



This is the ideal time of year in Fort Lauderdale. The weather is amazing, and it is the perfect time to enjoy some of the wonderful dining, entertainment and recreational venues in the local area. Schakolad's chocolatiers follow a European-style family recipe that has been used for three generations, and all of their chocolate is made right on the premises. If you are in the area, stop in and sample any or all of their treats, although my daughters recommend the chocolate-covered strawberries. They are proven crowd-pleasers.

While I love my work, it's always important to take some personal time to disconnect and unwind. Bill Keith Preserve, located at 1720 S.W. 17th St., is an idyllic location to connect with South Florida nature. The 3.4-acre park has a boardwalk and nature trail, an observation deck, a pavilion and picnic tables and a canoe/kayak launch for people like me who prefer to paddle their stress away. No need to miss out if you do not own a paddle-powered vessel; there are several rental establishments within a short distance from the preserve.

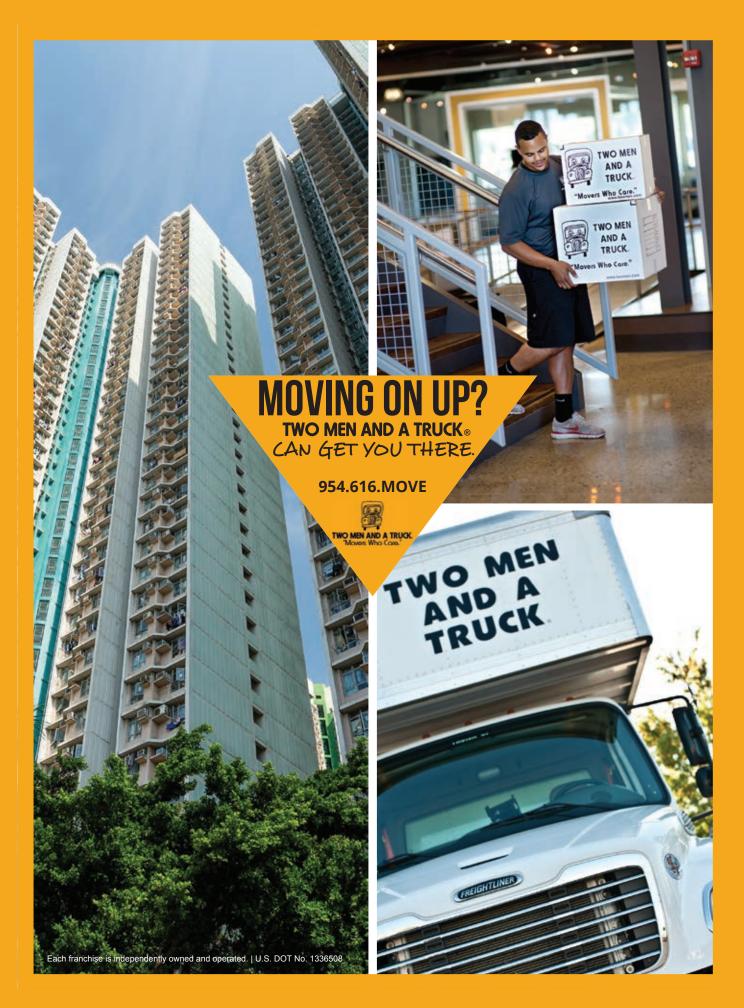

THE CITY'S AND RIVER'S SYNERGY

ART AT THE INTERSECTION OF ART, ARCHITECTURE, TECHNOLOGY AND PUBLIC SPACE

ur weather has turned to spectacular and the kind of weather you want to get out and spend time in as much as possible.

One of my favorite spots to get out and eat, drink and play is on the water and the top of my list is along the New River. The views of Downtown and the Riverwalk from the river are spectacular. I enjoy taking a free ride on the Riverwalk Water Trolley and stopping at the many great places to eat and drink along the way. Part of the joy of the ride on the river includes the bridges over and their artwork as you travel under. That collection is soon going to get a fantastic addition courtesy the Broward County Cultural Division under the Andrews Avenue Bridge.

