



The New Year brings a great opportunity to make a difference. Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale enters the 36th year of serving Downtown and the Riverwalk District. We proudly participate with the City of Fort Lauderdale in activation, oversight and improvement of 10 parks and five greenspaces within the Riverwalk District. The New River is the catalyst for the initial decision to build the Riverwalk pedestrian walkway but as our Downtown has expanded so have the real estate and responsibilities of the organization.

We take pride in our partnership with the City as we work to find unique and fun ways to engage the public, use our park land for public purposes and enjoyment, assure that our walks and seawalls support our marine industry and confirm that there is adequate infrastructure.

Huizenga Park enters construction this year and upon completion will offer yet more amenities to the Downtown and our public. From a dog park, playground, bathrooms, restaurant and more – it is surely going to be a grand destination. Esplanade continues to be a well-loved and used location for special events including walk/runs, music festivals and more. The location of Esplanade draws together Riverwalk, Museum of Discovery and Science and Broward Center for the Performing Arts to collaborate on public projects. The property known as the One-Stop is under contract with the City to build and operate an entertainment venue and public park area that offer more amenities. Sistrunk Park is soon to be getting new exercise equipment and Feldman Park is in construction as we go to print but we are hopeful it will be back open and operating in the next few months.

Tunnel Top Park, the eastern end of Riverwalk, in conjunction with Riverwalk Plaza at Cheesecake Factory Riverwalk Laura Ward Plaza are open to the public and being enhanced to make for a great experience. In partnership with the City of Fort Lauderdale, Riverwalk, DDA, Fort Lauderdale Water Taxi, the Las Olas Company, the Las Olas Association and Stranahan House hosted a ribbon cutting and festival on all 3 plazas on Dec. 10 to celebrate the opening.

Hardy Park remains very active, and Smoker Park again is becoming more of a destination that ever before. Our Downtown residents and visitors love the Florida weather and the very cool experience of being able to walk and enjoy all kinds of passive and active opportunities Downtown.

We are proud of our city for promoting from within – we bring on the best, train them well and move them forward to reach their best potential.

Police Chief Bill Schultz

Chief Schultz has been a police officer with Fort Lauderdale Police Department since 2001. With a variety of experience, he has covered patrol, special operations, field training, public information and internal affairs. His most recent assignment was in the operations bureau service as the commander of the patrol bureau and the community support units.

During his tenure he has garnered 20 departmental commendations, 55 public commendations and one lifesaving award. Chief Schultz holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice administration with a minor in psychology as well as a master's degree with a tri-concentration in technology, communications and police staff and command from Eastern Michigan University. He is a recent graduate of the FBI National Academy and the Police Executive Research Forum Senior Management Institute for Police.

TOWN HALL MEETINGS

FROM INFRASTRUCTURE TO SAFETY, SHARE YOUR OPINION

ver the last several months, I have been collaborating with you, our neighbors, City leadership and staff to deliver and approve a \$1.07 billion dollar budget for fiscal year 2024.

I am pleased to report that within the budget, I rallied for our emergency services departments to receive additional personnel, both in the fire and police departments. The fire department will now include 10 new positions that will allow for three firefighters to respond to both fire and emergency medical service at the same time without jeopardizing safety and response times. In addition, there will be three new fire stations operating in District IV as well as an EMS station on Las Olas. Finally, Commission supported a new initiative for police officers to be trained as emergency medical technicians to render aid as quickly as possible for our residents, neighbors and visitors alike.

The police department will increase by 14 positions, which provides three positions to be assigned to the Homeless Outreach Team (HOT). In addition to the increased homeless outreach, as of June 2023 the City has committed \$6.3 million in state and federal funding to address homelessness through various programs, including rapid rehousing, rental assistance and case management services to provide holistic support to help individuals gain employment. The City is also supporting continued services to assist individuals at risk of becoming homeless, such as seniors aged 62 and older and youth aged out of the foster care system.

On Oct. 23, City staff and I hosted an infrastructure town hall meeting where we presented the progress the City is making in District IV. I am very excited about the great strides we have made as a city with our infrastructure. During this meeting, staff announced they have launched Fortify Lauderdale. Over the next decade, Fortify Lauderdale will invest up to a half-billion dollars in stormwater infrastructure construction in multiple neighborhoods. Fortify Lauderdale will be in addition to the extensive work already underway in which we are investing \$200 million in eight neighborhoods to address tidal flooding and stormwater runoff.

