# **ILLUMINATING FORT LAUDERDALE'S FUTURE**

THE PHILANTHROPIC LEGACY OF SYLVIA ALDRIDGE AND DANA A. DORSEY

n the heart of Fort Lauderdale, two exceptional philanthropists, Sylvia Aldridge and Dana A. Dorsey, have left a remarkable impact on the community; their legacy echoes through the city's health, educational and cultural fabric. Their profound dedication to uplifting the lives of Fort Lauderdale's residents has changed the city's trajectory, creating a culture of empowerment and opportunity for all. Their commitment to philanthropy has set an example for generations to come.

Sylvia Aldridge, a visionary community leader and pioneer of Fort Lauderdale, began her remarkable journey in the city as a maid. Recognizing the lack of employment agencies catering to the needs of the Black community, she took the bold step of establishing Sylvia's Employment Agency. It became the first and, for a considerable period, the sole employment agency specifically serving the Black population in Fort Lauderdale. Sylvia was not content with merely providing job opportunities; she extended her efforts to address the transportation challenges faced by her clients. This led to the creation of Sylvia's Victories Cabs, a service that catered to the transportation needs of those she assisted.

Sylvia's compassion knew no bounds, as she continually extended her support wherever needed. When faced with the injustice of local hospitals refusing to admit African American patients, she fearlessly took charge of spearheading fundraising initiatives for what later became Provident Hospital. This 15-bed facility was located on Northwest Sixth Street, situated in what is now referred to as the Sistrunk Corridor. Despite living in a world that wasn't designed for her, Sylvia's accomplishments testify to her unwavering dedication and commitment to providing equal opportunities for Fort Lauderdale's Black community.

Complementing Aldridge's trailblazing efforts, Dana A. Dorsey was an instrumental figure in Miami and Fort Lauderdale, leaving behind a philanthropic legacy that aimed to enrich and secure the long-term prosperity of Fort Lauderdale. Dorsey, a prominent African American entrepreneur and benefactor, held the distinction of being South Florida's First Black millionaire. His influence extended beyond his financial success, as he assumed roles as a civic leader and philanthropist.

Dorsey's achievements were not solely personal; he recognized the significance of fostering an inclusive society, emphasizing the importance of supporting cultural diversity. Using his wealth and status as a prominent businessman and property owner, he made substantial contributions to the community, demonstrating a profound

commitment to its well-being. Notably, his contributions included donations to the Dade County Public Schools, as well as his instrumental involvement in the establishment of Miami's first Black bank and a Black-owned hotel.

Dorsey was a prominent landowner during the early years of Fort Lauderdale and Miami, with a notable investment in the development of the region. He commissioned Francis Abreu with the construction of a significant commercial building situated in downtown Black Fort Lauderdale's Northwest Fifth Avenue. The name "Dorsey Riverbend" pays homage to


the enterprising spirit of this influential Black entrepreneur and philanthropist. Dorsey's achievements and impact will forever serve as a reminder of just how far Fort Lauderdale has come.

Together, Aldridge and Dorsey's philanthropic efforts transcended traditional boundaries, touching the lives of individuals from all walks of life. Their shared vision of a more equitable and culturally vibrant Fort Lauderdale inspires a new generation of philanthropists and community leaders. # **HUIZENGA PARK REIMAGINED**

A NEW MODEL FOR PUBLIC SPACE TRANSFORMATIONS









he upcoming \$15 million transformation of Huizenga Park is an example of a new approach for creating world-class public spaces in Fort Lauderdale. With an anticipated groundbreaking early next year, the DDA is excited for how Huizenga Park Reimagined is inspiring our community to reinvest in our signature spaces.

This project has been years in the making, beginning in 2019 when the DDA hosted national experts from the Urban Land Institute to give us guidance on reinvesting in the public realm. We then studied the most successful downtown public spaces across the country. Park leaders from Dallas to Detroit, Tampa to Sarasota, Houston to Minneapolis and beyond shared best practices on what it takes to create and run a highly activated downtown park.

Inspired by the success of legendary parks throughout the country, we decided to create a public-private-philanthropic partnership (P4). Under this approach, one-third of the funding would come from the public sector, one-third from the private sector, and one-third from philanthropic donors.

