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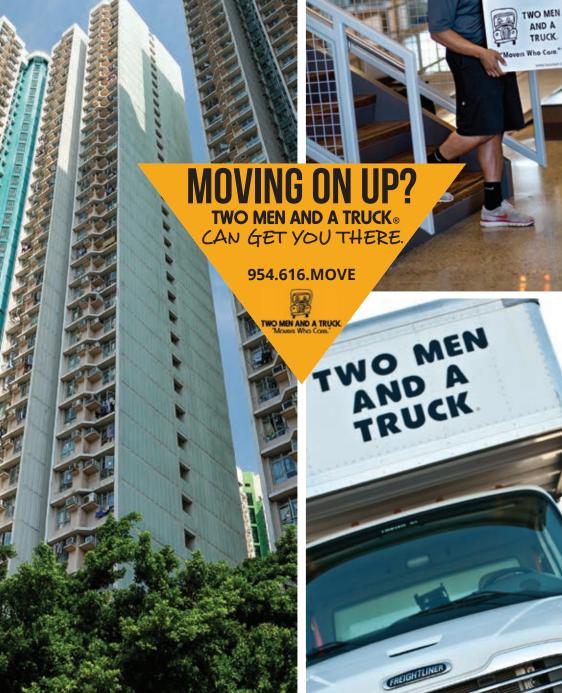



Copies are mailed to members and sponsors out of state, as well as making for an incredibly diverse distribution.

Just as the magazine is celebrating a milestone, we are reminded that Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale Inc. also celebrates 35 years of service to the city and community. Riverwalk and its dedicated board are the watchdogs of the pedestrian walkway on the north and south side of the New River along with 10 parks and green spaces within the Riverwalk District. We continuously work to activate those spaces and Downtown, bringing a wide variety of passive and active events to engage our residents and visitors. We review and report on infrastructure and needs along with park upgrades that are required.

We have more than 60,000 etched bricks within the pedestrian walkways as well as over 260 signature banners. The etched bricks celebrate all things in life and recognize and remember events and individuals in perpetuity. They tell us stories. We have installed fixed exercise equipment and specialty water fountains on both sides of the river, public art throughout Riverwalk and downtown, recycle bins, dedicated public planters, and funded numerous tree installations, gardens and aesthetic enhancements. We participated in rescuing the Shippey House and putting it in to active service in the Historic District. We have built playgrounds in areas with none. Through our grant process we have been able to bring many amenities to Downtown.

We pride our success on our members, partnership and sponsors who help us give back to public land. Through their continued support, Downtown Fort Lauderdale is a place to be and is a draw for visitors alike. Join us in 2023 as we celebrate 20 years of magazine publishing and 35 years of public service to Fort Lauderdale.

UPDATE ON SEVERAL CITY PROJECTS

s your new District 4 Commissioner and Vice Mayor for 2023, I'm looking forward to representing your interests in City affairs. Along with the two other new Fort Lauderdale City Commissioners seated in December 2022, Dr. Pamela Beasley-Pittman in District 3 and John Herbst in District 1, and current members Steven Glassman and Mayor Dean Trantalis, we are already working together on behalf of our community.

In conference in December, we instructed staff to no longer consider the proposal to raise the height of the PDD up to 500 feet. Your Commission passed the P3 (Public Private Partnership) to build our new water treatment plant to replace Fiveash.

This coming year promises to be an exciting one for Fort Lauderdale. We have seen the proposal to revitalize Huizenga Park, located Downtown by the Riverwalk and have entered into an agreement with the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) that guarantees that space will remain a park in perpetuity, providing for a muchneeded green space in the heart of our Downtown for all to enjoy. Commuter rail service on the east side of town is no longer a dream but a reality: in addition to Miami, Fort Lauderdale, and West Palm Beach, two more stations have recently opened in Aventura and Boca Raton, with more planned for Hollywood, the airport, Broward General, Oakland Park and Pompano Beach. Brightline service to Orlando should be running by mid-2023. And we will be considering building a tunnel under the New River to expedite this rail service.

We are working with our Broward County partners on regional projects. Discussions have begun on innovative ideas regarding homelessness, affordable housing, and traffic. And city staff continues to report on the progress we are making on the monumental task of fortifying our infrastructure.

I want to thank all my friends and neighbors for your trust in electing me to represent you on our Fort Lauderdale City Commission. I have enjoyed serving this community as Chief of our City's CERT Team, leader of our Medical Reserve Corps, and as President of Rio Vista Civic Association for 14 years. And I am honored to represent you in District 4 and serve the entire City of Fort Lauderdale.

