

THE "YACHTING CAPITAL OF THE WORLD"

THE ECONOMIC IMPORTANCE OF OUR WATERWAYS

he city of Fort Lauderdale has been coined the "Yachting Capital of the World" as well as the "Venice of America" due to its more than 50,000 yachts and around 165 miles of weaving waterways running throughout the city and to the ocean. These waterways contribute to our economy and lifestyle in countless ways.

Construction of the first of these canals began in 1920 as people began clearing the dense mangroves to open these channels. Las Olas Boulevard was also constructed just prior to this in 1917.

Marine industry

Broward County benefits from big bucks when it comes to the marine industry, bringing in around \$9.7 billion to our economy and more than 121,000 jobs. Fort Lauderdale is host to the Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show, which is known as the largest in-water boat show in the world and brought an impact of \$1.79 billion to our economy in 2021.

Cruise Industry/Port Everglades

According to the 2021 annual report, Port Everglades provided an impact of \$30 billion and provided jobs to 7,013 people locally. Port Everglades is ranked the third largest cruise port in the nation after Port Miami and Port Canaveral. More than 2.5 million passengers came through Port Everglades from October 2019 to September 2020, and these numbers would have been much greater if not for the industry shutdown which began in March 2020.

Hospitality

According to numbers published by Visit Lauderdale, \$1.36 billion in hotel revenue was brought into Fort Lauderdale's economy in 2021 and the number of visitors is expected to increase considerably throughout 2022.

Recreational

There are a multitude of activities to choose from along the New River and Intracoastal Waterway in addition to Fort Lauderdale Beach. Everything from boating, fishing, skiing, parasailing, and paddleboarding. No boat? No problem! The Water Taxi will get you anywhere along the New River and Intracoastal, with 11 different stops along the way. This is a recommended way to enjoy the New River, Las Olas, and Riverwalk Arts & Entertainment District.

CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE PREPARE FOR UPCOMING KING TIDES

King tides have historically caused street flooding in low-lying areas of our community. The City uses tax dollars and stormwater fees to invest in longterm strategies to reduce the frequency, duration, and intensity of tidal flooding in vulnerable areas. These include elevating seawalls, installing tidal valves, and making drainage improvements. We also take proactive steps to prepare for the king tide season such as inspecting all tidal valves. We encourage our neighbors to prepare by:

- Reviewing flood safety tips
- Second Se
- Reviewing your flood insurance policy

If you experience flooding on your street, make sure storm drains are not blocked. Rainfall concurrent with the high tide may cause some street ponding until the tide recedes. Remove waste carts as soon as possible once emptied or wait until your next scheduled collection day to put them out. Since we experience two tidal cycles each day, be aware of the timing of the high tides and how they may affect your travel plans. Avoid driving on flooded streets. While some roadway flooding is expected, please report impassable roads to our 24/7 Customer Service Center at 954-828-8000.

PREDICTED 2022 KING TIDES

Seasonal high tides known as king tides will occur through November:

Oct. 6-12 | Oct. 24-30 Nov. 6-9 | Nov. 23-27

Since higher tides are possible on both the new moon and the full moon, additional dates to watch for tidal impacts include:

Dec. 23-24

King Tide Reminders for Riverwalk Neighbors:

Pedestrians / Cyclists: Be mindful of high tide times when planning walks or bike rides along the Riverwalk.

Boating Community: Keep wake to a minimum to prevent wave overwash on to the Riverwalk.



Since I was first sworn into office in 2014, the Sistrunk Boulevard corridor, called "The Heart and Soul of the City" for good reason, has been reenergized with the arrival of new businesses and economic opportunities. A real sense of community has grown in recent years with family-friendly events and entertainment popping up around town, including free concerts in several of our local parks.

Water is life in Fort Lauderdale, and we all are fortunate to have the opportunity to enjoy the scenic waterways, the hustle and bustle along the Riverwalk, and the activity in and around the New River. 

