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



THE FOODIE EXPERIENCE

WINE AND DINE PROSPECTS TO TRY IN FORT LAUDERDALE

Ver the last couple months, we've had a lot of exciting things happening in Fort Lauderdale. We opened the renovated aquatic center with its iconic dive tower and broke ground on the reimagining of D.C. Alexander Park. The City also moved forward with construction of a new water treatment plant that will ensure clean, clear drinking water for generations to come.

We are in the midst of a dynamic evolution of our City in which we are witnessing an increasing cosmopolitan flair take shape. This month's issue of Go Riverwalk focuses on food and wine. The changes occurring in this segment of the economy are truly stunning as a wider variety of restaurants open and we attract restaurateurs and chefs of national and international stature.

Visit Lauderdale markets our foodie experience to people from around the world, just as they promote our beaches, fabulous weather and vibrant nightlife. As the agency says on its website, our beach hotels feature everything from world-class steakhouses to swanky Japanese eateries and our Downtown is dotted with European-style cafes and coffee shops, wine and craft beer bars and music-enlivened rooftop restaurants.

We have numerous new and interesting dining options for both locals and tourists to explore. There are far too many to list, but just consider these.

The Main Las Olas office and residential building at Las Olas Boulevard and Northeast Third Avenue features two international cuisine options. Fogo de Chao, a Brazilian

steakhouse that has operations globally from Brazil to the Middle East, opened there last year. Recently, it was joined by Moxies, a premium casual Canadian concept that has more than 70 other locations across Canada and the United States.

Nearby, a new restaurant is part of an agreement to upgrade Huizenga Plaza. The City is partnering with the Downtown Development Authority on the plaza upgrade with new terraces, walkways, civic lawn, river overlook and public restrooms. The new riverside restaurant will be operated by the Rusty Pelican. The Rusty Pelican is a chic waterfront eatery on Key Biscayne that has other unique waterfront restaurants around the country.

There are new cutting-edge food options in Flagler Village. Mister O1 Extraordinary Pizza has opened. It's an offshoot of Chef Renato Viola's place in Miami Beach that serves up elaborate and innovative pizzas. Next door is Santiago's Bodega. It styles itself as a polished, casual tapas bar much like its original location in Key West.

The Katherine on Broward Boulevard is the vision of James Beard semifinalist Timon Balloo and offers dinners infused with the cuisine of his Chinese, Indian and Trinidadian roots. The seafood-driven menu at Rivertail is curated by five-time James Beard Award-nominated chef José Mendin.

At the same time, some of our longtime establishments like YOLO have undergone major makeovers and others like Truluck's have returned to new locations.

And then there are all the great culinary events we have. Las Olas Riverwalk and our Downtown parks are home to everything from the Sunday Jazz Brunch to the Annual Chili Cook-off. Nearby in Flagler Village, there is the monthly Food in Motion event with a wide variety of food trucks to choose from. And, over in the North Beach shopping area, we have the Dining in the Streets event. The Visit Lauderdale Food & Wine Festival and Seaglass: The Fort Lauderdale Rose Experience have been huge hits.

I urge everyone to take a moment and experience all that Fort Lauderdale has to offer. Whether you are looking for a lobster bar, craft beer gastropubs or an Asian-fusion eatery, Fort Lauderdale offers something for everyone. Our variety and depth of cuisine is unparalleled.

And please remember: In the summer, throughout August and September, you can eat your way around some of the best restaurants in Greater Fort Lauderdale during Dine Out Lauderdale, when eateries offer prix-fixe, threecourse menus for very reasonable prices. AN EASY EXPLORATION

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS MAKE IT EASY TO MOVE AROUND TOWN

recently had an amazing Sunday with guests visiting from out of town enjoying events Downtown and along the Riverwalk. I showed them some of the amazing reasons why we love living here. What made it an even more enjoyable experience was taking advantage of the free transit options provided by the City to travel between the events.

We started with the Sunday Jazz Brunch and enjoyed the amazing music and all that was happening there and when we were ready to move on, hopped on the LauderGo! Water Trolley offered for free through funding by the City between Esplanade Park and Laura Ward Park. Along the way, we enjoyed the view of the City from the water to our next destination.

And after enjoying the beautiful artwork at the Las Olas Art Fair and walking through the amazing shops on Las Olas Boulevard we were able to order a free Circuit through their app, available again through funding provided by the City Commission through the Micro Mover Pilot Program.

The Micro Mover Pilot Program was developed by the Transportation and Mobility Department to respond to the Commission priority to provide innovative and sustainable solutions to mitigate traffic congestion issues. The pilot program was established to provide an on-demand service for the Downtown and fixed-route service on the Beach connecting to parking facilities using Circuit as the City's provider.

Last summer, the City implemented a six-month pilot

and while the pilot was scheduled to end in January, the City Commission approved funding to extend the pilot through the end of September due to its success. The service offered Downtown is provided in partnership with Brightline and Circuit through advertising revenue to be able to provide the full range of service times.

