In fact, I had my first boat when I was five years old! I eventually took over the family business and ran it for many years before selling it and moving to Florida in the late 1990s.

The move to Florida was inspired by my love of the ocean, diving and, of course, the beautiful weather. My partner Wendy and I initially settled on the west coast of Florida and worked in the boating industry prior to founding Yacht Sales International and moving to Fort Lauderdale.

As a long-time yacht broker, I immediately saw the advantage to hybrid boating especially in places like our own Venice of America. With a hybrid boat, you can cruise the waterways on electric power and not have the smell, vibration and fuel consumption you would have on a traditional vessel. Furthermore, you do not need a generator as all the appliances run on an inverter so there's an overall cost savings on general maintenance. In short, it's a different kind of boating.

Wendy and I live on a boat docked on the New River and our office is on the Riverwalk, so it was natural that we would be members of Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale and support their efforts to keep our Downtown beautiful and vibrant. They all carved their rightful places in our city's history by giving unselfishly of themselves to ensure greater opportunities for future generations.

I acknowledge those who walked with me and gave so much time — retirement time, making time, finding time, creating time — all invested in me as actions of approval of my candidacy. I am so grateful for their diligence in helping make this day possible. I have made a vow to endeavor to serve with tenacity, keeping District 3 moving forward and providing valuable input for our city in areas of care and trust.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE

Within Fort Lauderdale's long history, I often think about all the moving parts that have really helped build the community and keep it moving forward. First responders, our police officers and firefighters put their lives at risk each and every day to keep our residents safe. Having celebrated National First Responder Appreciation Day this month, I am extremely grateful for their dedicated service day in and day out. In addition to our first responders, Fort Lauderdale has excellent community leaders that have had a significant impact within the city, implementing improvements, planning redevelopments and keeping residents and officials engaged by hosting events within the City of Fort Lauderdale.

The City of Fort Lauderdale's Fire department was established in 1912 and encompasses 12 stations, which makes it the busiest fire department in Broward County. The division also has special operations teams such as Marine and Dive Rescue as well as SWAT, just to name a few. Until this year, Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue Department was led by Fire Chief Rhoda Mae Kerr, who in 2018, became the City's first female fire chief in its 100-plus year history. Now, Chief Steve Gollan manages an estimated 400 firefighter and lifeguards, receiving approximately 45,000 rescue calls annually. This is one of the highest numbers for a department of this size nationally. Thank you for your service to our residents!

Communities such as Imperial Point and The Galt Mile have largely shaped how Fort Lauderdale as a community has thrived. Imperial point was built in 1961 and was one of the first neighborhoods in the City to have sidewalks installed. Since then, there have been vast improvements that have positively impacted the community.

Betty Shelley is the longtime president of Imperial Point Civic Association and has served the interests of Imperial Point for more than 24 years! My wife Eileen and I have had the pleasure of attending her 90th birthday party, along with many other milestones for the community since 2010. Betty has had such an influential impact on hundreds of projects over the years. She said that out of the many projects that she has been a part of, she is most proud of the butterfly garden at the entrance that was built to help preserve the monarch butterflies. She is also extremely proud of the Dottie Mancini Park just behind Broward Health Imperial Point Hospital where they hold many family fun events throughout the year for the community such as their spring, fall and winter festivals that bring our community together.

The Galt Mile Community Association also has been led by two great leaders who have both made an impact on the community. Pio Ieraci was the president of the association for more than 30 years, but sadly lost his life due to Covid in 2020 at just 58 years old. Pio was a

dear friend of mine and he was beloved by the community, which is why last year I had the privilege of running and passing legislation to fund and designate a portion of A1A along Galt Mile in his honor to be known as "Pio Ieraci Memorial Drive." Since Pio's passing, Fred Nesbitt has taken on the monumental task of becoming the Galt Mile Community Association president that oversees 35 condominiums with more than 16,000 residents, and has been a great asset to the Galt Community. Fred has a valued leader in the association for years, and has undoubtedly represented the Galt Mile well since taking over for Pio's. I appreciate Fred's professionalism always.

TRANSPORTATION UNSUNG HEROES

MEET MITXI SANCHEZ IN TRANSPORTATION AND MOBILITY

e often highlight large projects here, but there are so many small projects that happen every day to improve the quality of life for our neighbors related to transportation. These projects are often not noticed by those traveling through, but so important to those who live there. And even for those who do notice, how the changes happened are likely a mystery.

