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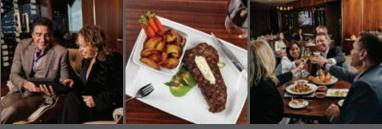

# DANCING IN THE STREETS, AND SINGING, AND PAINTING

BUSKERS PROVIDE ENTERTAINMENT ALONG THE RIVERWALK

ew experiences in town continue to make Fort Lauderdale a great place to live, work and visit. From Carter Park Jamz to Starlight Musicals and more, we are a city of music and entertainment.

And now we have "buskers" on the Riverwalk. The term **Busking** was noted around the early 1860s in Great Britain. The verb of **to busk** comes from the word "busker" commonly used to define street performances. Performances are anything that people find entertaining. Performers may present acrobatics, animal tricks, balloon twisting, caricatures, clowning, comedy, contortions, escapology, dance, singing, fire skills, flea circus, fortune-telling, juggling, magic, mime, living statue, musical performance, storytelling or reciting poetry or prose, street art such as sketching and painting, street theater, sword swallowing and ventriloquism

In conjunction with the City of Fort Lauderdale, Riverwalk has embarked on a series of Busker Fests, which give local performers the chance to showcase their varied talent. The talent pool and performances have been impressive thus far with entertainers who have ranged from a young cellist to an R&B sax performer. We have had a great variety of singer/songwriters as well as a ukulele group that brought a great smile to everyone's faces. Another young performer also gave us the great steps and moves of Michael Jackson as he performed on the plaza. Singers performed a Spanish operetta, actors engaged the audience with an act from Shakespeare, and a local artist painted beautiful art on site.

The variety of talent was impressive and we will continue to present these showcases in the hopes of finding more unique and willing performers.

The City of Fort Lauderdale has a Busker Permit Program that is in review and we are hoping to encourage more of these types of performances locally around the city. Busker programs in other cities and states thrive by allowing free performances around public plazas and spaces and creating a social collecting point for those passing by. To date we have hosted two events in Riverwalk Laura Ward Park with great public participation.



# LOCKHART PROJECT RIGHT ON TRACK

ort Lauderdale's Lockhart Stadium project is moving full steam ahead. The \$60 million development being completely funded by Miami Beckham United (i.e., Beckham group) is transforming the 64-acre property into a soccer-centric community destination.

Following successful demolition work, construction crews are installing infrastructure, laying foundation and working diligently to ensure the new 18,000-seat professional soccer stadium (see rendering) will be completed in time for the debut of Inter Miami CF, David Beckham's Major League Soccer team that will begin play in March 2020.

In addition to the soccer stadium, the project will include team and administrative offices, locker rooms, weight rooms, classrooms, dining facilities, medical and rehabilitation facilities, practice fields, parking areas and a turf field with seating that will be available for high school football games and events.

At the same time, exciting plans are taking shape for the community park that is also being funded and




constructed by the Beckham group. This signature project will be a premier community destination for Commission District 1 and the entire City. It will feature public gathering areas, open green space, shade structures, a dog park, playgrounds, multi-purpose fields, a walking/ jogging/fitness trail, along with other amenities.

The most recent project rendering (at left) illustrates the location of the stadium, practice fields and community parks and recreation areas, in relation to Commercial Boulevard and Northwest 12th Avenue. The site has three main areas — practice fields and the mini stadium will be located on the north, the soccer stadium will be situated in the center, and the community park will occupy the south end of the property.

The City's partnership with the Beckham group breathes new life into this landmark property. It brings professional soccer back to our community; provides our youth with opportunities for expert coaching, training and instruction; gives our City much-needed new parks and recreation areas, athletic fields and stadium access; and ushers in the return of high school games and athletic events.

Under our approved agreement, the City is not paying for any of the improvements being constructed by the Beckham group. Any investment we decide to make will only be for enhancements above and beyond what the Beckham group has already planned for the property, such as a community center or other public amenities. Our plan would be to fund additional enhancements through the parks bond, which voters overwhelmingly passed last March.

