

MURAL ART CREATED BY LOCAL ARTISTS ALONG THE RIVERWALK AND FORT LAUDERDALE

ort Lauderdale is more than just great weather and a pretty beach. We also have an inspired art community with quite a few local artists who are revitalizing the look of our downtown and Riverwalk Arts and Entertainment District. Here are some great locations to admire the unique mural wall art that animates our beautiful city and a little bit about the artists who created them.

Benjamin Moore Building Davie Boulevard and First Avenue

What better way to attract attention to a store that carries vibrant-colored paints than a vibrant-colored wall mural that looks like spilled paint! This mural is beyond impressive by Fort Lauderdale-based Avi Ram. See it in person or check out Avi's Instagram -Airbrushhero.

Harbormaster Tower at Port Everglades "Avian Odyssey"

Visually bursting from the sides of the Harbormaster Tower is "Avian Odyssey," a creation by mural artist Ernesto Maranje. A hummingbird appears on one side of the tower and an American white ibis on the

other. This mural was the 2021 winner of the NaCo Achievement Award in arts, culture, and historic preservation for Broward County.

Lighthouse of Broward "Main Course"

Another project which was painted by Ernesto Maranje for the visually impaired was titled "Main Course." This project was created to be multi-sensory for the blind, including textured walls, speakers with motion sensors activating sounds of nature and releasing scents of citrus to really bring the experience alive for all. Las Olas Boulevard Hoffman's Chocolates West Wall 601 E. Las Olas Blvd.

Located at the entrance to Las Olas' shopping district on the west wall of Hoffman's Chocolates, this stunningly vibrant mural created by Fort Lauderdale native and artist Steven Teller is an admirable work depicting the flora and fauna of our tropical climate here in Fort Lauderdale. 

The completion of the Riverwalk on the south side of the New River is in discussion with the upland projects going through the City process. It will be the culmination of a vision put in place 35 years ago to provide a pedestrian walkway on both the north and south side of the New River and to provide a crossriver connection to each side. The free Riverwalk Water trolley serves that purpose along with the Fort Lauderdale Water Taxi – both well used by residents and visitors.

The last segment on the north side was completed in 2016 connecting the pedestrian walkway from Broward Center for Performing Arts to Riverwalk Laura Ward Plaza. We continue to remain at the table to assure the best possible connection for the remaining projects on the south side of the New River utilizing the Downtown and New River Master Plans as well as the Riverwalk District Plan. Compliance by all of the projects that have been completed and abut Riverwalk make this amenity a well-loved and used city treasure. The southwest connection is the final segment in this iconic city project creating Riverwalk.

Pedestrian access to our waterways remains a priority to our city and will continue to work to achieve those goals.



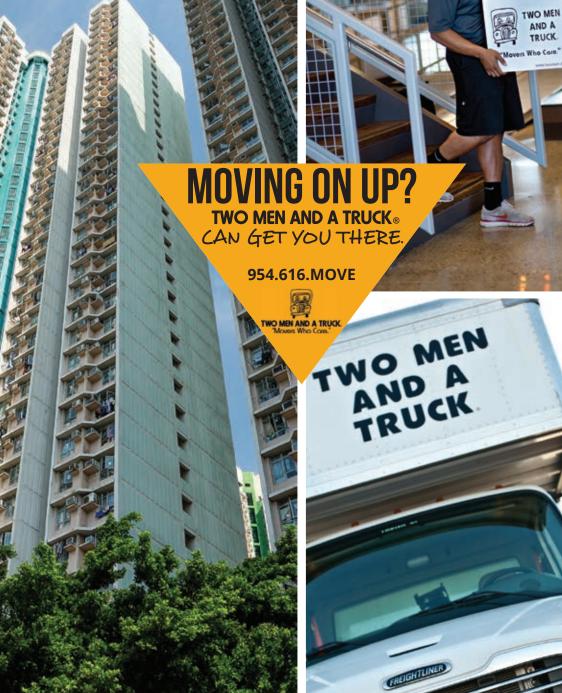

ARTISTS IN RESIDENCE

DISCOVER FORT LAUDERDALE'S LOCAL CREATIVE TALENT

he Fort Lauderdale arts community is thriving with countless galleries, cultural spaces, and, of course, local artists. The art scene in Fort Lauderdale is as diverse as our community with artists exploring painting, sculpture, film, music, textiles, print-making, and media arts, among others.

