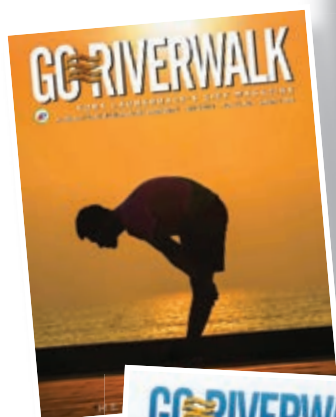

SUNRISE TO SUNSET

I hope that with the coming of May and the gradual departure of our seasonal visitors, all of our readers and supporters will have some time to appreciate our amazing city in the coming months. We all see how these visitors come back year after year to experience the many joys of Fort Lauderdale — our beaches and our Riverwalk — yet we sometimes forget to make time to enjoy all that our great community has to offer. Here are some thoughts on how to experience some of those signature Fort Lauderdale moments this summer.

There's nothing as iconic (and as easy to miss) as sunrise at Fort Lauderdale Beach. After enjoying sunrise, hopefully with your feet in the sand, you can enjoy coffee and a pastry at a lovely North Beach Village bakery, or grab a relaxed breakfast at one of our many beach eateries and watch the beach come to life. While you are there, think about stopping by our iconic Bonnet House or Hugh Taylor Birch State Park; both are oases of nature nestled in the heart of the beach.

Whether you take an invigorating walk, enjoy a breezy cruise on the Water Taxi, or opt to save time by driving, your next stop is Las Olas and a leisurely stroll through the shops and galleries, eyeing a new piece of art or something to wear. Las Olas has a quieter bustle in the summer months, but it never stops humming with the excitement and energy that draw droves of visitors here annually.

For lunch, it's a coin toss between finding a spot to watch the boat traffic on the New River or the pedestrians on Las Olas (and if you wait until later in the year for your Fort Lauderdale adventure, two new restaurants are anticipated to open on the Riverwalk in fall 2026). You can grab a sandwich from one of the many cafes and sit on a bench, or enjoy a leisurely lunch in one of our many dynamite eateries before continuing westward.

The Riverwalk is the perfect way to experience Fort Lauderdale's world-class culture. Whether walking or riding on the free Water Trolley, spend the afternoon on the New River. Stop in for a pint at Tarpon River Brewing or grab a coffee and pastry at The House on the River and just relax. If you feel like touring one of our many museums, you can get a glimpse into what life was like for the first residents at the Stranahan House or History Fort Lauderdale. NSU Art Museum and the Museum of Discovery and Science are home to top-notch exhibitions, comparable to those in larger cities.


For sunset, bring it back to the beach. Whether at Coconuts, the Pier Top Lounge at Pier 66, or another special vantage point, take advantage of those westerly views over the Intracoastal, downtown, and the Riverwalk—all the way to the Everglades—that make Fort Lauderdale such a special place to live, work and play.

HONORING THROUGH DESIGN

BIBI & KIM BUILDS A BRAND INSPIRED BY THE OWNER'S MOTHER

Beautiful and high-quality materials typically come with a steep price tag. But Kim Khan, owner of Bibi & Kim, sought to create a jewelry brand that offers timeless yet affordable pieces with designs meant to honor someone close to her who she lost far too soon.

“My mom actually passed away suddenly back in April of 2019. We were very, very close, so it was a tough time for me. So, I just threw myself into work as a full-time personal assistant,” she said.

She did so for about three years after her mother’s death, and it worked for a while. But ultimately, she felt numb and had lost all sense of herself.

“I needed a fresh start doing something that I’d never done before, something that would make me feel whole again. I’m naturally a very creative person. Before working as an assistant, I was a professional photographer and a model, but I just couldn’t find a way to reconnect to that part of myself,” she said.

That’s when she came up with the idea to start her own jewelry brand because Khan always admired her mother’s style and love for vintage jewelry. Taking a leap of faith, she put all her focus into starting her business with the intention of creating a brand that featured luxury pieces at an affordable price, all while honoring her mother’s memories by using her jewelry as inspiration.

