# Pouring cooking oil down the drain can lead to clogged sewer lines and overflows.

Fats, oils, and greases are the leading cause of sewer line clogs and sewer main overflows in Fort Lauderdale. Clogged sewer lines can back up into houses and spill onto roadways and into our waterways creating hazards for humans, fish, and wildlife.

With improper disposal down the kitchen drain, greasy leftovers can quickly turn foul, leading to disruptive and smelly backups in the sanitary wastewater system.

### **PREVENT COSTLY PLUMBING REPAIRS:**

- Pour cooking oils into old cans, milk containers or other packages and dispose in your black garbage cart.
- Use a paper towel to wipe dishes and pots to remove grease prior to washing.
- Place fat trimmings from meat in your black trash cart, not your garbage disposal.





This project is not a good fit for the proposed area and instead it belongs in an industrial or commercial area where it is permissible. Together, we can voice what we feel is right for District 3 and attract developments that enhance the lives of all our neighbors.

### Update on Melrose Parks and Melrose Manors Stormwater Improvements

Earlier this year, the drainage ditch in the Melrose Park neighborhood was rehabilitated and the entire stormwater management system was thoroughly cleaned. Storm drains throughout the neighborhood were recently inspected and crews will soon perform regular maintenance on the culverts that connect segments of the ditch under the neighborhood's streets. Following these improvements, the system is expected to hold water as designed and prevent severe flooding conditions like those experienced in October and November 2020 due to extreme rain and Tropical Storm Eta.

Melrose Manors also experienced significant flooding last fall and plans are underway to add an estimated \$30 million in stormwater management infrastructure to the neighborhood with a target start date in 2025. Over the next few years, the project will be in the design and permitting phase that includes public outreach activities as the project advances to construction.

Remember, while some water is expected on streets after heavy rain, if stormwater ponds for over 48 hours or roads are impassable, call the City's 24/7 Customer Service Center at (954) 828-8000.

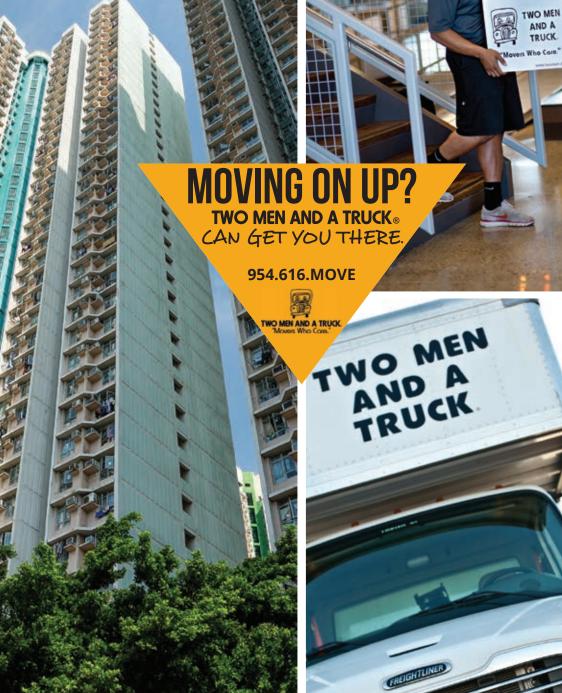

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### SAY HELLO TO LauderGO!

RIDE FOR FREE AND EXPLORE THE CITY ON THE GO BY LAND AND WATER

You may have spotted freshly wrapped shuttle and tram vehicles around the city as well as Water Trolley signage along the Riverwalk with the *LauderGO*! branding. You may have wondered, what is *LauderGO*? Is it really free? Where does it go? How do I hop on board? This article will be one of the many public-facing correspondence in the upcoming months that will provide an overview of the City of Fort Lauderdale's *LauderGO*? mobility services, which consist of the Community Shuttle, Seabreeze Tram, and Riverwalk Water Trolley.

### Origins of the name and look

The LauderGO! name and logo were created in alignment with the City's branding identity. The name has been coined from the term "Lauder," which has been used to represent various City programs (i.e., LauderBuild, LauderStreet, LauderTrac, etc.), and "GO!" to describe mobility services. For a unified look, the logo has been designed using City's graphic standards and color scheme.

### Funding

The City funds the *LauderGO*! Water Trolley and the Tram operations and maintenance, while Broward County sponsors the Community Shuttle service through the Penny for Transportation Surtax. The Florida Department of Transportation also provides supplementary grants to support costs not covered by the Surtax such as marketing, shuttle stop installation, etc. These partnerships are crucial to the City's ability to continuously improve its mobility services that fulfill community need.

### Service improvements

The LauderGO! brand does not only represent a new name or look, but also reflects the City's commitment to provide an equitable, safe, and quality passenger experience.

### **New Vehicles**

The City has transitioned to new vehicles leased from the County. The vehicles are equipped with ionizers that kill airborne pathogens in the air and on surface, a much needed feature especially amid the Covid-19 pandemic. The County also plans to convert these vehicles to environmentally-friendly propane fuel to reduce carbon footprint.

