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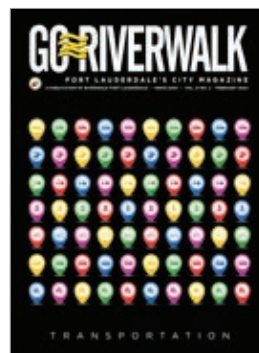

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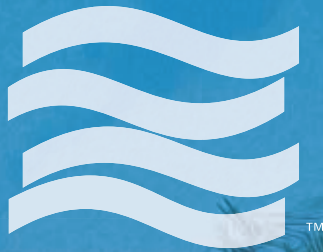

It is rewarding to see City staff encourage the City government to utilize their power to assure that our Downtown is pedestrian-friendly, with adequate shade and opportunities for a variety of things to do and is a destination for tourists as well.

REMEMBERING A COMMUNITY LEADER WITH THE MOST GENEROUS SPIRIT

Renée Korbel Quinn has served Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale Inc. since 2004 in a variety of volunteer and board positions.

Her legacy with Riverwalk includes formation of the GClub (a garden group) which applied for grant funding to install 25 decorative granite planters on Riverwalk that to this day spill over with lush tropical flowers and trees. She also was a part of the Tree Harmony Program on Riverwalk which provides more arbor coverage to the pedestrian walkways.

In 2010, she partnered with Courtney Crush and myself to secure the only annual event agreement with the City of Fort Lauderdale, which allowed for enhanced activation within the Riverwalk District. She served on the special events committee at Riverwalk, served as a board member and chair and performed the role of acting president during a major transition.

With her passion for culinary delights and crafted cocktails, Renée was a featured writer in GoRiverwalk writing the Bites & Sips column.

As a long-standing member of Riverwalk, we would be remiss if we did not mention a few of the other organizations that had the pleasure of her

expertise. Renée served on the executive committee of Winterfest and was a member of the Circle of Wise Women of Junior Achievement. She also participated in the Opera Society, Symphony of Americas, Special Olympics, Glam-A-Thon, Jessica June Children’s Cancer Foundation, Salvation Army Advisory Council, and many more. She was the recipient of countless awards, some of which were Riverwalk Tribute honoree, Winterfest Belle of the Ball, Glammy Award, and Diva & Diamonds Award, to just name a few.

Renée was incredibly successful at fundraising for the charities she was passionate about, and recently she partnered to form an event known as Positively Pink which raises funds for cancer patients.

Known as the CocktailR to some and as Spirited South Florida to others, Renée’s generous spirit and ability to master any task she took on added to her unique character.

Her legacy will continue and she will be remembered for her boots, hats, glasses, smile and social media connections that allowed her to confirm her role: “Conceive, Connect and Create.”

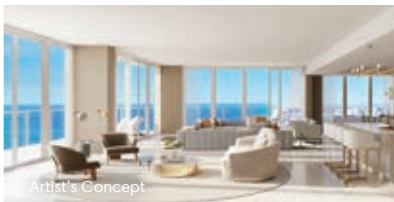

CROSSING A RIVER

A MONUMENTAL DECISION THAT WILL SHAPE THE FUTURE OF DOWNTOWN

Fort Lauderdale is not giving up on its quest to ensure that our world-class Downtown is not marred permanently by the construction of a high-rise train bridge.

While the Broward County Commission is moving to formally pursue construction of the bridge, the City is working with internationally recognized consultants. They have been analyzing the viability of building a tunnel and expect to have a report ready within a month.

Their initial research shows that a tunnel under the New River can be built much cheaper than the county claims. The consulting team is also investigating whether the County underestimated key costs of a bridge – particularly acquiring right-of-way from adjacent landowners.

The crossing of the New River is key to regional plans for commuter rail service between Miami and West Palm Beach. And, the County is anxious to move forward because we are approaching a new round of federal infrastructure funding that can help pay for construction.

But this is a monumental decision that will shape the future of Downtown for the next century. It should not be made without all the facts and certainly not without a complete and thorough exploration of all options.

Key Fort Lauderdale neighborhood associations and business leaders have long agreed with us in this regard and have favored a tunnel. They include the Broward Workshop, the Downtown Development Authority, the Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce and the Downtown Civic Association.

Even the U.S. Department of Transportation understands the seriousness of the matter and what is at stake. They awarded Fort Lauderdale a \$1 million grant last fall to undertake the review now underway.

Consider how far we've come through the efforts of the city.

We have already convinced the Florida Department of Transportation that a tunnel could be built for half as much as they initially believed. When the County continued to recite outdated mantras about financing a river crossing, we discovered new pots of federal assistance created through President Biden's infrastructure initiative and found willing partners in the U.S. government to assist us.