In July 2022, the makeover was completed and unveiled for the public to enjoy. The completed towers boast and reflect Fort Lauderdale's dynamic coastal life including swaying palm trees, towering sandcastles, and thriving sea turtles. The beautified towers will further enhance enjoyment of the beach, but also serve as a critical beacon for those in need of emergency assistance. MAKING STREETS MORE BEAUTIFUL

THE CREATIVE TOUCH TO OUR TRAVELS

What goes into a street is so much more than just pavement. The Transportation and Mobility Department works together with residents to address a variety of elements within the right of way of a street that include improving accommodations for pedestrians and bicyclists and moving vehicles at appropriate speeds for the street. But it is not just the traditional type of projects, it is also creating a more enjoyable experience while traveling along street through various creative placemaking element installations.

One program of the city is to wrap the utility boxes associated with traffic signals. This program was started several years ago and takes unsightly large silver boxes at many key intersections across the city and transforms them into artistic elements. The program has installed art across the city including on key corridors such as Broward Boulevard, Sunrise Boulevard and Sistrunk Boulevard. These boxes are not owned by the City, therefore the installations take coordination with both Broward County who own the boxes and many take coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation when they are along streets of their jurisdiction.

This year's efforts include transformations of boxes along A1A north of Oakland Park Boulevard, Southeast 17th Street east of US 1, and Davie Road between I-95 and the bridge over the New River as well as boxes that have already been wrapped on Northeast 18th Avenue north of Commercial Boulevard and Sistrunk Boulevard in the Dorsey Riverbend neighborhood.

Each installation varies in regards to the theme and artwork depending on the specific neighborhood through close coordination with the neighborhood associations on what they most want to see that means something to their neighborhoods. Some neighborhoods provide their own photographic images representing elements in their neighborhoods such as Shady Banks who provided photos for their boxes of a beautiful orchid and a beach view taken by a resident, others provide key themes such as Imperial Point and Coral Ridge Isles of native butterflies.

The themes of the upcoming projects will include a signature installation of Guy Harvey artwork along Southeast 17th Street through a partnership with the Guy Harvey Inc. which will add an amazing elevation to this corridor. And along A1A in the Galt, there will be a beautiful collection of native flowers with the first four boxes being wrapped this year and the remaining in the new year.

Stay tuned and keep an eye out for these little bits of art on your travels across the city as we continue to grow the program into next year.

LIGHT-BASED ART INSTALLATION TO ILLUMINATE 17TH STREET CAUSEWAY BRIDGE

t has been exciting to watch Fort Lauderdale's growth since my arrival in 2019, and as it continues to grow, the arts are helping it flourish.

The arts play many roles in the development of a city and can be leveraged to help create its unique identity and sense of place. Public spaces are planned, designed, and managed with this in mind. Unique to our public spaces in South Florida are our region's many waterways and bridges. Over the next couple of years, the Andrews and Third Avenue drawbridges in Downtown Fort Lauderdale will take on new identities with the addition of new light-based art installations that will transform these two functional structures into visually exciting landmarks.

The Cultural Division is also now in the process of commissioning an iconic, large-scale, light-based art installation for the E. Clay Shaw bridge, also known as the 17th Street Causeway. This 580-foot-long bridge connects the City of Fort Lauderdale to the beach and is one of the most recognizable structures in the city. It is also a gateway to our city via our waterways and is surrounded by Port Everglades, the Convention Center, and numerous hotels and restaurants.

