a fingerprint, a city's

architecture should confirm its identity to the rest of the world. Think of Seattle and the Space Needle comes to mind; mention New York and people envision the Empire State Building; head to Miami Beach and picture the mecca of art deco buildings.

In the big scheme of these grand cities, some ancient, some less-so, the city of Fort Lauderdale, home of the marine industry, is still young and burgeoning, still working out its nascent identity. It will be important as we move forward to encourage more art, identify and embrace our unique culture, drive philanthropy, and promote world-class education. But a uniquely recognizable skyline could be the most impactful element of all.

# TO THE MOON MARKETPLACE

THIS PLACE IS A SWEET FIND

**D**id you know that chewing gum has been around for thousands of years? Or that jelly beans were given to soldiers during the Civil War? The earliest reference to jelly beans is associated with Boston candy maker William Schrafft who urged people to send his jelly beans to Union soldiers fighting in the Civil War. I guess nothing helps ward off the discomfort of war quite like a jellybean. There is so much more to candy than most people realize, the same could be said for To The Moon Marketplace. It is so much more than a candy store. Well, let's let owner Antonio Dumas explain.

"I've always been in the food industry, from starting out as a waiter to restaurant manager to running a resort in Connecticut," explains Dumas. Eventually, he found his way to South Beach where he ran a gourmet market for ten years. "Then I moved up to Fort Lauderdale and wanted to replicate what I had been doing on South Beach," said Dumas. Initially, To The Moon was a market with gourmet food, international publications and only some candy. However, Fort Lauderdale isn't that sophisticated; or maybe it's just me. I think gourmet food is whatever I find at Whole Foods. Therefore, Dumas kept modifying his offerings, and the successful niche of nostalgic and hard-to-find candy took off. "But I told my friends 'I don't want to be known as just a candy store,'" reflects Dumas. However, the store does stock thousands of candies from more than 80 countries. But he is right; it is so much more than a candy store. It is more like a trip down memory lane. To The Moon stocks over 19,000 individual items, from wistful tin lunchboxes, over two thousand jaunty greeting cards, to vintage childhood toys like slinkys and that paddle with a ball on a string, which still frustrates me.

Everything in the store takes you back to a simpler, less confrontational time, even the name of the store itself – To The Moon comes from the 1950's. *To The Moon*, *Alice* was a famous catchphrase of the character

Ralph played by Jackie Gleason on the show "The Honeymooners." Ironically, Dumas parents' names are – you guessed it – Ralph and Alice.

Enough about television, back to candy. Dumas keeps up on all the sweet trends, like when are Chiclets coming back? And who bought the rights to bring back classics like Beemans and Black Jack gum? Well, he travels the world to food and confectionary trade shows, discovering new exciting taste treats coming our way or about nostalgic candy being made again. "I travel to about ten trade shows a year," he explained. Do the *Winter Fancy Food & Confection Show*, or the *Advanced Gummies and Jellies Course*, or the *Philadelphia National Candy, Gift & Gourmet Show* sound like any of the business conferences you have to attend? Me neither. ☺

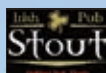

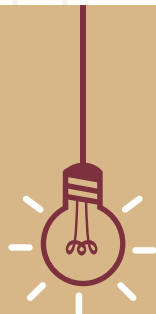

**T**he Broward County Appraiser's Office recently mailed over 775,000 TRIM Notices to Broward County property owners. These proposed notices show your 2018 property assessment, exemptions, and proposed tax amounts. It is important to remember the Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect taxes. We simply assess properties for tax purposes and grant tax-saving exemptions to qualified individuals.

If you have questions or concerns about any of the tax rates or non-ad valorem fees, please contact the taxing authority listed on the TRIM Notice or attend one of their budget public hearings.

The ABSOLUTE deadline to file an application for any 2018 exemption or appealing your property assessment is September 18, 2018.