A great starting place to explore the local arts scene in Fort Lauderdale for visitors and our Neighbors, are the six artist-in-residence studios at the New River Inn located within the History Fort Lauderdale complex. Guided tours by one of the six artists are available daily. In these converted studio spaces, artists Stephanie McMillan, Agneta Anderson, Laura Day Rebollo, Florencia Clement de Grandprey, Rucci, and the mononymous Jenna, create and exhibit paintings, ceramics, sculpture, glass, jewelry, and ready-made pieces that draw inspiration from our City.

Other Fort Lauderdale artists exhibit their work in our museums, galleries, and public spaces throughout the City. With projects and commissions throughout South Florida and the country, Jen Clay calls Fort Lauderdale home and has been working and exhibiting here for close to 10 years. Jen Clay is a multimedia artist creating textiles and animations for performance, video works, and installations. Clay's practice includes claymation, stop motion animation and sewing wearable works to best depict otherness, the uncanny, and the inhuman. A sense of childhood friendliness is seen in all of Clay's work with bright colors, repeated characters, and a softness of sewn wearable pieces.

Another facet of the Fort Lauderdale art scene is visual artist Christian Feneck. Feneck's studio practice is an investigation into the profound impact color has on our perception of space. Through Christian's architectural studies, he has found visual perception to be the primary motivation for the design and understanding of architectural space and developed a painting technique to further explore this belief. Feneck's constructed paintings explore the relationship of vision and the understanding of space by utilizing line structures in combination with a layered series of translucent color fields. The interaction of the various types and relative amounts of colors, and the seemingly infinite degrees of change between them, creates movement and depth forming layered compositions with a wide variety of spatial conditions. In this way, Feneck's work does not investigate a particular narrative, nor does it present any explicit message. The results of these paintings are an exploration of the relationship of color in our perception of space.

Along with the above venues, I have one more to add that is close to home, our very own Fort Lauderdale City Hall. Throughout the year, our Lobby Art Gallery Program showcases thousands of pieces by local artists featured in the first-floor lobby of City Hall. For example, our most recent artist reception hosted Barbie Pearson and her exquisite landscape paintings that were inspired by our city.

The opportunity to discover Fort Lauderdale's local art talent is boundless and there are countless artists and studios to uncover. Whether making an appointment to visit an artist's studio or meandering through one of our cultural institutions such as the NSU Art Museum, ArtServe, or History Fort Lauderdale, there is always local talent on display. While I focused on local visual artists here, there are even more exemplary musicians, playwrights, poets, actors, and dancers to recognize throughout our City. The City of Fort Lauderdale serves as a catalyst for creativity and offers unparalleled beauty in which to draw inspiration. In Fort Lauderdale, our diverse, inclusive, and flourishing arts community has something for everyone!

YEAR IN REVIEW

LOOKING AT ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF 2022

s we start a new year, it is a chance to take stock on where we have been in the past year and envision how to make the next year even better than the last.

We have been able to accomplish amazing improvements to our transportation system together under the direction of our Commission and in partnership with the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization, Florida Department of Transportation and Broward County. These projects assist in moving forward toward the Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2035 Vision that established the goal of creating a connected transportation network for all modes.

Over the past year of working together, nearly 10 miles of bike facilities and four (4) miles of new or enhanced sidewalks have been constructed in the city. Additionally, a variety of smaller annual initiatives have included the installation of speed cushions and speed radar signs within neighborhoods, and the addition of art to the utility box wraps at signalized intersections.

The department works very closely with our neighbors to understand the specific needs of each neighborhood and with our agency partners to realize those visions and we look forward to continuing that momentum of making amazing change together into the new year.

Although it is usually never as quickly as anyone would like, we continue to be persistent in advocating for ways to realize the vision of a more connected transportation

network that is more efficient and safer. As with our Complete Streets implementation title, we are "Connecting the Blocks" one at a time.