The people behind the scenes that make these things happen are true unsung heroes. Not only the facilities and maintenance teams that we could not do what we do without, but especially the staff who make sure the things



that need to get done get to the correct people, get done, and make sure the neighbors who asked are informed of the process and when it is completed.

In Transportation and Mobility, Mitxi Sanchez is the staff member who facilitates those concerns. Mitxi is a passionate and dedicated city employee who works every day to make the city a better place by facilitating transportation-related improvements. She lives by the mantra of "If not me then who" fielding hundreds of different inquiries each week that include coordinating with many different people across the City, County, and State. Last year alone, Mitxi has received, routed, and closed more than 1,400 neighbor requests with many others still in the process.

Her amazing knowledge of the network of people to help address each concern and the positive relationships that she has built has made her a tremendous asset to the city which can be attested to by anyone who has had the pleasure of working with her as a resident or colleague.

The department receives many requests that come through a variety of different avenues which are all managed by Mitxi. This requires a great ability to keep track of hundreds of requests at any time and where in the process every one of them is.

A major way the city receives concerns is through the Lauderserve system that can be found as an app in the App Stores for your device or at www.fortlauderdale.gov/ lauderserv. Many different items can be forwarded through this system, including transportation items like signs down, traffic calming needed, pavement marking refreshing needed, or updates on projects.

But unknown to most who use the system is the process inside the black box where those requests are received, sent to the appropriate department representatives who then forward to the appropriate person to address, and the follow up with the requestor to make sure they are aware it has been received and what the next steps will be.

Some of the small projects may not seem important by themselves but make a tremendous impact to the quality of life of residents making sure our streets are safer ... each sign and pavement marking block by block. Mitxi is my unsung hero because of her passion for helping people and caring for each and every resident's concerns and making sure that they are communicated with so that they understand that they are heard and their concerns will be addressed.





ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

GROWING A STRONG ECONOMY

n this issue we will review what will happen in the 2023 economy, who to watch and make some predictions.

Unemployment is basically full employment at 2.5 percent for Broward County with 42,012 new jobs created year over year as of this writing. This creates some challenges as we have to create 106,108 net new jobs by 2030. We have roughly 27,000 looking for work and roughly 42,000 job openings. Nationally, there are 4.45 million more job openings than unemployed workers.

Employers have been increasing wages to stem the flight of top talent. The question is will it be enough? Wage growth in general has been ebbing to 4.6 percent from a high of eight percent in 2020. The Consumer Price Index has shown signs of retreating down to 7.1 percent in November.

Recent job numbers beat predictions in December with 223,000 jobs added on a seasonally adjusted basis.

The Fed has been trying to cool down a hot economy and arrive at a "soft landing." What has been bucking the trend is unemployment, which has remained steady or decreased. Whether we are in a recession will not be known for some time.

Compounding factors like inflation, home and gas prices, interest rates, and a myriad of others are pinching consumers, however, retail figures have been solid.

Employers I talked to are not looking to lay off talent. Quite the opposite. They are doing everything they can to support their employees and treat them with everything from more flexible working environments to wage increase to day care on site.

We see the greatest job growth in the following professions: education, medical and health services, computer and information research, life and social sciences, healthcare support occupations, and healthcare practitioners (think nurses and physician assistants).

What we need to control is to provide the best place to live, work and raise a family. This includes: attainable housing, improved education opportunity, transportation alternatives, green space, cultural arts options and a host of other amenities.

Look for Huizenga Park to be revamped into a multidimensional asset that will transform that space into several different experiences within one footprint. Look for the reimagined space to begin construction in late spring. There will be a restaurant and plenty of options


for all to experience.

We continue to work on solutions for an inter-city rail connector that will run from Miami-Dade to North Broward. The so-call coastal link will terminate near Broward Health Medical Center on Andrews until we reach agreement on a solution to cross the New River. Look for that agreement this year to move us into the appropriations process.

Lastly, we have made great strides to address a resilient future in the wake of rising seas and stronger weather events. Adapting to our changing environment is key to protecting our economy and our future as residents.

There is no silver bullet to grow one of the strongest economies. It requires all of us to roll up our sleeves and be part of a legacy of which we can be proud. ⁽¹⁾


BEHIND THE SCENES

USCG FORT LAUDERDALE STATION GETS THE JOB DONE

ome heroes are easy to spot – they're visible in our everyday lives at hospitals, crimes scenes, fires, and soup kitchens. Other heroes work tirelessly behind the scenes to get the job done without most of us ever seeing them. An example is Coast Guard Station Fort Lauderdale that quite literally saves boaters just about every day.

