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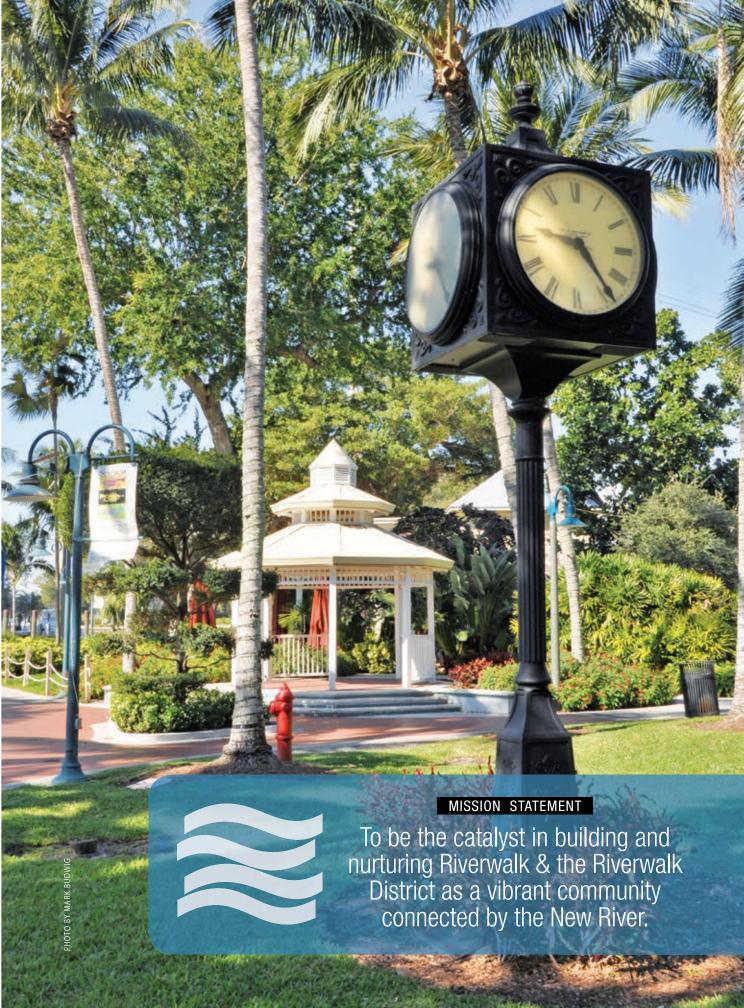

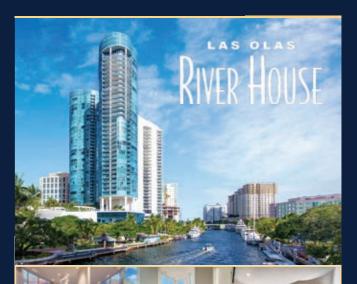

THE INFLUENCE OF DESIGN IN FORT LAUDERDALE

HOW THE MASTERPLAN OF RIVERWALK HELPED TRANSFORM AND REJUVENATE OUR DOWNTOWN

he dream of what would become Riverwalk Linear Park began when funding was approved by resident voters in 1986. This awarded a General Obligation Bond to offer resources to begin planning.

Since then, more than \$1.5 billion in public and private investments have been spent on the redevelopment of Riverwalk, now considered by many as "Florida's most beautiful mile."

EDSA was the architectural firm responsible for the award-winning masterplan, detailed design guidelines and construction services for the linear park. These efforts resulted in Downtown Fort Lauderdale becoming a world-class city in the heart of Broward County.

Just a few of the many awards and accolades: Riverwalk was awarded an inaugural "National Landscape Award" for public space in 1994 and has been recognized with the following awards: Broward Beautiful, 1st Place, Special Achievement, 2003; Aurora Award, 1996; Waterfront Center Award, 1995; Florida Design Arts Award, 1995; Florida Nursery, Growers & Landscape Association, 1993; American Society of Landscape Architects/Florida Chapter, Frederic Stresau Award of Excellence, 1992.

This masterplan helped centralize the New River as an economic resource for Fort Lauderdale, drawing tourists each year to stay, spend money, and for some, purchase real estate or relocate their business.