We have brought together for the first time high-level representatives of Brightline, Florida East Coast Railroad Industries and their parent company Fortress to work with our experts on how to build a tunnel at a reasonable price.

These are remarkable developments that show our efforts are beginning to bear fruit.

The County has conducted the most rudimentary analysis of its new idea of a 40-foot bridge. County commissioners



need a full-scale review of this plan before a decision is made.

The public needs to know where the bridge would start on the northern and southern ends and what roads would be closed. We need to see renderings and maps.

For instance, what will the city's prized historic district look like? It would live in the shadow and noise of a bridge. Imagine a retaining wall mere feet from these historic buildings or piers supporting a viaduct cantilevering overhead.

Also, any bridge requires major acquisition between Broward Boulevard and Southwest Sixth Street at the very least. This would impact not only the historic district but also an area undergoing rapid redevelopment that includes the Marina Lofts, Nautica and River Lofts projects.

The County may have to seize such property through eminent domain involving years of court fights. That's exactly what happened when the County expanded the international airport in the mid-1990s. They spent enormous amounts of money on legal fees, property experts and acquisition costs.

I urge concerned residents and businesses to once again rally together on this.

Ultimately, if there is not consensus, this project is doomed to fail.

The Biden administration and Congress are not going to help pay for a project that is subject to deep community divisions. How can there be consensus when essential studies have yet to be completed and discussed in community meetings? How can there be consensus when there is so little information about the county's planned direction?

Fort Lauderdale deserves better. Broward County deserves better. And, my friends, you deserve better.

MICRO MOVER

EVOLUTION FROM A PILOT TO A PERMANENT SERVICE IN THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE

In the ever changing and evolving landscape of urban transportation services, the City of Fort Lauderdale is advancing its Micro Mover on demand service. The Micro Mover, which started out as a pilot program, is now being solidified in the city's transit infrastructure.

The service took a monumental leap forward last month with the introduction of additional vehicles scaling up the fleet to accommodate up to 20 vehicles and receiving

substantial backing as part of the fiscal year 2024 budget. This expansion in funding will offer more services to residents and visitors by extending service hours, providing more flexibility and accessibility to the city's residents and visitors. The micro mover is set to play a more significant role in catering to the communities' transit needs with these augmentations.

The City Commissioner's commitment to advancing this service is evident in the increase in the operating budget with the budget now standing at \$1,750,000. This funding represents a remarkable surge from the pilot program's funding in the previous fiscal year. This financial boost highlights the City's confidence in the Micro Mover's efficacy and its significance in the transportation network.

The collaborative effort between the City of Fort Lauderdale and Circuit, the service provider, has been instrumental in steering the micro mover service toward permanency while maintaining the city's commitment to keeping the service free of charge for the community.

Beyond the city's operating budget for transportation services, efforts persist to leverage existing grant funding for micro transit services. The city is working collaboratively with the Florida Department of Transportation with the goal of offering similar Micro Mover transit services particularly in the northwest community with this pilot existing for multiple years. Moreover, the City is consistently looking for new opportunities to expand and enhance on-demand and fixed route transit services.

The transformation of the micro mover service from a tentative trial to a fully funded and expanded service signifies the City of Fort Lauderdale's commitment to accessible innovative transportation options. As it continues to evolve and adapt to the communities' needs the Micro Mover stands as a testament to the City's dedication to progressive and efficient transit services.

The City continues to pursue efforts to enhance the transportation options for residents and visitors either through expanding the services we finance or leveraging available funding from Broward County and the state to create a transportation system that keeps our residents and visitors on the move. ANNUALLY, ARTS BRING IN MORE THAN \$386M TO OUR LOCAL ECONOMY

Over the past year and a half, the Cultural Division and the City of Fort Lauderdale participated in a national Arts and Economic Prosperity study (AEP6), led by the non-profit organization, Americans for the Arts.

One of AEP6’s key takeaways is that our cultural sector contributed a whopping \$386 million in economic impact to Broward County in 2022, which in turn, supported 6,718 full and part-time jobs.

The AEP6 findings underscored the strong demand for arts and culture experiences. Attendance numbers at Broward’s arts organizations topped 5.8 million people during that single year. These culture consumers spent an average of \$41.74 per person, per event (on top of the price of a ticket).

Across the board, it’s clear that Broward’s cultural sector generates significant amounts of event-related spending by audiences. If you think about your own

attendance habits at cultural events, it’s likely you often spend money on parking, dinner, drinks or perhaps even a new outfit. All of this spending helps fuel our local economy.