There are nine districts in the Coast Guard system which break out into 37 sectors, including Station Fort Lauderdale. Technically based in Dania Beach just above the Dr. Von D. Mizell-Eula Johnson State Park, the station reports into the Seventh District in Miami. They have a colorful history including being responsible for the Coast Guard's one-and-only hanging that occurred on Aug. 17, 1929, when personnel from Station Fort Lauderdale (then known as Coast Guard Base Six) were killed in the line of duty as they boarded a rumrunner during the Prohibition. James Horace Alderman killed three members of the Coast Guard boarding party. Two years later, he was convicted of murder and piracy and hanged at Base Six.

The original Fort Lauderdale site was approximately 14 acres and was created in 1875. The first keeper was Washington Jenkins, who served from 1876 until 1883. Originally, the station was tasked with "affording succor to shipwrecked persons who may be cast ashore" and the



station keepers and their families were required to walk the beaches and search for castaways after a storm. That's quite the job description.

The actual base was established in accordance with Coast Guard Headquarters Letter of June 1924 and was staffed by 33 men from the Coast Guard Cutter Yamacraw in September 1924 under commanding officer C.G. Porcher. The rest, as they say, is history.

Your life is somehow touched by the Coast Guard even if you're not a boater. Although officially tasked with maritime operations, law, response, transportation management, security and defense, stations like Fort Lauderdale have a long list of other duties that go well beyond their charter. Sure, they monitor the waterways 24/7/365, but they also mobilize hurricane relief in Florida and take control of local bridge operations in case of emergency – the bridges you use every day.

They visit schools to work with students, provide security during the Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show, and help organizations like the Wounded Warrior Project with charity runs and sponsorships. The station maintains aids to navigation (with the motto "Keeping it Lit"), they lead the Winterfest Boat Parade, and they even rescue dogs that may have fallen overboard. In true Coast Guard fashion, they're "semper paratus" (always ready).

These dedicated men and women work on behalf of all of Fort Lauderdale and yet, most of us are unaware of their good (and essential) deeds. Just a look at their Facebook page says it all – there's a phone number which is manned by a real person willing to help and their hours are listed as "always open." There's comfort in that.

You may not see them every day, but USCG Station Fort Lauderdale personnel are ever present. The next time you're on or near the water, think about what it takes to make Fort Lauderdale work as a whole and give thanks for Station Fort Lauderdale. They're an intricate part of our community and they may just save you someday too.

UPDATES FOR BROWARD COUNTY PROPERTY OWNERS

Exemption Amount Increase for Widows, Widowers, Blind Persons and Persons Totally and Permanently Disabled

housands of Broward County property owners qualify for these exemptions. Under previous law, these exemptions deducted only \$500 from the property's assessed value which equates to an annual savings of only \$10 in property taxes. Representative Michael Gottlieb and Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez secured language in the 2022 legislative session which increased this exemption amount to \$5,000 for an increased tax savings of approximately \$100 beginning in 2023.

Automatic Senior Exemption Renewals for 2023

After the initial application approval, the Low-Income Senior Exemption automatically renews each year unless the senior notifies our office that they no longer meet the income requirement for this exemption. People who received the Senior Exemption in 2022 and are still living at the same address do not need to send in a signed renewal card to continue receiving this exemption.

Our office will mail the Senior Exemption renewal information this month with the annual income limitation set by the state of Florida.

If your 2022 adjusted household gross income does not exceed the income limitation, you DO NOT need to do anything to continue receiving this valuable exemption for 2023. Your exemption will automatically be renewed provided you are still living at the same address and receiving Homestead Exemption.

If your 2022 adjusted household gross income did exceed the income limitation, you must notify our office that you no longer qualify for this tax year when you receive the annual income notification from our office. We understand the adjusted household gross income for some individuals may change from year to year so an applicant may qualify one year and then not the next.

If you did not receive the Senior Exemption for 2022 and you believe you may qualify, please visit our website at web.bcpa.net and click on the "Senior Exemption" icon to view this exemption. You can also apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/SeniorsAppForm. The absolute deadline to apply for any 2023 exemption is Sept. 18, 2023.