It's exciting to see the tremendous progress being made on this important community project. 

rts and entertainment. Let's see... arts and entertainment. What can you possibly do in Fort Lauderdale for arts and entertainment? Like so hot that you want to use those curse words

from the old Q\*bert game. #~%@ It's hot! If anyone in this city can't find something related to arts and entertainment, they really aren't trying. We have a whole district dedicated to the idea of arts and entertainment. Did you know that way back in the early 2000s the city knew it wanted an arts and entertainment district when it created the Regional Activity Center Riverwalk Arts and Entertainment zoning district? This is basically the Broward Center for the Performing Arts and the Museum of Discovery and Science along with IMAX. There is a lot to do there and both venues have award-winning programs.

But there are also other areas in the city that are prominent in arts and entertainment. The Flagler Arts Technology Village (FATVillage) has the monthly art walk on the last Saturday of every month, except December. This month it will be on Saturday, September 28. If you haven't been to this monthly event you're really missing out. Local artists and artisans from all over South Florida display their creations here. Along with free music and food vendors this event is really something to be proud of and wouldn't have happened if it weren't for the visionaries of this area. Plans are in the works to bring an upscale movie theater to Flagler Village. As someone who lives in the general area of Flagler Village, and is a huge movie buff, I'm very excited. I love going to the movies and having something like this in our Downtown is pretty impressive and will be easy to walk to by hundreds of people living in the area. There isn't a first-run movie theater anywhere in Downtown Fort Lauderdale and this type of addition does nothing but support the Downtown as a vibrant area with multiple choices for entertainment.

Here's the takeaway: Fort Lauderdale is no longer the sleepy town it once was. Density in the downtown area has reached a point where it can support various entertainment options. 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# **DON'T BE DISTRACTED**

VISION ZERO AIMS TO ELIMINATE ALL DEADLY AND SEVERE INJURY TRAFFIC CRASHES

s a native South Floridian, I am proud to say I work, live and play in Fort Lauderdale. As a member of the City's Transportation and Mobility Department, our team of professionals has been at the forefront of innovation. The Transportation Division has advanced progressive planning and policies to make Fort Lauderdale's streets and roadways safe, easy to use and attractive for people walking, biking, driving or using transit regardless of age or ability — a vehicle for an equitable transportation system that supports public health.

Since the transportation division's inception in 2012, we have accomplished a great deal through collaboration, engagement and consensus-building, which in turn, has moved us closer to fulfilling our shared citywide vision of creating a multimodal transportation ecosystem with a safety-first blueprint. This progressive stance is why the City adopted Vision Zero with the understanding that safety on our streets needs to be an all-systems approach and that no amount of traffic deaths is acceptable.

Vision Zero is a global movement that aims to



eliminate all deadly and severe injury traffic crashes. In Fort Lauderdale, we have made strides toward this goal; however, achieving success requires continuous, long-term commitment and decisive action from each and every one of us.

We need to change our perspectives to emphasize a safety-first culture, which should be adopted by all of us as one of the most important steps to accomplishing our goal. From the improvements we plan, invest in and implement to the responsibility of all drivers and people walking, biking and those using other modes, we need to choose safety during every moment as we move through our city.

As one of the first 10 cities to adopt Vision Zero in the country and the first in Florida, Fort Lauderdale has been a leader in planning and programming Vision Zero-centric policies. Our commitment to implementing progressive planning practices and our dedication to execute a variety of strategies to effect change has resulted in regional and national recognition. One of the key strategies we've employed is advocacy for new policies that make our streets safer, such as the new distracted driving law in Florida.

On May 17, Governor Ron DeSantis signed a bill to make texting while driving a primary offense in Florida. This means that drivers can be pulled over and ticketed just for texting and driving. Under this new law, texting and driving, which includes all text communication, is banned. Also banned is the use of all hand-held devices within construction and school zones, except for in emergencies. Drivers may use navigation technologies on their phone without penalty.

In a report by the Governors Highway Safety Association, distracted driving was cited as one of the attributing factors related to the national rise in deadly traffic deaths. Prior to the adoption of the new law, Florida was one of four states in the country that had a texting and driving law but lacked the ability to enforce the behavior without citing a different primary offense first.