### Value Adjustment Board

The Value Adjustment Board (VAB) is an independent quasi-judicial review board. If you believe your property assessment is not what a buyer would have reasonably paid for your property on January 1, 2018, you should first contact our office. If after speaking with one of our appraisers, you still do not agree, you can file an appeal with the Broward County Value Adjustment Board. If you were denied an exemption, you may also file an appeal with the Value Adjustment Board challenging this denial. The absolute filing deadline for Value Adjustment Board petitions is September 18, 2018. and has become one of the most beloved shows of all time.

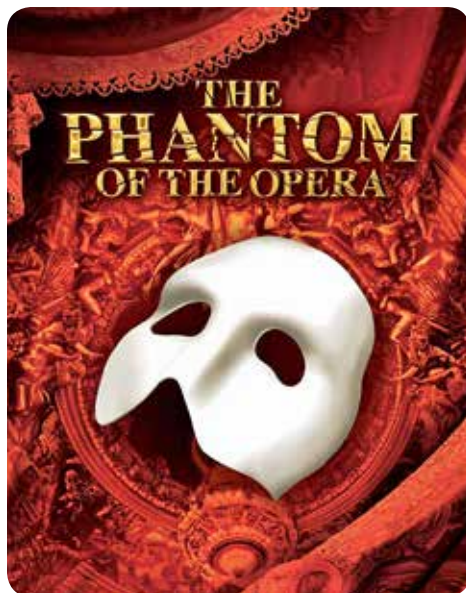

# COCKTAIL TRENDS

I'LL TAKE YOU ON A JOURNEY FROM MY NEWEST OBSESSION, FROSÉ, TO MY TRIED AND TRUE COCKTAIL, THE OLD-FASHIONED. GET READY TO BE SHAKEN AND STIRRED.

## How Sweet is too Sweet?

The clamor towards quality ingredients and healthier alternatives in cocktails has produced a trend for a more refined definition of sweetness and in some cases complete abandonment of sweet additives. When matching one's specific palate to a cocktail, the sweetness is an essential element to finding perfect personal balance. Some would say sugar is a necessary ingredient in any cocktail, but this focus on quality ingredients has forced some to reconsider the worthiness of sucrose as the source of sweet.

The "traditional" Old Fashioned is a combination of sugar, bitters, and whiskey garnished with a citrus twist and a maraschino cherry. Adaptations of the classic Old Fashioned are a prime example of how varied the sweetness options can be. People focused on minimizing their calorie or carb intake may be happy with replacing the traditional sugar with one

of the many brand name substitutes or sugar-free syrups. Another approach is to shift the flavor profile towards alternative ingredients such as vanilla bean. Describing the taste of vanilla beans sounds almost like a bourbon ad, with their "sweet, perfumed aroma with a woody or smoky flavor." It's not hard to see how replacing sugar with alternative ingredients can produce a similar effect.

Another strategy is to completely deconstruct the classic recipe. Rather than finding some sucrose replacement, this approach celebrates the alchemy that arises by minimizing the number of ingredients and brings out their inherent subtleties. An example of this strategy might be foregoing the sugar and sugar substitutes altogether. This leaves the mixture of ingredients in a much more subtle flavor profile where the qualities of the bitters combine with sweet notes of citrus and depending on the bourbon; those notes can rise or fall in the overall flavor profile.

The type of cherry used is another prime example of how adding that sugar cube to an old-fashioned may be overkill. There are a vast array of quality cherries to pick, from the Filthy Black Cherry featured in the photo to your generic maraschino. Citrus is another opportunity to introduce a more subtle and complex sweetness to this classic cocktail. A combination of expressed oils from a lemon twist, combined with a wedge of orange is just one example of citrus as a marriage of sweet and tart.

If you're somebody who enjoys exploring the experiences of flavor and aromas combined with spirits, it might be worth considering how your cocktails are sweetened. There are virtually limitless options and depending on the focus of the imbiber, the best option may yet to be found. Of course, there's always the option of enjoying a spirit neat for the ultimate in simplicity. ☺

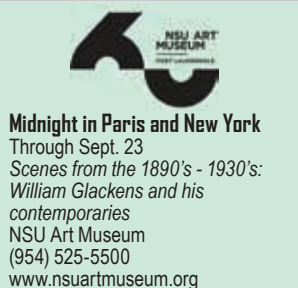

## TIM FORMAN

THE HORIZON LOOKS BRIGHT FOR LOCAL ARTIST  
TITLE OF WORK: *SHOWING OFF*

A local native is in the sunrise of his artistic career. Tim Forman of Fort Lauderdale offers an atmospheric study of sky and sea in his paintings. He demonstrates his interest in capturing his native South Florida with a profound sense of perspective and depth in stunning landscapes of light, movement, and color.