Listening to the concerns of District IV regarding the process for allowing Public Private Partnerships (P3), I initiated the discussion with the city attorney to develop a draft ordinance addressing P3's within Fort Lauderdale. Public-private partnerships are agreements between public and private entities to allow for greater private sector participation in the delivery and financing of public building and infrastructure projects. In addition, I have requested that any comprehensive agreement that is presented to the City Commission is done so by two public hearings to allow for sufficient public participation. The City Commission will review the draft ordinance and recommendations from the Council of Fort Lauderdale Civic Associations, provide feedback to the city manager and the city attorney for incorporation into the draft ordinance. In addition, I am requesting your feedback to be considered and included in the P3 ordinance. Your opinion and participation matters!

As we move into the new year, I look forward to setting the goals for our city at the Commission Prioritization Workshop on Jan. 18. Each January, the City Commission sets its priorities for the upcoming year. These priorities are then voted on at a future commission meeting. As these priorities have major influence over the city's budget, I am asking you to please get involved. In January, I will be hosting a district town hall meeting to gather feedback from the community. What priorities would you like me to advocate on your behalf?

YEAR IN REVIEW

LOOKING BACK AT ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF 2023

s we start yet another year, it is a great time to reflect on last year and look ahead to what is in store for the new year. It is also an opportunity to be grateful for what we've accomplished and look to identify ways to make next year even better and to keep the great momentum moving forward.

We have been able to accomplish amazing improvements to our transportation system together under the direction of our Commission and in partnership with the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization, Florida Department of Transportation and Broward County over the last year. These projects assist in moving forward toward the Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2035 Vision that established the goal of creating a connected transportation network for all modes.

Over the past year I have shared a wide range of the type of work we do here at the Transportation and Mobility Department to move toward that vision every day, including projects involving transit, parking, sidewalk, traffic signals, bike lanes, both by the city and partners, however there is much more as well.

Although it is usually never as quickly as anyone would like, we continue to be persistent in advocating for ways



to realize the vision of a more connected transportation network that is more efficient and safer.

The following are some of the key accomplishments from the past year that were highlighted in my look ahead last January:

- Implemented projects including traffic calming along Bass Park and began construction on streetscape improvements on Northeast Fourth Avenue north of Sunrise Boulevard to expand on the previous complete streets project.
- Began the Sidewalk Master Plan.
- Completed the design of Riverland Road traffic calming measures.
- Implement signal improvements based on technology.
- Hired consultants to begin the design of the Las Olas Concept Plan.
- Began design on Sunrise Lane Streetscape improvements.
- Completed the design of the wayfinding signage program in central beach area.
- Completed the Tunnel Top Plaza project.
- Began the design of the first two segment of the LauderTrail Commission Priority.
- Implemented parking facility improvements with more in progress.

Over the past year we have also added extra focus on working with neighborhood associations on quality-oflife and safety issues within the neighborhoods including identifying maintenance needs like pavement markings and signage, line of sight issues, signal timing improvements and needed traffic calming. We have had great success in making a difference neighborhood wide and look forward to continuing this effort into the new year.

The following is a glance at what's on the horizon for next year based on the Commission's priorities and approved budget:

- Completing the construction of Northeast Fourth Avenue streetscape project.
- Completing the Sidewalk Master Plan.
- Installation of the beach wayfinding project.
- Continue to leverage grant funding to implement transportation goals.
- Increase micro-mobility options.
- Continue to advocate for enhancements to improve the ability of people to move throughout the City.
- Continue to advocate to our partners to improve traffic congestion along major corridors.
- Complete the design of the first phases of LauderTrail.
- Continue to advocate for grant funding to complete transportation projects.





Spend any time on or near Fort Lauderdale waterways and no doubt a streamlined sportfishing boat or stately superyacht has caught your eye. Beyond the stunning lines of these vessels, their transoms are often what garners attention. Stylized boat names glittering in goldleaf under the Florida sun, colorful designs featuring prized marlins and other artistic flourishes are all on full display – sometimes all on the same boat.

Chances are, these eye-catching transom masterpieces are the results of one woman – Fort Lauderdale artist and native Monique Richter. She's known worldwide in boating circles for two things – her unmatched talent at creating hyper-realistic faux teak finishes and using gold and platinum leaf to turn boat names into stylish works of art that harken back to a bygone era.



The foundation for Richter's career as arguably the most sought-after boat artist in the world began at a young age. At just two years old, Richter's mom handed her paintbrushes and began teaching her the painting techniques that would serve Richter so well in subsequent years.

Richter painted throughout high school and college, mostly canvases and murals featuring her signature vibrant color palette and favorite subjects — sunsets, salt water and sea life. She began selling her art, often at venues on Las Olas, sometimes commissioned for projects to adorn the walls of businesses and private homes in the area.