The City's Transportation and Mobility Department (TAM) has been working with its partners to hold a Bike to Work Day. Bike to Work Day FTL (#B2WDFTL) is part of a series of events celebrating March as Bike Month in the State of Florida.

Under our Vision Zero commitment and implementing our neighbors' vision of being a connected community where we can get around by whatever mode we choose, this event will celebrate biking in Fort Lauderdale. It will focus on celebrating the bicycle as a fun and healthy transportation mode and is an opportunity for novice cyclists to try two-wheeled commuting in a group and a chance for veteran riders to share fellowship.

The event is organized by the City in partnership with many local and regional partners to make it a fun and exciting day. We have created a website for the event (http://bit.ly/b2wdftl) that includes helpful resources, like finding a buddy to ride with, finding your nearest pit stop, information about joining a commuter convoy, and a full list of partners. - **Invite a friend or coworker to ride along.** Riding your bike is always more fun with a friend. So send out some texts, G-chat your office mates, or make a few phone calls. And make sure they register too! Then make plans to meet up that morning and ride to your pit stop together.

On March 8, remember to turn the worst part of your day into the best part of your day! You get to wake up a little earlier (maybe even catch a beautiful sunrise), get on a bicycle, and smile. Stop by any of our pit stops on your way to work, enjoy a free breakfast, grab some other giveaways, and then ride your bike to work. Also, if you're a regular bike commuter and you are as excited as we are about making sure all the folks trying it out for the first time have a great experience, consider volunteering!

PIXAR PUTT POP-UP BRINGS OUT YOUR INNER KID

he satisfying thud of a putter connecting with a golf ball coupled with the playful laughter of kids and adults alike can be heard on any given day at the Las Olas Oceanside Park, aka the Loop, where a unique pop-up event is drawing in visitors daily — the Pixar Putt Pop-Up.

The touring pop-up event combines the fun of mini golf with the well-known animated characters and stories from Pixar. "We hope that Pixar Putt will be part of everyone's day on Fort Lauderdale Beach or night out for Pixar Putt After Dark."

The pop-up offers something for every Pixar fan with each hole designed after a different film from the animation studio.

From the eighth hole designed after *Inside Out*, which has players drop their ball into colored holes based on their current mood, to the *Up*-themed 18th hole, which has an interactive balloon suspended house that "floats" through the sky, each hole showcases recognizable details from a Pixar movie.

The pop-up encourages guests to connect with their inner child and is open seven days a week through March 26, with after dark sessions available for adults on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays after 7 p.m.

"We're excited that guests get to immerse themselves in their favorite Pixar films. Pixar films celebrate human connections which makes Pixar Putt the perfect experience for family and friends," said Larabee.

However, this pop-up has not only been a great offering for residents and tourists, but it has also been a wonderful opportunity for the Fort Lauderdale Parks and Recreation department to receive more recognition and much deserved funding for future events at The Loop.

"When we received the inquiry, we saw it as a great opportunity to offer something unique for our visitors but also create a mutually beneficial partnership," said Arianne Glassman, the Fort Lauderdale Beach and open spaces coordinator for Fort Lauderdale Parks and Recreation.

"We essentially hired them as an activation partner so that way we would receive a portion of the profits which will go back into our annual budget so that we're able to create more experiences for people to enjoy."

The events that the funds from partnerships like this will help support include free concerts and movie series, an Easter event, and their entire month of holiday events.

"All of these free events cost money to put on," Glassman said. "So, this is a nice opportunity to raise funds to support these events and keep them free for our visitors."

The pop-up has been such a success and has received an overwhelmingly positive reception from guests that there are plans to extend its stay into April and Rockefeller Productions even plans on bringing the pop-up back to the city again in the future as they are adding new cities and future dates to their tour.

CAREERSOURCE BROWARD PROVIDES A GEM OF A RESOURCE FOR BUSINESS

ne of the most important but underutilized services our government provides for business is run by a company called CareerSource Broward (CSBD). Now I know some of you will say, "I know about CareerSource." But do you really? When I ask business men and women about CareerSource, 80 percent have never used it but may have heard about it.

"CareerSource Broward is the federally funded and locally executed workforce development incubator for employers," said Heiko Dobrikow, chairman of the CSBD Workforce Development Board. "We are the direct link to the unemployed and underemployed, and a resource for financial assistance and training."

Right now, for example, CSBD is running its summer youth employment program. It provides veteran consulting-based training. How about helping pay for school? Yep. They do that, too, and so much more.