“I knew I wanted to create pieces that were modern but vintage inspired to reflect both my style and my mom’s style. That combination is also reflected in the name, Bibi & Kim. Kim is my name, of course, and Bibi is for my mom Bibiana,” she said.

Khan launched Bibi & Kim online in 2023, focusing on timeless and elegant designs.

Each piece is made with 18K PVD gold-plated stainless steel or silver stainless steel to replicate the sophisticated look of significantly pricier pieces while ensuring long-lasting durability, tarnish-free wear and hypoallergenic comfort.

Her attention to detail doesn’t just stop at the jewelry pieces. Every order arrives in curated packaging using eco-friendly packaging and soft pouches, all with her brand’s signature black-and-white details.

To establish her presence in the Fort Lauderdale community, she started doing pop-ups two months after launching, garnering success. So much so, she opened a storefront in April 2025. But to keep with the theme of a high-end jewelry shopping experience, the Bibi & Kim storefront is only open to the public a few times a month or by appointment. Fear not, though, Bibi & Kim can also be found at several monthly pop-up events throughout Fort Lauderdale.

Locals aren’t the only ones vying for Bibi & Kim’s timeless style. “One moment that really confirmed to me that I was doing something special was when the stylist for Skye P. Marshall, who plays Olympia on the show *Matlock*, reached out to me and requested two pairs of my earrings for Skye to wear in an editorial piece for a magazine. It was a proud moment for me,” Khan said.

Bibi & Kim has also been featured in *Cosmopolitan* three times, with it being ranked No. 3 on *Cosmopolitan*’s list of 17 Affordable Jewelry Brands as Best Gold-Plated.

But all this notoriety hasn’t gone to Khan’s head. “The recognition and kindness I’ve received because of my brand and pieces is extremely rewarding. I’m very thankful that I started this brand, because it really opens doors to things that I never even knew were possible,” she said.

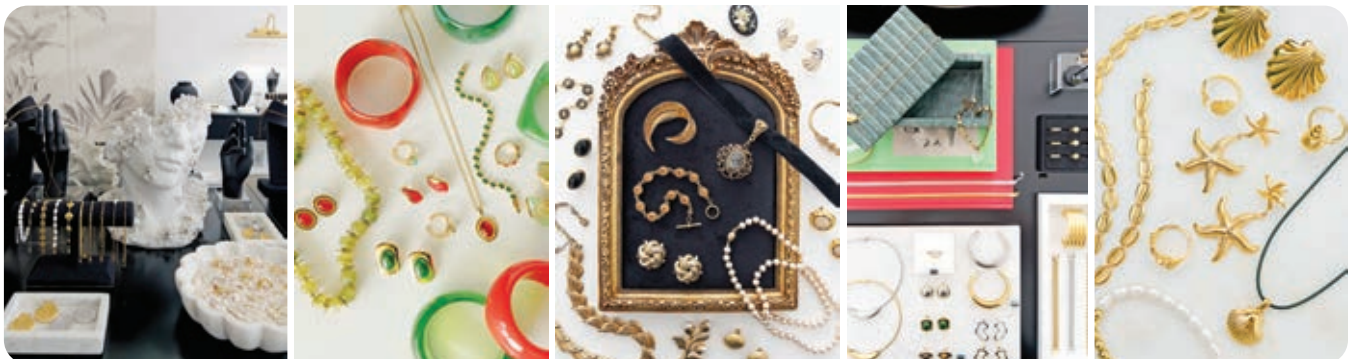

TUNE IN

DIVING INTO THE MARINE INDUSTRY, ONE PODCAST AT A TIME

There are more than 584 million podcast listeners worldwide, and that number is projected to reach 619 million by the end of 2026. It's an upward trend that shows no sign of slowing down, with estimates of around 652 million listeners by 2027.

Podcasts are here to stay. They offer listeners a quick and easy way to stay informed and up to date on virtually any topic that interests them, including the marine industry. It should surprise no one that the Yachting Capital of the World is home to two popular marine-themed podcasts, each of which provides a unique view into our industry and the larger ecosystem. While each has a unique perspective, both help elevate our industry and its future.