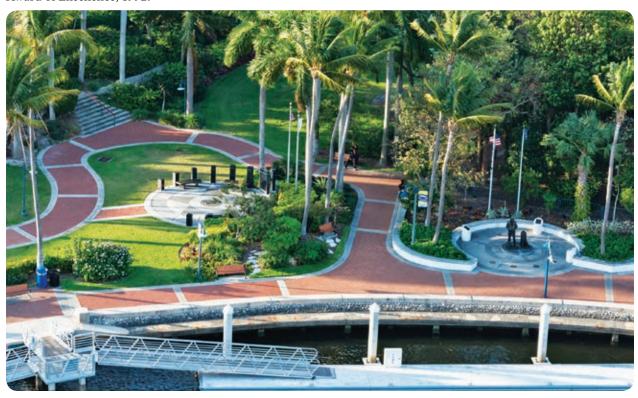
Along with connecting Fort Lauderdale's arts and science district with Las Olas and the entertainment district in a beautiful and fluid way, the Riverwalk serves as a central hub for residents, tourists, and businesspeople to come together to enjoy the beauty of the New River and the abundant greenspace of the many parks dotted along the way. This has resulted in a walk score of 94/100 which doesn't hurt!

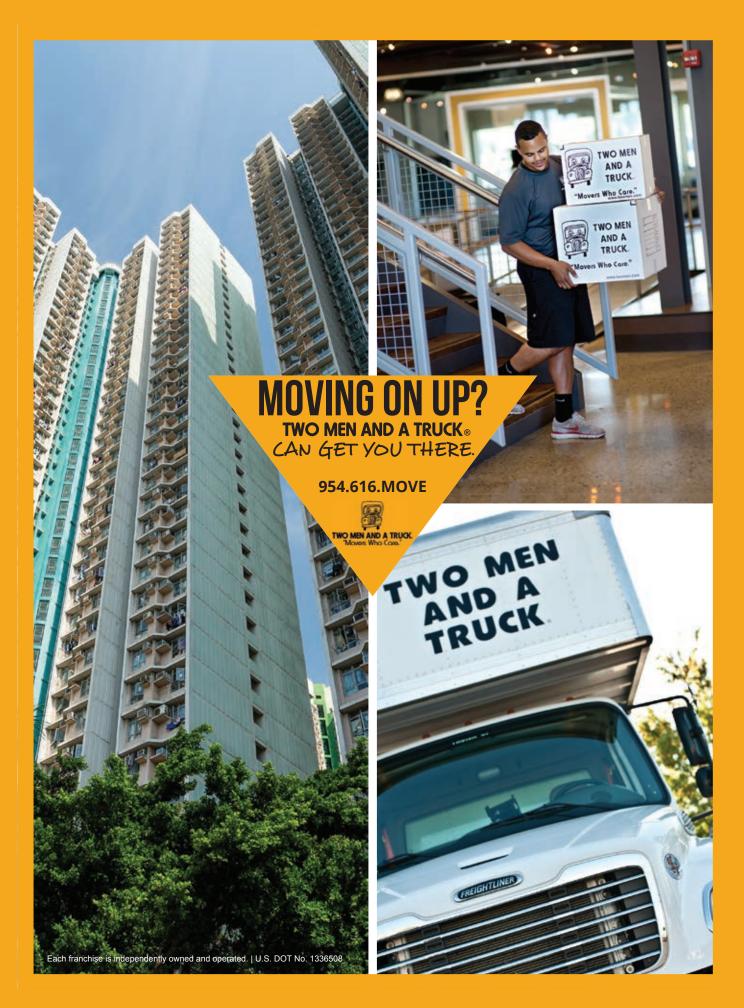

HISTORY MEETS DESIGN

THE BUILDINGS IN OUR CITY TELL A STORY

he great City of Fort Lauderdale is known for its beauty, envied beaches, favored night spots, restaurants and bars, and the combination of bustling tourists and residents. Our streets are filled daily by local businesspeople, Fort Lauderdale residents, and out-of-towners visiting to escape harsh weather and celebrate our sun, smiles, and fun personalities. We are a city full of energy, but we should not be too busy to slow down and notice local architecture and history.

In bringing up history, let us start with the South Side Cultural Arts Center, a popular spot for family gatherings that is currently being used for performing arts, culinary classes, and sports. The building has historical significance: it is the City's first elementary school that was in use until 1969 and it is one of the earliest buildings in Fort Lauderdale.