She's always painted, but her budding art career eventually took a backseat to other pursuits. She enjoyed a long, successful pro wakeboarding career until a broken toe sidelined her ambitions. She went on to earn her captain's license and helm large boats for private clients throughout the Caribbean. It was on one such excursion to the Bahamas when a chance sighting of a passing boat with a faux teak transom paint job reignited her artistic passion. She was so motivated by the possibilities of what she saw that she handed in her resignation notice and charted a new career course.

Richter returned to Fort Lauderdale, convinced she could master the faux teak painting technique and turn her love of fine art into her career. She reached out to boat building legend Roy Merritt who, after seeing her early faux teak work samples, realized her potential. He teamed her up with his woodworkers, and Richter focused on refining her technique to achieve ultra-realistic results. It wasn't long before she was regularly applying her faux teak artistry to the transoms of Merritt sportfishing yachts.

Once she mastered faux teak, she realized the age-old technique of using gold leaf to craft boat name lettering was a natural complement to her painted backdrops. She learned the craft from Fort Lauderdale-based John Teeto, widely considered one of the best gold leaf artists in the world. He helped her refine her approach, and today Richter is also recognized as a master at gold and platinum leaf application.

Her work soon caught the eye of other boat builders, along with well-heeled private boat owners. She quickly became the boat artist everyone wanted, and her schedule quickly filled.

Her energetic personality and ability to manage a sevenday workweek saw her flying around the world to add artistic flourish to boats owned by celebrities, singers, athletes and other high-profile customers. These customers, impressed with her precision and work ethic, recruited her to also adorn their planes and homes with her signature style.

DOES MY HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION AUTOMATICALLY RENEW?

fter your initial application for Homestead Exemption has been approved, it automatically renews each year unless there is a change of ownership or eligible use of your homesteaded property. Each January, our office mails a Homestead Renewal Notice and "Change Card" to all homesteaded properties. Florida law requires the property owner to notify the property appraiser of any change which may affect homestead eligibility. This Change Order Card provides an efficient way to communicate these important changes to our office.

If there are NO changes to the use and/or ownership of your property, simply keep the card as your receipt verifying that your Homestead Exemption has automatically renewed for another year. However, if there are changes, please mark the Change Card accordingly and return it to our office.

If your name is not printed above the mailing address section on this card, it means you are not protected by Homestead Exemption at this property. You may be on title to the property, but you are not receiving Homestead Exemption. If you are eligible for Homestead Exemption on this property, you must complete your own Homestead Exemption application. You can apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/ HomesteadExemption If you are a co-owner, surviving spouse, trust beneficiary or otherwise believe you are eligible for this exemption, you must file your own Homestead Exemption application to receive the benefit. If you have any questions relating to the death of the owner, the Change Card or need assistance in filing for Homestead or other tax-saving exemptions, please visit our website at web.bcpa.net or contact our Customer Service Department at (954) 357-6830.

Where did my portability savings go?

A portability deduction is only posted to your property record page in the first year you receive your new Homestead Exemption. The portability savings from the first year form the basis of your new Save Our Homes value on a going forward basis and — in subsequent years — will rise or fall based upon market just value changes and the 3 percent cap, as your new Save Our Homes value has incorporated your portability savings. When our website is updated to display subsequent year property values, your portability deduction is no longer shown independently because it is already factored into your new Assessed/Save Our Homes value.

FORT LAUDERDALE ARTIST RESIDENCIES

ORGANIZATIONS CULTIVATE SPACES FOR ARTISTS TO CREATE

verywhere you look in Fort Lauderdale, art can be found. Whether that is visual art displayed in galleries and museums or performance art that can be seen in theaters and music halls. However, even for the most successful and prolific artists, a place to create and showcase their art is hard to come by. Studio and rehearsal spaces can be expensive to rent or are simply not readily available.

With that, a few organizations have taken it upon themselves to offer artists in need residencies within their spaces to create, display and in some cases perform their art for their audiences.

Las Olas Capital Arts

Las Olas Capital Arts is a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting the arts in the Fort Lauderdale community.

"When my husband and I opened Las Olas Capital Advisors which is our wealth management firm, I wanted to give back to the community in some way, but more specifically the arts community which I am so passionate about," said Jodi Tanner, Las Olas Capital Arts founder and curator.

"So, I decided to open Las Olas Capital Arts and it's our program where I can support, promote and exhibit local and emerging artists at my space here on Las Olas," she said.

Through their residency program, an artist is selected from their pool of possible candidates. Once chosen, the artist's work will be on display and for sale at the Las Olas

Capital Advisors office space for four months. At the end of the four months, Las Olas Capital Arts holds an artist's reception and the artist receives 100 percent of the proceeds from any pieces sold.