The first Andrews Avenue Bridge was built in 1904 as a fixed, one-way bridge but as we grew, that bridge has been upgraded several times. The drawbridge we have today was built 1981.

The bridge began a major upgrade in 2019 when Broward County began its rehabilitation project that included major systems replacements, upgrade of the pedestrian ramp on the south side of the bridge, renovation of the tender house, the addition of noise-reducing wheel paths, the addition of concrete paths in the shoulders for bicyclist safety, new underdeck lighting on the Riverwalk, and a new color.

The project experienced delays due to Covid; however, over the past month they have been finishing the remaining items to complete the project. The final element will be an art installation this spring under the bridge to further enhance the experience on the water and along the Riverwalk by transforming the underneath of the drawbridge through the commission of an artistic lighting installation (rendering pictured).

The Broward County Cultural Division has commissioned this public art installation in support of the County Commission's commitment to art in public places. Their Public Art and Design team is leading the effort to transform the Andrews Avenue bridge with a dynamic new light installation by Los Angeles-based artist and architect Susan Narduli. The artist was selected for the commission from a field of 55 applicants who applied to the initial call to artists. Commissioner Steven Glassman, who served on the selection committee representing Fort Lauderdale, shared that, "Great cities understand the importance of public art. Fort Lauderdale's art offerings continue to multiply and we look forward to this project."

Narduli describes her work as being at the intersection of art, architecture, technology, and public space and the Andrews Avenue Bridge project is no exception. Her winning concept employs pattern, color and custom programming to express the synergy between the city and the river around which it developed. The lighting will change with the tidal flows as well as special occasions.

To get a sneak peek of work by the artist, Susan Narduli will be featured at MAD Studios in Dania Beach during the five-day Ignite Broward activation from Jan. 26 through 30 where she will produce a site-specific interactive indoor experience.

THE MAGIC OF VENICE

EXPERIENCE THE VENICE OF AMERICA ON A GONDOLA RIDE

ne of the most unique ways to experience our local waterways, known as the Venice of America, is from the cozy, comfort and relaxed speed of a gondola operated by Las Olas Gondola.

Las Olas Gondola was founded in 2008 by New Jersey native Mike Novack, who brought the first authentic Venice inspired gondola service to the South Florida riverfront.

Then in 2013, former boat captain, Martha Beachem, joined the team as both a gondolier and manager for six years before eventually taking over the business from Novack in July of 2018.

"When I started with them, they were only doing two rides a week and eventually we started doing up to 50 rides a week," Beachem said.

"I did every single one, day and night. It didn't matter because I just loved it. Then one day, I found out Mike was sick and wanted to sell the business. So, we made a deal that was comfortable for everybody and I purchased the business," she said. like ours in the world," Beachem said.

Las Olas Gondola offers four different tours of Fort Lauderdale, seven days a week, which include their daytime cruise, night light romantic cruise, full moon cruise, and their most popular – sunset cruise. Each tour is 75 minutes long and fits up to six people, with the gondolier in the rear so you can enjoy the ride in your own private cabin in center.

During the ride, your gondolier can give you a history of the riverfront including the history of its earliest settlers, the Seminole Indians. For guests looking to celebrate a special occasion like a birthday, anniversary, or their busiest holiday of the year, Valentine's Day, the gondoliers pull out all the stops to make your tour that much more special.

For an extra fee, the gondoliers play music on the ride, place a cocktail table in the cabin, and provide ice, glasses and plates so guests can bring wine, champagne or soda, and finger foods to have on their ride. This package is especially popular for proposals, of which they've had many over the years.

Whether you are planning a proposal or just going on

Today, Las Olas Gondola is more successful than ever as the premier gondola ride service in Fort Lauderdale and can even been seen every year in the annual Winterfest Boat Parade. Guests can experience the beauty of Fort Lauderdale while floating down the New River in their authentic Italian gondola, which is operated by one of their professional and licensed gondoliers. However, unlike their competitors, their gondola was made with the same design of the gondolas in Venice, Italy.