Following a call to artists earlier this year, three artists have been selected for the next phase of this high-profile project. As part of this process, the Division is inviting the community to participate in an online survey that will lead to the development of a vision for this iconic structure. We greatly encourage the community's input, as this feedback is a key component of successful public art initiatives. Survey results will be collected and shared with the short-listed artists to use in their design proposals. I look forward to seeing what they produce. 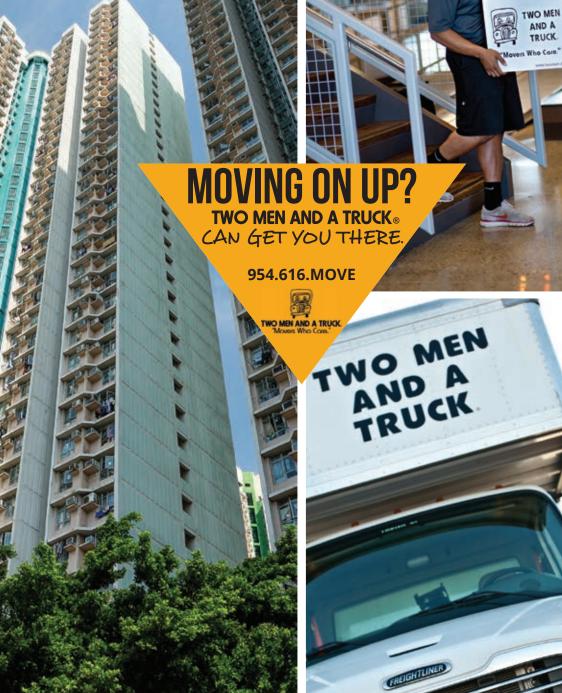

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THE COLLABORATIVE EFFECT

BUSINESS LEADERS TRAVEL TO WASHINGTON, D.C., TO MEET DECISION MAKERS

orking with government as a collaborative business community is critical to any thriving economy. The Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce and our partners often work on issues of common interest with federal, state and local public entities. We know there is a direct correlation between our efforts and successful outcomes.

Last month, a delegation led by Chair Burnadette Norris Weeks and 65 business leaders, elected officials, and key staff traveled to our nation's Capitol to work on a series of issues. Some were new to our workplan, and some have been there since I started at the Chamber 15 years ago.

The Issues Committee, led capably by Lacey Hofmeyer, Broward College, selected the following:

1. Port Everglades Deepening and Widening

- 2. Pell Grants for Short-Term Training
- 3. Funding for the Central and South Florida Flood Control System
- 4. Tax Incentives for Green Hydrogen
- 5. Funding for a New River Crossing
- 6. Passage of the Restoring Resilient Reefs Act
- 7. Tax Incentives to Convert Underutilized Commerce Property Into Residential Property
- 8. Solutions that Spur New Housing Supply
- 9. Tax Incentives for Property Ownership
- 10. Lending and Housing Equality for All
- 11. Pediatric and Adolescent Behavioral Health Funding

In Congress, from the time you begin work on an issue to the time it passes could be several cycles. It takes multiple trips to D.C. and meetings locally to make it to the finish line.

The Port Everglades project has been in motion for 26 years. Transportation solutions require planning, environmental and design. However, tax incentives for green hydrogen was already accomplished in this session of Congress.

Green hydrogen is generated with an electrolyzer, using water and electricity obtained from zeroemissions energy sources. Surplus renewable energy can be converted to hydrogen, storing dispatchable energy with zero greenhouse gas emissions. Hence, the government is now incentivizing a renewable energy source that decarbonizes the power sector.

We also continue to work on a commuter rail solution which will run on the FEC rail corridor with stops in Hollywood, Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International



Airport, near the Broward Health Medical Center on Andrews, the downtown Brightline station, Oakland Park, Pompano and Deerfield Beach.

Broward County already approved the southern portion of this system. What we need now is a solution with funding for crossing the New River. I wrote in this column previously about a tunnel solution. The Chamber currently supports that mode if economically feasible.

The key to me is committed business leaders who care about our community enough to spend their own money and time to travel to Washington, D.C., and be at the table where these decisions are made. Other states, cities and communities are doing the same thing and it is up to us to carry our message to the decision makers.



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WATER MUSIC

MULTITUDES OF BUSINESSES MAKE THEIR LIVING FROM AND ON THE WATER

Businesses in a specific geographic area have a symbiotic relationship, co-existing in a space and time and often complementing one another like an orchestra. The businesses around South Florida are like this, and you could say that the marine industry is their conductor.

Fort Lauderdale has 165 miles of waterways and a port that clears in 70 percent of the world's international pleasure craft so it stands to reason that an entire marine related economy circulates arounc the area and the people who live and work here. The Marine Industries Association of South Florida (MIASF) understands this integrated web of commerce and supports all the independent notes that work together seamlessly.