The new distracted driving law is a policy success, and with the partnership of enforcement agencies, will help increase safety while supporting the mission of Vision Zero to eliminate traffic deaths and save lives.

So, put your phone down, and keep your eyes up. Safety starts with you!

Giant inflatable art, that is, and it's coming to a park or library near you.


It's all part of "Searching for Giants," pop-up displays of enormous inflatable sculptures that will happen in all nine Broward County Commission districts during the months of September and October.

"Searching for Giants" serves as a countywide lead up to the popular music festival. Visitors at each of the nine "Searching for Giants" locations will have chances





### **TODAY'S STUDENT LITERACY WILL SHAPE TOMORROW'S WORKFORCE**

CHAMBER SUPPORTS LITERACY CHALLENGE BY PROVIDING LUNCH TO AREA TEACHERS

he Broward County Public Schools received some good news just before last month's start of a brandnew school year with the release of the latest grades for Florida's 67 school districts.

Broward earned an overall "B" grade, showing vast improvement in the number of "A" schools, with 105 as opposed to 86 last year. The district had no "F" schools at its district-run schools, a first in more than a decade and a sign that the efforts to educate our children are paying off.

Still, literacy remains a problem here and throughout the state. According to Florida Department of Education statistics, more than 40 percent of Florida's third grade students have been performing below the benchmark passing score for reading on the Florida Standards Assessment.

To help raise awareness and reading scores, the Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce has joined the University of Florida and the University of Florida Literacy Institute in a worthwhile project that has an ambitious goal: double the number of students participating in the James Patterson Literacy Challenge to achieve passing reading scores in two years. The initiative is the brainchild of the novelist and writer James Patterson and the University of Florida's College of Education.



"There are two problems facing low-performing schools when it comes to literacy. First, many children arriving at school each year are unprepared for the literacy expectations of their grade level. Second, many teachers are unprepared to address the needs of struggling readers."

Patterson donated \$3 million to kick off the James Patterson Literacy Challenge in 2018. The goal of the initiative is to work intensely with the faculties of selected schools to change the culture of literacy from one where failure is routinely accepted to one where failure isn't an option. Patterson, a native Floridian, lives and works full time in Palm Beach County.

During the past few months, the Chamber has participated in this unique partnership by raising money among Chamber leaders and concerned members to secure lunches for the 250 teachers participating in the second annual James Patterson Literacy Challenge. Last year, the project worked with the two low performing schools, Castle Hill and Larkdale Elementary schools.

This year, due to the initiative's success, another eight Broward County schools have been selected to participate in the program. Between late July and early August, teachers from these schools were involved in an exhaustive five-day, seven hours per day summer training session to learn innovative techniques to better teach literacy at typically underperforming schools.

The summer study is an outgrowth of the University of Florida's Literacy Initiative, which prepares teachers under its teacher development programs to serve students who struggle with reading through graduate coursework and professional learning experiences. If nothing else, the Chamber's input marks the recognition of how important literacy is to the business community.

These teachers are molding the minds of tomorrow's workforce. It is no understatement to say that our region's economy and way of life will depend upon how successful these instructors are in reaching their students. How well the lattice of success between today's classrooms and tomorrow's job openings operates is key to business leaders who appreciate and understand the link between literacy and the potential success of their prospective employees.

# ART ALONG ... AND ABOVE ... THE NEW RIVER

FROM A DECORATED DRAWBRIDGE TO UNDERWATER SCULPTURES, ART POPS UP IN UNUSUAL PLACES

A s Fort Lauderdale grows with many new residences and increased opportunities for tourism, art in public places continues to wind its way into the fabric of the City's design.

Not to say that Fort Lauderdale is new to the art scene. With the Fort Lauderdale Art Center (now the NSU Art Museum Fort Lauderdale) originating in 1958, Broward County's Public Art and Design Program launched in 1976, and events like the annual Las Olas Art Fair taking place since 1987, it has an established art history. This month's theme of Arts and Entertainment gives us the opportunity to highlight art in some not so usual places.

An announcement is expected soon to identify the finalist of a national call to artists that was issued by the Highway Bridge and Maintenance Division and Broward Cultural Division to transform the Andrews Avenue drawbridge spanning the New River in downtown Fort Lauderdale. The goal of the artistic intervention is to create a sense of place, bring interest and help activate the riverfront.