"Our gondola is an authentic antique wooden boat that was made in 1995. However, we're different from the gondolas in Venice because we have a motor to combat the New River's strong current. There's no other boat family outing, the ultimate goal at Las Olas Gondola is to make each ride magical for their guests. "We always tease each other that the gondola is magic because people can be fussing at each other one minute and then they get in the gondola, go on the ride, and come back laughing and having fun. So, that always makes me feel good, when people have a good time and enjoy it," said Beachem. ⁽⁶⁾

THE HOUSING-LABOR CONNECTION

WE SHOULD VIEW AFFORDABLE HOUSING AS A TOP ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ISSUE

ocal business owners have spent months struggling to recruit and retain adequate staff amid unprecedented labor shortages. Forced to recalculate their operations, restructure staff schedules, and hike wages, local owners are left scratching their heads, wondering how such a labor shortage came to be and why it has persisted.

Many believe the answer is simple. People can't work in Fort Lauderdale because people can't afford to live in Fort Lauderdale. We need a minimum of 5,000 units just to meet current demand.

The affordability of housing has been an issue for decades and the pandemic has exacerbated the problem, causing average mortgage and rent prices to skyrocket. Broward County relies heavily on low-wage jobs for industries currently experiencing severe shortages like hospitality. It's clear why affordable housing directly coincides with the labor shortage and should be considered a top economic development issue.

The average cost of rent in Fort Lauderdale, as of August 2021, was about \$2,300 per month for 900 square feet of space according to Rentcafe.com. That's higher than the national average of \$1,600-\$1,900 per month. Nearly half of the Broward workforce is employed in jobs earning less than 60 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI.) This imbalance makes it difficult, if not impossible, for average workers to find adequate housing on current incomes. Simply put, people can't be healthy consumers of the economy when most of the cost burden goes toward housing.

Business owners and employees alike are frustrated by the lack of affordable housing. At a recent Council of Economic Advisors meeting, several local business owners lamented that qualified candidates have turned down job offers because they cannot afford to live in the area. In addition, they've had to make adjustments, such as providing on-site breakfast for employees whose long commutes don't allow time to eat before their shifts.

Thankfully, some local groups are working tirelessly to



support affordable housing in Broward County. The Coordinating Council of Broward County, the Broward Workshop and vour Chamber have been working diligently for years to educate the public about housing issues and advocate for legislative change at the municipal, county, state and federal levels.

It's common for local leaders to mistakenly refer to the issue as either "Workforce Housing" or Section 8 Housing instead of "Affordable Housing." According to a recent report compiled by the Coordinating Council of Broward County, workforce housing describes the provision of shelter to a segment of the local population that is challenged to find affordable housing in high-demand markets such as South Florida. This term does not consider the needs of our community's elderly, youth aging out of foster care, college students, or persons with disabilities who still need an affordable place to live. The Section 8 Housing program assists primarily very low-income families and often has a lengthy waitlist.

In contrast, "affordable housing" follows the standard, nationally adopted guidelines for measuring housing affordability that determines the county's housing needs. Specifically, a household spending 30 percent or less of its income on housing costs is assumed to have "affordable housing," while spending more than 30 percent of household income on housing is defined as "cost-burdened."

We applaud the efforts of the Coordinating Council of Broward County and municipal and County entities who have implemented solutions such as land donations and streamlining the permitting process for developers who want to create affordable housing.

County Administrator Bertha Henry set up a \$48 million fund for housing development that is ready for construction. This is a good beginning, but we will need recurring dollars to support current and future demand.

Still, more can be done. At the Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce, we support expanding access to public transportation, including the Coastal Link commuter rail project, which would allow for more connectivity between residences and workplace, boosting what's known as the H+T (Housing + Transportation) index. It can also connect businesses with more consumers who are eager to shop and dine without traffic jams.