Wards Way, the brainchild of Kristina Hebert, president and CEO of Wards Marine Electric, is one. Hebert had the idea long before the show's Oct. 20, 2024, debut. She saw a video podcast as a two-fold opportunity.

One was to preserve the legacy of the marine industry and the evolution of yachting in South Florida. Each episode represented a chance to shine a light on the company's partners and other influential players in the region's marine industry. Hebert saw video storytelling as a way to honor the marine industry legacy and create a resource library that would outlast any single generation.

The other is that a podcast is an ideal way to reach, support and educate the next generation of marine industry professionals. "There's so much knowledge and experience that isn't always written down," she said. "I saw the podcast as a way to share information in an accessible, engaging format."

The data backs her up. Podcast consumers skew young, with 66 percent between the ages of 12 and 34, according to Edison Research's Infinite Dial 2025 report.

With the seventh collection of episodes underway, Wards Way has covered a lot of ground. From cigarette boat racing to whale detection systems to legislative policy changes, each

episode gives listeners a glimpse into marine topics they may never otherwise encounter. All production is done in-house, and each episode takes about 12 hours to produce.


Another local podcast helping elevate important marine-industry initiatives is The Blue Economy Podcast, hosted by Katherine O'Fallon, executive director of the Marine Research Hub. The series focuses on investable, solution-based companies contributing to the health and well-being of the marine environment.

Podcast conversations are wide-ranging and cover diverse topics, from technology supporting deep-sea exploration to aquaculture to sustainable marine innovations. The podcast debuted one year ago with a conversation with Fabian Cousteau, grandson of legendary ocean explorer Jacques Cousteau. It just marked that anniversary with an in-depth discussion of how South Florida built a blue economy hub.

Each episode is recorded by O'Fallon using her iPhone, a tripod and microphones. This simple approach allows her to interview people anywhere, at any time. Her raw footage is then sent to Yacht International Radio, which edits, produces and distributes the finished product across its broad distribution network.

"Our partnership with Yacht International Radio gives us global reach," O'Fallon said. "We're averaging between 18,000 and 20,000 views per episode, and they're coming from around the world. This is wonderful visibility for the Marine Research Hub's mission and work."

As O'Fallon plans the next season of the podcast, she is focused on adding even more diversity to the episodes. "My goal for the coming year is to add profiles of new start-ups offering innovative solutions that align with the blue economy message," she said.

Podcasts like Wards Way and The Blue Economy Podcast are innovative ways to build our industry's workforce pipeline, attract investments and document our rich history.

Legal Surveys – Property Boundaries

Owners are not required to file surveys with our office — unless they are seeking to split or combine parcels — so we very rarely see copies of legal property surveys. Property owners should have a copy of their legal property survey in the closing documents when they purchased the property. This survey defines the property’s boundaries, legal description and any easements or restrictions to help resolve any property line disputes and can be used for any permitting requirements.

Copies of Deeds are Public Records and Available for Free Online

We often hear of mailings aimed at Broward County property owners offering to provide the owner with a copy of their deed or previously recorded document. The company will provide this service for a fee; however, most documents are available online for free.

Deeds and many other important documents are available online on Broward County’s Records website and linked from the property record page. Property records can be found on our website at web.bcpa.net and select “Record Search” to search by name or address. To view a recorded deed from our website, click on the blue “Book/Page or CIN” number located under “Sales History for this Parcel” on the property record page. This will link you to the recorded document in Broward County Records where you can print a copy of the document at no cost.

Deeds recorded prior to Jan. 1, 1978, and recorded deeds utilizing Social Security numbers must be ordered in person or by written request to County Records. To search for documents recorded with Broward County Records, please visit their website at www.officialrecords.broward.org and select your search criteria. Documents matching these criteria will be displayed and you can print a copy of the selected document. Broward County Records Division may be reached at (954) 831-4000 should you need additional assistance.