We must also consider the story behind our very own Savor Cinema located by the river. Originally built as a church in 1926, Savor Cinema showcases American independent, international, and local films year-round. Before sporting the name we know today, this theater was called the "Vinnette Carroll Theatre" after Vinnette Carroll, the theater's director in the mid-1980s. What most people may not know is that she was the first African American woman to direct a Broadway show. What an incredible story! A piece of history sits right in our backyard for us to appreciate as a physical reminder of a great milestone accomplished by a past visionary.

Speaking of visionaries, architecture and art come to mind in the creative world. Fort Lauderdale is home to structural and visual art for all to appreciate. One such example is the development of Las Olas Walk, where modern art and murals by local artists decorate walls and building interiors. Fresh and innovative interior design features in the common spaces and in the furnishings inside the units are a popular choice. Las Olas is no stranger to art appreciation and does not shy away from an opportunity to express it!

On the topic of innovation, interior design, and the future, one project comes to mind –The Rain Tree Lofts designed by PALMA and Asi Cymbal. Asi Cymbal is an art collector and is working with PALMA to bring to life one of many artistically interesting buildings in Fort Lauderdale. Not only is the design aesthetically interesting, but it also considers our future and pays respect to the century-old Raintree.

There are so many architecturally and historically significant buildings that locals and residents may not know of. This can lead to history being forgotten and the deep meaning behind architectural design being ignored. However, by paying closer attention, we will find that the buildings in our City tell a story and by taking time to listen, we will understand where we come from. Ideally, we will share these stories with our loved ones to ensure that the City of Fort Lauderdale will never forget. ⁽¹⁾

INNOVATIVE DESIGNS ABOUND THROUGHOUT OUR AREA

to live, work, and play! Our lively city boasts such a unique vibe. Sunshine, beaches, and one-of-a-kind architecture continues to attract residents and tourists alike to seek the perfect ambiance and backdrop. South Florida continues to have an environment that cannot be replicated anywhere else. Fort Lauderdale is home to some the best architects and designers who have put their work on display for all of us to enjoy.



The innovative building designs we see throughout the Downtown skyline, as well as their modern interior design, are something that I still marvel at as a lifelong Florida resident.

Building exteriors with rich historical background continue to be a hallmark in our community. Some that stand out include the Pier 66 tower, Ocean Manor Resort, Sea Tower and the Hillsboro inlet lighthouse, in our newly named District 100.

The Pier 66 tower is an architecturally significant building. Principal designer, Richard F. Humble, infused with details that paid homage to his employer, and the tower's original owner, Phillips Petroleum. The number 66 features prominently throughout, including the 66 spires on the

building's crown, the 66 windows in each of the tower's walls, the 66-second glass elevator ride to the top, and the 66 minutes it takes the circular floor of the Pier Top to make a full rotation as guests are treated to panoramic views of the city and beyond.

The Ocean Manor Resort was first conceptualized in 1953, when real estate developer James Hunt had a vision to build the first high rise resort directly on Fort Lauderdale beach. From his vision, areas like Galt Ocean Mile have bloomed into the thriving community that it is today. You can find sunshine, luxury and relaxation all embodied into the newly remodeled Ocean Manor hotel. The design's bright white tones are complimented by crisp bright blues throughout the exterior and interior of the building. Hunt's contributions have played a huge part in the foundation of what is well known cities in Broward County.

The historic Sea Tower was built in 1957, and has become iconic in its "C" shaped residence design. The tower holds 83 units designed by architect Igor Polevitsky. The iconic architectural shape was designed to provide shade in covered outdoor units while still viewing the beautiful oceanfront. This building made Polevitsky a household name. He is also well known for his innovative architecture designs at popular hotels like the Shelburne, the Birdcage House and Havana Riviera.

However, maybe the most iconic design in District 100 is our Hillsboro Inlet Lighthouse. It was built almost entirely out of iron, and was first lit in 1907. The Inlet house is one of the oldest structures in still standing Broward. Its light can beam for 28 nautical miles and stands 132 feet tall. Located in Hillsboro beach the inlet is often a center point for picture perfect backgrounds, and often thought up as a historic landmark in Broward. In 2003 to honor its design and history, the United States Postal Service chose the lighthouse to commemorate Florida on a series of stamps.