In short, the arts are not only a fundamental part of our cultural identity, but also a key driving force behind our community’s growth and prosperity.

We look forward to seeing this positive economic impact continue as we move into the future. With more people moving to our community, there are more and more expectations of world-class arts and culture experiences. To ensure our cultural sector remains vibrant and poised for growth, we should focus on strategies that promote the robust development of our artists and our arts and culture organizations. The future is bright and the state of our arts is strong!

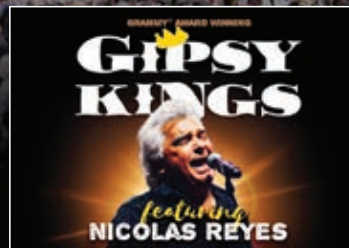

prosper and scale and currently have nearly 20 enrolled.

Broward UP (unlimited potential) is a program at Broward College that has 30-plus partners serving more than 5,000 residents since its inception in 2018. The free training courses for qualified residents has created over 2,550 workforce ready job seekers.

Our Racial Equity Council, chaired this year by John Jones, Calvary Chapel Fort Lauderdale, has been reviewing ways to identify capital flows or more importantly, where it is not flowing. We know that access to capital is critical for the success of a business, hence the review.

The Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance has included in its Prosperity Partnership two pillars specifically addressing these needs called, economic mobility and social justice and racial equity. Both pillars are capably led by business leaders and have significant agendas that should make a difference. You can find out more at www.theprosperitypartnership.org.

It will take all of our efforts to raise third grade reading scores which currently is a measly 53 percent. That means 8,997 students are not reading at grade level. Couple that with a declining high school graduation rate currently at 87.2 percent and you can see why the business community needs to engage. You can join Reading Pals through United Way of Broward County to assist.

We can help and be part of the solution by rolling up your sleeves and getting involved.

Be part of one of the business community's partnerships. Hire an underserved individuals and train them with new skills. Be a mentor, Big Brother or Big Sister. Help build a home with Habitat for Humanity. Give to the Community Foundation of Broward County. Do something.

INNOVATIVE WAYS TO GET AROUND FORT LAUDERDALE

Fort Lauderdale is an attractive destination thanks to our wonderful climate and myriad recreational opportunities. Whether you live here, work downtown or visit to attend a special event, Fort Lauderdale is an undeniably great place to be.

And, thanks to our forward-thinking local government, getting around our popular city is as easy as a day at one of our beautiful beaches. An interconnected network of public transportation options, some at no cost to users, invite residents and visitors alike to relax and leave the driving to someone else.

One of these innovative solutions is Fort Lauderdale’s Water Taxi. With more than 165 miles of local waterways, leveraging that resource to move people around town and beyond makes sense. And Water Taxi does it in spades. The fleet of bright yellow vessels is hard to miss. You’ll find them coming and going across ten stops in Fort Lauderdale every 30 minutes, seven days a week.

Water Taxi President Bill Walker noted the service saw unprecedented double-digit growth last year, thanks to a booming local hospitality industry and local riders. In spring 2023, ridership topped 80,000 in a single month. By the end of the year, Water Taxi had moved 1.2 million people around town.

Water Taxi is more than just a convenient way to get from point A to B. Knowledgeable captains and crew offer a narrated glimpse into Fort Lauderdale history, including famous residences and noteworthy yachts dotting the city’s shorelines.

As one Fort Lauderdale resident says, “I love taking visiting family and friends on the water taxi. The views of all the fancy mansions are incredible, and you can pop on and off as often as you like for a drink, meal, or shopping.”

Water Taxi also plays an important role during events like FLIBS. Special water taxi routes move attendees across all seven show locations. Visitors can park once at the Broward County Convention Center, then ride the water taxi the rest of the day.

For those who prefer to take the Brightline in, another public transportation service is available to help get around town. Circuit is fleet of all-electric vehicles includes GEMs (enclosed golf-cart type vehicles), plus EV sedans and EV vans. Circuit is a complimentary, on-demand rideshare service sponsored by the City of Fort Lauderdale.

Like other ridesharing services, riders download the Circuit app to their smart device and make a ride request. Unlike other services, Circuit drivers are full-time employees and all local to the Fort Lauderdale area. Once a request is received, a vehicle is dispatched and takes the rider wherever they want to go in the Fort Lauderdale service area – at no cost to the rider.

Beyond servicing the Brightline stations, Circuit transportation is available to anyone within the Fort Lauderdale service area.

“It’s a great reason not to have a car,” said Jason Bagley, vice president of strategic growth, SE at Circuit. “Whether you live here or fly in for an event or vacation, you can use Circuit to get to all the main points of interest.” Bagley noted that Circuit ridership averages about 20,000 passengers each month. As Circuit’s electric vehicle fleet grows, he anticipates a correlating growth in ridership, too.