EXPLORE FORT LAUDERDALE LIKE A TOURIST

TOURISM ENTREPRENEUR CHRIS HAERTING SHARES HIS TIPS AND TRICKS

When was the last time you felt like a tourist in your own city? It's not often that we stop to take in the sights in our hometown, but that shouldn't be the case when there's so much to see and do right here in our backyard. We asked Chris Haerting, longtime entrepreneur and expert in all things Fort Lauderdale tourism, for some tips, tricks and suggestions to help locals see their city in a new light.

How many years have you been in the hospitality industry in South Florida?

I've been the owner and operator of several tour-based businesses in Fort Lauderdale for just over 14 years now. I started my first business, Cycle Party, in 2012, which offered party bikes that seated up to 15 people to rent, with each one being led by your own personal tour guide. From there, I also created Paddle Pub and Bike Dude Rentals. Unfortunately, I've since had to close Cycle Party and Paddle Pub, but it's allowed me to focus more on Bike Dude, which offers multi-day bike rentals and makes for a great way to explore your city.

What have you learned over the years through owning several tourism-focused businesses?

For one, the landscape of tourism in Fort Lauderdale has drastically changed over years, which definitely coincides with the growth we've seen in Fort Lauderdale. I think the most important thing I've learned is how to pivot and change what you offer depending on what your clientele is looking for, especially when not as many people are looking to spend a lot of money on tourism right now. I've learned how important it is to offer activities and experiences for every price range.

What do you think makes Fort Lauderdale special as a tourist destination?

When you're in Fort Lauderdale, it feels like any other huge, vibrant city while still somehow managing to keep that small community feel to it. I feel like that's why people who come here, especially transplants, fall in love with it more than bigger cities like Miami because it's got that small-town feel. You get to know the people, the local businesses and be a part of a community. That's what I think keeps people coming back to visit and, for some, even move here.

What are your recommendations on how to explore Fort Lauderdale like a tourist?

It's tough to narrow it down because there are so many great ways to see the city, but I would say the Water Taxi is still probably one of my favorite inexpensive ways to experience Fort Lauderdale. I always suggest it to tourists because you can hop on and hop off, which makes seeing more of Fort Lauderdale super accessible. But even as a local, it's a great way to get around. One of my favorite new places that the Water Taxi stops at is Marina Village. It has a great

location close to the beach and it's just a cool concept with the food hall that has several different restaurants. But the major standout is the 500-person ferry that they turned into a floating bar and lounge. It's definitely a spot that deserves a shoutout. I've actually talked to a lot of locals who knew about it, but once they finally went were so surprised at how cool it is.

What's a spot locals drive past every day without realizing how interesting it is?

Regina's Farm. It's really easy to miss because it's essentially tucked away in this small neighborhood right off Broward Boulevard. So, it's easily something people drive past all the time without even knowing it's there. But it's a super special, hyper local experience. The only downside is that it always sells out, but it is a very cool experience to be able to be a part of.

What's the most underrated outdoor experience within city limits?

I don't know if I would say it's underrated because I know a lot of people love it, but maybe Hugh Taylor Birch State Park. There are endless options for things to do, like paddleboarding, fishing, hiking and canoeing, as well as lesser-known, more unique activities like horseback riding and scuba diving that you wouldn't expect to find in a local park like that.

When was the last time you felt like a tourist in your own city and what sparked it?

When I visited the new Huizenga Park for the first time. I went there with my youngest a couple of weeks ago and we had a blast going to all the different sections. It's the first park in Fort Lauderdale that truly gave me a European feel with the format of creating these little nooks. There's something for the kids, dog lovers, people who want to relax and people who want to exercise. I was so impressed seeing both locals and tourists hanging out, enjoying the space. We've never had something like that before.

What tools – maps, apps, tours and local publications – actually help locals better explore their city?

I'd have to say the one that always puts a good local spin on what they offer is Airbnb Experiences. They do a great job of curating the best places to stay, but they also do a pretty good job of finding unique experiences. They also don't allow the big brands to go on there and promote their products, which is great. So, it's only host-oriented unique

experiences. The other one that's a favorite of mine is The Infatuation. They do tend to be more Miami-centric, but they have some pretty awesome recommendations for restaurants and dining in Fort Lauderdale.