The ridership continues to grow with the most recent data, showing that nearly 15,000 riders were carried in just one month and that the peak ridership times include lunch and evening commute/dinner. The highest volume drop-off locations are at the Brightline station and the Beach at Las Olas Boulevard, which shows how important this service is to moving people between downtown and the Beach and to other transit options.

Due to the significant demand, there have been some challenges with wait times during peak periods. Currently, Circuit is in the process of completing additional analysis to better understand ridership patterns to reduce wait times and analyze the system performance moving forward. They will be infusing additional vehicles to understand the balance needed for the best performance during different conditions.

Additionally, on March 13, the service in Downtown was expanded to the west to include most of the Dorsey Riverbend neighborhood, including the L.A. Lee YMCA/Mizell Community Center and the City's Development Services Department. On-demand service will improve mobility in this area and overall connectivity to other areas of the City.

The Circuit micro transit service is available Downtown daily from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The Beach fixed route service operates daily from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. To take advantage of this service, download the Circuit App and for more information scan the QR code below.



From its origins in speakeasies and juke joints, jazz was brought into the concert hall setting by Norman Granz whose Jazz at the Philharmonic series began in



GEORGIA PIG CELEBRATES ITS 70TH YEAR

THE HIDDEN GEM BARBECUE SPOT THAT DOESN'T DARE CHANGE A THING

or those who have lived in Fort Lauderdale for a long time, you are likely familiar with the longtime owners of Carroll's Jewelers – the Moormans. However, you may not know that they are also the family behind the wildly popular barbecue spot, Georgia Pig.

"As my dad likes to say, we're in the solid gold business downtown and the liquid gold business out west," said Luke Moorman of their popular mustard-based barbecue sauce. However, as Luke and his family only came on as owners of this hidden gem joint in 2014, they had some mighty big shoes to fill from the previous owners.

Founded in 1953, Georgia Pig was established by Linton and Frances Anderson who had moved to South Florida in the early 1950s from Jesup, Georgia, bringing with them their family recipes. Initially, Georgia Pig was only a meat market but quickly expanded into a restaurant to meet the demand of eager customers looking to get a taste of the best barbecue in town. Before they knew it, the restaurant became a huge hit. Then in 1997, the couple's son, Wayne, took over the family business alongside his wife, JoAnn. That was until 2014, however, when they decided it might be time to pass the torch to someone else and who better to take over than longtime Georgia Pig customers, the Moorman family.

"My family and I have been going to the restaurant for as long as I can remember," Luke Moorman said. "So, when the opportunity to purchase Georgia Pig came up, we discussed buying it with Wayne and JoAnn and everything just sort of fell into place," he said. Luckily, for other longtime customers, there were no worries to be had about the change in ownership as the Moorman family had no plans to alter their beloved restaurant. "The most common thing that happens with a restaurant when new owners come in is they change the thing that drives customers to keep coming back. So, we went out of our way physically, mentally, and financially in order to keep it the same, so that we wouldn't lose those customers," he said.

With that, all of their menu items have remained the same which includes staples like their chopped pork sandwich, barbecue platters, and their delectable pies which are made in-house daily. Yet, one of their biggest draws is their weekly specials such as their meatloaf Mondays and the ever-popular fried chicken Fridays. Along the thread of keeping things the same, even many of their staff members have been with the Georgia Pig since the very beginning.

"We prioritize taking care of our staff. We want them to prosper and have a career with us which isn't usually the case for a typical service industry job," he said. Ultimately, there's something to be said about Georgia Pig's 70 years of success and sticking to what you know best and for them that's great hospitality and finger licking good barbecue. @

NOW'S THE TIME TO INNOVATE

e continued to speedily power through the first quarter despite headwinds of full employment, rising interest rates and continued inflation. February job figures nationally continued to buck strong recessionary fears as most of our sectors in South Florida maintained or expanded. As of this writing, 2.2 percent unemployment in Broward County means we have 50 percent of available workers for open positions.

Wage growth is ebbing nationally. This is good news for federal policymakers who will add that metric to their interest rate brew. It seems that interest rate increases will continue. Eventually something has to give.

New talent migration to our area is coming from typical markets: New York City, Boston, Chicago lead the pack. We also have seen professionals head east from Los Angeles and San Francisco.

We continue to see hospitality grow with new restaurants like Moxies opening. More will come as our urban core intensifies with density and excitement. Entrepreneurs and larger companies find greater Fort Lauderdale a prime location to set up a second office or main position.

Our downtown market currently has an inventory of 10,976 units with a 94 percent occupancy rate. There are another 4,539 units under construction, but this should taper off. With market forces bearing down, developers are finding it more difficult to begin moving dirt.

We don't see the 58.5 percent five-year rent growth continuing at that non-sustainable rate. The forecast is calling for annual rent growth at a modest 3.8 percent.

We have 9.5 million square feet of inventory for class A-C space with another 30,000 square feet under construction, according to Colliers International. "Healthy tenant demand has pushed rental rates up to a record high of \$51.08 per square foot for full services, a 40 percent increase over the last five years," their report stated.