FORT LAUDERDALE'S UNSUNG HEROES

THE JOBS THAT OFTEN GO UNNOTICED AND THOSE WHO DO THEM

t's often said that the most difficult things in life take a village to accomplish. The same can be said for the city of Fort Lauderdale. However, some of the most important and necessary jobs done to keep the city running smoothly are often overlooked – that is until now. From maintenance and security to even landscaping, these are just a few of Fort Lauderdale's unsung heroes deserving some much-needed recognition.

John Bradshaw City Hall Security

City Hall is and always has been one of the more secure government buildings in Fort Lauderdale. However, much of that peace of mind is thanks to those working in security like part-time security guard, John Bradshaw.

Bradshaw has been working in security for most of his life but first got into the field right after college.

"A friend of mine owned a bar and, since I'm a big guy, he asked me to work there as a bouncer. Then from there, I started working at a bar called Bermuda Triangle in Fort Lauderdale Beach and those were some of my first jobs in security," he said.

After working in security for some time, he happened to hear about a security position that had opened up at City Hall. Bradshaw, who also happens to be a part-time park ranger, heard about the position from a fellow ranger.

"He told me about the job here at City Hall. So, I filled out the application and a couple of months later, I got a call to come in for an interview," he said. With that, Bradshaw has been working security part time for City Hall ever since.

Even though a large part of his job is ensuring those working in and visiting City Hall feel safe, his favorite element of the job is its social aspect and adding a little bit of sunshine to people's day.

"One part of what I do is greeting people when they come in and directing them to where they're going but I think it's also one of the more important parts of my job here. It doesn't matter if you're the mayor or a homeless person coming in to use the restroom, I greet everyone with a smile and a hello and make everybody feel welcome," he said.





Anthony Byrd City Hall Maintenance

There's nothing worse than being late due to a faulty elevator or having to go upstairs because the ground floor bathroom is out of order.

For anyone spending time at City Hall in Fort Lauderdale, they have maintenance professionals like Anthony Byrd to thank for keeping those things we use almost every day, and for the most part take for granted, in working order.

Byrd has been the sole person in charge of maintenance at City Hall for a while now. But before that, he was previously in charge of outdoor upkeep until he was promoted to handling maintenance for the entire building

"I was primarily in charge of handling tasks like cutting the grass outside, picking up trash, trimming trees, and things of that nature. However, after some time I got into doing maintenance for the building as a promotional position," he said.

Since then, Byrd has been the go-to man for fixing issues that arise involving electrical, plumbing, and hardware as well as handling the janitorial duties of the building.

"An important part of my job is really just maintaining the integrity of City Hall itself," he said.

His job is much more than that and without him, problems like a broken ceiling tile or a leak that may seem small to some are things that could soon become catastrophic.

"Most people wouldn't notice that there's something wrong or out of place but because I'm here all the time I catch those little things. Where someone might see a wet ceiling tile and think it's just condensation, I see that the auxiliary drain pan might be clogged, and I should take it out before the ceiling tile collapses. So, a lot of my work is fixing things before they ever become a problem," he said.

Insaaf Latiff City of Fort Lauderdale Landscaping

Fort Lauderdale is known for many things but one aspect of this gorgeous city we often take for granted is the immaculate landscaping that can be seen throughout the area. From the sun impatiens framing the signs at Esplanade, Peter Feldman and Victoria Parks to the coonties palms on Andrews Avenue by City Hall, landscaper Insaaf Latiff has done it all.

"Our role is to make the city beautiful. We live in an already beautiful city, but our job is to make it even more beautiful. My goal is always to create safe, accessible, and enjoyable spaces for all," he said.

Latiff began his more than 20-year career in landscaping at the City of Fort Lauderdale Parks department working in landscape and athletic field maintenance. His work included designing and installing butterfly gardens as well as building baseball fields from the ground up.

Since then, he has gone on to become the parks supervisor for District 6 and along with his talented and hardworking crew, they can often be seen adding new colorful plants and flowers to the parks and maintaining the landscaped areas around the City.

"Our work never stops because it's not just about putting in new plants, flowers, and foliage but it's also about maintaining everything. So, we work hard to make sure everything stays looking fresh and beautiful year-round," said Latiff.

Yet, when he and his crews' hard work is all said and done, he hopes people will take a moment out of their day to appreciate their hard work beautifying the city. "I wish that people would appreciate our work that we have done around the City of Fort Lauderdale and enjoy the beauty of our City," he said. ⁽¹⁾