The following are some accomplishments from the past year:

- Rebranded the City's community transit system to LauderGo!
- Implemented a pilot micro transit program in Downtown and the core of the beach
- Implemented traffic calming measures across the city in partnership with neighborhoods
- Completed the construction of the Made to Move project on Flagler Drive


- Implemented priority projects from Neighborhood Mobility Master Plans including a tactical urbanism project to implement Lake Ridge's vision for Northeast 15th Avenue
- Partnered with Broward County and the Florida Department of Transportation on improvements to signal timing
- Complete the design of projects including traffic calming along Bass Park and streetscape improvements on Northeast Fourth Avenue north of Sunrise Boulevard to expand on the previous complete streets project.

- Complete the design of Riverland Road traffic calming measures
- Implement signal improvements based on technology

- Implement a wayfinding signage program in central beach area
- Completion of the Tunnel Top Plaza project
- Begin the design of the first segment of the LauderTrail **Commission Priority**
- Implementation of Parking Facility improvements (1)



very once in a while, not very often, but occasionally you meet someone who changes your life. In my professional world that person is Carolyn M. Michaels, IOM, executive vice president of the Chamber.

LOCAL ARTIST DRAWS ON WATER FOR INSPIRATION

Pennis Friel is a busy man. I caught up with him as he was painting a 32-foot mural near Hillsboro Beach at The Cove Restaurant, a legendary establishment that's getting a million-dollar facelift. It's an appropriate project since his artwork celebrates coastal culture and his self-publishing art studio and gallery, called Connected by Water, create vivid imagery in all kinds of mediums all over South Florida which he calls "the mecca for marine art."

Born and raised near Pompano Beach, Friel grew up hanging at the beach, fishing, surfing and diving. His first artwork was displayed when he was just 17 years old and preparing for art school. That's when he took a turn into the music industry where he spent nearly the next two decades. Then, inspired by his wife, Friel quit his day job and began concentrating full time on marine art. That was a decade ago and he hasn't looked back since. "I haven't asked for a project in 10 years," he says. "Work comes to us continuously and we're six months out at any given time. I'm really thankful to be able to follow my passion."

Whether designing tournament and team apparel, boat wraps and transom graphics, custom painting commissions or giant murals, Friel brings his signature fluid style to his game fish and underwater environment images. He has worked with Jimmy Buffett's Freeman-Merritt hybrid boat (Last Mango), Jimmy Johnson's Billfish Custom Shootout, and even with South Florida's Winterfest Boat Parade. When asked about his favorite project, it becomes clear that it's hard for him to choose and he laughs, "It's whatever I just finished."

It's no wonder that it's hard to pick just one given the volume of work Connected by Water creates. Could it be one of the 142 episodes of their podcast highlighting special guests who are all somehow connected to the marine industry and environment? How about Friel's role as one of only 27 artists who work for the United States Mint for which he created an elegant sailing design for the Rhode Island dollar coin?

"It's tough to choose," he says. "For sure, one highlight was the large-scale project of the Atlantic Harmony installation on the Atlantic Boulevard Intracoastal bridge."

The City of Pompano Beach had commissioned artwork covering 283 linear feet under the bridge. Today, that colorful mural is appreciated by boaters as well as those taking the promenade beneath the bridge and this beautification work was rewarded with the Pompano Beach Chamber of Commerce Arts and Culture Award. Friel is a brand ambassador for Maui Jim and was named the Billfish Foundation's Artist of the Year. He's also an avid conservationist and philanthropist, focusing tirelessly on a variety of charities



including Surfers for Autism, Freedom Fighter Outdoors, Special Olympics and many more.

Friel is a fine art painter, illustrator, muralist and the creator of brands. Water and all things marine are an obsession as well as a profession and lifestyle for him and his staff. He believes that water unites the community and creates a unique culture that lifts the mood and takes stress away. An apt tag line for him and his studio may be their belief that "there's a coastline within all of us."

Friel had to climb down from a ladder to do our interview and with 60 to 80 open projects running at any given time, it's a wonder he has time to think about much less plan his next move. When asked about his source of inspiration, Friel laughs.

"Inspiration is a tricky thing. You just have to put your head down and get it done – there's not a lot of time for pondering," he says. "That said, being out on the water always helps with the energy and positivity that keeps me going and feeling blessed."