The New River remains integral to the success of the marine industry in South Florida and an art installation that can be visible to pedestrians along the riverfront, motorists on the bridge and boaters will certainly enhance the existing renovation project that is replacing necessary electrical, mechanical and hydraulic components of the drawbridge. Motivated by a passion for art and ecology, 1000 Mermaids Artificial Reef Project and Gallery is a public eco-art initiative that is creating underwater sculpture gardens off the coast of Fort Lauderdale using massive sustainable concrete modules designed with input from area biologists and adorned with the body casts of real people in the form of 1,000 merfolk.

With the help of government and private citizens deploying the sculptures, the artificial reef provides optimum coral growth and new habitat for undersea life. As one of the founding members of the Marine Research Hub of South Florida, MIASF is grateful for the increased awareness of the world's third largest coral reef and the importance of safeguarding this ecosystem that offers world-renowned snorkeling, diving, ecotourism and research opportunities.

Combining the dramatic elements of the Intracoastal Waterway in Fort Lauderdale, luxury waterfront living and thought-provoking gallery exhibitions, The Art Fair on the Water transports attendees via water taxis through a curated showcase of independent artists from around the world that reflects modern and contemporary artistic styles representing the past, present and future.

From Jan. 23 through 26, the public is invited on a four-to-five-hour excursion to a destination of private residences where three categories of art exploration will

be displayed: ArtIndie, ArtCurated and ArtInteractive. This innovative exhibition attracts homebuyers, art collectors and boaters alike and demonstrates the significance and interconnectivity of the waterways on our community.

The annual Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show, which celebrates its 60th anniversary this year, helped launch the career of Dr. Guy Harvey, well-known marine artist, conservationist and scientist who began selling his famous artwork at the show more than 30 years ago.

With more than 1,200 exhibitors, FLIBS continues to showcase many existing and emerging artists, including sculptors, glass artists, woodworkers and painters that depict life both above and below the sea in the eternal attempt to capture the eye of the beholder.

Record Store Day started back in 2008 as a way to celebrate independently-owned record stores. The annual event, which takes place in April, usually draws about 1,000 people throughout the day.

Whether it's a holiday or a regular weekday at Radio-Active, their ultimate goal is to instill the love of music in people from all walks of life.

"There's no other experience like walking into a local independently run music store where you can have face to face interactions with fellow music fans," Schenk says. "There's nothing like it."

If after speaking with one of our appraisers, you still do not agree, you can file an appeal with the Broward County Value Adjustment Board. If you were denied an exemption, you may also file an appeal with the Value Adjustment Board challenging this denial.

## **ACCESSIBLE ARTS**

#### SHINING THE SPOTLIGHT ON INCLUSIVE ENTERTAINMENT

ort Lauderdale's arts and entertainment season will soon be in full swing. Audiences are excited to see what's coming to the stage and screen to delight the senses.

But what if your senses are limited or can be affected by loud noises and bright lights? Engaging with the arts can be difficult for some patrons with mental or physical challenges. Local organizations are working to help change that to make entertainment more inclusive.

South Florida venues are expanding access to allow people with and without disabilities the same opportunity to attend, participate in and appreciate the arts. For example, assistive listening devices are available to amplify sound and audio description provides an explanation of the action. Open captioning displays dialogue on a screen and individuals on the autism spectrum can enjoy sensory-friendly options at select live performances, movie screenings and museum exhibits.

A group helping to facilitate these types of programs locally is the Florida Access Coalition for the Arts. They bring regional players together to help promote and provide equal access for all.

"No one should feel singled out because of a disability. It's important to get the word out that these types of performances exist and are out there for everyone," said FLACA Board Member Lew Balaban. 3

Here are examples of what's available.

#### **Outdoor Art**

A multi-sensory mural specifically designed for the visually impaired is located outside of the Lighthouse for the Blind in Fort Lauderdale. Brought to life by Cadence Landscape Architecture, it features textured shapes that can be felt, an aromatic diffuser for scent, and incorporates sound. Visually impaired individuals assisted with creating the mural last year.