The Greater Fort Lauderdale area's hardworking employees deserve a place to rest their heads at the end of a long workday without the worry of an overburdensome housing cost. Meanwhile, our area's businesses want economic conditions that will bring and keep potential talent here. It's time to recognize affordable housing as a top economic development issue in Broward County a variety of local initiatives designed to help put this issue to bed. @

ort Lauderdale's culinary scene makes me hungry thinking about all the options we are blessed to have at our fingertips. From upscale eateries to charming cafés to hole-in-the-wall secret spots, you can satisfy any craving on any budget here. By land or sea, the options are virtually endless.

Of course, many of the most popular dining destinations are heavily influenced by our most abundant natural resource – water. Whether it is an oceanfront location, a menu heavy on fish and seafood, or a backstory infused with nautical flair, eating out in Fort Lauderdale is never short on good food, great views, and interesting history.

The best part of our culinary scene is that it is as diverse as our population. It isn't exclusively about pricey restaurants catering to visiting yachts and their well-heeled clientele. For every **YOT Bar & Kitchen** or **Secret Garden Dining Club**, there are a host of options that serve up simple, honest eats, often with a little kitsch on the side. Here's a roundup of staff favorites at the Marine Industries Association of South Florida.

At the top of that list is the **Jungle Queen**. An absolute throwback to the 1950s, this one-of-a-kind riverboat cruise is Fort Lauderdale's longest-running attraction. Polynesian fire dancing? Check. BBQ dinner? Check. Amazing views up and down the New River? Check. For an unforgettable, family-friendly evening that entertains and showcases the best of Fort Lauderdale by water, nothing beats a night on the Jungle Queen. It's where we take friends and family when they visit from out of town.

Think mermaids are a myth? Think again. You can find them nightly at the **Wreck Bar**. Located at the iconic B Ocean Resort, these sirens of the sea have been entertaining Wreck Bar guests since the 50s, when the likes of Marilyn Monroe and Joe DiMaggio grabbed a tropical cocktail and took in the porthole view. Today, you'll find not just family-friendly mermaids, but also late-night mermaid and aquamen burlesque shows. Times have changed.

Of course, not everything is about going back in time. When you want a casual meal surrounded by Florida's

natural assets, nothing beats **Quarterdeck** on the pier at Dania Beach. Yes, it's a chain, but one set apart by its jaw-dropping Atlantic Ocean views. The pier is also a popular fishing spot, so cast out your line and breathe in the salty air. Tasty food will be waiting when you work up an appetite.

These are all spots that are well-known by locals and visitors alike. But what about some lesser-known options? I'm talking about places that not even every local knows about.

These are the spots usually learned about by word-of-mouth. Not exactly secret but also not widely advertised, these gems are favorites of Fort Lauderdale locals and anyone "in the know." If you haven't discovered them yet, you'll enjoy exploring these under-the-radar establishments.

Top of the list is definitely **Capone's Flicker Lite Pizza and Raw Bar.** Tucked away behind a nondescript storefront on Ocean Drive in Hollywood, this old school hole-in-the-wall is a favorite spot for anyone craving authentic Chicago- or NYC-style pizzas. It's also popular for sports fans. You can catch virtually any event on the big screens or the mini-flat screens at each table.

Head up and inland to discover yet another south Florida icon. **Georgia Pig BBQ** has been around since 1953, serving up authentic open-pit barbeque, Brunswick stew, and pecan pie. The Pig started life way out on what was then rural Highway 441. Back then, they primarily served hungry construction workers that were laying the foundations for modern south Florida. Today, BBQ lovers from near and far head to the Pig's current location on State Road 7.

Finally, I'd be remiss if I didn't mention a personal favorite – **Il Paesano**. By day, this tiny storefront is a go-to for authentic Italian foods and ingredients. By night, the owners Paola and Vergilio serve up homecooked meals in an intimate atmosphere. It's an unassuming approach to delivering delicious food, and a place you can't help but return to again and again. It's a huge favorite of the entire MIASF staff.