A key ingredient for the success of this P4 is the Huizenga Park Foundation. This nonprofit was formed to raise the philanthropic dollars needed to reimagine Huizenga Park. Following the footsteps of beloved public spaces from across the country, the Foundation will transition into the organization that will operate, maintain and program the park to ensure it is forever managed as a world-class destination.

The DDA and Huizenga Park Foundation are building Downtown Fort Lauderdale's signature gathering space in honor of the entrepreneurs and community leaders who paved the way for our city's success. Both Wayne and Marti Huizenga were dreamers and doers who inspired leaders across multiple generations to give back.

"We're so proud that this project has inspired established community leaders and a new generation of philanthropists to invest in this special park," said Huizenga Park Foundation Chairman Steve Hudson. The new park design features a series of outdoor rooms that will transform the site into our city's outdoor living room, dining room and backyard – all in one. We're thankful for the leaders who have committed to a legacy naming opportunity in the park and believe in the importance of creating a world-class space for generations of Fort Lauderdale residents.

# **MOVING ALONG**

ADVOCATING FOR TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

s we close out one year and look to start the new, transportation staff are already starting to plan for our next budget cycle. Developing a plan for transportation projects in the City to implement the Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2045 vision is a very multifaceted process that looks well beyond just the City budget.

Funding is also pursued through state, federal, county and private grant funding which all have their own rules and restrictions. The leading contributing factors to the need to explore multiple funding sources are roadway jurisdictions and the high cost of roadway projects. Many are unaware that all of the main roads in our city are not under the jurisdiction of the City, but instead owned by either the state or county.

The Transportation and Mobility Department works closely with our county and state partners to advocate for projects that align with the city's Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2045 Plan to be included in their budgets and that existing projects in their plans incorporate elements that improve safety and mobility for all users within our city. These partnerships have greatly widened the possibility of moving toward our vision together.

One of the most recent processes was participation in the Florida Department of Transportation budget process, which follows a similar process to the city budget where a draft budget is presented, comments are received and then a final budget is approved for their budget year which starts on July 1.

Their budget is structured the same as the City's CIP, programming out five years, with the new fifth year added each year. This year, there are 43 projects programmed

within the City of Fort Lauderdale in the next five years, which include types of projects such as resurfacing, bridge rehab, interchange redesigns, street lighting improvements, signal technology upgrades and intersection improvements.

Each of these projects are reviewed by city transportation staff who advocate for the best interest of the city from the very beginning during scope development all the way through construction. Although these projects are not cityrun projects, they provide incredible opportunities for multimodal improvements within the City. The City could not have made the incredible accomplishments of installation of more than 47 miles of bike lanes since the Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2045 Vision was created without the state and county partnerships.

Examples of some recent success stories of community requests incorporated into projects within the FDOT budget include:

- Design of two new signals on SRA1A, at Northeast 27th Street to improve vehicle and pedestrian safety and Northeast 14th Court to add a pedestrian crosswalk are both in design this year;
- Installation of a new traffic signal at Imperial Point Hospital entrance completed this year at a location where there had been significant safety concerns;
- Shady Banks and Tarpon River Mobility Master Plan grant funded improvements programmed for design this fiscal year to implement priorities from their plans through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization CSLIP Grant program;
- Northwest 19th Street median island project programmed for installation to help improve safety <sup>®</sup>

# **BROWARD COUNTY'S THRIVING NONPROFIT ARTS AND CULTURE**

ARTS BOLSTERS LOCAL ECONOMY WITH \$386 MILLION IMPACT

or more than a year, Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale have been collecting data as a part of the sixth Arts and Economic Prosperity Study (AEP6), an effort of the national arts advocacy organization, Americans for the Arts. The goal of this effort is to quantify the economic impact of the nonprofit arts and culture industry, both locally and nationally.

Unlike many other industries, the nonprofit arts and culture sector stimulates large amounts of event-related spending by audiences. More than 3,000 audience-intercept surveys collected by Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale attest to this fact. These surveys reveal the spending habits of our local event attendees, how dollars are spent in conjunction with events and the economic activity generated. The financial data of more than 100 Broward-based arts and culture nonprofit organizations was also compiled. The results of our efforts provide valuable insights locally and also contribute to the study's conclusions on the national-level.