### Wraps and stop signage

All the trams and shuttles are wrapped with the *LauderGO*! branding. The Riverwalk Water Trolley uses the Water Taxi branding but features a *LauderGO*! banner and flag to distinguish it from the rest of the Water Taxi fleet. Additionally, *LauderGO*! signage will be installed in eight Water Trolley stop locations along the Riverwalk and Seabreeze Tram stops in Fort Lauderdale Beach. Solar-powered lighting will also be installed later this year in selected stops to increase ease and safety of passengers using the services at night.

### Webpage, fleet tracker and trip planner

A *LauderGO!* page along with a mobile app that passengers can use to plan trips and track fleet in realtime are being finalized. These public tools are being designed to clearly and quickly convey frequently searched information by passengers (i.e., routes,

schedule, how to ride, etc.).

### **ADA-Compliant Shuttle Stops and Shelters**

The City is also working on a project to design and install stops and shelters compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 in areas along the Community Shuttle routes where they are deficient. These will improve passengers' safe access to the larger transit network.

### **COUNTY'S INVESTMENT IN THE ARTS**

ARTS GRANTS PROCESS GETS STREAMLINED

he Broward County Cultural Division has been working for the past two years on a complete overhaul of our grantmaking programs to create a better and more streamlined process for the allocation of funding. Government can occasionally get a bad rap for implementing laborious processes designed to ensure accountability and these measures can sometimes have the unintended consequences of creating even more barriers to access.

The Cultural Division's new grantmaking system is aimed at eliminating barriers and creating a means for more equitable distribution of funding. By consolidating 11 separate grant programs into four targeted programs, we now have a more streamlined means of providing general operations and program support for non-profit organizations and municipalities, and project-based support for individual artists. In 2023, we'll roll out a new program to provide capital funds for cultural facilities.

Earlier this fall, the County Commission approved the Cultural Division's annual budget with an increase to its grantmaking capacity, continuing a positive trend of growing investment in the arts. For fiscal year 2022, the Commission approved more than \$5 million for cultural grants, representing a \$200,000 increase over fiscal year 2021.

The allocation for grants will provide \$4.4 million in operating grants to 35 cultural institutions, \$367,000 in program support to fund the cultural programming of nearly 50 non-profit organizations and municipalities, and \$233,000 to support the projects of Broward-based, individual artists.

In total, the overall investment demonstrates the County's continued support of Broward's arts and culture sector and underscores the importance of the sector on the local economy. A recent study conducted by Americans for the Arts calculated the economic impact of the non-profit arts and cultural industry in Broward at more than \$400 million dollars each year, supporting more than 11,000 jobs and generating more than \$40 million in revenue for local and state government.

In the first 10 months of 2021, ArtsCalendar.com received 1,276 event listing submissions – that's hundreds of events taking place in our community every month! We have a lively and diverse arts community here in Broward and it's clear that continued investment in the arts has a tremendous benefit for us all.



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THE UNIQUE CHALLENGES WHEN DESIGNING FOR A YACHT

Great interior design elevates a living space into a functional work of art. South Florida is replete with examples of skilled designers transforming interior spaces into havens of beauty and style. From high-rise condos to waterfront villas, our home lives are enriched thanks to the creativity and vision of these interior artists.

But what happens when that living space floats? And there are numerous outdoor living areas to consider, all of which will be exposed to extreme conditions? While general design principles still apply, an interior designer is faced with unique challenges when creating the living spaces on a yacht. Things you never think about on land, like securing a lamp on a side table or where safety equipment is stored, suddenly require great consideration when you're designing for life at sea.

Nobody knows this or does it better than Amy Halffman, who has been creating unforgettable interiors for yachts and superyachts for more than 20 years. With more than 100 new build yachts under her belt so far, Halffman has seen and done it all when it comes to yacht interior design. Which is why she is one of the most sought-after designers in the marine market today.

Halffman honed her design skills at the helm of Westport Yacht's interior design department. There she worked closely with yacht owners to design interior and exterior living spaces that captured the essence of the owners' personality. Whether it was her team managing the entire design process or she was working with an owner's personal designer, Halffman turned out unforgettable living spaces throughout her 12-year tenure at Westport. Since 2016, Halffman has been leading her own interior

But you won't hear her self-promoting her exceptional skills. Instead, she adopts a low-key approach to what she does, choosing instead to let her work speak for itself. And speak it does. Superyacht owners seek out her services to create their personalized living spaces, often for every boat they commission.

One of her most high-profile projects to date is M/Y Boardwalk, the 252-foot Feadship that hit the water earlier this year and made an appearance at the 2021 Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show. Boardwalk represents the fifth yacht Halffman has worked on for the superyacht's owner, billionaire hospitality and casino mogul, owner of the NBA Houston Rockets, Tilman Fertitta.