Circuit partners closely with Water Taxi year-round to provide guests a seamless experience from the Brightline station to the city’s waterways and waterfront establishments. This is especially helpful during FLIBS, since it allows attendees to skip the drive altogether and take the train instead.

Circuit, headquartered in Fort Lauderdale, started as a pilot program with the city. After a successful roll out, today Circuit is a permanent partner to provide alternative transportation in Fort Lauderdale. Beyond Fort Lauderdale, you can also find Circuit in more than 40 markets across the United States.

UPDATES TO THIS EXEMPTION

AUTOMATIC RENEWAL FOR THE LIMITED-INCOME SENIOR EXEMPTION

A change in the Limited-Income Senior Exemption renewal process no longer requires seniors to sign and return a renewal card.

After the initial application approval, the Senior Exemption automatically renews each year unless the senior notifies our office that they exceed the income requirement for this exemption. People who received the Senior Exemption in 2023 and are still living at the same address do not need to send in a signed renewal card to continue receiving this exemption.

Our office will mail the 2024 Senior Exemption income limit information later this month as set by the state of Florida.

- **If your 2023 adjusted household gross income *did not* exceed \$36,614 as set by the state for the 2024 tax year**, you DO NOT need to do anything to continue receiving this valuable exemption for 2024. Your

exemption will automatically be renewed provided you are still living at the same address and receiving Homestead Exemption.

- **If your 2023 adjusted household gross income *did* exceed \$36,614**, you must notify our office that you no longer qualify for this tax year when you receive the annual income notification from our office.

If you did not receive the Senior Exemption for 2023 and you believe you may qualify, please visit our website at web.bcpa.net and click on the “Senior Exemption” icon to view this exemption and all the other available exemptions. You can also apply online at <https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/SeniorExemption>. The deadline to apply for any 2024 exemption is Sept. 8, 2024.

Getting around a huge metropolitan city like Fort Lauderdale has never been easier with such a wide range of transportation options available. From rideshare and rental services like Circuit and BCycle to hop-on-and-off options like the LauderGo Community Shuttle and the Water Taxi, there are a variety of ways to get around town for every type of traveler, regardless of the distance or destination.

Circuit

Rideshare apps have completely changed the way we get around town. However, with rideshare services like Circuit, travelers now have an option for shorter-distance trips around downtown Fort Lauderdale. Circuit is a free micro-transit solution that uses fleets of small, open-air electric vehicles to get travelers to and from their destinations which are only a short distance away. Circuit is the perfect option for those one-to-two-mile trips to places like the Brightline Station, Las Olas Boulevard, the beach, hotels, restaurants, shops and more. Currently available in the downtown and northwest areas of Fort Lauderdale, more locations will be added soon.

Water Taxi and free LauderGo! Water Trolley

If you can't traverse Fort Lauderdale by land, why not by sea? The Water Taxi is one of the longest-running and most unique transportation systems in Fort Lauderdale. The Water Taxi offers 10 different stops on their Fort Lauderdale Route where travelers can hop on or off.

Aside from being a great way to get around town, however, The Water Taxi also doubles as a sightseeing excursion with each captain providing a detailed history of the river and sights along the way.

The free LauderGo! Water Trolley, sponsored by the City of Fort Lauderdale, stops at eight spots in Downtown Fort Lauderdale each day from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

LauderGo Community Shuttle

The LauderGo Community Shuttle is another free and convenient transportation option for Fort Lauderdale residents and visitors. Formerly known as the Sun Trolley, the community shuttle offers five routes that cover areas the larger Broward County Transit buses are unable to serve. As for catching the shuttle at one of its many stops, passengers can track its route on the LauderGo Tracker mobile app which can be accessed from a phone or computer. From there, you can hop on and off the shuttle at any one of their many stops and make your way to your destination.

BCycle

Bike sharing has become an increasingly popular way to get around cities and Fort Lauderdale is no different. BCycle has taken the city by storm offering electric bike rentals as an alternative way to get around town. BCycle bikes are an economical and convenient transportation alternative for trips that are either too far to walk or too short to drive. Just sign up for one of their three membership options, choose a bike from any B-station and go. Plus, BCycles are designed for both the rider and the city with automatic lights, a front basket and an adjustable seat post.