In FY22, Broward County arts and culture nonprofit organizations spent \$138,773,054, which leveraged an additional \$247,830,621 spending by audiences, generating a total of \$386,603,675 in economic activity. These numbers are impressive by themselves and are a testament to the strength of our arts and culture sector. When you dig a little deeper into some of the study's

audience data, you see that in FY22 nearly six-million people attended arts and culture events and spent an average of \$41.74 per person, per event. This spend is on top of the price of a ticket, on items such as parking, dinner and lodging.

AEP6 study results also demonstrate the importance of the arts in our community, with more than 80 percent of survey respondents indicating that they view cultural venues as "important pillars" that "instill a sense of pride" in their neighborhoods and communities.

Most people understand the important role of artists and arts and culture organizations in our communities. Participating in studies like AEP6 help us to advocate for continued and increasing support of arts and cultural opportunities. There is no doubt that the state of our arts is strong and although there is still much work to be done, we can be proud of our accomplishments and celebrate the fact our community values arts and culture.

# A HISTORY LESSON

A LOOK AT A FEW EUROPEAN CITIES' INFRASTRUCTURES

hile on a recent trip in Europe (it was my first time) I was captivated by infrastructure and history.

I heard fascinating stories dating back to the Roman Empire and heard perspectives of enduring conflicts. For thousands of years Europeans in several cities I visited have withstood sieges and floods, disease and famine.

Two areas stood out — Passau, Germany and Budapest, Hungary. Passau is a city in Lower Bavaria on the Danube River. The river rises in the Black Forest mountains of Western Germany and flows some 1,770 miles to the mouth of the Black Sea. In Passau, the Danube meets with two other rivers — the Inn from the south and the Ilz from the north.

As we arrived by water, I sensed this city has dealt with floods. Concrete walls rose as a barrier to a cresting river. Think of our New River and walls on either side to 20 feet or more. Even with these barriers, the Danube



can and does shut the city down.

As recently as 2013, the river rose to a level of 42 feet which left most of the city under water. In 1954, the river crested just under that.

This flood left 50,000 without water and electricity. Several thousand residents were forced from their homes. Throughout the lower portion of the city you could see water lines on buildings. In fact, there are line markers displayed on city hall, indicating high water marks over the years.

Few cities went unscathed by the 2013 flood. Budapest was also hit hard. It has flood fences that reach 30.5 feet. The river was expected to peak at 29.4 feet. Forceful currents broke dams adding to devastation. Thankfully, those river defenses protected the city. There were other, more horrific disasters in this capital city currently with a metro population of 3.3 million.

Hungarians arrived in the late 9th century but the area was pillaged by Mongols in 1241. There were to be eight sieges; the most recent in 1946. As I toured both the Buda and the Pest sides, I was awestruck by the current state of the city and tried to imagine the devastation of the sieges.

The beautiful bridges of Budapest were bombed along with many strategic buildings of significance during World War II. Multiple fixed bridges connect the region. I stayed close to the Szechenyi Chain Bridge, the first permanent bridge across the Danube which opened in 1849. It has beautiful stone carved lions at each of the abutments which were saved after German troops bombed the bridge in 1946.

While bridges span the Danube, light rail was abundantly available for hop-on, hop-off connectivity. I loved how seamless it was with times easily displayed for each arrival

Rail systems were evident throughout my journey easing the carbon footprint. Clearly a massive investment has been made. I was reminded of Brightline as I rode the high-speed train from Rome to Florence, Italy. The Direttissima rail line reaches speeds of up to 155 mph.

Through these efforts, they donate their collective time and manpower to Habitat for Humanity. Numerous local families in need reap the benefits of these efforts in the form of a solid roof over their heads and a fresh start.

Some of the business teams putting forth this effort have even been known to move on to second and third construction projects once they complete their assigned building tasks. Lending extra support to less-experienced crews, while working long hours under the hot Florida sun, is a testament to the commitment of these people to our local community.

And, of course, it would be remiss not to note the charitable efforts made at the individual level of everyday citizens across our city and county.

Organizations like Save the Sea Turtles, 1,000 Mermaids Reef Project, Junior Achievement, and the Humane Society, to name just a few, could not exist without the countless volunteer hours donated by residents.

