

EXPERIENCE ART, CULTURE AND ENTERTAINMENT JUST STEPS AWAY FROM THE RIVERWALK





Priverwalk continues to be a hub and is fortunate to have so many opportunities for you to experience art, culture, nature and entertainment. When walking the north side of the New River at the western end, you first experience the Broward Center for the Performing Arts which joins with Esplanade Park, a grand location for special events and performances. Across the street is the Museum of Discovery and Science which features learning opportunities that cover a variety of subjects.

Continuing down the north side, you next encounter several historic properties that offer a learning experience about Fort Lauderdale and Broward County.

As you continue east, you will note that you have passed several pieces of art in public places and soon encounter the NSU Art Museum. This location showcases exhibits that engage the public and make it clearly a grand destination.

Farther down the Riverwalk you will reach Stranahan House, which was a trading post and home to the founding family of Frank and Ivy Stranahan. It is a lovely facility, filled with facts and history and a great place to visit and learn.

Within a short walking distance of Riverwalk is the South Side Cultural Arts Center which hosts a variety of classes in the arts, dance, culinary and other options and is a great place to join a class.

Also within a short walking distance of Riverwalk is the Fort Lauderdale Fire and Safety Museum, which is a converted fire station that holds antique fire engines and equipment and a special children's area to learn about the gear on display, and about the history of fires.

We also want to include Bonnet House Museum and Gardens as a beautiful destination that features an art-filled home and lush gardens and tours telling about the house and its fascinating history.

The Jungle Queen and the Carrie B both offer narrated sightseeing cruises along the New River and Intracoastal Waterway, sharing history and fun facts about the area and residents.

Also, within Fort Lauderdale is the Stonewall National Museum and Archives as well as ArtServe and many other galleries and shows that present art.

Local art walks are a good way to immerse yourself in our art scene. They are hosted around the city monthly as evening entertainment.

As you can see, we are a city of art, culture, music, and adventure. Welcome to

ort Lauderdale is filled with opportunities to enjoy art and local culture. Murals, art in public places and soon to have the statue at Tunnel Top Park are a few examples of types of art that abound. Having some very famous local artist has given us some unique and treasured pieces such as the Seminole Indian Girl at Smoker Park by renowned artist Nilda Comas. Nilda was invited to the Florida Artist Hall of Fame. She is known for her works created in marble, bronze, and other materials. Her fantastic works have been featured all over the world.

Broward County Cultural Division Director Phillip Dunlap brings a creative approach to art within Broward County, including fixed, visual and interactive opportunities to experience something different and meaningful. The series IGNITE! sponsored by the county grows and continues to offer more new approaches to understanding and participating in art.

Joseph Cox, president and CEO of the Museum of Discovery and Science, also has stepped out of the box to bring innovative experiences to the public and educating at the same time. His program schedule is clever and different and leaves you always checking to see what next may pop up to experience.

Broward Center for the Performing Arts, led by President and CEO Kelley Shanley, offers an extensive list of shows to see and in conjunction with The Parker Playhouse showcases a variety of musical performances to appeal to nearly all.

Bonnie Clearwater, director and chief curator, leads the charge at NSU Art Museum in Downtown Fort Lauderdale with creative and thoughtful art exhibits that draw you in over and over.

Museum experiences are bountiful including History Fort Lauderdale led by Executive Director Patricia Zeiler featuring several properties that demonstrate history of the area. The group also maintains a robust library of historical facts, documents and pictures that tell the story.

Jennifer Belt, executive director at Stranahan House, invites the public to visit the historical property in the heart of Downtown and tells the story of our founding family – the Stranahans.

For film lovers, Savor Cinema Fort Lauderdale offers a unique experience of viewing old films as well as brand new signature films in a beautiful, comfortable theatre with great sound and lighting to enhance the experience.

Our internationally acclaimed Nova Southeastern University Art Museum is continuing its tradition of topof-the-line exhibits.



# **SUMMER TRAVELS**

WHEN ART AND TRANSPORTATION INTERSECT

t is that time of year when I make my trip home to Massachusetts and often drive. This year I spent a little time in Washington, D.C., and then drove up to western Massachusetts for a family celebration.

Being in the transportation field, I tend to geek out a bit about things that other areas are doing, well or not too well, and especially about historic feats that were accomplished.

This year I contemplated the use of granite for curbs and what the cost differential may be with concrete used here (they are relatively equal for that area with granite having a longer life span ... I checked), the great work that D.C. is doing growing their bike lane network (but with some challenges on new bike lane signals), upper or lower deck on the George Washington Bridge in New York City (lower deck was the right choice), and my most amazing experience was on my first venture on the Merritt Parkway through Connecticut. The excitement of what the next bridge may look like overshadowed the Friday afternoon traffic out of The City.