In 1992 the big light was turned off and renovated to replace the old mechanism that contained 400 pounds of mercury with a specially designed ball bearing system. The lead based paint was also sandblasted off and epoxy paint was applied in 1995. The project was completed and the large light was relit on January 28, 1999.

We have much to offer with our architecture in South Florida, and we will continue add to our skyline.

NEW PUBLIC ART EXHIBITS CELEBRATE WATER AND LAND

he City of Fort Lauderdale is committed to enhancing its identity through public art and community beautification. As part of this commitment, the City is proud to unveil two of its latest public art exhibits.

The first exhibit, a palm tree sculpture by world-class artist Romero Britto, was generously donated to the City by Yasmin Reger. This sculpture stands near downtown at Florence C. Hardy Park, located at 25 S.W. Ninth Street, to enhance the aesthetics of the area and spur creativity amongst the community. The sculpture is located in the northwest section of the park by the tennis courts. This statue will also mark the continued expansion of the City's recreational amenities with projects such as the LauderTrail on the horizon. This multi-use trail will pass by Florence C. Hardy Park along the Florida East Coast Railway to connect the City's neighbors and visitors to various parks, transit, local businesses, and attractions.

The second exhibit is the Street Art Regatta, a cultural program, curated by Grace Arts Center Inc. based in Fort Lauderdale and serving South Florida. In 2020-2021, 20 street and pop artists created original artwork on sails as the canvas. Quantum Sails partnered with the City to reproduce the original imagery on new sails in 2022. Youth sailors from the Lauderdale Yacht Club Sailing Foundation exhibited the artwork on the water transforming the

Intracoastal into a floating theater of kinetic imagery and energy. The first series of sails were inspired by South Florida's award-winning dance community creating a dance floor on the water for audiences to enjoy along the docks of the Lauderdale Yacht Club with resources raised for expanding sailing and art scholarships for Broward County students. New River Fine Art commissioned two local artists to celebrate the glamour and nostalgia of beach gatherings and sailing all to honor the City's moniker as the "Venice of America." Each year, more galleries and artists are invited to join the process of creating an interactive installation on the water and land. To celebrate historic architecture and outdoor gathering spaces for the community, the sails are currently on display outside at the South Side Cultural Arts Center, located within Florence C. Hardy Park at 701 S. Andrews Ave.

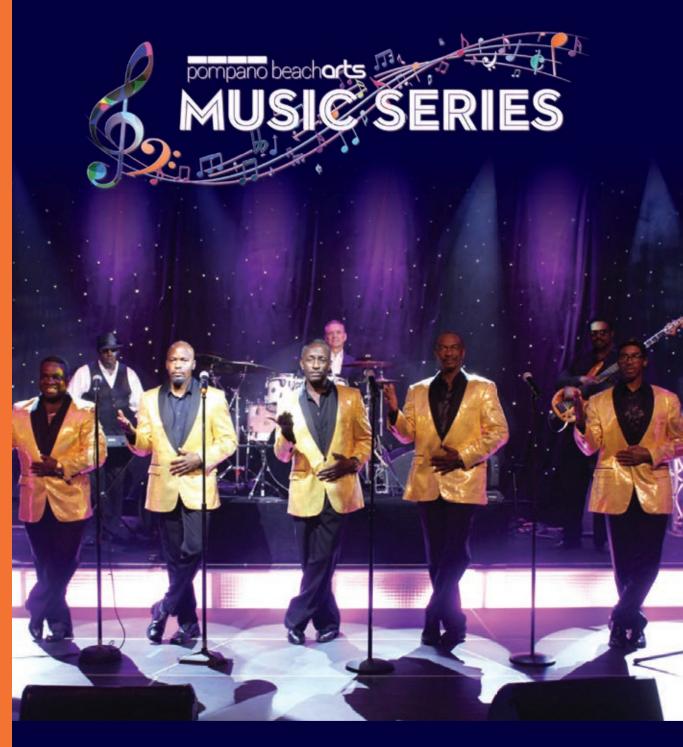
With the inclusion of public art and the LauderTrail, along with the existing South Side Cultural Arts Center located within Florence C. Hardy Park, this area of Fort Lauderdale will soon serve as a hub for recreation and cultural offerings. GETTING TO THE BEACH FOR EVENTS

CITY OFFERS EASY TRANSPORTATION TO OUR SUNNY SHORE

We have entered the season of amazing events on the beach, and in my transportation lens this also comes with how to move people to and from those events. One of the great things about living in Fort Lauderdale is the beach is so close to many neighborhoods. Because of this easy access, it opens up the possibilities of how to get to events.