Designing the interiors for a superyacht is challenging under the best of circumstances. But when you throw in a global pandemic and a significant health situation (Halfman was diagnosed with breast cancer in January 2020), delivering a finished project on time is an even greater achievement.

"Even though the build for Boardwalk began well before 2020, finishing the interior components really ramped up toward the end of 2019. It was a challenging situation being in the thick of things while facing both unexpected healthcare demands and the global issues caused by

Covid-19," Halffman said when asked about working to complete Boardwalk's interior.

"Before Covid, I was traveling back and forth to the Netherlands regularly, but that stopped early in 2020 when travel ground to a halt," she noted. "We had to get creative to keep the momentum going. Thankfully, I have a great team to lean on and an exceptional owner who I've worked with for years. Despite the bumps in the road, we carried on without a hitch, and delivered Boardwalk by the deadline."

The result is understated elegance and an excellent example of Halffman's attention to detail and thoughtful design. It is also a perfect reflection of Boardwalk's owner.





### **2022 HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION**

UPDATES ABOUT YOUR PROPERTY

Il qualified Florida residents are eligible to receive a Homestead Exemption on their homes, condominiums, co-op apartments, and certain mobile home lots.

To qualify for Homestead Exemption, you must own and make the property your permanent residence on Jan. 1 of the year for which you are applying for this valuable exemption. Pursuant to Florida law, all assessments and exemptions are based upon the status of the property on Jan. 1.

If you purchased and/or made the property your permanent residence in 2021 and have not applied for Homestead Exemption, you can apply for 2022 exemptions at any time – there is no need to wait until 2022 to file your exemption application with the property appraiser's office. You can easily apply online at https://web.bcpa.net

### The timely deadline to file for all 2022 exemptions is March 1, 2022.

You must make the property your permanent residence by

Jan. 1, 2022, in order qualify; however, you have until March 1 to timely file your application with the property appraiser's office. The late filing deadline for all 2022 exemptions is Sept. 19, 2022. For information about all the other exemptions available to qualified applicants, please visit the "Exemptions & Classifications" page on our website https://web.bcpa.net/ bcpaclient/#/Homestead

Once approved, your Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you have already applied and been approved for Homestead Exemption at your current property, you do not need to reapply for this exemption. You will receive a Homestead Exemption renewal card next month to keep for your records.

THE DRIVING FORCE BEHIND THE SEMINOLE HARD ROCK WINTERFEST BOAT PARADE REMINISCES

ike many people, Lisa Scott-Founds holds fond memories of the Seminole Hard Rock Winterfest Boat Parade. Now the president and CEO of Winterfest, Scott-Founds grew up watching the parade with her family.

"I was the youngest with an older brother and two sisters. The difference in our ages kept us from doing a lot of activities together. Winterfest was a tradition we all enjoyed. I remember picnic baskets, blankets, lawn chairs, Frisbees, lots of laughter, and overall smiles on the shore waiting and watching Winterfest.

"I reflect on these memories when I talk about Winterfest. Watching the lights of the parade in a child's eyes tells you why I have the best career. I am surrounded by community leaders committed to continuing the magic."

Scott-Founds has a long history with the event. She joined the parade as a volunteer on the ball committee in 1987. Later, she was hired as the community relations manager for Winterfest in 1994. "I was with Winterfest for approximately a year when the position opened to be event director. A few members of the board encouraged me to take the position. Talk about old school," she said.

"I faxed my resumé minutes before the deadline. I didn't realize exactly what I was walking into, with



this role. A few years earlier, the organization was in financial ruin. In 1990, partners such as the Sun Sentinel and WSVN Channel 7 along with community leader Wayne Huizenga saved the parade from bankruptcy. I remember not taking a paycheck to ensure other employees were paid." Scott-Founds spent her early years rebuilding the parade

Lopez will appear onboard the Fifth Third Bank Grand Marshal Showboat, waving and greeting spectators along the 12-mile parade route as it sails along the New River, Intracoastal, the Parade Public Viewing Area presented by Baptist Health toward Pompano Beach. to its former glory while ensuring the organization's funding was healthy.

As Lisa's job title changed from community relations manager to executive director to president and CEO, she picked her employees and volunteers very close to the vest.



"I surrounded myself with people that have the same passion for the parade," she said.

She brought back Dawn Diehl who had taken a few years off after maternity leave as event director and logistics for the showboats. Another Florida native, Amy Tate, was already an employee when Lisa was hired. This team of three reached out personally to family, friends, and locals to expand the volunteer base to more than 300 parade-loving fans. In 2001, Amy moved to Georgia.

"As fate would have it, I received a phone call by the director of the Pompano Parade. We talked about me losing a staff member and she responded, 'why don't you hire me?' Kathy Keleher was added a month later."

Today, Winterfest continues as a family-affair with Lisa's husband, brother, sisters, nieces, nephews; Dawn and Kathy's children; children of board members and the return of past interns as volunteers for events, dock walkers, and viewing area volunteers.

"My love of Winterfest is still the driving force in me today.