Its website is data rich, showing December unemployment figures at 2.2 percent. While that sounds good, what it really means is we don't have enough people looking for work to fill the open positions we have. And that's assuming those looking are adequately trained to for open positions.

One solid program you can plug into right now is

the Summer Employment Program (SYEP), which encourages Broward County employers to participate as a worksite for our youth. Businesses can hire a young adult at no cost — a savings of nearly \$3,000 per youth hired thanks to the Children's Services Council and additional supporters funding the program.

"The SYEP Program offers multiple advantages to youth, including gaining real-world experience and income, developing employable skills, and receiving mentorship from professionals across various industries and occupations," said Carol Hylton, president and CEO of CSBD.

Youth between the ages of 16 and 18 will earn a wage of \$14 per hour and can work up to 30 hours per week between June and August. It's important to know that employers will need to provide oversight and meaningful work that translates into workforce skills. In other words, more than making coffee and making copies.

Perhaps the most underutilized service CSBD provides relates to training programs and financial assistance through their On The Job Training program (OJT). Available training grants can cover a matching portion of training expenses and, in some cases, related



equipment and partial wage reimbursement, too.

Imagine, you get your candidates trained and CSBD pays the up to 75 percent of the candidate's wages during the training period while they are productive for your business. One caveat is the candidate cannot begin employment prior to the approval of OJT.

FACES OF THE WATERFRONT

FORT LAUDERDALE'S HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY STRETCHES ALONG ITS WATERWAYS

hat do you think of when someone mentions the "hospitality industry"? Usually what comes to mind are people who work in restaurants, hotels, theme parks and bars. But think about our waterfront and all the myriad personalities who call our waterways their office. Together they make up the face of the watery paradise we call home. Let's meet a couple.

Dave Donovan, Carrie B

The *Carrie B* is a sightseeing paddlewheel tour boat that has been providing three daily narrated cruises from the New River Docks in Downtown since 1991. In fact, more than 600,000 passengers have been served so far. At the helm, you'll find Captain Dave Donovan who has been in command of various vessels since 1977 but calls this boat home. "The Carrie B is special," says Donovan. "She's been cruising the Venice of America for over 30 years was named for the original owner's grandmother."

Donovan shares his skippering duties with his brother Jack and often does the narration on the 90-minute cruises. "I love telling people the stories and tales of the historic New River, the Intracoastal and Port Everglades," adds Donovan. He says he's worked with all kinds of charter companies throughout the years but believes that the Carrie B is the best-run by "owners who are the absolute nicest people on earth."

Donovan's boss and company president, David Jordan, repays the compliment. "Dave is a very accomplished captain and is knowledgeable about the Fort Lauderdale harbor," he says. "He also has a good sense of what it takes to ensure that people have a good time. Maybe that's because he was in the entertainment industry for years as DJ Tony Q. Foxx!"

Heather Milton, *Jungle Queen*

Captain Heather Milton has been at the helm of the *Jungle Queen* since 2014 and to date, is the only female captain in the company's history. In 2018, she was named marine operations manager and head captain of the riverboat that has been sailing Lauderdale's waterways since 1935. "I've worked many different jobs but this one comes with the best scenery hands down," says Milton. "Heading inbound on the New River while the sun is setting on the skyline is a sight to behold."

Captain Milton has been operating the waterways for a little over 10 years and feels that Fort Lauderdale is ever-changing and it's exciting to see what may pop up next. "Although our cruises may run along the same route every day, no two days out here are the same," she adds. "My days at the helm of the Jungle Queen are by far my favorite part of the job and it keeps me on my toes."

Greg Farley, Fort Lauderdale Water Taxi

The Fort Lauderdale Water Taxi is a hop-on, hop-off service that visits 11 stops along its route. Passengers can choose where to disembark and spend time, whether at restaurants, shops, parks or other points of interest. Specialty cruises include sunset and holiday lights outings and you can even charter a water taxi for a special event like a corporate gathering or birthday party.

General Manager Greg Farley has been with the company for four years and believes "the best part of having a career on the waterfront is being involved in the community." He appreciates his work and his lifestyle. "Working on the waterfront means you have a front row seat to all the amenities and events that make Fort Lauderdale so special," says Farley. "It means getting to

interact every day with diverse people from many walks of life.

The next time you take a water taxi or a cruise on the waterways of Fort Lauderdale, give thanks for all the welcoming faces who make Fort Lauderdale so friendly. They define much of what our unique city is about and they bring a little joy to all our days.