TOPS Broward County Transit

Broward County Transit is Fort Lauderdale's bus system available for people traveling throughout the city but especially for those with disabilities. Their paratransit service, TOPS, is a shared-ride program designed specifically for people with physical, cognitive, emotional, visual, or other disabilities who cannot travel on the fixed-route bus service. With TOPS, the estimated travel time is about the same and costs \$3.50 one way, in exact change. Also, for those in need of extra time or support, a reservation can be made by contacting the TOPS call center one to three days in advance between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Aside from experiencing all that Fort Lauderdale's scenic nature trails have to offer, the city is also well known for its historical significance. With the mobile app, Florida Stories, tourists and locals can experience Fort Lauderdale in a brand new way. Developed and sponsored by the Florida Humanities Council, Florida Stories' walking tours allow you to go behind the scenes and learn more about Fort Lauderdale's history, culture, and architecture. Through the app, you can go on a guided GPS-enabled walking tour that includes audio narration and photos at each tour stop.

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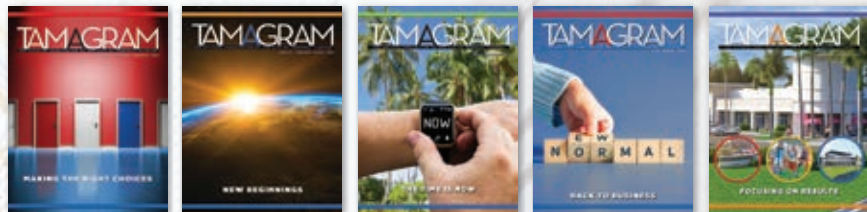
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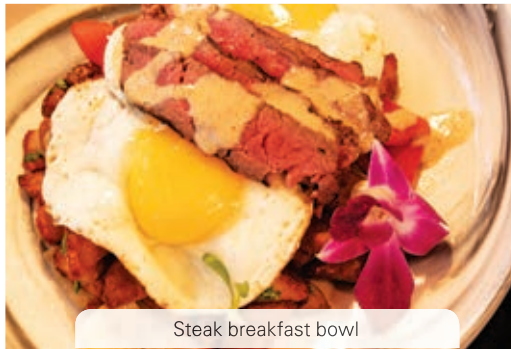
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THE HOUSE ON THE RIVER

A CONVERSATION WITH CHEF AEDIAN REID

Open since May, the historic House on the River infuses tradition with unique twists on its menu. Renovated by Society 8 Hospitality, the revitalized restaurant graces the Riverwalk with a historic spot to dine.

Chef Aedian Reid joined the House on the River just before the restaurant opened, so he has been there for just over a year. Reid grew up learning from two family cooks and bakers, his mother, Kurlene Young, and his grandmother, Inez Richards. The chef continues to draw culinary inspiration from his mother, who farms two acres in Loxahatchee with fruits, vegetables and more than 18 varieties of mangoes.

Now that the restaurant has been open for several months, we wanted to find out more about Chef Reid.

How do you go about choosing menu items?

How often does the menu change?

Most of the menu items — current and future) come from the owner's vision — Steven D'Apuzzo). He will bring suggestions to me about certain items that can be added to the menu, and from there, I come to the conclusion of what is executable, or the best way to prepare and execute in the kitchen. Aside from that, I also come up with ideas that I can "bring to the table," so to speak, that I feel can enhance the quality of our guests' dining experiences.

How does the historic atmosphere of the building infuse your menu and/or your cooking style?

Being that The House is more than 120 years old, I tend to take a more traditional approach with cooking. One thing I pride myself on is that there is no smoke and mirrors when it comes to the menu. The menu is simply driven by my passion and culinary techniques.



In one or two words, how would you describe yourself as a chef?

Dedicated

What led you to this career?

Literally growing up in a kitchen and seeing how food has a way of bringing joy to people.

How old were you when you started cooking and who first inspired you?

I started cooking around 7 or 8 years old — as soon as I could reach the stove. My inspiration and passion for cooking comes from being around my mother and grandmother.

Who inspires you now?

My current inspiration comes from the guests and making sure they leave having had a great flavor-driven experience. Most of the menu items are traditional dishes with unique spins I've added to them so they have different flavors and blends of foods than what they've had elsewhere.

What is your signature dish?

Pita-Crusted Salmon

What is your favorite dish to make at home?

Jerk Chicken

Which kitchen tools are must-haves in your home kitchen?

My No. 1 must-have item is a sharp knife, closely followed by a quality cutting board.

Pita Crusted Salmon – Parmigiana, arugula, couscous, dill, yogurt and cucumber

Short Rib – Braised short rib, chianti gravy, orange zest and garlic whipped potato

Shrimp and Crab Squid Ink Tagliatelle – Roasted tomato and garlic cream sauce

Herb Crusted Lamb Chops – Mint chimichurri and smashed potato