A direct connection

Some companies have an obvious connection to the marine industry. Take for example Zeno Mattress and Marine Bedding that has been creating custom bedding and linens for boats since 1954. This family-owned business specializes in comfort for every size and make of vessel because a good night's sleep isn't just for land.

Another direct marine connection is Aere Docking Solutions that creates fenders for yachts. Beyond fenders however, the woman-owned Aere also builds personal watercraft docks and floating work platforms that help maintenance personnel service a yacht from all sides even while it's in the water.

Of course, no yacht would be complete without the personal touches of Karen Lynn Interior Design that creates custom interiors for local and visiting boats and aircraft. If an owner wants to make a newly-purchased yacht her own, fresh furnishings, upholstery, window treatments, flooring and art must be spec'd, sourced and expert installation executed for a makeover.

Finally, think about what it takes to provision a yacht for short charters or long passages. National Marine Suppliers has it all covered from food to galley-ware so no chef has to struggle to serve the very best to an owner or guest.

Ancillary services

Speaking of provisioning – the 17th street Publix was once known as the highest grossing store in the chain as it services yacht chefs and waterfront homes in the area. And homes lead us to local real estate. With yachts come owners who often look for homes in the South Florida, especially at waterfront locations with dockage that can accommodate their vessels. Fisher and McClellan is just one realty firm that focuses on both residential and commercial real estate with a special emphasis on luxury waterfront opportunities. Finally, for those yachtsmen who don't look for long-term real estate, there are dozens of luxury hotels and waterfront restaurants all of which benefit from visiting boats as well as repeat traffic from local boaters.

Surprising add-ons

If we think beyond the bakeries, cleaners, art galleries, restaurants and yacht mechanics, we come to some unusual businesses that also benefit from the presence of the industry. Take for example, MediaLab, a provider of unique factual content like Salty Jobs, which is a look at marine industry careers. With jobs like these, videographers, producers and graphic artists find themselves enveloped by the marine lifestyle.

Fort Lauderdale's private plane airport (FXE) has the busiest customs office in the executive airport universe as it manages how some yacht owners arrive and depart the area while Tropic Air Charters makes sure people are able to catch up with yachts in the Bahamas and beyond for island access.

Finally, let's not forget the behind-the-scenes heroes. Everything (soft goods, engine parts, marine equipment, foodstuffs and more) has to move seamlessly to its final destination. Companies like Compass Logistics & Marine work in freight forwarding and logistics to make it all happen. Owner and licensed customs broker, Danny James, develops tailored supply chain solutions for U.S. and foreign-flagged vessels and draws heavily on local businesses to make it come together.

A fine symphony

Water Music is a suite of pieces written in 1717 by George Frideric Handel for Baroque orchestra. It's beautiful music with a long legacy. The businesses that make their living from the water in South Florida are much like that suite with the marine industry at their center, making all the parts come together flawlessly. (9)

A LESSON ON THE EXEMPTION

HOW IS THE \$50,000 HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION APPLIED?

he history of Homestead Exemption dates to 1934 when Florida voters approved a \$5,000 exemption to help ease the burden of property taxes. This exemption amount was increased to \$10,000 in the 1960s by the Florida Legislature but was not yet incorporated into the Florida Constitution. A constitutional amendment adopted in 1980 increased the Homestead Exemption amount to \$25,000. In 2008, Florida voters adopted a constitutional amendment increasing the Homestead Exemption amount to \$50,000 based on the property's assessed value.

This amendment increasing the Homestead Exemption to \$50,000 is a bit complicated for a few reasons:

- **1.** The first \$25,000 of the exemption is applied by all taxing authorities to the first \$25,000 of your property's assessed value.
- 2. The second \$25,000 exemption is NOT applied to the school portion of your tax bill. The school board budget at roughly 37 percent of the entire tax bill makes up the single largest portion of your property tax bill.
- **3.** The second \$25,000 of the exemption is applied to the portion of assessed value between \$50,000 \$75,000. This means you will not receive the full benefit of the



second \$25,000 if your property's assessed value is less than \$75,000. If your property's assessed value is less than \$50,000, you will not receive any additional savings from this second \$25,000 exemption.

ort Lauderdale has often been touted as one of the major marine industry capitals of the world. However, aside from well-known industries like cruises, yachting and sailing, and even fishing, there are so many more unique water-based businesses to explore doing business in and around Fort Lauderdale.