2023 HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

SAVE OUR HOMES CAP SET BY THE STATE

he Florida Department of Revenue has set the 2023 Save Our Homes (SOH) cap at 3 percent. This SOH assessment cap limits increases to the Assessed/SOH Value for properties receiving Homestead Exemption to no more than 3 percent per year or the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) regardless of increases to the just value of the property. This cap results in considerable property tax savings over time for properties with Homestead Exemption. It is important to remember this is not a cap on the actual taxes, but rather a cap on the amount the Assessed/SOH Value of the property may increase annually.

Important: The Save Our Homes cap begins the year after you receive Homestead Exemption. This cap does not cover new construction or construction that was not taxed before the "Save Our Homes" limit applied to a particular property. When buying/acquiring real estate, do not assume the property taxes will remain the same as the current owner's taxes. Under Florida law, a change in ownership will reset the assessed value of the property to full market value, which could result in higher property taxes. To help property owners better prepare, our office offers a New Homebuyer's Tax Estimator on our website at https://web.bcpa.net/ bcpaclient/#/Tax-Estimator.


Late Filing Exemption Deadline | Sept. 18, 2023

After the initial application approval, the Low-Income Senior Exemption automatically renews each year unless the senior notifies our office that they no longer meet the income requirement for this exemption. People who received the Senior Exemption in 2022 and are still living at the same address do not need to send in a signed renewal card to continue receiving this exemption.

Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you are already receiving Homestead Exemption on your current home, you do not need to reapply. If you have not yet applied for your 2023 Homestead Exemption, Low-Income Senior Exemption, or any other exemption, you can still late file until Sept. 18, 2023. To apply for any of these exemptions, please visit https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Homestead. Once the September statutory "late-filing" deadline has closed, we cannot accept any more 2023 exemption applications regardless of any good cause reason for missing the late filing deadline. Property owners who moved to a new home in 2023 can pre-file for tax year 2024 at https://bcpa. net/homesteadonline with portability/web/index.aspx.

FORT LAUDERDALE TOURISM

A NEW INFLUX OF TOURISM BROKE RECORDS OF YEARS PAST

here is no denying that the tourism and hospitality industries make up a large part of Fort Lauderdale's economy and this became even more evident with these industries screeching to a halt during Covid.

"I think it became more glaring how tourism dependent this destination really is," said Stacy Ritter, president and CEO of Visit Lauderdale.

However, with 2022 having recently come to a close, we now have a much clearer picture of the monumental comeback the city has made since 2020 with its overall boom in both tourism and hospitality. "Tourism is thriving on multiple levels," explains Ina Lee, owner of Travel Host Magazine. "When we came out of 2022, we had certainly one of our best years ever."



In 2022, Fort Lauderdale saw an incredible increase in tourism in multiple different areas of the industry from hotel stays to airline travelers and more. In fact, according to the Visit Lauderdale Hospitality Report, the total tourism development tax collected this past year broke \$100 million for the first time ever. By the end of 2022, it actually reached \$115 million which was 30 percent higher than the same time in 2021 according to that same statistic.

"We have never, ever, ever done this much in tax collection," said Heiko Dobrikow, general manager for The Riverside Hotel. "Everyone in the industry was blown away

and I know we were all thinking look how we knocked it out of the ballpark."

With this boom in tourism and revenue, the City is also able to reinvest that directly back into expanding what the Fort Lauderdale has to offer. In the next few years, residents and tourists can look forward to the opening of several new hotels with Pier Sixty-Six currently being renovated as well as a new 800-room hotel being added to the convention center which is also currently being expanded to add an additional 525,000 plus square feet of venue space.

"When it opens in 2025, it will be a game changer and it's going to make a big difference in the marketplace to attract major city-wide conventions," said Lee. However, for Fort Lauderdale, it's not only the promise of more places to stay or exciting prospects for future events that draw in more visitors – it's their dedication to safety.



Many industry professionals learned a lot of lessons from Covid but one in particular is the push for cleaner facilities and an even higher attention to detail for our visitors.

"I think from a business standpoint in the hotel industry, we learned quickly that the safety our guests and employees are what matters most," said Dobrikow, "So, if I have a sick employee, I would rather have them stay home for a few days to get well. You have to be on your game in order to really provide your customers with the cleanest and friendliest hotels in town, so people want to continue to come back."

With that, it's clear that for leaders in these industries, they have certainly used what they've learned to grow our already booming city and provide for a prosperous future. "We are a better-known destination than we were three years ago. People discovered us, fell in love with us, and are coming back," said Ritter.