Downtown Fort Lauderdale has recovered faster and stronger from the Covid downturn than most markets ranking in the top 10 in the United States, according to a study completed at UC Berkeley. Remember during Covid when some thought remote workers spelled the death of office? Not so fast.

In Florida, only Jacksonville ranked higher for recovery. San Diego, Baltimore, Columbus and Las Vegas led the study for quickest recoveries. Calgary, Indianapolis, Portland and San Francisco trailed the field.

We continue to develop community assets like Huizenga Park, Tunnel Top Park, and War Memorial. Soon look for the community asset at Drive Pink Stadium to be resolved, giving us more attractive options. Our convention center expansion including a hotel fits nicely into our growth landscape along with future plans for connections from a mobility hub at Fort

> Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport.

The strength we are experiencing in our economy is directly related to intelligent planning, attractive community assets, and collaboration between the public and private sectors. Now is the time to innovate and accelerate. (1)

The Sears property was sold to developer Aimco in May 2022. The developer has plans for multifamily apartments on the mixed-use project, known as Searstown.

MIXING BUSINESS AND PLEASURE

AN INTERVIEW WITH JONATHAN POGASH OF THE COCKTAIL GURU

e ospitality is at the heart of every yachting experience. Entertaining on board is a big part of what makes time at sea relaxing and memorable. Nobody understands how to elevate entertainment like Jonathan Pogash, the original Cocktail Guru.

A veteran mixologist of the New York City nightlife scene, Jonathan has been crafting specialty cocktails and artisanal alcohol creations for decades. He leveraged his expertise and launched his consulting business, The Cocktail Guru, in 2006. The goal? To elevate the art of the mix and make it accessible to aspiring bartenders everywhere.

Since then, Jonathan and his team of talented mixologists have worked with a global roster of clients. Whether helping restaurants curate cocktail menus or teaching individuals the perfect pour, The Cocktail Guru's approach to cocktail enlightenment is equal parts education and entertainment.

I had a chance to sit down with Jonathan recently to find out more about his business and learn how he's helping yacht crews around the world elevate the on-board experience for guests.

How did you get involved with the marine and yachting industry?

Around 2014, I was contacted by a chief stewardess from a superyacht asking if we offered private classes. It was an intriguing opportunity and one we were excited to pursue.

We did our research to ensure the class we offered would maximize value to the crew. One thing we learned early on is that any interior crew training should be GUEST/IAMI accredited. GUEST is the only internationally accredited maritime hospitality program for crew working in the superyacht sector. If you're a crew member looking to work on bigger boats, having GUEST/IAMI accreditation is very valuable for your career trajectory.

So, we got busy getting GUEST/IAMI-certified and then launched our accredited interior crew training classes that year. We worked closely with several experienced stews, including Bethany Hodnefield and Adrienne Gang, to shape and refine the curriculum. You might recognize Adrienne from the first season of Below Deck.

We offer in-person training classes at several Fort Lauderdale-based yacht training facilities, including Maritime Professional Training, Bluewater Yachting, and Blue Oceans, typically in the spring and fall. This April, we're teaming up with Aileen Keenan, The Yacht Stew Guru, for our classes at Blue Oceans.

We also offer private classes on board vessels that are

docked in and around Fort Lauderdale and the northeast United States.

How is bartending service unique in a yacht environment?

Space is the biggest constraint. Unlike a typical bar environment, where you will have expansive room to work, yacht crew is confined to a small galley area. Even on superyachts, crew must work within much smaller spaces than they would on land. We make it a point to incorporate tips and tricks for managing in small spaces into our course curriculum.

Tell me about your expansion into fine wines.

My father, Jeffrey Pogash, had a very successful 18-year career with Moet Hennessy USA. Before that, for 17 years he was the U.S. representative for CIVA, the organization that represents the growers, shippers, and cooperatives in Alsace, France.

His wine and spirits knowledge is unmatched. When he retired in 2011, he offered his expertise to The Cocktail Guru. His joining the team adds a natural synergy and allows us to offer education that covers the full spectrum for our students. Cocktails, wines, champagnes. You name it, we cover it.

LOW-INCOME SENIOR EXEMPTION INCOME REQUIREMENT CLARIFICATION

o qualify for the 2023 Low-Income Senior Exemption, an applicant must be 65 years or older as of Jan. 1, 2023, with a combined household adjusted gross income not exceeding \$35,167 for 2022. Many seniors believe they do not qualify for this exemption because their Social Security payments exceed this amount; however, applicants who file income taxes should look at their adjusted gross income amount (line 11 on the IRS 1040 form) to see if they do qualify for this additional exemption. If you are not required to file an income tax return based on your age and income, you would qualify for this exemption. To apply for the additional Low-Income Senior Exemption, please visit our website at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/ SeniorExemption.

Q: What would our readers be surprised to know about you?


A: I compete in CrossFit for my age group, and I finished 40th worldwide in the online qualifier.

city unique. So, our bank's mission is to empower local companies to maximize their potential and local business is the soul of the community.