Lighthouse for the Blind President and CEO Ellyn Drotzer is proud that the artwork remains as a reminder that everyone can succeed in the arts. Another example of that type of success happened on a national stage earlier this year when a wheelchair user won a Tony Award for the first time in history. Ali Stroker won bestfeatured actress for her role in "Oklahoma!" The win was an inspiration to many who might think theater is out of their reach. But Drotzer says the arts can inspire anyone to take center stage.

"We are constantly finding ways to expose the population to different opportunities. That can be in the arts as well. The arts can be a passion and also a profession. Nothing is off limits."

#### Theater

At the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, in addition to listening devices, audio description, open captioning and sign interpretation, sensory-friendly performances are a relatively new addition. The center creates a more comfortable atmosphere by bringing the lights up and allowing the audience to walk around as needed. There is also a quiet room and trained staff on hand to assist.

#### Museum

The Young at Art Museum partners with the Broward Center to create sensory performances. The museum in Davie welcomes visitors to a Sensory Sunday every second Sunday of the month, along with classes and workshops designed for adults and students of all abilities. Another resource is a map of quiet areas and times that are calmer to visit.

#### Dance

The Miami City Ballet provides Touch Tours for those with visual impairments. Before select shows, patrons can physically explore by touching costumes, props and sets. During the actual performance, a live narration through personal headsets provides context and allows visitors additional input for an overall richer experience.

#### Opera

The Florida Grand Opera coordinates with the Library of Congress in Washington to obtain braille and large print copies of the libretto (translation of the opera). The audience can borrow copies during the performance and the FGO says they are the only opera company in the country to provide this service. For open captioning, performances are translated on a digital screen because each opera is sung in its original language.

#### Cinema

Sensory-friendly films are shown with the lights turned up and the volume turned down. These are available at the Museum of Discovery and Science, as well as select AMC and Regal Theatres. Audiences who might not feel comfortable in a traditional movie are invited to these tailored showings.

#### A NEW LOOK AT "SUSTAINABLE" IN FORT LAUDERDALE

I'm not sure if I've ever mentioned being envious of the "farm to table" movement that seems available to most states in the U.S. — with the singular exception of Florida — whose fresh food seasons seem limited to those months when the rest of the nation is under snow. Since Fort Lauderdale is nearly 400 miles from the nearest state border of the continental U.S., "local" here has a different definition.

Therefore, it was delightful to find Even Keel Fish and Oyster, a new dining destination that seeks out locally sourced seafood for their daily changing menu. Ever had clams from Cedar Key or crispy oysters from the Gulf? Here's your chance. Chef/owner David MacLennan (also a South Florida native) has connections. Yep, there *are* fishermen in the Keys who call when they have a great catch — so fresh, they aren't still flopping, but not far off. The idea of Modern Floridian Coastal may sound very PC, but it's a way of life for this eatery.

Even Keel opened in January 2019 with a selfimposed mission to serve the best of local offerings at a price that would appeal to those of us who live here, although seasonal visitors are, of course, welcome too. The innovative menu is affordably priced, not a special occasion-only location. From small to large plates and creative pizzas, there is something for everyone.

We were especially excited about the Happy Hour offerings – although the dinner menu was also impressive. Tuesday features \$2 oysters\*, Wednesday has \$19 all you can eat spicy mussels. Happy Hour (bar area and petfriendly patio area only) is offered Tuesday through Friday from 4 to 7 p.m. (with half-price all wines, cocktails, spirits and beer) plus weekend hours from 3 to 6 p.m.

\*The raw oysters are "cold" water oysters – shipped in fresh daily, but summer water temperatures in the Gulf make cooking local oysters a better choice. These are on the menu too.

They are closed on Mondays. This fall, the Thursday Happy Hour will feature Craft Nights with craft beer, craft tacos and well, crafts, made by local artists with a connection to beach and ocean causes. Sunday brunch is planned once more when the snowbirds return.

This is a place we will look forward to going to alone, or with guests, and will find the slightest excuse (even fighting northbound traffic) to do so. <sup>(1)</sup>

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