MAINTAINING HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

DETAILS ON HOW TO BECOME ELIGIBLE

Resently my office has been hearing from more and more adults living with and caring for their aging parents at their parents' homesteaded property, only to lose this previously established Homestead Exemption when their parent passes away. This is because under Florida law, the Homestead Exemption is granted to the owner/applicant, not to the property itself. Thus, when a homesteaded recipient passes away, their Homestead Exemption must be removed for the following tax year. This often results in significant tax increases for coowners who cohabitate at the property, but never file for Homestead Exemption in their own name.

While **we always recommend you seek professional advice from a qualified attorney** before making any title changes, there are ways to prevent this dramatic increase in taxes for adult children who have been living with and caring for their parents. To be eligible for Homestead Exemption, applicants must both own and make the property their permanent residence.

Generally speaking, when a property is held in a

trust, individuals with a beneficial right to use and occupy the property under the terms of the trust, are eligible to receive Homestead Exemption at the property. Applicants may provide a Certificate of Trust form (available on our website) completed by the Trustee attesting to their use and occupancy rights under the terms of the trust.

Owner/occupants who believe they may be eligible for Homestead Exemption, should file an application in their own name to avoid potential reassessment should a co-owner pass away or be removed from title.

Keep in mind this is a VERY simplified explanation of some rather complicated legal issues. There are many variations (with legal and tax consequences) of ownership which is why we always recommend you seek professional advice from a qualified attorney before making any title changes to your property.

MURAL ARTIST MARCUS BORGES

CHANGING HOW WE CONSUME ART

ities are often referred to as concrete jungles and it's no surprise what with their harsh lines and cold sterile buildings. However, one way Fort Lauderdale has avoided sharing that moniker is their dedication to funding public arts – specifically murals. Over the years, Fort Lauderdale has transformed into a public art exhibit with intricate murals dotted around the city depicting everything from Fort Lauderdale's vibrant flora and fauna to pop art pieces and everything in between. Yet, one artist in particular making a splash of his own is self-taught graffiti artist, abstract artist, and muralist Marcus Borges aka "Grabster."

Born in Brazil but raised in New York, Borges was drawn to art from a young age and quickly realized it was something he not only had a natural talent for but was also extremely passionate about.

"When I was in high school, I was the kid who could do perfect pencil portraits of people with charcoal and my art teacher in particular took notice. She really was a big supporter of me pursuing art and would always give me art books on M.C. Escher and Salvador Dali," he said. From there, he continued to pursue his passion for art and was first exposed to the world of graffiti art through breakdancing.

Yet, it wasn't until wasn't until he dropped out of college and moved to Atlanta that he discovered he could actually have a career in street art. "I met my mentor who goes by the name Totem. Now, this was before the internet but even at that time he was a world famous graffiti artist and muralist. I met him through breakdancing not knowing who he was but when I went to his studio and saw his work I was blown away that you could actually make a career out of something like that," he said. Seeing his interest in art, Totem took him under his wing and introduced him to the world of murals and with that, Borges never looked back.

Today, the artist is well known in Fort Lauderdale and throughout the country for his murals, which often combine flashy pops of neon color palettes with geometric shapes and angles. "Geometry is a big part of my artwork because I've always been interested in math and inspired by artists like M.C. Escher who was known for his geometric pencil art like the never ending staircases and the hands drawing each other. His pieces





always had geometric shapes that don't physically make sense in the real world which I've always found fascinating," said Borges. Another motif often found in his work is a nod to 80s and 90s pop culture references from his childhood, including sci-fi movies like Star Wars and video games such as Marble Madness and Sonic.

Throughout his career, Borges has worked with wellknown brands like Red Bull, Stoli, and Mountain Dew and even musicians like Kodak Black and Bruno Mars.

Yet, one commissioned mural he is especially proud of is his piece he did with fellow muralist, Tiago Magro. "I don't often collaborate with other artists but when I heard Tiago was involved, who is a good friend of mine, I immediately wanted to collaborate. Our styles are very different, with mine having a lot of detailed lines and angles and his style is freer with splashes of paint and spray painted graffiti but being as different as they are, they blended nicely together to create something really unique," he said.

The piece, entitled Fort Lauderdale, Past, Present and Future, can be seen on the Tru by Hilton in Downtown Fort Lauderdale and is one of many murals done by Borges throughout the city.