The City's Transportation and Mobility Department is promoting two rejuvenated options this year, our Free Bike Valet service at major barrier island events and the rebranding of the former Sun Trolley to LauderGo!. Both are making it easier to access events on the beach, coupled with our Las Olas Garage with supportive Seabreeze Tram has created great options no matter how you want to get there.

The Free Bike Valet service will be offered for the July 4th festivities on the beach this year, located at the intersection of Las Olas Boulevard and Seabreeze Boulevard. The fenced area is manned by staff throughout the event to watch over your bicycle. Bring your own lock to secure it to the marathon racks and you will receive a check ticket. The location is convenient to events happening on the beach near Las Olas Boulevard.

The City has provided this free service in the past, as well as by private events like the Tortuga Music Festival with the location conveniently located at the ticket office at D.C. Alexander Park. Most recently, the City

sponsored the service at the Fort Lauderdale Air Show at the corner of Sunrise Boulevard and SRA1A that was very successful, with some of the best parking available for the event.

Don't have a bike? That is OK — the City also offers a free community bus service from Downtown to the beach through two routes. What was once the Sun Trolley has now been rebranded as LauderGo! It is now funded by your Broward County Penny for Transportation. The two routes on the beach include the Beach Link (Daily, 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.) and Las Olas Link (Friday to Sunday, 12:45 to 5 p.m.).

The Las Olas Link connects the Brightline Station east along Las Olas to the beach and north to Vistamar Street while the Beach Link connects Broward General along Southeast 17th Street to the beach north to the Galleria Mall. Visit www.fortlauderdale.gov/laudergo or download the LauderGo! App from your app store for more information and live tracking.

Prefer to drive? The Transportation and Mobility Department also manages the great parking facility of the Las Olas Garage. There are five levels of parking in the facility just blocks from the event. If you park at the garage, you can take advantage of the free Seabreeze Tram to bring you from the garage to the beach between Las Olas Oceanside Park and Cortez Street.

No matter how you want to get to the beach, there is a great alternative for you.

EXPERIENCING NATURE THROUGH ART

TWO NEW PUBLIC ART INSTALLATIONS ARRIVE ON THE SCENE

ecently, our Public Art & Design program installed two new sculptures, adding to its collection of more than 280 pieces of public art. These newest additions to the County's growing collection are quickly becoming local landmarks and can be found at Pine Island Pocket Park in Davie (on Pine Island Road, just south of 595) and Everglades Holiday Park in west Broward. The two public art installations celebrate nature, transform the environment, acknowledge their respective communities, and continue the rich tradition of public art Broward County began nearly 45 years ago.

As with many of our public art installations, it is important the pieces have a connection to the community in which they are located. This was especially important with *Silhouette Herd* by artist Wendy Klemperer. The pieces were commissioned in partnership with the County's Highway and Construction Engineering Division for the Town of Davie and feature a group of five galloping horses that reflect Davie's rural and equestrian roots. The sculptures seek to acknowledge the equestrian trails located throughout the town, evoking a time when horses ran free in nature.

Flight Path by artists Jennifer Madden and Jeffrey Reed was commissioned for Everglades Holiday Park in partnership with County Parks and Recreation, which recently completed a nearly \$16 million renovation on the park. At the far western edge of Broward County, the artistic partnership created



a monumental sculpture in a larger-than-life representation of a Great Egret. The sculpture is stainless steel and glistens in the sun against the backdrop of the Everglades. To enhance the work, and embedded in the pathway adjacent to the sculpture, are 20 flat sculptures depicting a variety of birds that can be found in the Everglades. Visitors can enjoy a nearby identification key to challenge themselves

to identify each one displayed.

Art has a unique way of facilitating thoughtprovoking ideas and conversations through a shared experience and these two pieces are no exception. They allow us to reflect on the importance of understanding and preserving our environment and it is for this reason, both projects were envisioned as opportunities to experience nature through art. 📵

CHALLENGES, CHALLENGES

THE KEY INGREDIENT TO A GREAT ECONOMY

n any given day someone will say to me, "the biggest challenge facing south Florida is..." We have many opportunities which I have explored with you — supply chain logistics, talent pool, access to capital, racial equity, voting rights, water resources, and resilient economies to name but eight.