The history and culture of this roadway really struck me and made me do research as soon as we got to our destination. If you haven't traveled on a northeast parkway, you have no idea how beautiful they are. They were "highways" designed for passenger traffic and recreational use, going through areas of scenic beauty, focusing on providing access to the best scenery even if it meant making the route longer. Key design features were that grade crossings were eliminated, they had minimal exits and entrances, there were often restrictions on commercial vehicles, and the landscape

design was a key element. These parkways were built to protect and preserve the natural scenic values, basically creating an elongated park to contain the roadway ergo its name "Parkway."


The Merritt Parkway was the first divided, limited-access highway in Connecticut that was constructed in the 1930s to alleviate traffic congestion on the Boston Post Road. It was an example of a significant new phase of American highway design where the experience was as important as moving vehicles, combining aesthetics with function.

And what makes this Parkway so amazing is the way that they accomplished the grade separations through the 69 artistic bridges within the 37.5-mile length that brought such architectural styles as Art Deco and Art Moderne to a new medium of bridges. The bridges were designed by architect George L. Dunkelberger to reflect the natural environment with representations of animals, plants, and representations of progress and movement.

Art and function continue to play a role in transportation projects in Fort Lauderdale including those I have highlighted in past articles like the Flagler Drive and Northeast 15th Avenue projects with painting art onto the street, sculpture installations like the Northeast 13th Street roundabout installation as well as those being completed by the Broward County Cultural Division on several key bridges in the city in the future.

Keep your eyes open for these and more examples of the intersection of transportation and art across the city.

CHARLIE ST. FLOWERS AND COFFEE WILL FILL YOUR CUP

or those who crave a cup of coffee with a side of conversation and some laughs, it's hard to come by a shop or café that offers that unique sense of community. Yet for New York transplants and siblings, Charles Tracy and Valarie Tracy Cianci, they were set on changing that when they came to Fort Lauderdale with a plan to open a coffee shop that not only offers high quality coffee and food, but the chance to make lifelong friends.

"When I lived in Midtown, I worked as a bookkeeper and a block away from where I worked a little coffee and flower shop opened up. It was a cute, teeny place and all they sold was coffee and flowers. The next thing I know they're popping up everywhere around Manhattan. So when my brother, who is a trained chef, and I moved to Fort Lauderdale I said, 'Why don't we do this?'" said Cianci.

With that, Tracy and Cianci took what was initially a passing idea, to start a similar shop here in Fort Lauderdale that soon bloomed into a popular hot spot the community absolutely adores.

Today, Charlie St. offers espresso drinks locally sourced from the Miami-based Panther Coffee as well as delectable dishes like their turkey and mozzarella sandwich made with organic turkey breast, mozzarella, sun dried tomatoes on ciabatta and lavender-infused Belgian, and of course flowers.

"Our food, coffee, and beverages are definitely where

Charlie St. shines, but we liked the idea of offering flowers, plants, and succulents because it's unique but also makes the place look inviting," she said.

Even though the siblings now call Fort Lauderdale home, they didn't forget to pay tribute to their New York roots.

"Well, my brother's name is obviously Charlie, but we also chose the name because there's a very popular street in the West Village called Charles Street. So we thought it would be nice little nod to New York and where we came from," said Cianci. Aside from their curated menu made with a lot of love and care by the culinary trained Tracy, it's their passion for the community that really sets them apart.

From weekend yoga classes to selling art in the shop from local artists, the siblings behind Charlie St. are dedicated to creating an inviting space where people from all over can feel like family when they stop in.

"Everyone here is so nice and we've really gotten close with our customers. I have the same people who come by in the morning during the week and before they say anything, I know exactly what kind of coffee they want," said Cianci.

"Growing up in the city, and especially in Brooklyn, we had neighborhoods where everybody knew each other. So when we moved here I felt like this area was missing that, but now with Charlie's I think we've created a spot that has just that." <sup>(1)</sup>

# **KEEP CHUGGING**

THE CHAMBER'S COUNCIL OF ECONOMIC ADVISORS LOOKS AT INFLATIONARY CONDITIONS

he South Florida economy is chugging along with consumer demand remaining constant and fluctuating inflation numbers the soup de jour for the rest of the year.

Over three-quarters of the Chamber's Council of Economic Advisors (CEA) projects consumer demand will either stay the same or increase (16 percent projected decreases). The CEA represents 22 market segment executives who meet with the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta-Miami Branch, on a quarterly basis.

Those citing a softening in demand stated that inflationary conditions and higher financing costs were the main drivers. A recent report cited the Fort Lauderdale, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach Metro region with inflation as high as 9 percent in April on its way to seven percent in June.

Nationally, inflation has been on a steady decline ending July at 3.2 percent with price increases moderated as of this report. The CEA reported most businesses are maintaining price and passing most increases through to consumers.

More than half of the CEA indicated that there are still upward cost pressures outside of labor costs. All this while three-quarters of CEA respondents indicated credit conditions remained the same and some are holding back on capital investments.