Local support-focused events equally benefit from the volunteers in our community, too. Fort Lauderdale Beach Sweep has resulted in thousands of beach lovers collecting more than 80,000 cigarette butts, thousands of plastic straws and several tons of trash. ## **2024 HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS**

DEADLINE TO FILE FOR 2024 EXEMPTIONS IS MARCH 1, 2024

Il qualified Florida residents are eligible to receive a Homestead Exemption on their homes, condominiums, co-op apartments and certain mobile home lots. To qualify for Homestead Exemption, you must own and make the property your permanent residence on Jan. 1 of the year for which you are applying for this valuable exemption. Pursuant to Florida law, all assessments and exemptions are based upon the status of the property on Jan. 1. If you acquired the property as your permanent residence in 2023 and have not applied for Homestead Exemption, you can apply for 2024 exemptions at any time – there is no need to wait until 2024 to file your exemption application. You can easily apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/HomesteadExemption.

## The timely deadline to file for all 2024 exemptions is March 1, 2024.

You must make the property your permanent residence by Jan. 1, 2024, in order to qualify; however, you have until March 1 to timely file your application with the property appraiser's office. The late filing deadline for all 2024 exemptions is Sept. 18, 2024. For

information about all the other exemptions available, please visit the "Exemptions & Classifications" page on our website https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/ Homestead.

Once approved, your Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you have already applied and been approved for Homestead Exemption at your current property, you do not need to reapply for this exemption. You will receive a Homestead Exemption renewal card next month to keep for your records.

## **HELP FOR HAWAII**

WITH THE ISLAND PARADISE OF MAUI IN NEED, FORT LAUDERDALE SHARES SUPPORT

outh Florida is no stranger to natural disasters and no stranger to helping those in need. That's why when one of the worst fires in U.S. history hit the Hawaiian Island of Maui, local fundraisers were organized, donations were made and a Fort Lauderdale firefighter made his way across the Pacific to lend a hand.

Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue Captain Kevin Galt was deployed in the days following the August fires to assist in recovery efforts through a coordinated disaster response.

"Teams come in and don't know the terrain, get to work and will work till they drop. Local departments worked so well together to bring the most positive outcome among the devastation," he said.

The wildfires killed nearly 100 people and burned thousands of acres, destroying homes and businesses in West Maui. Hundreds of residents were displaced and many had to make harrowing escapes. The race to find survivors began quickly as crews went digging through the ashes. Captain Galt worked to bring in heavy equipment that removed dangerous debris to make it safer for teams to enter.

"It's rewarding to help the men, women and canines get what they need to complete a difficult mission and bring closure to families," he said. "Bringing comfort to people in a time of tragedy."

With more than 25 years with Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue and over 15 years as part of the FEMA Florida Task Force Urban Search and Rescue Team, Captain Galt has been deployed around the country. He said he was

inspired by the residents on Maui, "In the face of incredible devastation I was impressed by the resilience of the locals from start to finish."

And the resilience of the people is still being tested today as many residents continue to struggle emotionally, and now financially, in the wake of a reduction in tourism.

"The island is grieving together for all that's been lost," said Aloha Jeep Rental owner Asha Hall. "Now we're also feeling the economic impact from a lack of tourists."

Rentals have dropped significantly, as Jeeps sit waiting for customers. A long-time resident of Maui, her business, like many other small local companies, is hurting without the influx of outside dollars. The efforts from Fort Lauderdale and various agencies, along with donations to organizations like Maui Strong, are making a difference. But there's another way to help if you can — plan a trip to Hawaii.

Mindful travel is what is needed now. What does that mean? Here's my advice as someone from Hawaii who visited family on Maui shortly after the fires: Be respectful, particularly in the western areas where most of the devastation occurred. Show reverence for the people and for the land by bringing a generous spirit to the island as it continues to mourn and recover.

Fort Lauderdale is blessed with a tropical lifestyle similar to Maui, and your visit there will let you deliver some love from the Sunshine State and also experience the Aloha Spirit when it's needed more than ever.



## CALL TO ARTISTS WINNER JACK MCQUEEN

MCQUEEN USED HIS DELIVERY ROUTE AS INSPIRATION FOR NIGHT LIFE

t's often said that there is an artist inside all of us. However, not everyone can take a chance to pursue their creative passions as a career or even as a hobby. "People always submit something in the daytime, so I wanted to do something different and pick a nighttime scene. However, seeing as McQueen does have a full-time job, he sought out help from his wife to complete the time consuming painting by the deadline.