In my 35-years in organizational management with Realtors' associations and this Chamber, one theme continues and stands between a good economy and a great economy — housing. Whether it is renting or owning a home, the ability of our workforce to be safely and economically housed is as bad as it has ever been.

At a recent housing summit, I heard some solutions worth exploring beyond what we have been doing. Alameda, California, issued a \$580 million bond for

housing and County Commissioner Nan Rich suggested this as an option for us. She also floated adding affordable housing to state impact fee laws and institute an ordinance like what was done in Boulder, Colorado. Walter Duke, former mayor of Dania Beach, suggested "we must increase density" to provide for alternatives. These ideas and more need to be debated and deployed if we are going to make a difference with the numbers.

Here's what we know: in 2020 our county population was 1,942,273 and the poverty rate was 12.7 percent, down from 14 percent in 2017, but still too high. Our white population has declined while our Black and brown populations have increased (whites still lead at 689,773). Pembroke Park has the highest poverty rate at 22.5 percent of its population and Fort Lauderdale the

lowest at 15.8 percent.

We had 826,382 housing units in Broward County in 2020 with Fort Lauderdale leading at 95,057 (11.5 percent) and Hallandale Beach with the lowest amount at 27,314 (3.3 percent) of major municipalities.

For rentals, there were 121,440 vacant units in 2020 and of that there were 68,654 for short-term rentals. The majority of these structures were built prior to 1989.

The rub comes when we look at housing prices. The median sales price for single-family homes in Broward County was \$520,000 during the first quarter of this year. Meager supply is leading to soaring prices.

I bought my first home with a pool for \$80,000 with \$3,000 down and I was making \$38,000 with little to no savings. That doesn't happen in this market.

Rentals aren't any better. One-bedrooms are beginning at \$1,700 and three bedrooms are \$3,000-plus. Supply is also an issue.

The other push is what we pay our workforce. We are doing better but we must increase salaries for our workers or face the talent flight we know is happening.

I know we have many priorities throughout our region. One mentor suggested to me if I had too many priorities, I had no priorities. Let's make housing all citizens number one.

DESIGNERS PAY ATTENTION TO A SEAMLESS EXPERIENCE

houghtful design does more than take a space from bland to beautiful. Good interior design incorporates efficiency into the mix, too. And does so in a way that allows you to enjoy a seamless experience without ever knowing – or likely caring – what's happening behind the scenes.

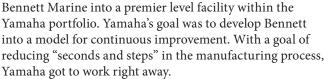

2022 PROPERTY EXEMPTIONS

IT IS NOT TOO LATE TO APPLY

he timely deadline to apply for any 2022 exemption was March 1; however, applicants can still late file until Sept. 19, 2022. If you both owned and made the property your permanent residence as of Jan. 1, 2022, you can still apply for 2022 Homestead Exemption and any other exemptions you may qualify for. You can easily apply for Homestead Exemption online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Homestead as well as view all the other exemptions available to qualified applicants.

Both Homestead Exemption and the Low-Income Senior Exemption automatically renew each year. If you were receiving Homestead Exemption in 2021 on your current home, you do not need to reapply. If you were also receiving the Senior Exemption in 2021 and your adjusted household gross income for 2021 did not exceed \$32,561, this exemption has automatically renewed and you do not need to do anything additional. If your 2021 income exceeded \$32,561, please notify our Exemption Department at exemptions@bcpa.net so we can remove the Senior Exemption for the 2022 tax year.

Quarterly Tax Payment Installment Plan

While the Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect taxes, our office receives many calls from residents inquiring about installment tax bills and their recently approved exemptions. Broward County's Records, Taxes and Treasury Division is responsible for the billing and collecting of property taxes.

For property owners on their installment payment plan, the first two installment payments (June and September) are based on the previous (2021) tax year. This means residents who have been approved for 2022 Homestead Exemption or other exemptions will not see these showing on either the June or September installment bills. The final two installment bills (December and March) will be adjusted to include any 2022 exemptions or changes to the property's taxable value. The deadline to apply for Broward County's Installment Payment Plan was May 1, 2022.