Margins for the remainder of this year were a mixed bag for CEA members, with the majority expecting them to remain stable or increase but about one-third looking for a decline.

In a tight labor market, none of the CEA was decreasing their labor force, with most maintaining and a third actively hiring. Our talent market remains tight with 2.9 percent unemployment and 32,092 citizens looking for a job. That has cut into the spread between the 40,621 open positions in Broward County as of this report.

Through all of this we have added 27,756 new jobs year-over-year, according to the Florida Scorecard. For perspective, just to keep up with migration and to remain at current employment levels we need to create 86,458 new jobs by 2030. In the tri-county area we need 279,029 net new jobs.

We have had a record number of ribbon cuttings for new businesses this year with the majority of them in the hospitality space. This isn't surprising. The sector was hit hard during Covid. Many shuttered and new players are emerging now like New River Café & Bakery, Pummarola, and Hatch.

Unfortunately, our visitor indexes are flat and at a normal rate for this time of year. What we know is there are more options outside of Florida and the United States attracting tourism. Room prices are moderating as demand ebbs. Revenue per unit was down two percent in the second quarter.

All this to say, keep chugging South Florida, keep chugging. <sup>(1)</sup>

# **ART IN MANY FORMS**

THE FORT LAUDERDALE CONCOURS IS NOT JUST ABOUT CARS











he Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show (FLIBS) is arguably the premier multi-day event in Fort Lauderdale's annual calendar. For five days each October, FLIBS brings together boating enthusiasts from every corner of the globe, immersing them in all things yachting.

One FLIBS event stands out, though, as an evening that goes beyond the typical yacht-related fare to reach across demographic boundaries and bring together people with diverse interests. The Fort Lauderdale Concours, held on the Friday night of the show weekend, takes attendees beyond boats and immerses them in a unique artistic experience.

Three years ago, Maria Jannace, founder and CEO of Fort Lauderdale Concours Inc. and Maxim Creative Group, wanted to bring the concours experience to FLIBS but do so in a way that had never been done before anywhere in the world. Working with Las Olas Capital Arts, the duo created a popup art gallery at the Fort Lauderdale Concours that showcases a variety of art styles, all from artists in the south Florida area. All the art on display is for sale, and 100 percent of proceeds go directly to the artists.

Of course, you can't have a concours without rare and collectible cars, and Jannace promises this year's event will impress even the most avid car enthusiast. In keeping things local, many of this year's showcase cars will come from South Florida. These will be complemented with collectible cars from other parts of the U.S., too.

While this year's car lineup is kept under wraps until Friday night, previous concours events have included standouts like a 1971 Lamborghini Miura P400 SV (long considered the world's first super car), a 1955 Mercedes-Benz 300SL Gullwing (a favorite of Zsa Zsa Gabor and Tony Curtis), and a 1934 Packard LaBaron Twelve Individual Custom Sport Phaeton (one of only 960 ever produced).

Finally, perhaps the most unique aspect of the concours overall is the inclusion of collectible sneakers — another form of artistic expression. Jannace saw including sneakers as a way to bridge demographic divides and introduce the world of concours to a younger, more diverse audience. Jannace worked with a collectible sneaker curator to ensure that the shoes selected visually complement each of the cars on display.

The only evening concours in the world, the Fort Lauderdale Concours is truly a one-of-a-kind event that brings together lovers of different art forms for an evening of relaxed camaraderie and new experiences. Concours attendees can also vote for their favorite car, with a People's Choice Award given at the end of the night.

Don't miss this year's Fort Lauderdale Concours, part of FLIBS weekend. It's your opportunity to enjoy an informal party atmosphere and immerse yourself in art in many forms. @

Our office mailed over 776,000 TRIM (proposed tax) Notices to Broward County property owners last month. The 2023 Just/Market Values are based on the market data from 2022 as Florida Statutes require our office use January 1 as the date of assessment each year.

The TRIM Notice you received shows your 2023 Just/Market Value, any tax-saving exemptions you are receiving, and the proposed tax amounts as set by the various taxing authorities listed on the notice. It is important to remember the Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect taxes.

If you believe you are entitled to a Homestead Exemption or any other exemption not shown on your TRIM Notice, you may still late file for any 2023 exemption until Sept. 18, 2023. #### **Value Adjustment Board**

The Value Adjustment Board (VAB) is an independent quasi-judicial review board. If you believe your Just/ Market Value is not what a buyer would have reasonably paid for your property on Jan. 1, 2023, you should first contact our office. If after speaking with one of our appraisers, you still do not agree, you can file an appeal with the Broward County Value Adjustment Board. If you were denied an exemption, you may also file an appeal with the Value Adjustment Board challenging this denial. The absolute deadline for Value Adjustment Board petitions is Sept. 18, 2023.