As for the future of his career, he hopes to one day create larger than life pieces around the world. "I want to do



large scale murals, like 100-foot murals, in other parts of the world. If I'm going to do murals I want it to get to that caliber," he said. ⁽¹⁾

hroughout her high school career, Jonerra Henrisnor has soaked up financial literacy, entrepreneurship skills and career readiness through several programs at Junior Achievement of South Florida.

The Stranahan High School senior, who aspires to attend Florida A&M University and eventually become an orthodontist, has been involved in different JA programs, including its career bound and summer internship programs. She has even gone on to get a job at State Farm as part of their youth employment program where she has already gotten her Florida 4-40 Customer Representative license and is working toward getting her life insurance license.

Henrisnor is one of 54,000 students that the South Florida organization reaches each year.

"But now, as a senior, after getting involved in their programs, I can see how it helped her harness her abilities and put them towards her life outside of school. It gave her something new to work towards," Hart said.

Attending JA of South Florida has been a positive experience, Henrisnor said.

"Junior Achievement is a perfect program," she said. "If you see any opportunity in life that you feel like it's going to benefit you, do it. Don't look back, don't question yourself, do it. I did not question myself when I had the opportunity to apply to the JA internship program and I don't regret it one bit," she said.

JA programs teach students in kindergarten through the 12th grade financial literacy, entrepreneurship skills and career readiness.

Since its founding by members of the Fort Lauderdale Rotary Club in 1959, JA of South Florida has positively impacted more than a million students through their programs. However, the non-profit organization would not be able to continue bringing these lifechanging programs to the now 70,000 students they reach yearly without their annual fundraising event, JA World Uncorked.

The annual event hosted by the Circle of Wise Women offers guests the chance to sample dishes and drinks from more than 35 different restaurants and beverage partners while they experience firsthand the organization's interactive learning environments – JA BizTown and JA Finance Park.

When they are not exploring the 60,000 square foot venue, guests can also enjoy live music, participate in the raffle and silent auction. Yet, it goes without saying that the most rewarding part of the evening is seeing how the funds raised directly impact the future of their various programs.

n interview with founder Bob Howell "Made Man Bob," on-air host and producer of the podcast Sips, Suds and Smokes.

HOWELL: As a member, I recently had the unique opportunity to help select our most recent Charity Barrel, a Maker's Mark Private Selection. Bob explains how their Private Selection Barrel is created by adding 10 custom wood finishing staves to each barrel which is then aged in their limestone cellar to extract a unique, flavorful taste profile. The finishing staves can be any combination of five flavor profiles chosen especially for this program. From a possible 1,001 possible stave combinations, our team selected which of those staves, and how many of each, were added to the barrel to create the unique flavor profile for this barrel. Our selection team consisted of several of our founding members, who have selected well over 100 barrels over the years, as well as several members at large who were selected in a drawing, the proceeds of which were also donated to the charity.

About the Fort Lauderdale Whiskey Society

The Fort Lauderdale Whiskey Society is a group of more than 3,300 enthusiasts and industry professionals who are dedicated to the appreciation of fine whiskey in all its forms (Bourbon, Scotch, Canadian, Irish, Japanese, etc.). Through tastings, whiskey dinners, whiskey events and discussions on our Facebook group page, we seek to expand the knowledge of both our members, and the public, on our favorite beverage.

The society is open to everyone, from beginners to experts, and all are welcome to join our community. We

have regular monthly meet up tastings where anyone can attend and learn more about whiskey and meet like-minded individuals.



In addition to working with the other founding members of the Society, I'm also a producer and on-air host of a radio show and podcast about whiskey called Sips, Suds and Smokes. As a consequence of that position, I have a good number of friends in the whiskey business. I thought that perhaps we could leverage those contacts, along with our Society member's love of whiskey, for a charitable purpose.

So a few years ago I partnered with a distillery and a local retailer, where we went to Kentucky to select a private barrel of whiskey. That barrel was then bottled and sent to the local retailer who in turn agreed to handle the receipt and sale of the bottles and to then donate the profits from that barrel to our main charity, Honor Flight South Florida. It's a win for everyone!

So far in 2022 we have raised over \$20,000, and are hoping to add to that tally with this Maker's Mark barrel selected for our friends at Batch New Southern Kitchen. In 2023 we are hoping to continue our charitable work with our partners to increase the number of charity barrels, and other whiskey themed events, so we can continue to support the fine work these charities provide.