"I started painting around the age of ten, in oils surprisingly, with a gentleman named Peter Olsen at his art studio. I would go there once a week," reflected Forman. Initially, he liked painting animals and pointed to a lovely painting of an elephant. He explained that it was his first commissioned work, at the age of 12, for his grandfather. That shows the level of support his entire family gave him and his art. In fact, Forman never thought he was going to be a professional artist or that he would make a living at it, it is just something he enjoyed. "When I first started painting it was a hobby and a way to give gifts to people. It remained a hobby until I was about 16 or 17, but it was also at this time I discovered the work of Florida landscape artist A.E. "Beanie" Backus. His work inspired me to paint landscapes," he explained. Forman continued a traditional education path and attended Florida Atlantic


University where he obtained a degree in business. "I had plans to be a realtor, I never planned on being a professional artist, I hadn't even gone to school for art," elaborated Forman. However, art was just one of those things he had always done. It wasn't even a childhood dream; he just had that persuasion in his heart that it was something he was supposed to do.

Forman went on, "In 2012 I did my first show. I rented a space at the Lauderdale Yacht Club and put up a bunch of pieces – and I sold some. Around the same time, I got into a gallery and got some commission work." Those early successes gave him the confidence to continue down this artistic path. But Forman points out that being an artist is very capricious, and it is not like you have a predictable salary. "In fact, I'm doing a lot more commission pieces, but you never know where it is going to come from. For example, you might do a show and not sell a single piece – then in a month someone will contact you to do a commission piece because he or she saw your work at that show."

As an artist, Forman is drawn to the horizon line and the unique light that is on display at dusk and dawn. "Honestly my favorite subject to paint would be the sunrise or sunset. But when I go to a location, there are

things that stand out, and those are the things I want to capture. So I'll paint a small piece on location, which will take about an hour, along with some photos. Then I bring these back to my studio where I will create the larger finished piece."

Painting is like anything, the more you do the more you learn. "So I keep a discipline of always painting. I know some artist paint for a while and stop or take time off for a period. However, for me, I was doing a painting a week when I first started six years ago. Then a few years ago it turned into two paintings a week, and now I'm ready to go to three paintings a week."

Art as a career is very much like creating a painting; you never know what the final picture will look like; but for Tim Forman's career, it looks like there will be a beautiful horizon ahead.

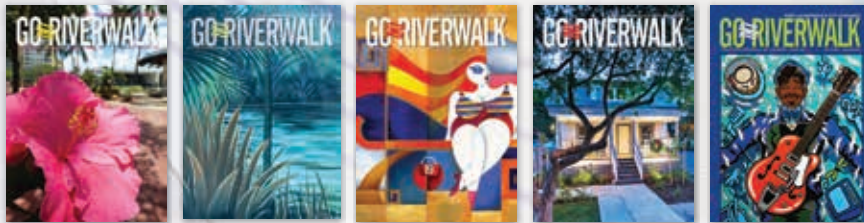

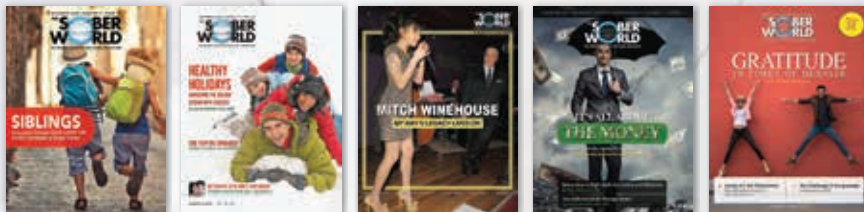