Why do you think it's important for more locals to get out and explore their town from a tourist's perspective?

It's funny because I don't know many people who live here who've gone on the Jungle Queen or the Water Taxi since

they were kids, for example. Those are tours where it's 99 percent tourists, but I recently went on the Jungle Queen for the first time in years and it was so much fun. Not only that, but it also really gave me a new perspective on the town, seeing it from the water. That's one reason why I think more people should explore the city as if they're tourists, so they can have a newfound appreciation for how special the city is that they call home.

A TRANSFORMATIVE DINING DALLIANCE

EMBARK ON A CULINARY JOURNEY AT TIMBR

TIMBR's understated yet enticing exterior is reminiscent of a quaint English pub, with its black and white facade accented by whimsical flower boxes hanging off its shuttered windows. But the restaurant itself is anything but ordinary. Once inside, you are whisked away to a woodland wonderland. Each table in the main dining room is nestled under a canopy of large artificial trees, complemented by twinkling lights overhead. But it's the room beyond where most guests are eager to spend their time.

What can only be described as something out of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, the entire room is covered in a glorious display of intertwining colorful flowers and greenery. It's easy to get swept up in the ethereal ambiance that you might just overlook placing your order. However, the dreamy array of dishes and drinks will quickly grab and hold onto your attention.

The menu, which blends refined American staples with European classics, features a mesmerizing collection of rich culinary experiences that couples effortlessly with each of their playful takes on craft cocktails.


There are several standout options for something to sip on, but two take the top spots — and for good reason. The Glass Garden, as the name suggests, is a sweet and refreshing crystal-clear cocktail made with sparkling wine, St. Germain, and a pop of fruity J.F. Haden Mango Liqueur that mimics the nostalgia of a melted mango Popsicle.

But for something a bit more robust in flavor with a lot of visual appeal, the Forager is the way to go. A play on the traditional whiskey sour, it features Woodford Reserve Bourbon and black cherry cabernet, which gives it its signature burgundy color that makes for a vibrant drink topped with a fragrant sprig of rosemary. As for the star of

the show, the food, there really is no wrong way to order.

Whether you'd prefer sampling several starters or dive right into the entrees, each plate is a worthwhile indulgence. Yet, if you had to choose what to start with, the roasted beet tartare with citrus crème, pistachio and plantain chips is delightfully light and hearty. Although for something truly special, the burnt Caesar is unlike any other chef's take on the beloved salad. With grilled baby romaine, anchovy crumble, quail egg and a black garlic Caesar dressing, this is quite possibly the most decadent yet fresh take on a Caesar that needs to be sampled firsthand to be fully appreciated.

The same goes for the entrees, with dishes from the land and sea, as well as house-made pastas created daily. Each section has its own fan favorite, but two dishes absolutely shine. The aged duck breast, nestled among a roasted fig compote, heirloom carrots, barley miso glaze, and a lavender jus, is incredibly earthy and tender and melts in your mouth. The pan-seared yellowtail snapper is also divine with a charred leek cream and dill oil that is once again delicate yet rich in flavor. But it's the addition of trout roe that brings a briny burst to this otherwise refined dish.

The only question diners are left with at the end of a meal like this is, what sweet treats await? One dessert serves as a sublime ending to any meal at TIMBR, and that is their three-tiered cheesecake. Keeping with the theme of focusing on fresh flavors served in a stunning presentation, this dessert is not only beautiful to look at but with its layers of raspberry sorbet, raspberry gel, lemon mousse, lemon curd and graham cracker crust all carefully cut into a rectangular slice, it will make your mouth water just looking at it. Then, before you know it, you'll be wiping the plate clean.

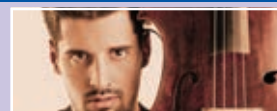

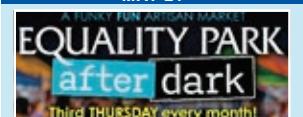