Their current artist in residence is Lori Pratico, who is a painter and muralist whose preferred medium is acrylics although she has also produced work on graphite and pastels for some of her older collections.

"We've been doing this for about nine years now and we've had 21 solo artist exhibits. It's something I'm so proud of because we are not only able to support and promote an artist's business, but we help them engage more with the community as well," she said.

Broward Cultural Division

The Broward Cultural Division advances arts and culture locally by investing in the creative sector and providing capacity-building opportunities for those in the art community. Through various grant programs, they can support eligible artists, nonprofit organizations and municipalities to promote the sustainability and development of the arts and culture in Broward County.

Recently, the Broward Cultural Division created the Artist Innovation Grant, in collaboration with the Community Foundation, to provide professional and established artists of all disciplines the opportunity to create new and experimental art projects in public spaces throughout Fort Lauderdale.

"This idea spawned when FatVillage went under construction which meant a lot of artists were being displaced," said Erica Mohan, former contact grant administrator for the Broward Cultural Division.

"But even before that, studio spaces in Broward are always scarce. So, the idea came to me of creating an artist residency program where artists could use unused government spaces to create and display their work."

Their first resident artist, Pablo Matute and his art, can be seen on display at the Broward County Library. "Pablo is the first artist for our residency at the main library and he has three and a half months to work and exhibit in the space and he is currently creating a whole new art installation using palm leaves," she said. For their pilot year of the program, 10 individual artists have received funding to produce projects now through Sept. 30.

Destination Sistrunk Cultural Center

To create more opportunities for the exploration of Black culture and heritage throughout Broward County, the nonprofit organization Destination Sistrunk Cultural and Community Investment Partnership joined the Broward County Cultural Division to establish the Destination Sistrunk Cultural Center.

"In my role as the director of community engagement at the cultural division, I oversee our initiatives in arts education and cultural heritage," said Grace Kewl, Destination Sistrunk program director.

"With that, we created Destination Sistrunk to serve as our flagship cultural heritage initiative to advance arts and culture, historic preservation and tourism in historically Black neighborhoods along with the hope of fostering

similar kinds of initiatives in other neighborhoods."

Today, the cultural center offers artist residency programs for individuals, businesses and organizations whose work aligns with the mission and purpose of the program area.

With a focus on music, performing arts and fashion, some of their residency programs include the Songfest Industry



Program, the Spoken is the Word Music Industry Program and the Sistrunk Fashion Program. "We have



a strong focus on fashion, music and the performing arts because it's more common to have visual arts spaces than spaces dedicated to performing arts. Performing artists simply require more space to cultivate their craft so we created this location for artists to use before they grow, refine

and comfortably move to perform in larger performance spaces," Kewel said.

ANIMAL ARTISTS

MODS OTTERS FIND ENRICHMENT THROUGH PAINTING

• he Museum of Discovery and Science is home to some of the most unique artists that can be found in Fort Lauderdale — their resident otters.

"Since our North American river otters are small mammals, they are wild animals, but they are also intelligent to the extent that they need behavioral enrichment," said Dane Tullock, MODS director of life sciences. "We offer them this kind of enrichment in a few different ways including creating a diverse behavioral environment for them to live in that replicates a Central Florida estuarine environment.

"One of the more fun enrichment activities we do with the otters that guests can be a part of is our otter painting."

The paintings are created by using nontoxic paint which the otters are encouraged to walk through and then over the canvases. The creations are sold in the MODS gift shop.

"I like to call it abstract art because the otters create shapes and splotches with their footprints. Once they're finished, we stamp the back of the paintings and sign the name of the otter who painted it so the guests can know exactly which otter made it. It's kind of a cool way to give interactive enrichment to our animals, but also provide a product for our guests," Tullock said.

Currently, MODS has two otters in residence, Peach, 6,

and Toosie, 2, who also happen to be mother and daughter. "They came to

us in October of this year from our sister facility



in Flamingo Gardens. Most otters will live in the wild between eight and 12 years, but we have a long history with our otters living into their 20s. So, we got Peach and Toosie in exchange for our previous otter, Joey, so he could live out his twilight years in Flamingo Gardens," he said.

MODS guests can get involved with the otters through the museum's Breakfast with the Otters program. In addition to a catered breakfast, the event features an otter talk, an outdoor training session, activity tables for guests to create a group enrichment item for the otters to enjoy and a special guest appearance by their resident otters.

Everyone who participates in the Breakfast with the Otters goes home with an original otter painting.

"It allows guests to learn more and get a deeper understanding of the otters. We have an animal husbandry specialist who does a presentation and then we also

demonstrate how we feed and train the otters," Tullock said. ⁽¹⁾