HOMEOWNERS, CHECK YOUR MAIL

DOES MY HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION AUTOMATICALLY RENEW?



fter your initial application for homestead exemption has been approved, it automatically renews each year unless there is a change of ownership or eligible use of your homesteaded property. Each January, our office mails a Homestead Renewal Notice and "Change Card" to all homesteaded properties. Florida law requires the property owner to notify the property appraiser of any change which may affect homestead eligibility. This change order card provides an efficient way to communicate these important changes to our office.

If there are NO changes to the use and/or ownership of your property, simply keep the card as your receipt verifying that your homestead exemption has automatically renewed for another year. However, if there are changes, please mark the change card accordingly and return it to our office.

If your name is not printed above the mailing address section on this card, it means you are not protected by homestead exemption at this property. You may be on title to the property, but you are not receiving homestead exemption. If you are eligible for homestead exemption on this property, you must complete your own homestead exemption application. You can apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/HomesteadExemption

If you are a co-owner, surviving spouse, trust beneficiary or otherwise believe you are entitled to this exemption, you must file your own homestead exemption application to receive the benefit. If you have any questions relating to the death of the owner, the change card or need assistance in filing for homestead or other tax-saving exemptions, please visit our website at web.bcpa.net or contact our customer service department at (954) 357-6830.

Where did my portability savings go?

A portability deduction is only posted to your property record page in the first year you receive your new homestead exemption. The portability savings from the first year form the basis of your new Save Our Homes value on a going forward basis and — in subsequent years — will rise or fall based upon market just value changes and the 3 percent cap, as your new Save Our Homes value has incorporated your portability savings. When our website is updated to display subsequent year property values, your portability deduction is no longer shown independently because it is already factored into your new assessed/Save Our Homes value.

he non-profit organization Junior Achievement of South Florida has been making an impact on K-12 students for more than 60 years. he market for gin is huge. Once considered a drink of our grandparents, the variety of offerings now available are mind-boggling.

Just a few words, however, on the name: *genievre* is the old French word for juniper, whose berries, originally used medicinally, became the flavoring agent for the malted barley spirit, gin. To this day ANY product called gin has juniper (at some level) in its herbal flavor profile.

The Irish are credited with being among the first to distill spirits (after the ancient Arabs). While the legend that St. Patrick brought the skill back to Ireland in the 4th century is questionable, by the 11th century monks there were distilling grain into liquor.

We had occasion recently to meet one of the young Irishmen who founded Glendalough Distillery which makes both Irish whiskey and two fabulous gins – one traditional with botanicals and a pink one that adds rose petals to the mix. Their attention to detail in both their whiskey and gin is remarkable and obviously a labor of love.

Gin is tremendously food friendly – something that surprises many folks we know. The day of bathtub gin is thankfully gone (although, it really wasn't true gin anyway) and the selections on the shelves are mind boggling.

If you don't want to rush out and buy a full fifth of gin you can go for happy hour and have your mixologist stir up a treat. Don't be afraid to ask about the flavor profiles – it's the additions of everything BUT juniper that make each product unique.

Renée K. Quinn, our Spirited South Florida expert, suggested a few Downtown spots that have people behind the bar who know gin goes in more than just a G&T, which include: No Man's Land, to Sidecar II at Vino's on Las Olas, the Wilder, Unit B Speakeasy and YOLO.

Then check the menu for:

- Charcuterie especially Iberico ham, prosciutto or any cured meat, and boldly flavored cheeses
- Smoked salmon well, what doesn't go with that?
- Pate any kind
- Berries and cucumbers surprised, eh?
- Shrimp in almost any fashion spicy included.

And create your own food pairing favorites. It's been around this long for a reason, and there's no time like the present to be-GIN enjoying this ancient brew.