"I could never have completed this in time without the help of my wife. It was such a large thing to tackle by myself, so this piece was really a joint effort," he said. As for the possibility of submitting something next year, McQueen has already started planning for his next submission and hopes to see his wife submit her own piece as well.

"I absolutely want to submit something again next year and my wife has already said she wants to submit something as well. We want to turn it into our own competition between the two of us and I can't wait to see how we both do next year," he said.

\$5 MILLION RAISED SINCE ITS INCEPTION

ince its founding in 2009 at the home of Janet Davis, the Circle of Wise Women has become one of the most prominent supporters of Junior Achievement of South Florida. What began as 10 passionate women coming together to champion on the non-profit's mission of empowering young people has since grown exponentially.

Today, the Circle of Wise Women has 168 members and has raised more than \$5 million for Junior Achievement of South Florida through fundraising events such the Rosé Soirée and JA World Uncorked as well as created the Lorraine Thomas Girls Scholarship Fund.

Thanks to these fundraising events, Junior Achievement can continue to fund its 20 different educational programs and initiatives. With that, we take a deeper look into how the Circle of Wise Women directly supports children taking part in Junior Achievement programs.

#### JA World Uncorked

As far as fundraising for Junior Achievement goes, JA World Uncorked is by far its largest fundraising event of the year. An average of 700 guests sample the best cuisine, spirits and wine South Florida has to offer while also enjoying live

music, dancing, raffles, a silent auction and more. All of this takes place in Junior Achievement's 60,000 square foot facility aptly named JA World. This year's event that took place this past January raised \$345,000, which according to their website, is the highest amount raised in the history of the event. Proceeds raised from JA World Uncorked goes toward supporting JA educational programs.

#### Rosé Soirée

The Rosé Soirée fundraiser celebrates the power of women coming together to support the growth and development of young people in the community. Guests are invited to mingle while enjoying cocktails and hors d'oeuvres and learn more about the Circle of Wise Women and all that these women do in support of the youth taking part in JA's programs. The annual event also includes the Circle Pinning Ceremony for new members as well as the awarding of two well deserving female students with the Lorraine Thomas Girls Scholarship Fund. The 2023 Rosé Soirée raised \$220,000 and these proceeds will go toward JA programs including JA Career Bound and JA Fellows programs as well as the Lorraine Thomas Girls Scholarship Fund.

#### **Lorraine Thomas Girls Scholarship Fund**

Along with Junior Achievement's two annual fundraising events started by the Circle of Wise Women, the group found a way to directly impact two deserving students every year by awarding them with the Lorraine Thomas Girls Scholarship. Named in honor of the late founding member Lorraine Thomas, the scholarship provides financial assistance for female high school seniors who complete JA high school programs such as Career Bound and JA Fellows. The scholarship is presented at the Rosé Soirée fundraiser and this year's recipients were South Plantation High School student Alexandra Fernandez and Dillard High School student Taylor Simpson. With these scholarships, Alexandra plans to attend St. Thomas University to pursue a degree in criminal justice and Taylor will be attending University of Central Florida to study aerospace engineering.

"I take a week off of work just to help out for the week between the ball and the parade. You could basically say I work as my mom's event assistant and do whatever she needs me to," he said.

As for Keleher, he is truly a legacy volunteer with him taking on his first job at age 8.

"I remember one of my first jobs was to dress up as Peter Pan and pose with one of the board member's children who dressed up as Cinderella for the posters that year. Since then, my jobs have only gotten better," said Keleher. Over his 22 years of volunteering, Keleher has gone on to do everything from being the Winterfest mascot to a runner for his mom to ensure everything and everyone are where they need to be.

Today, Keleher is the head of the dock walkers and works with his team as the liaison for the boats, law enforcement and parade control.

"We are the eyes of parade control. We let out all the boats, tell them when to leave and we do boat staging which involves mapping out the order of the boats in the parade," Keleher said.

Even with the long hours spent volunteering to make each Winterfest a success, this event will always hold a special place in their lives.

"I think Winterfest will always be a part of my family and the way that we do things. I don't see it ever not being a part of my life and I plan to keep it a family tradition for years to come," Keleher said. ®