From water vessel towing and transportation to boat propellor manufacturers and Fort Lauderdale's iconic Water Taxi, each of these businesses bring something unique and important to the people who live and work here in Fort Lauderdale.

WATER TAXI

The Water Taxi has grown over the years to become Fort Lauderdale's most well-known water-based transportation system but also tourist attraction in the city. But many still don't know the history behind these beloved yellow boats that can be seen driving up and down the New River.

"When the water taxi first started, it was just a taxi system," said Chloe Cannon, marketing coordinator for Water Taxi. "Then when our current owner, Bill Walker, bought the business in 2007, he really transformed it into what it is today which is more of a tourist attraction than just transportation."


With that, the Water Taxi has become one of the most popular tourist attractions on the riverfront. The company operates with a fleet of 13 boats that come in three different sizes – their double decker boat, their mid-size boat, and the old trolley which is unique in that it offers a free transportation service for the city of Fort Lauderdale.

For tourists and locals looking for a fun way learn more about the city though, you can purchase an all-day pass, multi-day pass, or one of their evening passes to ride on the Water Taxi's larger boats at your leisure.

Regardless of whether you plan on using the Water Taxi for transportation or for touring purposes though, each captain provides a detailed history of the river and sights to see all while you can enjoy refreshments in each of the boats' fully stocked bars.

For those looking for something a little different, their newly introduced sunset cruises are sure to be a memorable experience as well as their holiday cruises which take you along the river to look at Christmas lights during the winter.

"Fort Lauderdale is a big city, and the Water Taxi is a great way to explore it," Cannon said.



P & L TOWING AND TRANSPORTATION

Many marine businesses cannot operate without the help of towing and transportation services which is where companies like P & L Towing and Transportation come in.

P & L was started in 1993 by Captain Beau Payne who grew the company for 24 years until his untimely passing.

"We got one tugboat and everything kind of blossomed from there but I was not really directly involved," said Heidi Payne, president of P & L Towing. "All those years, I was doing my own thing practicing law so when he passed in 2017 unexpectedly it was a whirlwind."

With those unfortunate circumstances, Payne managed the business on her own before finding her now vice president and director of operations, John Tomlinson. "I was very, very lucky to find John just six months later who has been basically a savior for me," she said.

Now, the duo operates the business together and have found a lot of success in a multitude of industries in need of towing and transportation services. P & L runs a fleet of tugboats designed to tow and transport a variety of maritime vessels. From luxury yacht assists to cargo towing from the U.S. to the Caribbean, as well as navy and military vessel ship docking, they can assist with towing in many different industries.

They are not only known for their towing capabilities but also their marine salvage endeavors.

"Last year we refloated a vessel that sank on the Miami River. So, that's something we want to do more of as well as we want to get back into artificial reef construction," said Tomlinson. In fact, P & L plans to retire two of their boats in the future to create artificial reefs and support local ocean life.





FRANK & JIMMIE'S PROPELLER SHOP

Fort Lauderdale is made up of many generational businesses but it's not every day that you come across a business like Frank & Jimmie's Propeller Shop which has been in business for more than seven decades.

Founded in 1947 by Frank Baron and Jimmie Harrison, the friends started their business at a time when propeller work was unfortunately not in high demand. So, in the meantime, to break even the business partners would take on any odd jobs they could find.

"They were just kind of the boatyard guys doing whatever it took," said Jimmie Harrison Jr., owner of Frank & Jimmie's Propeller Shop. "They were painting or scraping boat bottoms and pulling boats out of the water but their first task always was to chase the alligators off from the boats."

After a few hard years scraping by, the partners finally found a steady stream of business and were able to move into a larger space in 1949 and hire their first employee in 1954.

The two founders have since passed but their legacy lives on in Jimmie Harrison Jr. who continues to run it to this day. 
